Food and nutrition continues to be a vital part of our students' day. Throughout the 2009-2010 school year, we maintained an above average student participation record. This calculates to over one quarter of a million lunches during a single school year! These appetizing meals were nutritionally balanced while promoting a healthy eating lifestyle.

During the 2009-2010 school years we observed an increase in common allergens and diabetes. One of the most common allergens is dairy. With written recommendations from the student's physician we can provide the proper food substitution. We have several students that are diabetic. We provide each of them a daily carbohydrate count for their selected meals so that every student has the opportunity to participate in healthy choices through our school meals program.

We made capital improvements to our Food Service equipment totaling \$38,630. Capital investments included a new upgrade to our technology, touch-screens at all ten of our registers and the ability for improved data control collections. This system provides the latest in cutting-edge technologies that excels in compliancy, keeps customer information current and affords a more hands-on approach for our parents.

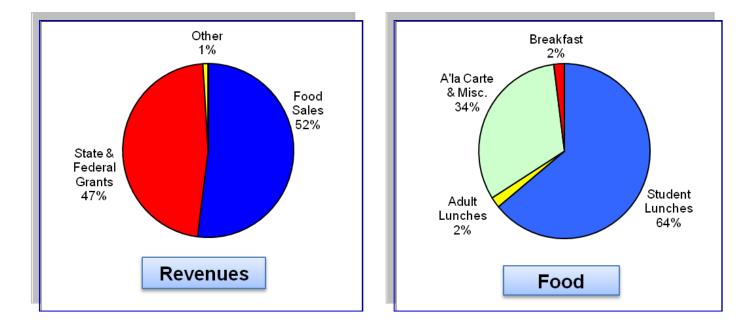
Our new technology allows parents secure, around-the-clock access to their children's accounts to view activity, balances and make deposits. For convenience, a parent can make a single credit card deposit for multiple children and the information flows directly to their account within minutes, reducing money handling in the lunch line. This technology also provides parents with viewable account and meal histories. New features include an automated email notification of low student account balances and have made us more accessible to our community as we continue to seek out clear parental communications.

#### HEALTHY BULLDOG MEAL QUICK BITES 2009-2010

- We served 54,564 breakfasts. (increase of 8,524 from 2008-2009)
- We served 248,285 lunches.
- 30% of our families qualified for financial assistance.
  - \* 8% increase from 2005
  - \* Our percentage has almost doubled since 2000 when 16% qualified.
- 85% of our staff missed no more than two days of work.
- Our lunches reached 1/3 of our students' recommended daily nutritional allowances.
- Our breakfasts reached ¼ of our students' recommended daily nutritional allowances.
