Goal One – Learning

Our focus on academic growth and competency-based education (CBE) continues to strengthen across classrooms. Teachers are providing students and parents with meaningful, actionable feedback tied directly to learning targets, helping students understand their progress and next steps. Parent-teacher conferences were highly successful, with several classes incorporating student-led components. Our teachers, interventionists, and support staff are taking a close look at achievement and benchmark data to improve achievement at Prairieview. Through our dedicated data review meetings and daily collaboration time, our staff is focused on:

- Looking at individual students who might not qualify for additional services,
 but who can receive extra support in the classroom to close achievement gaps.
- Leaning into the data with curiosity and an open mind so that we can do what's best for students.
- Working with students to take ownership of their achievements and areas for growth.
- Identifying weaknesses in classrooms and setting short-term term goals to strengthen them.
- Collaborating to identify Tier 1 interventions that teachers can use to target improvement.



Fifth graders enjoyed a special visit to Lakeview Junior High's 7th grade classrooms, where 7th graders shared their "Spooky Stories." Teachers have also been engaging students in goal-setting conversations, using self-assessments and Panorama data to help students reflect on their strengths and identify areas for growth—supporting both academic ownership and learner characteristics. Students are continuing to practice kindness and empathy in meaningful ways. A group of students recently led a kindness-themed presentation for their peers in each grade level. Prairieview participated in Unity Day on October 22, joining schools nationwide in promoting inclusion and standing together against bullying. These experiences highlight our commitment to nurturing confident, compassionate learners who embody our theme of Becoming a Champion in all areas of development.

Goal Three – Environment

Team 66 sponsored a festive Trunk or Treat, providing a safe and fun opportunity for students and families to connect. Classrooms also celebrated with Halloween parties and our annual parade. These events would not be possible without the support of our dedicated parent volunteers, whose time and energy help bring these experiences to life for our students. In the LRC, Mrs. Csorba contributed a variety of fun literacy connections, most famously her pumpkin design contest! Lastly, on October 24th, we recognized Bus Driver Appreciation Day.
