DENTON HIGH DHS Chamber Orchestra selected as Commended Winner

The Denton High Chamber Orchestra, under the direction of David Mairs, was recently selected as a Commended Winner by the National Orchestral Honors Project.

The National Orchestral Honors Project is a national competition, entered by recordings, in which the top quarter entries are selected as National Winners, and the second quarter entries receive Commended Honors.

The adjudicator for the project was Larry Livingston, chair of the conducting department and music director of the Thornton School Orchestras at the University of Southern California.

The DHS orchestra will receive recorded and written comments and suggestions from Mr. Livingston and a CD of the winning performances.

"Many of the finest orchestras in the nation entered the competition and the Mark of Excellence program received entries from 25 states," said Rick Yancey, director of the National Orchestra Honors Project.

Mr. Yancey stated the Denton High Orchestra is a fine example of orchestras everywhere, and a credit to the Denton Independent School District.

Denton ISD honored for music education

For the second year in a row, the Denton Independent School District has been named as a "Best Community for Music Education in America." The school district also attained this honor in 2007 and in 2004.
