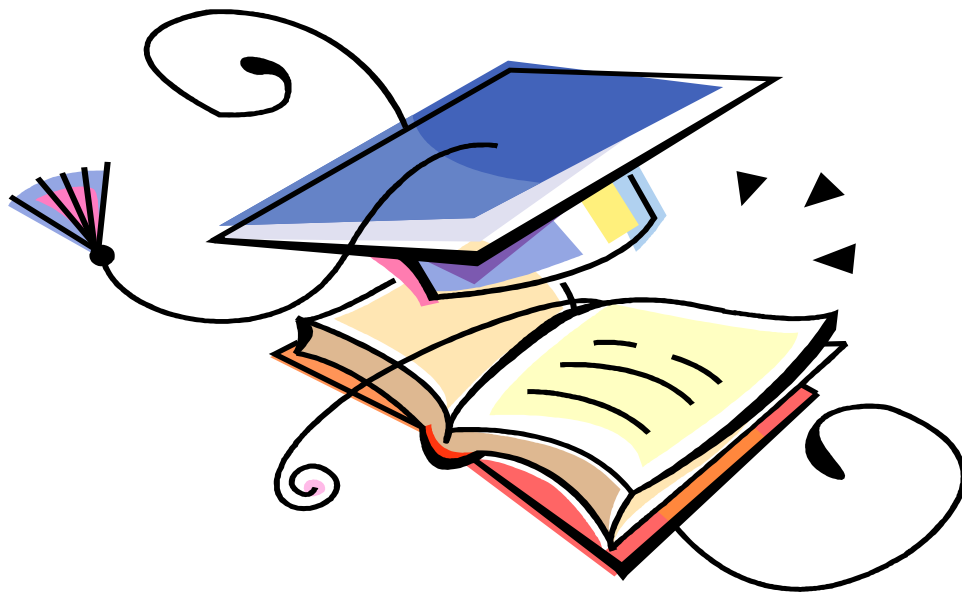

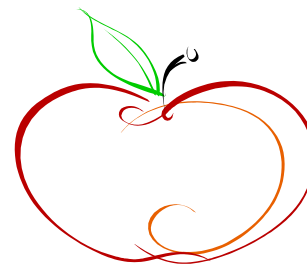

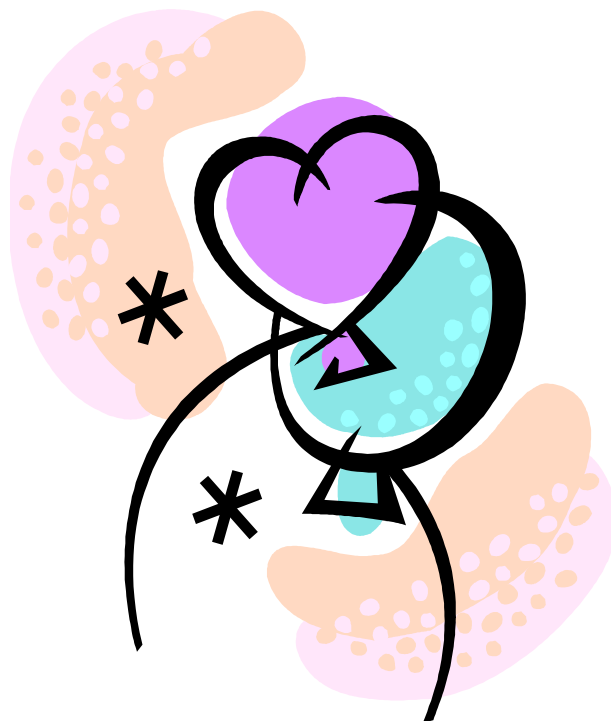

## Monarch Project

During Earth week the 3rd and 4th grade class repotted many milkweed starts. They are healthy and for sale.

In class the students will go back to the question, look at their hypothesis and re-evaluate how the project went. We will go over the scientific process again. A science project board was made and will be presented to the class to show them how they can organize information in a science project in future grades.

## Milkweed Plants For Sale

A 4" pot will cost 50 cents. Plant them in sun to part shade, water regularly. First season plants will be fragile. It would be best to plant them in a place of their own like a flowerbed where you can find them in the spring. Plant about 7 together may be a good idea. When started from seed (like these plants this year) may not bloom until the following year. Plants die back over winter. Linda Kappen—846-6280

## More About Milkweed

There has been some misunderstanding about Swamp Milkweed being on the Oregon invasive weed list. It is not. Swamp Milkweed is considered a safe alternative to Purple Loosestrife (*Lythrum Salicaria*). Purple Loosestrife is on the noxious weed list for Southern Oregon.

Some may confuse Milkweeds with the Butterfly Bush (*Buddleia davidii*) that is on the Oregon noxious weed "B" list. They have encouraged using a cultivated variety rather than the straight wild variety found on roadsides, riparian areas and forest openings. Deadheading the flowers will keep it from spreading. Grind compost or burn the deadheads. The butterfly bush is great for Butterfly gardens, select and use with care. More info can be found on-line. Questions- Linda Kappen 846-6280
