## CHANGES

We have adjusted the master schedule to allow for a math intervention time and for an uninterrupted reading block as per recommendations from Education Northwest. We have also rearranged our teacher preps so there isn't a prep going on at the same time as lunch except for the last 15 min. when most students are outside.

# CHANGES CONT.

Our 3 new teachers this year are receiving in-school and district mentoring, and our 2nd yr. teachers are also continuing with in-school and district mentoring.

The new ELA curriculum, Wonders, is more aligned with the core standards, and comes with 3 days of staff training. This curriculum also provides interventions for all students, inc. ELL and Special Education. Our Literacy Initiative is also providing for training from Education Northwest directly to each school and teacher to roll out this new curriculum. Our Instructional Coaches are receiving extensive training to be able to sustain and support the implementation of the new curriculum. We're also receiving training from Marilyn Moncur in writing strategies throughout the year.

We're lucky to have 2 district elementary math leads in our building, Mrs. Gochnour and Mr. Greenwalt who are providing training for math interventions.

We are starting a GT program for gr. 3-5 called the Genius Hour which will take place on Fridays. This focuses on those students who qualify to be able to research and develop a topic which interests them.

We received an extra allocation in Sept. and after considerable deliberation with our 2nd, 4th, & 5th gr. teams, we decided to hire 2 para-professionals which will focus their time in those 3 grades, since they have the largest no. of students.
