Background Information

Each year, in accordance with Board Policy BQ (Legal) and BQA (Local), every campus is required to develop, review, and revise a Campus Improvement Plan (CIP). The CIP serves as the framework for campus decision-making and is directly aligned to the District Improvement Plan and Strategic Priorities.

The 2025–2026 CIPs were collaboratively developed by campus leadership teams, including administrators, teachers, staff, parents, and community representatives. These plans are data-driven and outline strategies, performance objectives, and resources to improve student achievement, address identified needs and monitor progress toward state and federal accountability standards.

Key areas of focus in the 2025–2026 CIPs include:

- Increase the district's accountability rating for Domain I: Student Achievement in reading, math, science, and social studies to ensure all campuses meet acceptable accountability ratings.
- Increase the district's accountability rating for Domain II (Growth) from 72% to 80%.
- Strengthen parent and family engagement opportunities.
- Building campus administration capacity through targeted professional development aligned to campus academic needs.
- Increase the awareness of fiscal stewardship and operational excellence by focusing resources on instructional expenditures to support academic goals.
