



Academic Goals - Reading / Math

- Each student below grade level will make more than 1 year of growth as measured by iReady





SHS Reading


Based on iReady, Fall 2022,

Number and operations and algebraic thinking were areas of needed improvement.

Based on the elements of number and operations and algebraic thinking, the team determined that if we improve on our word problem solving strategies as a school, we will improve in these areas.

Academic Action Plan

- Increase independent reading
- Implement specific systematic strategies K-5 in Phonics and Vocabulary instruction with regular progress monitoring
- Implement systematic math word problem solving strategies K-5 to establish problem solving language and process
- Growth of Professional Learning Communities Teachers analyze classroom assessment data and collaborate on planning ELA/Math instruction for Tier 1 and guided groups, teacher-led instruction
- Professional Development for Benchmark Advanced phonic and vocabulary instruction
- Guided groups will be differentiated based on student needs analyzed through formative assessments

Academic Action Plan w/ Instructional Coaches

- Coaches are working with teachers to evaluate data and determine highly effective instructional practices
- Teacher academies aligned to SIP
- PLCs are working closely with coaches on data protocols to analyze student growth goals
- Current cycles include: progress monitoring, pre/post assessments data, Tier 2 instruction, guided math and reading, Writers Workshop, and computational fluency
- Facilitate peer observations

100% of teachers, staff and students will develop an understanding and implement the use of SEL standards and self-monitoring tools as a result of recommendations from the district SEL committee.
