# Coach's Corner Newsletter

# PREPARE FOR CONFERENCES PREPÁRESE PARA LAS CONFERENCIAS

#### Before the conference

- Ask your child how she feels about school.
- Ask your child if there is anything that they want you to talk about with their teacher.
- Tell your child that you and the teacher are meeting to discuss his/her progress.
- Check your child's grades and ask your child questions about their assignments.
- Make a list of topics/questions that you want to talk about with the teacher.

#### **During the conference**

- Be on time for the meeting.
- Relax and be yourself.
- Ask the most important questions first.
- Take notes on what you want to remember.

#### After the conference

- Talk about the positive points of the conference with your child.
- Talk about the areas of concerns and help make a plan to improve in those areas.

#### **Potential Questions**

- Is my child reading at grade level?
- What is my child doing well in? What needs improvement?
- Is my child finishing classwork and homework?
- Does my child take part in class discussions or activities?
- How is my child doing in math? Are they on grade level?
- What can I do at home to support their learning?

#### Antes de las conferencias

- Pregúntale a tu hijo/a cómo se siente en la escuela
- Pregúntale si hay algo que quiera que hables con su maestro/a.
- Dile que tú y el maestro/a se reunirán y asegúrese de que pueda asistir.

- Haz una lista de los temas que quiere tratar con el maestro/a.

#### Durante la reunión

- Sé puntual a la cita.
- Relájate y sé tu mismo/a.
- Haz las preguntas más importantes primero.
- Toma notas de lo que quiera recordar.

#### Después de la reunión

- Habla sobre los puntos positivos de la reunión.
- Habla con tu hijo/a sobre las áreas de preocupación y ayúdalo/a a crear un plan para meiorar en esas áreas.

#### **Preguntas posibles**

- ¿Está leyendo mi hijo/a al nivel de grado esperado?
- ¿En qué está destacando mi hijo/a? ¿En qué necesita mejorar?
- ¿Está terminando su trabajo en clase y las tareas?
- ¿Participa en las discusiones o actividades de clase?
- ¿Cómo le va en matemáticas? ¿Está al nivel de grado?
- ¿Qué puedo hacer en casa para apoyar su aprendizaje?



# **Grade Level Happenings**

### Kindergarten

We started the month of November with a trip to Brookfield Zoo! We had a great time looking at animals and the weather was perfect. I keep hearing from the students that they loved the dolphin show!

In our Amplify reading unit, we read different stories. After listening to all of the stories we went to the STEM lab with Mr. Boyk and completed STEM challenges based on the stories. One of the stories we read was "The Three Billy Goats Gruff". In the STEM lab our goal was to build a bridge that held as much weight as it could.



our goal was to build a bridge that held as much weight as it could. The kindergartners did a great job problem solving to make their bridges stronger with each try.

We are continuing to learn letter names and sounds and use those sounds to read and write CVC words. We are using those CVC words and heart words (high frequency words) to read sentences. In dual classrooms we continue learning to read and write sílabas.

In Math, we learned about 2D shapes (triangle, rectangle, square, and hexagon). Do you know what shape has three sides and three corners? We also learned about 3D shapes (cylinder, cone, sphere, cube). 3D shapes are solid shapes that have 3 dimensions. Do you know how many flat surfaces have a cube? Our next unit is measurement. The kiddos are very excited!

#### 1st Grade

In Amplify, we are starting to learn about Mesopotamia and Ancient Egypt. Students are comparing and contrasting different components of these two civilizations including, farming, cities, writing, leaders, and religion. In UFLI, we are learning about consonant digraphs, while still practicing reading fluency, writing and our heart words. In math, we are using strategies to make ten to help add three numbers together. Also working on math stories for both addition and subtraction with numbers 0-20.



#### 2nd Grade



Fun! Fun! Second grade has had such an exciting past couple of weeks!

To wrap up our Ancient Greek Civilization unit we created our very own "Potato Olympics"! Each student had their very own potato athlete. We had opening ceremonies, where students introduced their potatoes and the country they represented. Potato athletes then participated in a series of events, and had the opportunity to win gold, silver, and bronze medals. We had such a GREAT day!

& 20s A

In math, we are currently working on module 4, addition and subtraction to 200 with word problems to 100. We'll be busy working through this module until after winter break.

#### **3rd Grade**

In math we are wrapping up our second module that focuses on place value and measurement. We will be starting our third module soon! The new module will be focusing on multiplication and division.

For Amplify, we are finishing up our third unit on the human body systems. Students got to learn all about the different body systems and how they all work together to help us move. Our next unit will focus on The Ancient Roman Civilization.



In science we are learning about invisible forces. Students had the opportunity to design their own bridge and test how much weight it could hold without it collapsing. Students were very curious to see all the different designs that their classmates came up with.

November is a very busy month for 3rd grade and we are ALL very excited for Thanksgiving break!

#### 4th Grade



For Math, students are on Module 3, continuing to work on multiplication strategies in word problems. We will be starting our division lessons in the coming weeks.

For Amplify, students are working on the Empires in the Middle Ages unit, part 2. Particularly, the decline and fall of the Roman Empire which led to the Islamic Empire

For Science, students are continuing to learn about the concept of ENERGY and will continue this up to Thanksgiving break.

#### 5th Grade

In 5th grade we just wrapped up ancient civilizations in reading. We learned all about the Maya, Aztec, & Inca civilizations. Next up is poetry where we will be reading and writing different styles of poetry.

Our field trip to the Field Museum was a great opportunity to see the artifacts of ancient civilizations as well as many other amazing exhibits. Thank you to our amazing volunteers, we all had a great time!!!



In math, students are learning algorithms and strategies for multiplying and dividing large whole numbers and decimals.

Also in 5th grade, we just wrapped up our exciting Social Studies unit on revolutions! Students have been learning about major turning points in history, including the American, French, Mexican, and Russian Revolutions. To show what they've learned, students are now working on a creative project building a timeline that highlights key events, important leaders, and the lasting impact of one of these revolutions. We can't wait to see their hard work and creativity come to life as they connect the past to the present!

We are working on jump rope in all grades. Grades K - 2 are focussing on jump rope skills with an individual rope. Grades 3 - 5 are doing group jumping with a long jump rope as well as individual jumps.

#### Music

In Music, K-2 students have continued to work on keeping a steady beat and basic rhythms. This month students have started working on two new shaking and scraping instruments, the maracas and the cabasas. They have also begun working on the mallet instruments with an emphasis on proper mallet technique and aural skills. The 2nd Grade Tigers will perform the school song on boomwhackers at the end of the month.



3rd-5th grade students have been refining their mallet techniques on the

glockenspiels and xylophones. They have also begun to work on choral music, focusing on melody and diction, singing in both English and Spanish.

# SEL / Health

All grade levels have finished up our unit on Mental Health and Wellness and did great! We learned what our body feels like if we are angry and ways to help calm down. We have started our unit on Nutrition. All grades will be learning about making healthy food choices.

K&1- Healthy vs. Unhealthy

2&3-Learning about the different food groups

4&5- Learning more about reading food labels and what vitamins and minerals the different food groups can provide your body.

#### **Innovation Center**

#### **DiNovember and the Traveling Mural Project**

We celebrated DiNovember with dinosaur-themed books, displays, and activities across all grade levels. As part of our celebration, students contributed to the nationwide Traveling Mural Project, where ten schools work together to create a shared community mural. Our students contributed to the Wegner mural by coloring dinosaurs, fossils, and bones. Pieces of our mural will soon travel to other parts of the country, and in return, we will receive sections created by partner schools. We look forward to sharing the completed mural later this school year.

#### **Book Clubs Have Begun**

Our in-person book clubs are up and running.

• 3rd Grade: Area 51 Files

• 4th Grade: Dogtown

• 5th Grade: Millionaires for the Month

Students meet weekly to read and discuss assigned chapters. They will create a final project after finishing their book.

### **Technology**

November is shaping up to be an exciting month in the STEM Lab!

The Second Grade students are studying Ancient Greece. The students built soldier transport boats out of popsicle sticks, aluminum foil, paper, and bubble wrap. The fastest boat crossed the "Aegean Sea" in 1.1 seconds.

The Fifth Grade students are building forts for the Continental Army during the Revolutionary War. These forts have to withstand a wind storm, an earthquake, and an "attack" from the British Army.

The Third Grade students are going to complete the magnet-propelled car challenge. They have to build a car out of household supplies (cardboard, tape, popsicle sticks, etc.). Then we will use opposing sides of magnets to repel/propel the car down the track.

#### K-2 Enrichment

Students in 1st and 2nd grade ELA groups have begun doing research for final projects. Be on the lookout for some great products!

Second grade math students are finishing up learning about money and decimals. Students will move on to geometry next. First grade math students have been working on place value and problem solving.



Second grade math students have been working on triple digit addition and subtraction. Students have also been working on word problems and error analysis problems.

#### 3-5 A&E

It's been so much fun reading and discussing some amazing novels with the reading enrichment students this month!

5th grade finished The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe and are working on creating their end of novel projects.

4th grade is close to finishing their novel, Pax. They are excited about the puppet show we will be creating for their end of unit project.

3rd grade is doing a wonderful job reading *I Survived the Sinking of the Titanic*. They have been practicing using text evidence to describe the main character and will be practicing writing paragraphs soon.



# **End of Day Pick-Up Changes**

We know that sometimes families need to make alternate arrangements for student pick up at the end of the day. If you need your child take alternate transportation (walking, riding with a friend, etc.) please follow these procedures:

- A parent or guardian MUST notify the office of the change by 2pm
  - A parent or guardian may send a note to school with their child, call the office, or send a ParentSquare message (by 2pm) if that's easier!
  - Emergencies will be handled on a case by case basis
- If someone is picking up your child from the office, that person MUST be listed as an alternate pick up person in PowerSchool.
  - Please call or visit the office to add someone to your child's pick up list!
  - Anyone coming to pick up a child MUST have a photo ID so that we can match the person with the name in PowerSchool

We take the safety of our students very seriously, which is why these procedures are in place. Thank you for your support in helping us keep students safe and minimizing any confusion at dismissal.

# **Tardy Students**

- If your child arrives to school after 8:40am, they must enter through the front doors.
- We will provide breakfast for tardy children until 9:15am
- CHILDREN WHO ARRIVE AFTER 9:10 WILL RECEIVE ONE OF THE COLD LUNCH OPTIONS.
- If you know your child will arrive AFTER 9:10 and would like to call ahead to request a specific lunch, you may do so until 9:10.

#### **Breakfast and Lunch**

Breakfast and lunch are FREE for D33 students. Each month we will send home a lunch menu showing the lunch choices for each day. Students are welcome to bring a lunch from home if you prefer.

Our main entrance will open for students eating breakfast at 8:15. Students who are NOT eating breakfast should arrive at school at 8:30.

# **Visiting Wegner**

District 33 is committed to securing all of its buildings to maintain a safe and appropriate learning environment for all of its students using the Raptor Visitor Management System. All visitors (volunteers, substitutes, and vendors) who seek access to either the district office or to a school building when school is in session shall be required to ring a bell at the front entrance and identify themselves and their purpose for visit before being granted access. Once access is granted, visitors must present photo identification for the first visit. All visitors' identification will be checked against the sex offender databases in the 50 states. If the check comes back clear, a dated ID badge will be printed for the visitor to wear for that day's visit. The sex offender database will be automatically checked each time a visitor signs in at the office. When departing from the building all visitors will need to stop by the office to be logged out of the Raptor Visitor Management System. The ID badge must be returned prior to leaving.

#### **Volunteer Information**

One of our goals for Wegner is to create an environment where our families feel welcomed and we prioritize opportunities for families to be more involved in the school, including volunteer opportunities. It is important to know that any parent who wants to volunteer at Wegner, must complete the volunteer form.
