What is the Attendance Law?

Education Neglect- Under 12 years old

Minn Stat. §260C.007, Subd. 6(3), is without necessary food, clothing, shelter, education, or other required care for the child's physical or mental health or morals because the child's parent, guardian, or custodian is unable or unwilling to provide that care



What is the Attendance Law?

Habitual Truant- 12 years old and older

Minn. Stat. §260C.007, Subd. 6(14), "Habitual truant" means a child under the age of 17 years who is absent from attendance at school without lawful excuse for one or more class periods on seven school days per school year if the child is in middle school, junior high school, or high school or a child who is 17 years of age who is absent from attendance at school without lawful excuse for one or more class periods on seven school days per school year and who has not lawfully withdrawn from school under section 120A.22, subdivision 8.

Since PAWS was developed at LPMS, days students were suspended have decreased






TIER 2 or 3:

Special Education Supports (District Wide)


- -School Social Workers SEL/Mental health support

Mental Health Partnerships


- -Outpatient therapists in all buildings

- -Specialty services: trauma therapy, group therapy, grief groups, and culturally specific therapy for Native Americans.
