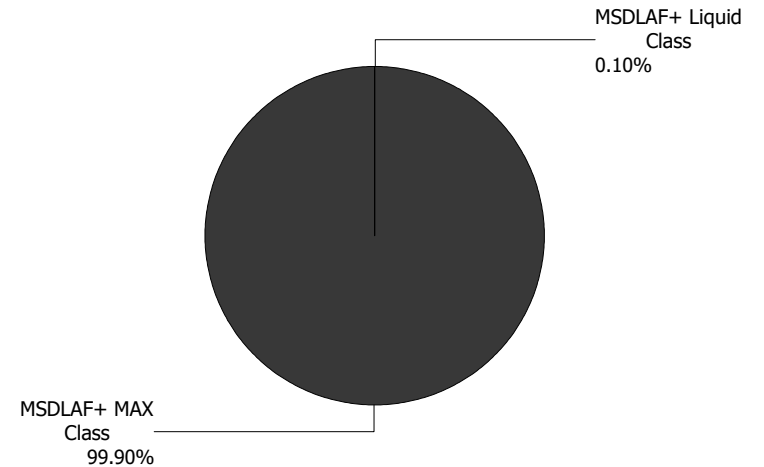

Re: Proposed Investment Strategy: Implementation of \$4M CD Ladder

Purpose

This memo outlines a proposed adjustment to our current investment strategy and requests the Board's permission to designate \$4 million of 917's investment funds as "long-term" and agree that the long-term funds can be used to create a Certificate of Deposit (CD) laddering strategy.

Background and Strategy

In alignment with Policy 705 Investments, our primary objectives for depositing and investing school district funds are: 1) principal safety, 2) liquidity to meet immediate payment requirements, 3) obtain a market rate of return.

To increase our yield while maintaining safety and appropriate liquidity, we are proposing the following investment process:

- **Funds Source:** Designate \$4,000,000 of current investment funds as "long term".
- **Investment Vehicle:** Transfer up to \$4,000,000 of the long term funds that are currently held in the MSDLAF+ Max Class to create a "CD ladder" by purchasing Certificates of Deposit with varying start dates and maturity dates of up to two years.
- **Time Horizon:** The designation of \$4,000,000 as long term funds would remain in place until adjusted by the 917 Board.



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Delegation of Authority and Reporting

Per Policy 705, the Director of Finance serves as the designated investment officer responsible for investment decisions. To execute this specific strategy effectively in a fluctuating interest rate environment, District 917 is requesting explicit Board permission to:

1. Make the day-to-day decisions regarding specific CD purchases, maturity lengths (within the 2-year window), and rates.
2. Operate under the “prudent person standard” to exercise judgment and care in securing the best possible return while prioritizing the safety of the capital.

Accountability: To ensure full transparency and routine monitoring, 917 will provide the Board with a comprehensive **monthly report**. This report will detail the specific CDs purchased, their maturity dates, interest rates, and the overall status of the \$4 million portfolio.

Action Requested

Request that the School Board approve the strategy to designate \$4 million as long-term and authorize 917’s Director of Finance to execute investment decisions in creating a CD ladder with the long-term funds. The Director of Finance will present monthly reports to the Board on the status of the long-term designated funds.

806 CRISIS MANAGEMENT POLICY

I. PURPOSE

It is the policy of the school district to provide a safe and healthy work environment for its staff and students. The purpose of this policy is to direct the superintendent or designee to develop and implement crisis management procedures.

- A. The Minnesota state legislature has mandated that each public school district has a crisis management plan.

The handbooks include roles for school district administrators, staff and community/county agencies in addressing emergencies.

III. POLICY IMPLEMENTATION AND REVIEW

- A. The Emergency Procedure Handbooks are available for administrator and staff reference in each school/program office.
- B. The school district will conduct reviews of this policy and the crisis management plan, described in the Emergency Procedure Handbooks, as required by state and federal law.

Fall Leadership Conference

The **Minnesota Association of Alternative Programs (MAAP)** sponsors a student organization called **MAAP STARS**, dedicated to building student leadership, voice, and agency across alternative learning schools. As part of this effort, we are excited to have DCALS reengage with MAAP STARS by giving students the opportunity to attend the upcoming Fall Leadership Conference.

- Where: Long Prairie MN
- When: **October 22 and 23, 2026**
- Who: 10 students (5 from Main and 5 from North) and 2 staff

This two-day overnight conference is designed specifically for student leaders from alternative schools across Minnesota.
