Why Safety Hazard Reviews Matter

- Required by Illinois Law (105 ILCS 5/29-3) to ensure safety
- Identifies hazards to justify transportation for students living within 1.5 miles of school, using an ISBE point system, ensuring compliance with state guidelines and annual reevaluation

Transportation Under 1.5 Miles: Why it Matters?

- Permitted when serious safety hazards exist (ISBE point system, Illinois Law)
- Annual review ensures current conditions are assessed, as changes in sidewalks, signage, and neighborhood can alter risk

Fiscal Responsibility

- Unit 5 has a \$2M transportation deficit
- State reimbursement is prorated
 - FY26 estimate is 71% general transportation and 61% special transportation
- Removing outdated hazard zones helps financial sustainability





2025-2026 Identified Hazard Zones


- Elementary: Carlock, Cedar Ridge, Fairview, Fox Creek, Glenn, Northpoint, Parkside,
 Pepper Ridge, Towanda
- Junior High: Kingsley, Chiddix, Evans
- Hazards include rail crossings, lack of sidewalks, and high-traffic areas

Changes for 2025-2026


- Normal Community High School: Sidewalk improvements now completed
- Grove Elementary: Neighborhood sidewalks completed
