Senate Bill 142 Bell to Bell, No Cell Act

- No personal cell phones, tablets, smart watches, or bluetooth devices.
- FSPS must establish a policy with exemptions (e.g. IEPs & 504s), that must be approved by DESE (ASBA Policy will be presented prior to the first day of school).
- The District's policy related to SB142 must be posted on the school's website before the first day of school.
