Staffing Benchmarks Common Practice

- One assistant principal for each 550 students
- One counselor for each 400 students
- One librarian for each campus
- 5.5 Clerks for each 1,000 students at secondary (Minimum 3 positions)
- 4.5 Clerks per 1,000 at elementary (Minimum 2 positions)
- Instructional Aides 12.8 aides per 1,000 students

Staffing Benchmarks Common Practice

- Clerical support 4.0 per first 1,000 students
- Nurses RN vs. LVN (Licensed Vocational Nurse)
- PEIMS Categories for non-classroom support include (counselors, nurses, librarians, diagnostician, instructional facilitators, technicians etc.) Campus Administrators, (principals, assistant principals, athletic directors, etc.) Superintendent, business manager etc.) Compare to state average.

Example: District of 2,100 students average 39.1

Staffing Benchmarks Common Practice

- Staffing Technology (director, supervisor, network technicians, computer repair, PEIMS coordinator, administrative assistant with purchasing responsibly) Average load is 700-750 units per technician.
- Security—(day time campus, night security, investigator—unique to each district)

Elementary

- Teachers (22 students per classroom)
- Pre-K
- PE Teachers (One certified teacher per campus with one or more aides)

Middle School

- Statewide classes run 20-24 students when the reference is 8/7 master schedule—except in special education classes & certain electives)
- Multiple coaches assigned to athletic periods
- Average electives on state-wide benchmark is 20-24 students.
- Explore Large Group Instruction for savings

High School

• State benchmark: Students take 8 classes a day, Teachers teach 7 classes per day

Staffing benchmark is 20-24 students per section

Special Education

- Director, diagnosticians, speech pathologist, residential placement, aides.
- Maintenance of Effort (MOE)
- Do not make any cuts to special education without a review of "MOE"
- Set aside funds in anticipation of a residential placement
- Student Code Audit

Life skills

• 1:10 qualifying students

Diagnostician/LSSP

• 1:90 per special education population

Behavior Specialist

• 1:200 per special education population

Child Nutrition

- Independent Kitchens vs. Central Kitchen
- Contract for Nutrition Services vs. District operation
- Meals per Labor Hour (MPLH)
- Staffing efficiencies
- Pro-rated reimbursement of utilities, insurance, equipment costs, custodial etc.

Area maintained per employee

	Enrollment Range	Median SF per Maintenance Employee	Median Acres per Grounds Employee	Median SF per Custodian
K-12	<5k	120,000	45	25,989
K-12	5-20k	103,571	70	23,598
K-12	>=20k	77,021	85	20,000

If average house is 2,000 square feet:

- K-12 Custodian is responsible for space equivalent to 11 homes

Human Resources

- Early Notification: Small stipend (1,000-1,500) for early retirement
- Staffing Model: District Staffing Ratios for all positions
