



When we highlight, celebrate, and educate ourselves on differences, we all become more open and comfortable interacting.



- Students who feel connected to at least one adult show higher academic achievement and lower rates of bullying and absenteeism.
- Connection fosters resilience, trust, and engagement (it's equity in action).
- There's no "one size fits all" fix. relationships grow through layered, consistent strategies



THE LAYERED Approach

There's No One-Size-Fits-All Solution

- Relationships are built through layers of daily interactions.
- Death by 1,000 cuts → applies in reverse: relationship growth comes from 1,000 small moments.
