## From the Babb BNAS specials teacher Bobbi Jo Powell-

I would like to share that the 3-6 graders have been working on Blackfeet star stories and constellations. This correlates with what they are learning about in science. They are learning the stories and for some constellation's there is more than one story. An example would be The Big Dipper constellation, which has two stories, one is the Seven Brothers and the Little Sister, while the other story is about the Moon and the Seven Singers. We identified the characters, setting, and the problem/solution, and also discussed the theme (what they learned or what the lesson expressed through the story). They are also learning the Blackfeet names and symbols for the Milky Way and that the Blackfeet referred to it as the Wolf Trail, the Big Dipper, Pleiades, the Morning Star, Sun, Moon, and Many Moons. Next, they will be learning about the design of the tipi, what the top, middle, and lower section represents along with what type of symbols and the correct placement of these symbols. UPDATE: Bobbi will continue as the Babb BNAS teacher for the remainder of the school year. During this time, she will also be mentoring Zoee in developing her foundational BNAS curriculum understanding. Bobbi is also working directly with the teachers in identifying where the BPS BNAS curriculum can support or even supplant

lessons within the adopted curriculum for science and social studies. Our goal is to begin next school year with these lessons identified so that the classroom teachers can implement the BNAS curriculum within their regular science and social studies lessons. A big shout out to Bobbi for these efforts.

We also added a new staff member, teacher assistant Zoee Johnson-

Hello, My name is Zoee Johnson. I was born in Canada and grew up just north of the border in Cardston where I also went to school.
