**Approve recommended increases in the District Meal Prices
for the 2014 – 15 School Year.**

Discussion:

An increase in District Meal Prices for the 2014-15 is necessary because the Federal “Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act” which reauthorized the National School Lunch program requires the District to increase meal prices to meet Federal equity pricing requirements. Complying with the equity in pricing will necessitate raising the Elementary school and Junior/Senior school lunch prices from \$2.25 to \$2.35 and \$2.50 to \$2.60 respectively, milk prices will stay the same at \$0.40, Adult meal prices will stay the same at \$3.00.

No increase is proposed in breakfast prices at all levels.

Free and reduced prices remain the same for 2014 – 15.

*Notes: Reduced prices are set by the Federal Government. The State is currently paying the reduced breakfast cost. We have not been informed of any changes for “Reduced” meals by either the Federal or State governments. However, if there is a change, the district will implement the Federal and State prices.

Recommended Resolution:

Resolution #2013-14-10 APPROVE RECOMMENDED INCREASE IN DISTRICT MEAL PRICES FOR THE 2014-15 SCHOOL YEAR.

WHEREAS, the Federal “Healthy Hunger-Free Food Act” requires the district to increase elementary and Junior/Senior High school lunch prices to meet Federal equity pricing requirements ;
and WHEREAS, the fixed price for Pattern Meals and Meal Price Equivalents is increasing to offset the continuing increases in the cost of food; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors approves the recommended increase in district meal prices for the 2014-15 school year.
