Administration Reports May 2025

A.C. Houghton Elementary

The 2024-2025 school year is rapidly coming to an end in a few short weeks. Our last month and a half includes our final diagnostic assessment for the school year, organizing end of year events and also hiring for Jumpstart in August, looking ahead by planning for next school year already.

Our 3rd grade team concluded OSAS testing last week, and now all grade levels are working on our final iReady diagnostic for this school year, in both Math and Reading. Students are working hard to showcase what they learned this school year, which will produce data that is used to help us plan for next steps and next school year. Staff has worked hard to support all students to meet at least one year's academic growth in each of those subjects. As reported in earlier board reports, we did show growth from fall to winter, and soon we will see the benefit of our hard work this school year with results from our student's diagnostic growth results!

ACH participated in two very successful fundraising activities in the past several weeks. Near the middle of April we hosted McTeacher Night in Hermiston, where many of our staff 'volunteered' to work at McDonalds helping serve our families that traveled from Irrigon to come have dinner! A proceed of those sales will be presented at the end of the year assembly. This event is well supported as students are really excited to see their teachers in a different setting. We had a great turnout and raised nearly \$1,000 which we are planning to use to bring a National School Assembly to ACH. We also had a very successful annual school carnival held on May 1st. The weather was warm, but nearly perfect and quite pleasant (with very little wind) for an evening event of fun, games and prizes. There were lots of smiles from our kids and I can't say enough about our amazing community support for this annual event. ACH staff, that was willing to put in an extra-long day, worked alongside with our dedicated Parent Club, plus local Fire Department and EMT's, who all pitched in to help raise money that is used to support classrooms and our students. Funds raised are managed by our Parent Club and are used to purchase much needed student supplies, books for our vending machine and many other items needed throughout the school year. Throughout the month of April, our building was filled with a lot of exciting events, with one of the highlights being our STEAM Day on April 25th. This event engaged students across all grade levels in activities that nurtured their skills in math, engineering, art, and science.

Our 4th-grade students had the opportunity to express their creativity by painting flowers on actual canvases. The activity was led by Cynthia Hodgdon, who guided the students through a step-by-step process to create their own masterpieces. Additionally, the students planted seeds which they will continue to nurture and observe grow until the end of the school year. It was a fantastic combination of art and nature.



In 5th grade, students worked in teams to test the velocity of marbles down a track. The structure of the track was determined by the students, and they experimented with different arrangements to see how speed was impacted by changes in the track's design. It was a

wonderful hands-on learning experience that sparked curiosity and teamwork.



Under the leadership of Mr. Temple and Mrs. Benetti, our 6th-grade students had the thrilling task of designing and building bottle rockets using 2-liter soda bottles. Students modified their rockets with engineering adjustments to optimize their flight. The rockets were launched using a combination of air pressure and water, and each student had three attempts to launch their rocket. The farthest distance was recorded, and the excitement of the launches created an unforgettable event. Students from all grade levels gathered to watch the rocket launches and cheer on their peers during the distance competition.



In addition to STEAM Day, we are also celebrating the success of our students in the district math competition. Our 5th and 6th graders excelled, with three students from each grade level earning first, second, and third place in the competition. In the 4th grade, students placed 5th and 6th, and 9th and 10th, demonstrating strong performance overall. Our students were not only excited about their individual success but also proud of the collective achievement. The

excitement surrounding this competition has created a great deal of energy around math learning, and our students continue to grow in their confidence and skills.



1. You Science Staff Training:

On Friday, May 10, all HJSHS staff will participate in a training session focused on the implementation of the You Science platform. This initiative is designed to enhance our career exploration and academic advising capabilities. The goal is to fully integrate You Science into our advising and CTE programs beginning in the 2025-26 school year. Staff will receive training on how to utilize student aptitude and interest data to better align students with elective offerings, career pathways, and post-secondary planning.

2. Senior Countdown & Testing Wrap-Up:

With just a few short weeks left in the school year, we are in full countdown mode for our seniors. Graduation preparations are underway, and the student body is focused on finishing the year strong. State testing (SBAC) is nearly complete, with only a small number of students still needing to finalize their assessments. We appreciate the efforts of our staff in creating a supportive testing environment and maintaining accountability through the final stretch.

3. Master Scheduling for 2025-26:

We are actively working on the Master Schedule for the upcoming school year. We have distributed preregistration forms to students to gather input on elective preferences. Once responses are collected and reviewed, we will use the data to determine the number of sections needed for each course. This student-driven approach ensures that our scheduling decisions are aligned with actual interest and supports efficient staffing and resource distribution.

4. Spring Athletics Update:

Athletics are in full swing as we approach the postseason. District Golf is scheduled for May 12-13, and District Track will take place on May 23 at Crook County High School. Baseball and softball state playoffs are set to begin on May 26. Our teams are performing well across the board, and we anticipate a busy stretch ahead with both travel and hosting responsibilities. The commitment of our student-athletes and coaching staff continues to reflect positively on the school and community.

5. Graduation & Senior Completion:

We are proud to report that we expect 100% of our enrolled seniors to graduate on time this year. Seniors are currently completing their final presentations and end-of-year requirements. As we prepare for the upcoming graduation ceremony, staff and students alike are focused on closing out the year with a strong finish and celebrating the accomplishments of the Class of 2025.

MCSD Maintenance & Facilities Report – May 2025

The required annual inspections and preventative maintenance are being scheduled for June - July and schedules have been shared with pertinent staff. This will help our staff to be able to work around these inspections when cleaning or taking care of other projects. The next step will be scheduling the approved maintenance projects that need to be completed during the summer months.

The board packet includes the quote from Beynon Sports for the two full sized tennis courts at Irrigon Jr Sr High for their growing program. The funds have been secured through grants from Morrow County Unified Recreation District and the City of Irrigon CREZ funds. Once approved, we will move forward with scheduling.

The boiler at Irrigon Elementary has a large leak and three options were given to the district for the replacement. We recommend to fully replace the cast iron style with two smaller high efficiency boilers, the quote and contract are included in the board packet for your review.

We have wrapped up our bond community engagement presentations. We have appreciated all the support from the stakeholders. The IMESD will be mailing informational postcards to help inform voters. Please return your ballot by May 20!
