Consideration of Approval of an Interagency Agreement with Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station, a Member of The Texas A&M University System and an Agency of the State of Texas for a Face-to-Face Course Titled Robotics and Automation Technology

RECOMMENDATION

The District President recommends approval of an Interagency Agreement between Collin College and Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station for a face-to-face course titled Robotics and Automation Technology.

RATIONALE

The Interagency Cooperation Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 771, provides authority for covered entities to enter into Interagency agreements with each other to perform functions and services as set forth in the act. Collin College wishes to partner with Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station to deliver a face-to-face course titled Robotics and Automation Technology. A draft agreement has been generated and is under negotiation between Collin College and Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station. This approval will be contingent on the parties reaching a mutually acceptable agreement. The Interagency Agreement is expected to begin with a successfully negotiated agreement and will end August 10, 2026.

Collin College, in partnership with Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station, will deliver a course that prepares students to design, service, and optimize automated systems across diverse industries. Students will gain the ability to troubleshoot, test, and maintain robotic and automation equipment while learning to maximize efficiency and productivity in manufacturing and supply chain environments.

BUDGETARY CONSIDERATION

No costs are expected to result from this agreement. Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station will pay Collin College \$750 per student participating in the course, up to 20 students total.

**THE TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY SYSTEM
INTERAGENCY COOPERATION CONTRACT**
Agreement No. M2601822

THIS CONTRACT AND AGREEMENT (the "Contract") is entered into by and between the State agencies shown below as Contracting Parties, pursuant to the authority granted and in compliance with the provisions of "The Interagency Cooperation Act," *Texas Government Code*, Chapter 771.

I. CONTRACTING PARTIES:

TEXAS A&M ENGINEERING EXPERIMENT STATION, a member of The Texas A&M University System and an agency of the State of Texas, having a place of business at 1111 RELIS Parkway, Bryan TX 77807 ("TEES"), and

Collin County Community College District ("Collin College"), having a principal place of business at 3452 Spur 399, McKinney, TX 75069

II. STATEMENT OF SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED:

TEES, in partnership with Collin College, will deliver the face-to-face course titled, "Robotics and Automation Technology" as further described in Attachment A (the "Program").

III. BASIS FOR CALCULATING REIMBURSABLE COSTS:

TEES will pay Collin College \$750 per student participating in the Program, up to 20 students total.

IV. CONTRACT AMOUNT:

The total amount of this Contract shall not exceed \$15,000.

V. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES:

Collin College will invoice TEES for the total cost of the Program based on the actual number of enrolled students in the Program. Upon receipt of a valid invoice, payment will be made by TEES to Collin College within thirty (30) business days.

VI. TERM OF CONTRACT:

This Contract is to begin upon the date of last signature below, and shall terminate on August 10, 2026.

VII. TERMINATION:

This Contract shall terminate upon full performance of all requirements contained in this Contract, unless otherwise extended or earlier terminated as provided in accordance with the Contract. Either TEES or Collin College may terminate this Contract at any time, in whole or in part, without cost or penalty, by providing 30 calendar days' advance written notice to the other party. In the event of such a termination, the parties will, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon in writing, cease all work immediately upon the effective date of termination. TEES shall be liable for payments limited only to the portion of Program work completed and delivered to TEES. If federal or State laws or regulations or other federal or State requirements are amended or judicially interpreted so that either party cannot reasonably fulfill this Contract and if the parties cannot agree to an amendment that



would enable substantial continuation of the Contract, the parties shall be discharged from any further obligations under this Contract.

VIII. GOVERNING LAW:

This Contract and any of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties hereto, shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas.

IX. SEVERABILITY:

Each provision of this Contract is severable. If any provision is rendered invalid or unenforceable by statute or regulations or declared null and void by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions will remain in full force and effect if the essential terms of this Agreement remain valid, legal, and enforceable.

X. FORCE MAJEURE:

Except as otherwise provided, neither TEES nor Collin College is liable to the other for any delay in, or failure of performance, of a requirement contained in this Contract caused by force majeure. The existence of such causes of delay or failure shall extend the period of performance until after the causes of delay or failure have been removed, provided the non-performing party exercises all reasonable due diligence to perform. Force majeure is defined as acts of God, war, strike, fires, explosions, pandemics, or other causes that are beyond the reasonable control of either party and that by exercise or due foresight, such party could not reasonably have been expected to avoid, and which, by the exercise of all reasonable due diligence, such party is unable to overcome. Each party must inform the other in writing with proof of receipt within three (3) business days of the existence of such force majeure.

XI. AMENDMENT:

The parties shall maintain an ongoing relationship during the Contract term and will collaborate on any modifications that may be necessary to the Program to meet the objectives of the Contract. A change may not be made to the Program except by a written request agreed to and signed by both parties (an "Amendment"). Each Amendment shall be sequentially numbered and deemed to automatically incorporate the terms of this Contract to the extent not in conflict with the Amendment terms.

Product Description

The deliverables under this Agreement include the following:

- A 64 hour, face-to-face course delivered at Collin College’s Technical Campus located at 2550 Bending Branch Way, Allen, TX 75013. The course will be held June 8, 2026 to July 30, 2026.
 - Description: The Robotics and Automation Technology program prepares students to design, service, and optimize automated systems across diverse industries. The curriculum emphasizes hands-on training in robotics, programmable logic controllers (PLCs), electrical controls, fluid power systems, and mechatronics integration. Students gain the ability to troubleshoot, test, and maintain robotic and automation equipment while learning to maximize efficiency and productivity in manufacturing and supply chain environments. Learners are equipped with marketable skills applicable to fields such as automotive, electronics, medical, food and beverage, and pharmaceuticals, making this program an excellent foundation for advanced study in engineering.
 - Learning Outcomes: By the end of the course, learners will be able to:
 - Describe the fundamentals of robotics and automation systems, including robot types, axes, coordinates, and kinematics.
 - Safely operate and configure industrial robots, including EOAT setup, sensors integration, and tool center point calibration for part handling tasks.
 - Develop and optimize robot programs using motion types, speed control, and path planning to achieve efficient automated operations.

- Learner-facing content housed in Canvas for learner access and student management.
- Course registration, collection of fees, and learner communication via CVENT registration system.
- Issuance of TEES certificates and/or digital badges to learners.

DISCUSSION: The District released Requests for Proposals for consulting services to provide comprehensive marketing and communications services in support of Collin College's strategic priorities. These services will focus on strengthening institutional branding, enhancing community engagement, and advancing enrollment growth through data-informed and targeted outreach strategies.

The selected consulting firm will assist the College in evaluating current messaging effectiveness and developing strategic marketing initiatives aligned with long-term master planning and student success goals. Key components of the engagement include the development of targeted communication strategies, including both broad-based broadcasting and audience-specific narrowcasting approaches, to better reach diverse populations across the Collin College service area.

The scope of work includes the creation and execution of integrated marketing campaigns designed to:

- Enhance the College's brand recognition and visibility
- Increase overall student enrollment
- Expand awareness of long-term master planning initiatives
- Improve outreach to key demographic groups, including traditional students, adult learners, continuing education participants, and senior populations

The consulting firm will also develop and deploy multi-channel advertising strategies utilizing digital platforms, social media, direct mail, print media, radio, and television to ensure consistent and effective messaging across all communication channels.

In addition, the engagement includes conducting market research and facilitating community engagement efforts such as surveys and focus groups to inform data-driven decision-making and continuous improvement of marketing strategies.

Services would begin April 27, 2026 through August 31, 2027 at an estimated cost not to exceed \$1,500,000 and is budgeted in the External Relations Department's annual operating budget with the option of contract renewal for two additional fiscal years subject to Board approval.

AGENDA ITEM: Consideration of Approval to Close/Terminate the AAS Degree and Associated Credit Certificate in Polysomnographic Technology

DISCUSSION: Since 2012, recruitment and retention of students in the Polysomnographic Technology (Sleep Studies) program have been challenging. Of the 14 admitted cohorts, only 1 has graduated at full capacity (16 students) and only 4 others have ended with 10 or more graduates. Most cohorts have ended with only 3-9 graduates each year, and of the graduates most have chosen to complete only the certificate. Two cohorts are currently running with 9 enrolled students scheduled to graduate in May 2026 and 6 enrolled students scheduled to graduate in May 2027.

Multiple pathways are available to enter a Sleep Technician/Technologist career path, many of which do not require an associate degree or credit certificate in polysomnographic technology. According to the Board of Registered Polysomnographic Technologists (BRPT), most technologists enter the field through on-the-job training and self-study education. This fact has contributed to the recruitment and retention challenges Collin College's credit program has faced.

Recently Collin College initiated a Continuing Education course sequence of 352 contact hours in Polysomnographic Technology that is recognized as a Sleep Technology Approved Resource (STAR) by the BRPT to assist those who are already working in the field to prepare to sit for the Certified Polysomnographic Technician (CPST) professional certification and the Registered Polysomnographic Technologist (RPSGT) professional certification. Enrollment in this course sequence has been quite robust with 129 students enrolled in fiscal year 2024 and 83 students enrolled in fiscal year 2025.

The credit AAS and certificate program courses will continue to be taught through Spring 2027 to teach-out the program to allow all currently admitted students to complete their awards. The AAS degree and associated certificate programs will be closed to new declarations by students (effective Summer 2026).

DISTRICT PRESIDENT'S RECOMMENDATION:

The District President recommends approval of the closure/termination of the AAS degree and associated certificate program in Polysomnographic Technology.

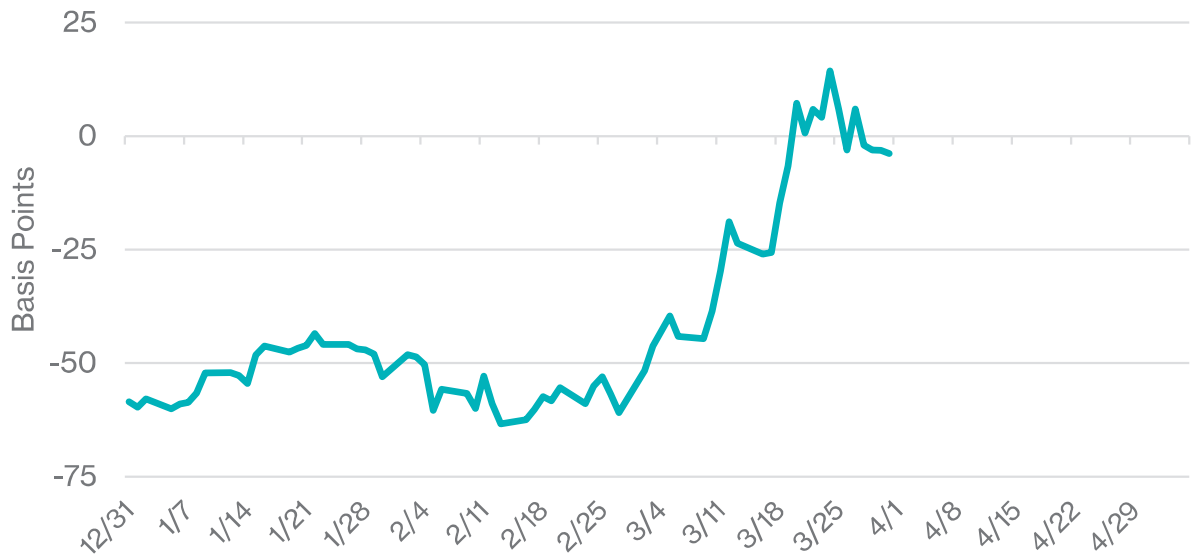

- Economic growth for the fourth quarter of 2026 was revised lower to 0.7% from 1.4%
- Labor market data continue to show there's not much hiring or firing taking place
- The rate of change of inflation has slowed, but cumulative inflation is above average

- During most of February, the Fed Funds futures market was pricing in over two .25% Fed cuts this year.
- At the end of March, futures market data are projecting the Fed to be on hold this year.

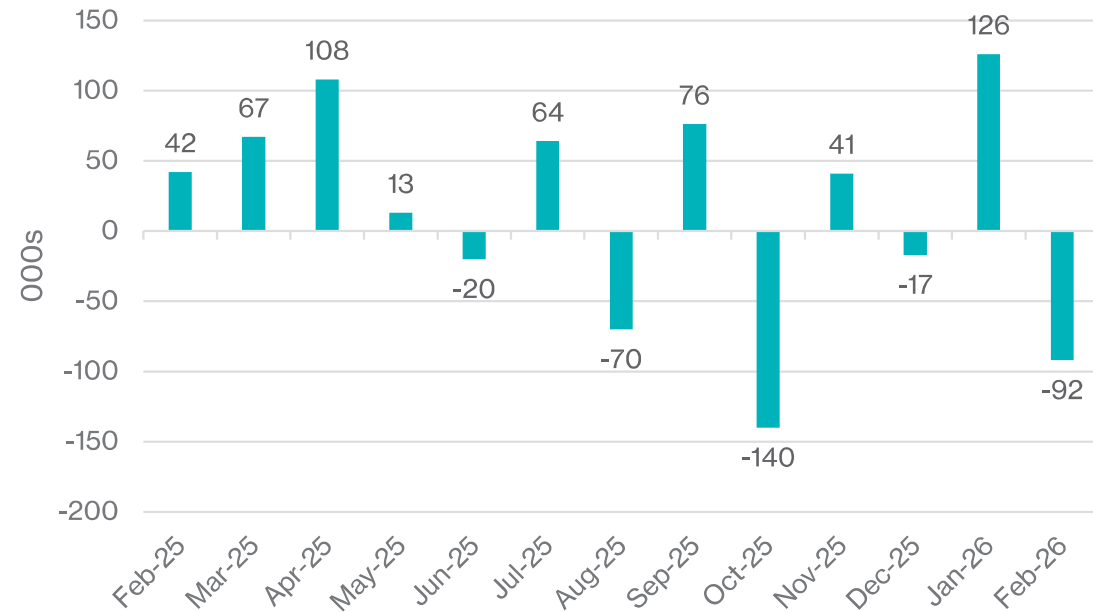

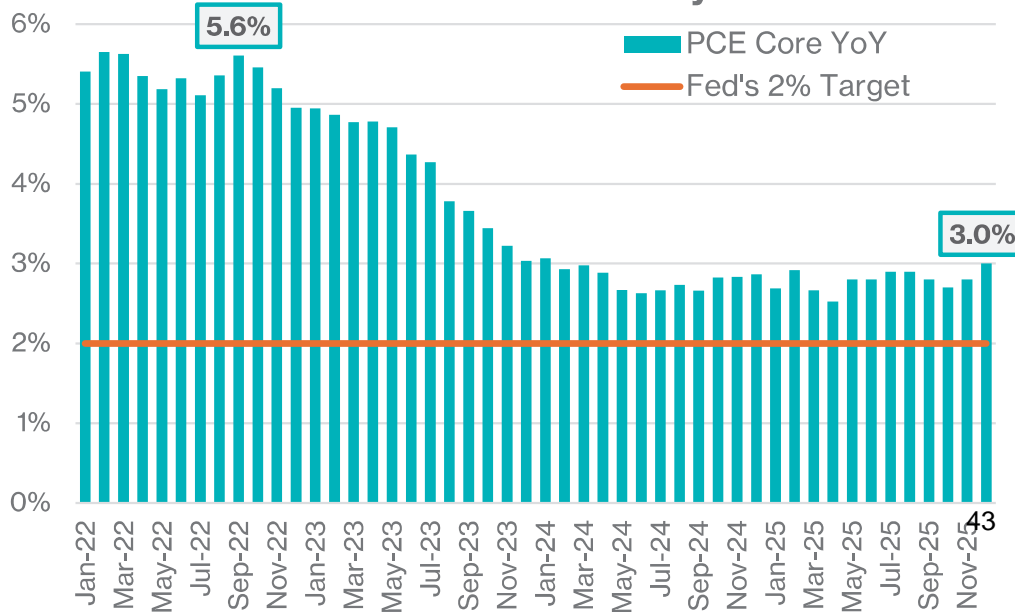

Nonfarm Payrolls - MoM Change



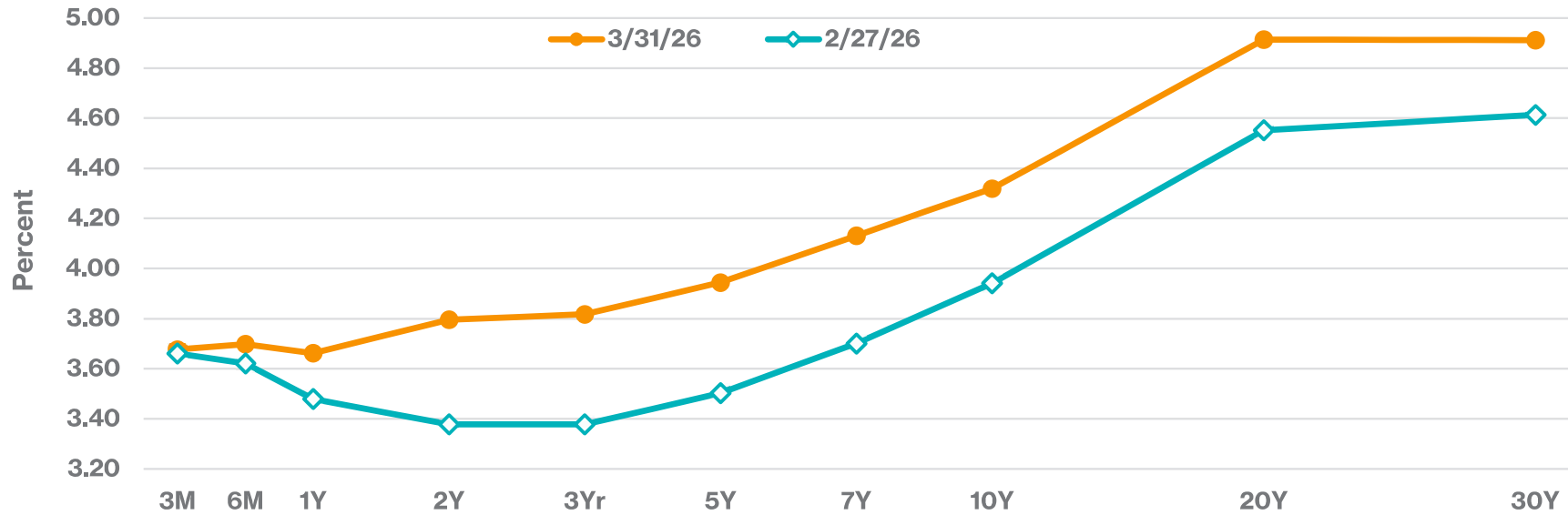
PCE Core Inflation Yoy

- U.S. consumers say their greatest financial concern right now is affordability, due to the accumulated inflation since the pandemic.

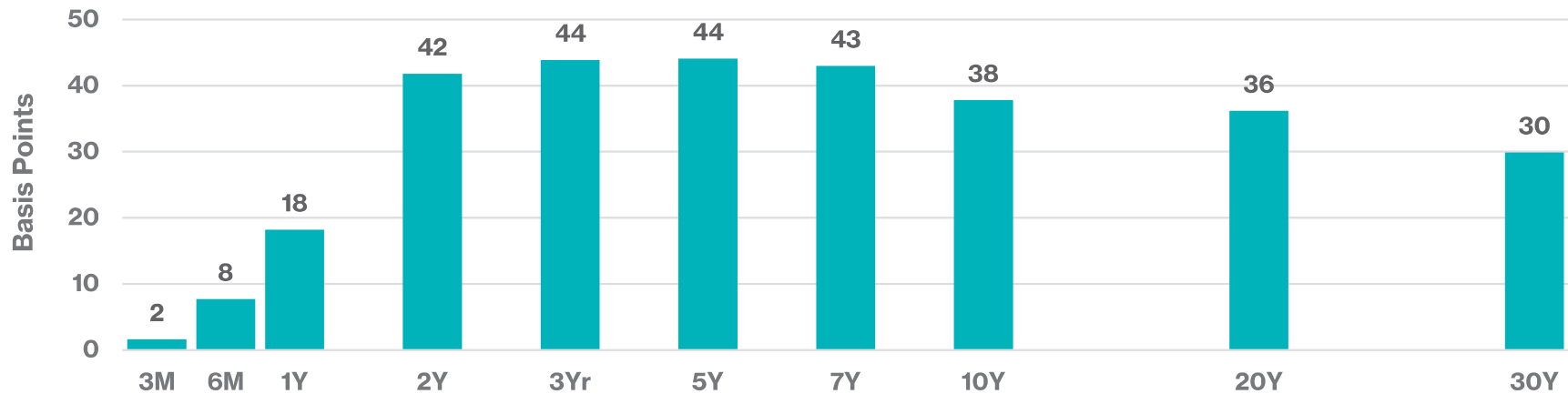

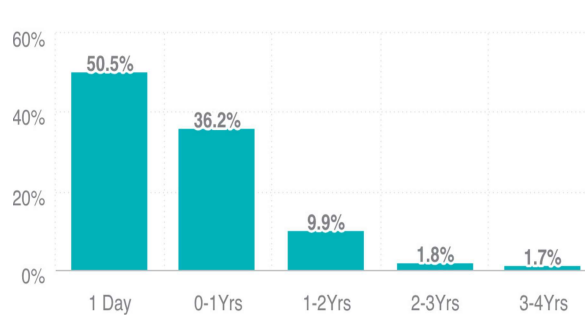

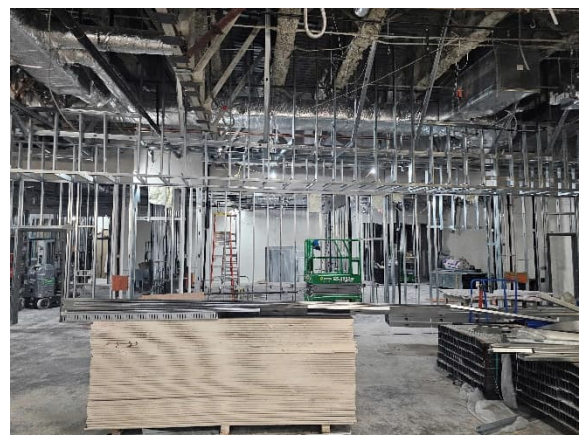

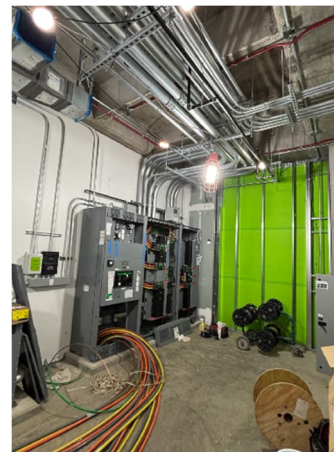
