

Long Range Bond Planning Committee

Committee Membership

The District seeks to involve a cross-section of Aledo ISD citizens and staff in an ongoing community-wide effort to study District needs and develop bond programs, when needed, to serve the District's increasing student population.

This committee is charged to serve in an advisory capacity to the AISD School Board and Administration on an ongoing basis and to focus specifically on long-range bond planning.

Committee's Objectives

Study existing demographic data and future projections for student enrollment; Tour district facilities and review capital improvement needs in consultation with AISD staff; Identify any additional needs or facilities required of the district to effectively carry out its mission long-term; Review Aledo ISD's current and projected financial status, considering all factors, including but certainly not limiting AISD to: a school bond election; attendance rezoning, new construction, building additions, temporary facilities and/or any other options for addressing long-range facility needs; Develop recommendations for consideration as part of a long-range facility plan for the AISD School Board and Administration.

Committee Composition – (37 members by design)

Two representatives from each attendance zone at K-12 schools (18)

Two parents, each with a child attending that school

Note: For purposes of this committee's work, The Learning Center will be included with Aledo High School

Three members of the original 2025 Committee (3)

One representative staff member from the elementary, middle and secondary grade levels (3)

Thirteen appointees from the community at large (13)

Three members of the business or corporate community

Three resident taxpayers without current AISD students

Seven citizen members appointed by the Board of Trustees

Committee Membership Selection Process

Each campus principal will facilitate the selection process at the attendance zone level from a pool of volunteer applicants through a consensus process working with the campus site-based team.

Appointment of at-large members from the business and residential community will be conducted via application with the assistance of the East Parker County Chamber of Commerce.

Each Board Trustee will appoint one citizen member.

Committee Leadership

The committee will be led by a chairperson or co-chairpersons selected by the Committee on an annual basis each June. This person or persons shall come from within the committee's membership.

The chair or co-chairs shall be citizens and not employees of AISD and if co-chairs are chosen, they represent separate constituencies of the district (i.e., one chairperson elementary and the other secondary).

Committee Meetings

Meetings will be open to the public. Following each meeting, a summary report should be posted on the district website to keep the public informed of ongoing discussion. Periodically, and as necessary, a written recommendation will be presented to the Board and Administration at a called and posted Board meeting and shall be posted to the website for public information and review.

The ultimate responsibility for action regarding district long-range facility planning lies solely with the seven elected members of the Board of Trustees.
