Discussion & Review of Preliminary Financing Plan for Proposed \$1,036,485,000 Bond Sale from the 2023 Bond Program	Josh McLaughlin, Bond Advisor with BOK Financial provided the Board with preliminary information for the 2023 Bond sale. The proposed financing plan for the Series 2023 Bonds will fund the construction and renovation of various facilities detailed in the Bond Program. Denton ISD has actively deployed various debt management practices to lower the borrowing costs of taxpayers. Due to these actions it provided District taxpayers with more than \$311.2 million of direct savings since year 2005. Each year, Denton ISD's Board of Trustees are required to set two separate tax rates:
	• Maintenance & Operations ("M&O") Tax Rate: Used for the "day-to-day" operational expenses such as teacher salaries, instructional programs and services, etc
	• Interest & Sinking Fund ("I&S") Tax Rate: Used for annual debt service requirements of bonds approved by voters.
	Denton ISD's total tax rate decreased by 19.54 cents over the last 4 years. The 2023 Bond Program will be implemented without an I&S tax rate increase. The Series 2023 Bonds will initially be structured with annual principal payments over the next 30 years (i.e. final maturity of August 2053). However, Denton ISD will have the flexibility to prepay the bonds prior to scheduled maturity, without penalty.

Discussion of 2023- 2024 Compensation Plan Recommendations	Jason Rainey, Executive Director of Human Resources provided the Board of Trustees with information regarding salary increases for Denton ISD staff for the 2023-2024 school year. The proposed recommendation will include two parts: an employee pay increase for all employees, and equity adjustments for employees whose current salary is below the market median. The general pay increase model for consideration provides for a 2% or 3% of employee salary increase. Each teacher and librarian will receive a 3% of actual salary increase. This pay increase positively affects 2,500 of our experienced teachers and librarians. The employee groups general pay increase (raises) would be as follows:
