They analyzed the results, determined who was the low bidder, and Ms. Dee Dee Kearing of Springsted, Inc. presented the results at the meeting. Out of eight bidders, the winning bid from Piper Jaffray & Co. came in at 3.647%, saving taxpayers in the school district \$181,000.

A motion was made by Ms. Droegemuller and seconded by Mr. Moroz to approve the Resolution Authorizing and Awarding Sale of General Obligation School Building Refunding Bonds, Series 2007A, Fixing the Form and Specifications Thereof, Providing for Their Execution and Delivery and Levying Taxes for Their Payment. A roll call vote was taken and the following voted in favor thereof: Mr. Gregory Baufield, Ms. Susan Droegemuller, Ms. Patricia Gleason, Mr. Gary Landis, Mr. John Moroz, Ms. Carter Peterson, and Ms. Linda Cohen, and the following voted against the same: no one; whereupon the motion passed on a 7-0 vote.

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

The Standard Operating Procedures have been developed in accordance with Board of Education policies and reflect past and present practice. It is intended that these procedures be reviewed annually, modified as necessary, and approved at the Board's Organizational Meeting each January.

Should anything in these Standard Operating Procedures be found to be in conflict with state or federal law or regulations, these procedures shall be modified accordingly.

A. BOARD ORGANIZATION

1. The officers of the Board of Education, as established by law, are the Chair, the Clerk, and the Treasurer.
2. It is the practice of the Wayzata Board of Education to also elect a Vice-Chair.
3. All officers shall be elected at the Organizational Meeting held annually on or as close to January 1 as practical, but not later than the second Monday of January.
4. A Board of Education member not elected to an office shall be designated as "Director."
5. Annually the Board of Education may establish "Standing Committees" and further designate the membership and charge of such committees.
6. The Board of Education may, for specific purposes, establish "Ad Hoc Committees." The Board shall set a charge, membership specifications, and timeline for such committees.
7. Annually it is necessary to name Board representatives to other organizations. The Board Chair shall appoint such representatives, subject to ratification by the Board of Education.

B. BOARD MEETINGS

1. Schedule
 - a. On or as close to January 1 of each year as practical, but not later than the second Monday in January, the Board of Education shall conduct an Organizational Meeting. The purposes of such meeting shall include:
 - 1) Election of officers
 - 2) Designation of Board committee structure
 - 3) Appointment of Board representatives to other bodies
 - 4) Such other action as may be deemed necessary

B. BOARD MEETINGS – Schedule (continued)

- b. At the first meeting of each new school year in July, the Board will:
 - 1) Establish a calendar of Regular Board Meetings and Work Sessions
 - 2) Establish and/or confirm District goals/directions
 - 3) Designate official relationships
 - 4) Approve membership in professional organizations

2. Agendas

- a. Board agendas will be prepared according to a schedule established by the Superintendent. The following is a one-month example:

- Monday, Aug. 22 - First draft of agenda reviewed at Board Work Session

- Tuesday, Aug. 30 - Reviewed at Cabinet Meeting
- Tuesday, Sept. 6 - Reviewed at Cabinet Meeting
- Tuesday, Sept. 6 - Finalized by Board Chair, Vice Chair and Superintendent
- Thursday, Sept. 8 - Public Agenda Posted
- Friday, Sept. 9 - Board packets released to Board in a.m.
- Friday, Sept. 9 - Board packets released to public in p.m.
- Monday, Sept. 12 - Regular Board Meeting

- b. Board members may place items on the agenda for Regular Board Meetings or Work Sessions by contacting the Board Chair, Vice Chair or the Superintendent, or for a Regular Board Meeting, at the time the tentative agenda is reviewed at a prior work session. After the agenda has been prepared and posted, new items may be considered for placement on the agenda at the Regular Board Meeting under the "Approval of Agenda" item.
- c. The Board shall annually review and establish its Regular Board Meeting agenda format. The format shall include a "Consent Agenda" which provides for routine items to be enacted with one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Board member or citizen so requests, in which event the item will be removed from the Consent Agenda and addressed in sequence. Changes in agenda format may be approved by the Board during the school year.
- d. Board packets shall either be e-mailed or delivered to Board members' homes so that they are received no later than three (3) days prior to a Regular Board Meeting.
- e. All Board meeting agendas and notices shall be posted on the District web site, the official bulletin board at the Administration Building, and in each of the buildings of the District at least three (3) days in advance of the meeting.

B. BOARD MEETINGS (continued)3. Conduct of Meetings

- a. The rules of parliamentary procedure in the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall prevail if there is any question concerning the conduct of any meeting.
- b. Voting on Motions/Resolutions
 - 1) When calling for a vote on a motion, the Board Chair will use the following procedure:
 - All in favor say "Aye."
 - All against say "No."
 - Any abstentions?
 - 2) In the event of a divided voice vote, the Board Chair may request a roll call vote.
 - 3) The Board Chair will vote last on all motions and resolutions and will summarize the vote tally.
 - 4) The Clerk will record all votes on the "Clerk's Record of Motions" sheets.
 - 5) Resolutions will have a roll call vote.
- c. Public hearings may be established by Board action for specific purposes.

4. Public Participation in School Board Meetings and Work Sessions

a. Audience Opportunity to Address Board

The School Board shall normally provide a specified period of time during a Regular Board Meeting where citizens may address the School Board on any topic, subject to the limitations of policy (212). The School Board reserves the right to allocate a specific period of time for this purpose and limit time for speakers accordingly.

b. Agenda Items

- 1) Citizens who wish to address the School Board on a particular subject may speak during the discussion of that item only at the discretion of the Board Chair.
- 2) The School Board Chair will recognize one speaker at a time and only those speakers recognized by the Chair will be allowed to speak. Each speaker must fill out a form that discloses their name, address, and the issue they would like to speak on.
- 3) The School Board retains the discretion to limit discussion of any agenda item to a reasonable period of time as determined by the School Board.

B. BOARD MEETINGS – Public Participation - Agenda Items (continued)

- 4) The School Board Chair shall promptly rule out of order any discussion by any person, including School Board members, that would violate the provision of state or federal law, Board Policy as specified, or the statutory rights or privacy of an individual.

5. Record of Meetings

- a. The Board Clerk is legally responsible for the official Board records; however, the Board delegates to the Superintendent the responsibility for providing the personnel and equipment for Board meeting record keeping.

- b. The Board minutes will record votes as follows (samples):

Unanimous voice vote: "The motion passed unanimously on a 7-0 vote."

Roll call vote on a motion: "A roll call vote was taken and the following voted in favor thereof: (names will be listed); and the following voted against the same: (names will be listed); whereupon said motion carried (or failed) on a (numbers to be inserted) vote."

Standard resolution roll call vote: "Board member (name) introduced the (title of resolution) and moved its adoption. The motion for adoption of the resolution was duly seconded by Board member (name) and upon vote being taken thereon, the following voted in favor thereof: (names will be listed); and the following voted against the same: (names will be listed); whereupon said resolution was declared duly passed and adopted (or failed) on a (numbers to be inserted) vote."

- c. Regular Board Meetings will be broadcast live on cable television; Special Board Meetings will be videotaped or recorded.
- d. All Board Work Sessions will be recorded and tapes will be kept on file for a period of ninety (90) days.
- e. Published minutes will list a summary of Board Action and Other Business items.
- f. Complete minutes of all Regular and Special Board Meetings will be kept on file in the Superintendent's Office. As soon as practical following the completion of a school year, official minutes will be bound and maintained as a permanent record in the Administration Building.

C. OTHER BOARD PROCEDURES1. Access to Administrative Support

a. Board members should direct requests for information to the following:

- 1) Superintendent of Schools
- 2) Executive Director of Human Resource Services
- 3) Executive Director of Curriculum and Instruction
- 4) Executive Director of Finance and Business Services
- 5) Executive Assistant

b. The Administration will furnish all Board members with information prepared at the request of an individual Board member.

2. Legal Advice

a. The Superintendent is empowered to seek legal counsel as required during the normal course of business and within the limits of the budget.

b. If there are legal concerns involving the Board and the Superintendent, the Board Chair is empowered to seek legal counsel.

3. Attendance at State and National Meetings of School Board Organizations

a. The School Board feels it would be most beneficial to have representation at state and national meetings of School Board organizations with consideration given to timely issues and the established budget.

4. News Media/Board Relations

a. When the Board issues news releases and/or responds to questions from the media, the "official" spokesperson for the School Board will be the Board Chair.

b. Board agenda materials will be available to the public at the same time they are released to School Board members. Items of new Board business should not be given to the public other than through release of Board agenda materials.

c. When individual Board members speak to the news media, they should issue a standard disclaimer that emphasizes: "These are my personal views and do not necessarily reflect the views of the full School Board."

d. The Superintendent will administer the District Public Information Program according to the guidelines established under Board Policy 901.

BOARD MEMBER AUTHORITY

POLICY: 202

Because all powers of the School Board derived from the state statutes are granted in terms of action as a group, individual Board members exercise authority over District affairs only as they vote to take action at a legal meeting of the Board.

In other instances, an individual Board member, including the chair, will have power only when the Board, by vote, has delegated authority to him or her.

It is contrary to the spirit of the statutes for any Board member to seek individually to influence the official functions of the School District. The School Board and its members will deal with administrative services through the Superintendent and will not give direction to any subordinates of the Superintendent.

SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS

POLICY: 203

School Board elections shall be conducted according to the provisions of Minnesota law. Board members shall be elected at elections held in odd numbered years on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November. If more than twice the number of candidates file for election than the number of seats available, a primary election will be held on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in September.

The term of office of a member shall be four years and until the member's successor qualifies. Board members shall be elected on a rotation basis of three (3) Board members elected in one election and four (4) Board members in the next election. New Board members commence service on the first Monday in January following the election.

- H. Recognize that school business may be legally transacted only in an open meeting of the School Board.

- A. Perform under general educational policies unless necessity requires otherwise.
- B. Function in meeting the legal responsibility that is mine as part of a policy-forming body--not as an administrative officer.
- C. Consider myself a trustee of public education and do my best to protect, conserve and advance its progress.

III. TO MAINTAIN DESIRABLE RELATIONS WITH OTHER MEMBERS OF THE BOARD I WILL —

- A. Respect the rights of others to have and express opinions.
- B. Recognize that authority rests with the School Board in legal session--- not with the individual members of the Board, except as authorized by law.

BOARD MEMBER CONFLICT OF INTEREST

REGULATIONS: 205-R

A School Board member who is authorized to take part in any manner in making any sale, lease, or contract in his or her official capacity shall not voluntarily have a personal financial interest in that sale, lease, or contract or personally benefit financially therefrom.

In the following circumstances, however, the School Board may as an exception, by unanimous vote, contract for goods or services with a School Board member of the School District:

1. In the designation of a bank or savings association, in which a School Board member is interested, as an authorized depository for School District funds and as a source of borrowing, provided such deposited funds are protected in accordance with Minnesota Statute. Any School Board member having said interest shall disclose that interest and the interest shall be entered upon the minutes of the School Board. Disclosure must be made when such bank or savings association is first designated as a depository or source of borrowing, or when such School Board member is elected, whichever is later. Disclosure serves as notice of the interest and must only be made once;
2. The designation of an official newspaper, or publication of official matters therein, in which the School Board member is interested when it is the only newspaper complying with statutory requirements relating to the designation or publication;
3. A contract with a cooperative association of which the School Board member is a shareholder or stockholder but not an officer or manager;
4. A contract for which competitive bids are not required by law;
5. A School Board member may rent space in a public facility at a rate commensurate with that paid by other members of the public.
6. A School Board member may be newly employed or may continue to be employed by the School District as an employee where there is a reasonable expectation on July 1, or at the time the contract is entered into or extended, that the amount to be earned by that School Board member under that contract or employment relationship, will not exceed \$8,000 in that fiscal year. If the School Board member does not receive majority

approval to be initially employed or to continue in employment at a meeting where all School Board members are present, that employment must be immediately terminated and that School Board member will have no further rights to employment while serving as a School Board member in the School District.

A contract made pursuant to the aforementioned exceptions will be void unless the following procedure is observed.

1. The School Board must authorize the contract in advance of its performance by adopting a resolution setting out the essential facts and determining that the contract price is as low as or lower than the price at which the goods or services could be obtained elsewhere.
2. In the case of an emergency when the contract cannot be authorized in advance, payment of the claims must be authorized by a like resolution wherein the facts of the emergency are also stated.
3. Before a claim is paid, the interested School Board member must file with the clerk of the School Board an affidavit stating:
 - a. The name of the School Board member and the office held;
 - b. An itemization of the goods or services furnished;
 - c. The contract price;
 - d. The reasonable value;
 - e. The interest of the School Board member in the contract; and
 - f. That to the best of the School Board member's knowledge and belief, the contract price is as low as, or lower than, the price at which the goods or services could be obtained from other sources.

LIMITATIONS ON RELATED EMPLOYEES

1. The School Board can hire or dismiss teachers only at duly called meetings. Where a husband and wife, brother and sister, or two brothers or sisters, constitute a quorum, no contract employing a teacher may be made or authorized except upon the unanimous vote of the full School Board.
2. The School Board may not employ any teacher related by blood or marriage, within the fourth degree, computed by the civil law, to a School Board member except by a unanimous vote of the full School Board.

CONFLICTS PRIOR TO TAKING OFFICE

A School Board member with personal financial interest in a sale, lease, or contract with the School District which was entered before the School Board member took office and presents an actual or potential conflict of interest, shall immediately notify the School Board of such interest. It shall thereafter be the responsibility of the School Board member to refrain from participating in any action relating to the sale, lease, or contract. At the time of renewal of any such sale, lease, or contract, the School Board may enter into or renew such sale, lease, or contract only if it falls within one of the enumerated exceptions for contracts relating to goods or services provided above and if the procedures provided in this policy are followed.

DETERMINATION AS TO WHETHER A CONFLICT OF INTEREST EXISTS

The determination as to whether a conflict of interest exists is to be made by the School Board. Any School Board member who has an actual, potential, or perceived conflict shall notify the School Board of such conflict immediately. The School Board member shall thereafter cooperate with the School Board as necessary for the School Board to make its determination.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURES

POLICY: 211

Official School Board business may be conducted only if a "quorum" of Board members are present. A "quorum" shall consist of four or more members. Official Board motions and resolutions shall be passed only by an affirmative "majority" vote. A "majority" vote is one where either ayes or nays outnumber their opposite. Abstentions, in effect, count as a vote for that majority. In the event of tie votes, abstentions have null effect and the motion or resolution shall have failed.

Each motion shall be carefully recorded. The names of members who make and second each motion shall also be recorded. The chair shall declare a motion adopted or defeated on the basis of voice vote or hand sign. Any member who challenges such declaration may request a show of hands on the same question and the chair shall honor this request. If the result is at variance with the chair's original declaration, the new result shall determine the motion's adoption or defeat.

Any formal meeting of the School Board may be adjourned to another time and place by an approved Board motion. In general, only topics on the agenda of the meeting adjourned should be addressed upon resumption of the meeting.

Except as inconsistent with public law or regulation or at variance with bylaws of the Board, meetings shall be conducted by Robert's Rules of Order.

The official minutes shall be bound and kept in the Office of the Superintendent of Schools.

Publishing of minutes shall be made in the legal newspaper according to law. Such publishing shall include an extract of minutes, full or in part, as may be determined by the School Board or Clerk. Such extract of minutes shall be clearly identified as such. A statement shall appear stating that complete minutes are available for public examination at the District Administration Offices or from Board members.

Copies of the minutes shall be available in all school libraries as well as the public library.

All records of the Board of Education shall be available to citizens for inspection at the Board of Education office.

BOARD VACANCIES

POLICY: 222

A vacancy on the Board occurs when a member dies, resigns, ceases to be a resident of the District, or is unable to serve on such Board and attend its meetings for not less than 90 days because of illness or prolonged absence from the District. In the event of vacancies, the Board member's position shall be filled in accordance with Minnesota Statute.

A temporary vacancy caused by a member being unable to serve on the Board and attend its meetings for not less than 90 days because of illness or prolonged absence from the District, may, after the Board has by resolution declared such vacancy to exist, be filled by the Board at any time, or until such ill or absent member is again able to resume the duties as a member of the Board whichever date is earlier. When such ill or absent member is again able to resume the duties as a member of the Board, the Board shall by resolution so determine and declare such person to be again a member of the Board, and the member appointed by the Board in their absence to be no longer a member thereof.

Any other vacancy on the Board shall be filled either by special election or appointment as specified by state law. All special elections or Board appointments to fill such vacancies shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term.

- I. The following regulations have been established in order to efficiently receive public input on matters properly before the School Board.

A. Notice of Public Hearings

Public notice of a public hearing required by law shall be given as provided by the enabling legislation. Public notice of other hearings shall be given in the manner required for a regular meeting if held in conjunction with a regular meeting, in the manner required for a special meeting if held in conjunction with a special meeting, or as otherwise determined by the School Board.

B. Public Participation

The School Board retains the right to require that those in attendance at a public hearing indicate their desire to address the School Board and complete and file with the clerk of the School Board an appropriate request card prior to the commencement of the hearing if the School Board utilizes this procedure. In that case, any request to address the School Board after the commencement of the hearing will be granted only at the discretion of the School Board Chair.

1. **Format of Request:** If required by the School Board, a written request of an individual or a group to address the School Board shall contain the name and address of the person or group seeking to address the School Board. It shall also contain the name of the group represented, if any, and a brief statement of the subject to be covered or the issue to be addressed.
2. **Time Limitation:** The School Board retains the discretion to limit the time for each presentation as needs dictate.
3. **Groups:** The School Board retains the discretion to require that any group of persons who desire to address the School Board designate one representative or spokesperson. In the event that the School Board requires the designation of a representative or spokesperson, no other person in the group will be recognized to address the School Board, except as otherwise determined by the School Board.
4. **Privilege to Speak:** A School Board member should direct any remarks or questions through the chair. Only those speakers recognized by the chair will be allowed to speak. Comments by others are out of order.

Individuals who interfere with or interrupt speakers, the School Board, or the proceedings may be directed to leave.

5. **Personal Attacks:** Personal attacks by anyone addressing the School Board are unacceptable. Persistence in such remarks by an individual shall terminate that person's privilege to address the School Board.
6. **Limitations on Participation:** Depending upon the number of persons in attendance seeking to be heard, the School Board reserves the right to impose such other limitations and restrictions as necessary in order to provide an orderly, efficient and fair opportunity for those present to be heard.

**OUT-OF STATE TRAVEL BY
SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS**

POLICY: 227

The purpose of this policy is to govern out-of state travel by School Board members as required by law.

Travel outside the state is appropriate when the School Board finds it proper for School Board members to acquire knowledge and information necessary to allow them to carry out their responsibilities as School Board members. Travel to regional or national meetings of the National School Boards Association is presumed to fulfill this purpose. Travel to other out-of-state meetings for which the member intends to seek reimbursement from the School District should be preapproved by the School Board.

Expenses to be reimbursed may include transportation, meals, lodging, registration fees, required materials, parking fees, tips, and other reasonable and necessary School District-related expenses.

Requests for reimbursement must be itemized on the official School District form and are to be submitted to the designated administrator. Receipts for lodging, commercial transportation, registration, and other reasonable and necessary expenses must be attached to the reimbursement form.

Automobile travel shall be reimbursed at the mileage rate set by the School Board. Commercial transportation shall reflect economy fares and shall be reimbursed only for the actual cost of the trip.

Amounts to be reimbursed shall be within the School Board's approved budget allocations, including attendance at workshops and conventions.

The Superintendent shall develop a schedule of reimbursement rates for School District business expenses, including those expenses requiring advance approval and specific rates of reimbursement.

This policy must be annually reviewed by the School Board.

 - c. Presentation of background information, reports or reviews as determined by agenda topics -- other District personnel or out-of-district personnel may be utilized for such presentations
 - d. Preparation of meeting summaries

POLICY ADOPTION AND AMENDMENT

**CRIMINAL OR CIVIL ACTION
AGAINST SCHOOL DISTRICT,
SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER,
EMPLOYEE OR STUDENT**

POLICY: 225

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidance as to the School District's position, rights, and responsibilities when a civil or criminal action is pending against the School District, or a School Board member, School District employee or student.

The School District recognizes that, when civil or criminal actions are pending against a School Board member, School District employee, or student, the School District may be requested or required to take action.

In responding to such requests and/or requirements, the School District will take such measures as are appropriate to its primary mission of providing for the education of students in an environment that is safe for staff and students and is conducive to learning.

The School District acknowledges its statutory obligations with respect to providing assistance to School Board members and teachers who are sued in connection with performance of School District duties. Collective bargaining agreements and School District policies may also apply.

REGULATIONS: 225-R

I. Civil Actions

A. Indemnification

The School District shall defend and indemnify any School Board member or School District employee for damages in school-related litigation, including punitive damages, claimed or levied against the School Board member or employee, provided that he or she was acting in the performance of the duties of the position and was not guilty of malfeasance, willful neglect of duty, or bad faith.

B. Legal Counsel

With respect to staff employed by the School District, upon written request of the staff member involved, the School District shall provide legal counsel for any staff member against whom a claim is made or action is brought for recovery of damages in any tort action involving physical injury to any person or property or for wrongful death arising out of or in connection with the employment of the staff member with the School District. The School District will choose legal counsel after consultation with the staff member.

C. Data Practices

Educational data and personnel data maintained by the School District may be sought as evidence in a civil proceeding. The School District will release the data only pursuant to the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, and to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, and related regulations. When an employee is subpoenaed and is expected to testify regarding educational data or personnel data, he or she is to inform the building administrator or designated supervisor, who shall immediately inform the Superintendent or designee. No School Board member or employee may release data without consultation in advance with the School District official who is designated as the authority responsible for the collection, use and dissemination of data;

D. Service of Subpoenas

It is the policy of the School District that its officers and employees will not be involved in providing service of process for third parties in the school setting.

E. Leave to Testify

Leave for employees appearing in court, either when sued or under subpoena to testify, will be considered in accordance with School District personnel policies and applicable collective bargaining agreements.

II. CRIMINAL CHARGES OR CONDUCT

A. Employees

The School District expects that its employees serve as positive role models for students. As role models for students, employees have a duty to conduct themselves in an exemplary manner.

If the School District receives information relating to activities of a criminal nature, by an employee, the School District will investigate and take appropriate disciplinary action, which may include discharge, subject to School District policies, statutes and provisions of applicable collective bargaining agreements.

Pursuant to Minnesota Statute, if reimbursement for a criminal defense is requested by a school district employee, the School Board may, after consulting with its legal counsel, reimburse the employee for any costs and reasonable attorney fees incurred by the employee to defend criminal charges brought against the employee arising out of the performance of duties for the school district. The decision as to whether to reimburse shall be made in the discretion of the School Board. A School Board member who is a witness or an alleged victim in the case may not vote on the reimbursement. If a quorum of the School Board is disqualified from voting on the reimbursement, the reimbursement must be approved by a judge of the district court.

B. Students

The School District has an interest in maintaining a safe and healthful environment and in preventing disruption of the educational process. In order to further that interest, the School District will take appropriate action regarding students convicted of crimes as it relates to the school environment.

C. Criminal Investigations

It is the policy of the School District to cooperate with law enforcement officials. The School District will make all efforts, however, to encourage law enforcement officials to question employees outside of school hours and off school premises unless there are extenuating circumstances or the matter being investigated is school-related, or as otherwise provided by law.

If such questioning at school is unavoidable, the School District will attempt to maintain confidentiality and to avoid embarrassment to the students and employees and to avoid disruption of the educational program. The Superintendent, principal, or other appropriate school official may be present

during the interview, except as otherwise required by law, or as otherwise determined in consultation with the parent or guardian.

D. Data Practices

The School District will release to law enforcement authorities educational and personnel data only in accordance with Minnesota Statute.

III. STATEMENTS WHEN LITIGATION IS PENDING

The School District recognizes that when a civil or criminal action is commenced or pending, parties to the lawsuit have particular duties in reference to persons involved or named in the lawsuit, as well as insurance carrier(s). Therefore, School Board members or School District employees shall make or release statements in that situation only in consultation with legal counsel.

I. OFFICER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

A. Chair.

1. The chair, when present, shall preside at all meetings of the School Board, countersign all orders upon the treasurer for claims allowed by the School Board, represent the School District in all actions and perform all duties a chair usually performs.
2. In case of absence, inability, or refusal of the clerk to draw orders for the payment of money authorized by a vote of the majority of the School Board to be paid, the chair may draw the orders, or the office of the clerk may be declared vacant by the chair and treasurer and filled by appointment.

B. Treasurer.

1. The treasurer shall deposit the funds of the School District in the official depository.
2. The treasurer shall make all reports which may be called for by the School Board and perform all duties a treasurer usually performs.
3. In the event there are insufficient funds on hand to pay valid orders presented to the treasurer, the treasurer shall receive, endorse, and process the orders in accordance with Minnesota Statute.

C. Clerk.

1. The clerk shall keep a record of all meetings in the books provided.
2. Within three days after an election, the clerk shall notify all persons elected of their election.
3. On or before August 15 of each year, the clerk shall:
 - a. file with the School Board a report of the revenues, expenditures and balances in each fund for the preceding fiscal year.
 - b. make and transmit to the Commissioner certified reports, showing:

- (1) condition and value of school property;
- (2) revenues and expenditures in detail, and such other financial information required by law, rule, or as may be called for by the Commissioner;
- (3) length of school term and enrollment and attendance by grades; and
- (4) other items of information as called for by the commissioner.

- 4. The clerk shall enter into the clerk's record book copies of all reports and of the teachers' term reports, and of the proceedings of any meeting, and keep an itemized account of all expenses of the School District.
- 5. The clerk shall furnish to the county auditor, on or before October 10, an attested copy of the clerk's record, showing the amount of money voted by the School District or the School Board for school purposes.
- 6. The clerk shall draw and sign all orders upon the treasurer for the payment of money for bills allowed by the School Board for salaries of officers and for teachers' wages and all claims, to be countersigned by the chair.
- 7. The clerk shall perform such duties as required by the Minnesota Election Law or other applicable laws relating to the conduct of elections.

D. Vice-Chair.

The vice-chair shall perform the duties of the chair in the event of the chair's temporary absence.

E. Superintendent.

- 1. The Superintendent shall be an ex officio, nonvoting member of the School Board.
- 2. The Superintendent shall perform the following:
 - a. visit and supervise the schools in the School District, report and make recommendations about their condition when advisable or on request by the School Board;
 - b. recommend to the School Board employment and dismissal of teachers;

- c. Superintend school grading practices and examinations for promotions;
- d. make reports required by the Commissioner; and
- e. perform other duties prescribed by the School Board.

OPEN SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS

POLICY: 209

Regular School Board meetings shall be held the second Monday of each month.

A majority of the voting members of the School Board shall constitute a quorum. No contract shall be made or authorized, except at a Regular meeting of the Board or at a Special meeting at which all members are present or of which all members have had notice.

Special meetings may be called by the Chair or Clerk or any three members upon notice mailed to each member at least three days prior thereto. For a special meeting, the School Board shall post written notice of the date, time, place and purpose of the meeting on the principal bulletin board located in the district office. The notice shall be mailed or otherwise delivered to each person who has filed a written request for notice of special meetings. The School Board's actions at a special meeting are limited to those topics included in the notice.

Emergency meetings are special meetings called because of circumstances that, in the judgement of the School Board, require immediate consideration. Posted or published notice of an emergency meeting shall not be required. However, the School Board shall make good faith efforts to provide notice of emergency meetings to each news medium that has filed a written request for notice. Emergency meeting notices shall include the subject of the meeting.

All Regular, ~~and~~ Special, and Emergency meetings and work sessions are open to the public.

CLOSED SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS

POLICY: 210

SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS FOR THE FOLLOWING SPECIFIED PURPOSES MAY OR MUST BE CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC AS DEFINED BY MINNESOTA STATUTE

Strategy for Labor Negotiations

Minnesota law specifies that the School Board may, by a majority vote in a public meeting, decide to hold a closed meeting to consider strategy for labor negotiations with organized bargaining units, including negotiation strategies or developments or discussion and review of labor negotiation proposals, conducted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes. The time of commencement and place of the closed meeting shall be announced at the public meeting. A written roll of members and all other persons present at the closed meeting shall be made available to the public after the closed meeting. The proceedings of a closed meeting to discuss negotiation strategies shall be tape recorded at the expense of the governing body and shall be preserved by it for two years after the contract is signed and shall be made available to the public after all labor contracts are signed by the governing body for the current budget period.

Sessions Closed by Bureau of Mediation Services

All negotiations, mediation sessions, and hearings between the School Board and its employees or their representatives are public meetings except when otherwise provided by the Commissioner of the Bureau of Mediation Services.

Preliminary Consideration of Charges

The School Board shall close one or more meetings for preliminary consideration of allegations or charges against an individual subject to its authority. If the School Board members conclude that discipline of any nature may be warranted as a result of those specific charges or allegations, further meetings or hearings relating to those specific charges or allegations held after that conclusion is reached must be open. A meeting must also be open at the request of the individual who is the subject of the meeting.

Performance Evaluations

The School Board may close a meeting to evaluate the performance of an individual who is subject to its authority. The School Board shall identify the individual to be evaluated prior to closing a meeting. At its next open meeting, the School Board shall summarize its conclusions regarding the evaluation. A meeting must be open at the request of the individual who is the subject of the meeting.

Attorney-Client Meeting

A meeting may be closed if permitted by the attorney-client privilege. Attorney-client privilege applies when litigation is imminent or threatened, or when the School Board needs advice above the level of general legal advice, i.e., regarding specific acts and their legal consequences.

Dismissal Hearing

A hearing on the dismissal of a licensed teacher shall be public or private at the teacher's discretion. A hearing regarding placement of teachers on unrequested leave of absence shall be public.

A hearing on dismissal of a student pursuant to the Pupil Fair Dismissal Act shall be closed unless the pupil, parent or guardian requests an open hearing.

Coaches; Opportunity to Respond

If the School Board has declined to renew the coaching contract of a licensed or nonlicensed head varsity coach, it must notify the coach within 14 days of the decision. If the coach requests the reasons for nonrenewal, the School Board must give the coach the reasons in writing within 10 days of receiving the request. On the request of the coach, the School Board must provide the coach with a reasonable opportunity to respond to the reasons at a School Board meeting. The meeting may be open or closed at the election of the coach, unless the meeting is closed as required by Minnesota Statute to discuss educational or certain other nonpublic data.

Meetings to Discuss Certain "Not Public Data"

Any portion of a meeting must be closed if the following types of data are discussed:

Data that would identify alleged victims or reporters of criminal sexual conduct, domestic abuse, or maltreatment of minors or vulnerable adults;

Active investigative data collected or created by a law enforcement agency; or

Educational data, health data, medical data, welfare data, or mental health data that are not public data.

Purchase and Sale of Property

The School Board may close a meeting to determine the asking price for real or personal property to be sold to the School District; to review confidential or nonpublic appraisal data; and to develop offers or counteroffers for the purchase or sale of real or personal property.

Before closing the meeting, the School Board must identify on the record the particular real or personal property that is the subject of the closed meeting. The closed meeting must be tape recorded at the expense of the School District. The tape must be preserved for eight (8) years after the date of the meeting and be made available to the public after all real or personal property discussed at

the meeting has been purchased or sold or the School Board has abandoned the purchase or sale. The real or personal property that is the subject of the closed meeting must be specifically identified in the tape. A list of School Board members and all other persons present at the closed meeting must be made available to the public after the closed meeting.

An agreement reached that is based on an offer considered at a closed meeting is contingent on its approval by the School Board at an open meeting. The actual purchase or sale must be approved at an open meeting and the purchase price or sale price is public data.

Security Matters

The School Board may close a meeting to receive security briefings and reports to discuss issues related to security systems, to discuss emergency response procedures and to discuss security deficiencies in or recommendations regarding public services, infrastructure, and facilities if disclosure of the information discussed would pose a danger to public safety or compromise security procedures or responses.

Financial issues related to security matters must be discussed and all related financial decisions must be made at an open meeting.

Before closing a meeting, the School Board must refer to the facilities, systems, procedures, services, or infrastructures to be considered during the closed meeting. The closed meeting must be tape recorded at the expense of the School district and the recording must be preserved for at least four (4) years.

Other Meetings

Other meetings shall be closed as provided by law.

Procedures for Closing a Meeting

The School Board shall provide notice of a closed meeting just as for an open meeting. A School Board meeting may be closed only after a majority vote at a public meeting. Before closing a meeting, the School Board shall state on the record the specific authority permitting the meeting to be closed and shall describe the subject to be discussed.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN SCHOOL
BOARD MEETINGS AND WORK
SESSIONS**

POLICY: 212

The School Board recognizes the value of participation by the public in deliberations and decisions on School District matters. At the same time, the School Board recognizes the importance of conducting orderly and efficient proceedings, with opportunity for expression of all participants' respective views.

The purpose of this policy is to assure open and orderly public discussion as well as to protect the due process and privacy rights of individuals under the law.

It is the policy of the School Board to encourage discussion by citizens of subjects related to the management of the School District at School Board meetings and work sessions. The School Board may adopt reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions on public expression in order to facilitate free discussion by all interested parties.

The School Board shall, as a matter of policy, protect the legal rights to privacy and due process of employees and students.

All citizens, including students, of the School District have a right to an opportunity to be heard by the School Board, within the limits of the law and this policy and subject to reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions. Among the rights available to the public is the right to access public data as provided by Minnesota Statutes.

School District employees and School District students have a legal right to privacy related to matters which may come before the School Board as provided by Minnesota Law.

The School Board may decide to hold certain types of public meetings where the public will not be invited to address the School Board. Possible examples are work sessions and Board retreats. The public is entitled to notice of these meetings and will be allowed to attend these meetings, but the public will not be allotted time during the meeting to address the Board.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN SCHOOL
BOARD MEETINGS**

REGULATIONS: 212-R

The following procedures will be utilized to facilitate public participation in regular School Board meetings. The School Board will provide a specified period of time at the Board's regular monthly meeting where citizens may address the School Board on any topic, subject to the limitations of Policy 211. The School Board reserves the right to allocate a specific period of time for this purpose and limit time for speakers accordingly.

1. Citizens who wish to have a subject discussed at a public School Board meeting are encouraged to notify the Superintendent's office in advance of the School Board meeting. The citizen should provide his or her name, address, the name of group represented (if any), and the subject to be covered or the issue to be addressed.
2. Citizens who wish to address the School Board on a particular subject should identify the subject and identify agenda item(s) to which their comments pertain.
3. The School Board Chair will recognize one speaker at a time, and will rule out of order other speakers who are not recognized. Only those speakers recognized by the Chair are allowed to speak. Comments by others are out of order. Individuals who interfere with or interrupt speakers, the School Board, or the proceedings may be directed to leave.
4. The School Board retains the discretion to limit discussion of any agenda item to a reasonable period of time as determined by the School Board. If a group or organization wishes to address the School Board on a topic, the School Board reserves the right to require designation of one or more representatives or spokespersons to speak on behalf of the group or organization.
5. Matters proposed for placement on the agenda which may involve data privacy concerns, which may involve preliminary allegations, or which may be potentially libelous or slanderous in nature shall not be considered in public, but shall be processed as determined by the School Board in accordance with governing law.
6. The School Board Chair shall promptly rule out of order any discussion by any person, including School Board members, that would violate the provisions of state or federal law, this policy or the statutory rights of privacy of an individual.

7. Personal attacks by anyone addressing the School Board are unacceptable. Persistence in such remarks by an individual shall terminate that person's privilege to address the School Board.
8. Depending upon the number of persons in attendance seeking to be heard, the School Board reserves the right to impose such other limitations and restrictions as necessary in order to provide an orderly, efficient and fair opportunity for those present to be heard.

Final Budget Adjustments

2007-2008

Overview

The attached spreadsheet shows the budget adjustments for the 2007-2008 fiscal year. The general fund budget situation is stable. The significant changes for this January, 2008 adjustment are:

- General fund revenue is \$1,105,789 higher than was the case in the preliminary budget. Integration revenue, general education revenue due to increased numbers of pupils, and the Hennepin County Highway 101 easement payment are the primary reasons for this increase.
- General fund expenditures are increased by \$2,343,755. Much of this is the \$1,643,026 budgeted for school site carryover. The money to pay the carryover amounts is held in designated reserve accounts in the general fund.

The specific changes are as follows:

Revenue

Integration Revenue—Integration revenue increased by \$418,372. Because of the demographic characteristics of the district, we now are eligible for integration revenue of \$129 per pupil unit, increased from \$92. The expenditure budget includes an equal amount.

Special Education Aid—A special education teacher was added at Gleason Lake Elementary. This salary expenditure will result in additional state special education aid of \$16,968.

Additional Career and Tech Levy—This levy component was changed after the budget was established last June. The additional revenue amount is \$4,654.

Oakwood Easement—The payment from Hennepin County for the roadway easement at Oakwood was \$193,500. By law this money must be used for capital improvements, so it will be placed in the operating capital reserve account for future expenditure.

EMS and CMS Anti-Bullying Grant—These grant amounts of \$3,500 each are actually unspent balances from FY07.

Deferred Revenue—The deferred revenue items are unspent grant amounts carried forward from the previous year, totaling \$140,487. There is also a deferred revenue amount of \$1,780 in the food service fund.

Additional Perkins Funds—Perkins funds are federal funds for career technical education. This \$8,548 is an increase in the federal grant amount over the amount originally budgeted.

High School Physical Education Activity—This amount of \$11,820 is fee revenue collected from students for off-campus physical education activities, such as bowling. This is 20% of the total cost of rentals. We have included the remaining 80% in the district's lease levy for next year.

General Education Aid—The preliminary budget was based on a projection of 11,483 pupil units. Based on October 1 enrollments, we now expect this number to be 11,543. This means an increase in basic aid of \$304,440.

Expenditures

Many expenditure items, such as grant expenditures, are equal to revenue amounts shown above. Other budget additions are as follows:

After School Programs at YMCA, and Mentor Program with Bloomington and Eden Prairie—These budget items were unintentionally omitted from the preliminary budget.

October 1 Building Allocations—Each year building allocations are adjusted to reflect actual enrollments as of October 1. The total adjustment is \$7,556.

Carryover—Carryover balances for building staff development, compensatory revenue, building allocations, field trips and schools' beverage revenues are carried over for expenditure.

High School Physical Education Lease Levy—As noted above, the district included 80% of the rental fees for off-campus physical education classes in its lease levy for the first time in the payable 2008 levy. However, the revenue will not be received and recognized until the 2008-09 school year. This budget allocation amount allows us to implement a fee reduction for students this year.

Legislative Action Committee – 2008 Platform

(DRAFT – December 20, 2007)

The School Board of Wayzata Public Schools and its Legislative Action Committee (LAC) has established the following legislative priorities for the 2008 session:

Appropriate and Stable Investment in Education

The financial issues that affect school districts are multi-faceted, complex and interrelated. School funding must be considered from a systemic perspective to achieve an appropriate and stable investment in education. In order to provide school districts with this level of funding and to improve the ability of local school boards to plan for future years, we recommend that the Minnesota Legislature:

- Increases the basic funding formula by at least an additional two percent for the 2008-2009 school year to avoid funding shortfalls.
- After taking significant steps to provide additional funding for special education, continues this direction by fully funding the state special education formula.
- Revises the current education funding formula to provide resources necessary to allow school districts to meet high academic standards. The first priority in revising the formula should be to implement and fund a location equity index to recognize market-based labor cost differentials.
- Includes an inflation factor on funding for the alternative compensation program.

More Reliance on Local Decision Making

Although all schools share the common goal of providing their students the best education possible, school districts vary greatly in many other aspects including size, number of schools, labor and transportation costs, and level of parent involvement. Given these differences, Wayzata Public Schools believes that local school boards should be given the discretion and flexibility to make decisions that are best for their district. In order to allow for local decision making and flexibility, we recommend that the Minnesota Legislature:

- Supports any legislation that allows districts to spend financial resources on areas that best meet local needs.
- Supports any legislation that would reduce or eliminate mandated reports and other requirements that create “busy work” for school districts and distract from the overall mission of a district.
- Opposes any legislation that would mandate all school districts to participate in a statewide health insurance pool.

School Readiness

Having all children ready to start school has long been a priority for Wayzata Public Schools. There is little disagreement among educators and parents that investing in school readiness programs has a strong payoff. School districts already have several programs that address early learners, but certainly more are needed. Early childhood programs, preschool offerings, targeted school readiness programs for at-risk students and optional all-day, every-day kindergarten are just some of the possible programs to improve school readiness of children. We recommend that the Minnesota Legislature:

- Provides additional funding to allow districts to provide enhanced programs and services to preschool children and their families.
- Allows flexibility to school districts in using funds designated for school readiness programs to meet local needs rather than mandating specific programs for all districts. The priority for Wayzata Public Schools is to emphasize programs that prepare pre-kindergarten children who are most in need of school readiness.
- Supports full state funding for voluntary all-day, every-day kindergarten. Wayzata Public Schools does not support further incremental movement toward full funding of all-day, every-day kindergarten. The incremental approach is problematic for districts like Wayzata that have to construct and operate additional classrooms to implement an all-day, every-day kindergarten program.
