The following is a summary of our audit work, key conclusions, and other information that we consider important or that is required to be communicated to the School Board, administration, or those charged with governance of Independent School District No. 284 (the District) in conjunction with our Single Audit of the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards (SEFA) for the year ended June 30, 2025.

OUR RESPONSIBILITY UNDER AUDITING STANDARDS GENERALLY ACCEPTED IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, *GOVERNMENT AUDITING STANDARDS*, AND TITLE 2 U.S. CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS PART 200, *UNIFORM ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS, COST PRINCIPLES, AND AUDIT REQUIREMENTS FOR FEDERAL AWARDS* (UNIFORM GUIDANCE)

We have audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the District as of and for the year ended June 30, 2025, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the District's basic financial statements. We issued our report thereon dated November 20, 2025, which contained unmodified opinions on those financial statements. Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, *Government Auditing Standards*, and the Uniform Guidance, as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our Single Audit of the District's SEFA for the year ended June 30, 2025. We have communicated such information to you verbally and in our audit engagement letter. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

PLANNED SCOPE AND TIMING OF THE SINGLE AUDIT

We performed the Single Audit according to the planned scope previously discussed and coordinated to obtain sufficient audit evidence. Completion of the Single Audit was later than originally planned due to a delay in the issuance of the 2025 *Compliance Supplement* by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB).

AUDIT OPINION AND FINDINGS

Based on our audit of the District's SEFA for the year ended June 30, 2025:

- We reported that the SEFA is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements.
- The results of our tests indicate that the District has complied, in all material respects, with the types of compliance requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal programs.
- We reported no deficiencies in the District's internal controls over compliance that we considered to be material weaknesses with the types of compliance requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal programs.

OTHER OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS – UNIFORM GUIDANCE REVISIONS

In April 2024, the OMB issued the 2024 revised Uniform Guidance, aiming to streamline grant management and reduce grantor agency and recipient burden. The revised guidance is effective for new federal grant entitlements awarded on or after October 1, 2024. Recipients and subrecipients will need to determine the relevant Uniform Guidance criteria based on the award date. Districts may have grants awarded under the previous Uniform Guidance and others awarded under the revised Uniform Guidance in the same fiscal year, and will need to work with grantor or pass-through agencies to ensure each award is in compliance with the applicable requirements.

The revision includes a number of significant changes to the federal Single Audit process, including: an increase in dollar threshold for requiring a Single Audit from \$750,000 to \$1,000,000; changes to the thresholds and process used for determining major programs; an increase in the threshold for the disposition of equipment and remitting unused supplies from \$5,000 to \$10,000; and an increase in the de minimis cost rate from 10 percent to 15 percent. Key changes to written policy requirements for recipients include enhancement of cybersecurity controls, inclusion of veteran-owned businesses to the group of entities for procurement preference, and a broadened scope for reporting of mandatory disclosures. The revised audit requirements will be effective for fiscal year 2026 district audits.

MANAGEMENT REPRESENTATIONS

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated March 2, 2026.

OTHER MATTERS

We were engaged to report on the separately issued SEFA, which is not required supplementary information. With respect to this supplementary information, we made certain inquiries of management and evaluated the form, content, and methods of preparing the information to determine that the information complies with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the method of preparing it has not changed from the prior period, and the information is appropriate and complete in relation to our audit of the financial statements. We compared and reconciled the supplementary information to the underlying accounting records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves.

PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

The purpose of this report is solely to provide those charged with governance of the District, management, and those with responsibility for oversight of the District's financial reporting process comments resulting from our audit. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

We have audited Independent School District No. 284's (the District) compliance with the types of compliance requirements identified as subject to audit in the U.S. Office of Management and Budget *Compliance Supplement* that could have a direct and material effect on each of the District's major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2025. The District's major federal programs are identified in the Summary of Audit Results section of the accompanying Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs.

In our opinion, the District complied, in all material respects, with the compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major programs for the year ended June 30, 2025.

BASIS FOR OPINION ON EACH MAJOR FEDERAL PROGRAM

We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and the audit requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance). Our responsibilities under those standards and the Uniform Guidance are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of Compliance section of our report.

We are required to be independent of the District and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal program. Our audit does not provide a legal determination of the District's compliance requirements referred to above.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF MANAGEMENT FOR COMPLIANCE

Management is responsible for compliance with the requirements referred to on the previous page and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of effective internal control over compliance with the requirements of laws, statutes, regulations, rules, and provisions of contracts or grant agreements applicable to the District's federal programs.

AUDITOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES FOR THE AUDIT OF COMPLIANCE

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether material noncompliance with the compliance requirements referred to on the previous page occurred, whether due to fraud or error, and express an opinion on the District's compliance based on our audit. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and, therefore, is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, *Government Auditing Standards*, and the Uniform Guidance will always detect material noncompliance when it exists. The risk of not detecting material noncompliance resulting from fraud is higher than for that resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Noncompliance with the compliance requirements referred to on the previous page is considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, it would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user of the report on compliance about the District's compliance with the requirements of each major federal program as a whole.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, *Government Auditing Standards*, and the Uniform Guidance, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material noncompliance, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the District's compliance with the compliance requirements referred to on the previous page and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.
- Obtain an understanding of the District's internal control over compliance relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with the Uniform Guidance, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the District's internal control over compliance. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

We have not performed any auditing procedures with respect to the District's basic financial statements subsequent to the date of our report on those financial statements. Our audit was performed for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the basic financial statements. The accompanying Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by the Uniform Guidance and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

101 SCHOOL DISTRICT LEGAL STATUS

I. PURPOSE

A primary principle of this nation is that the public welfare demands an educated and informed citizenry. The power to provide for public education is a state function vested in the state legislature and delegated to local school districts. The purpose of this policy is to clarify the legal status of the school district.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

- A. The school district is a public corporation subject to the control of the legislature, limited only by constitutional restrictions. The school district has been created for educational purposes.
- B. The legislature has authority to prescribe the school district's powers and privileges, its boundaries and territorial jurisdictions.
- C. The school district has only the powers conferred on it by the legislature; however, the school district's authority to govern, manage, and control the school district, includes implied powers in addition to any specific powers granted by the legislature.
- D. Pursuant to statute, the official name of the School District is Independent School District No. 284 also referred to as Wayzata School District / Wayzata Public Schools.

101-R SCHOOL DISTRICT LEGAL STATUS - REGULATIONS

I. RELATIONSHIP TO OTHER ENTITIES

- A. The school district is a separate legal entity.
- B. The school district is coordinate with and not subordinate to the county(ies) in which it is situated.
- C. The school district is not subservient to municipalities within its territory.

II. POWERS AND AUTHORITY OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT

A. Funds

- 1. The school district, through its school board, has authority to raise funds for the operation and maintenance of its schools, and authority to manage and expend such funds, subject to applicable law.
- 2. The school district has wide discretion over the expenditure of funds under its control for public purposes, subject to the limitations provided by law.
- 3. School district officials occupy a fiduciary position in the management and expenditure of funds entrusted to them.

B. Raising Funds

- 1. The school district shall, within the limitations specified by law, provide by levy of tax necessary funds for the conduct of schools, payment of indebtedness, and all proper expenses.
- 2. The school district may issue bonds in accordance with the provisions of Minn. Stat. Ch. 475, or other applicable law.
- 3. The school district has authority to accept gifts and donations for school purposes, subject to applicable law.

C. Property

- 1. The school district may acquire property for school purposes. It may sell, exchange, or otherwise dispose of property which is no longer needed for school purposes, subject to applicable law.
- 2. The school district shall manage its property in a manner consistent with the educational functions of the district.

3. The school district may permit the use of its facilities for community purposes which are not inconsistent with, nor disruptive of, its educational mission.
4. School district officials hold school property as trustees for the use and benefit of students, taxpayers and the community.

D. Contracts

1. The school district is empowered to enter into contracts in the manner provided by law.
2. The school district has authority to enter into installment purchases and leases with an option to purchase, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 465.71 or other applicable law.
3. The school district has authority to make contracts with other governmental agencies and units for the purchase, lease or other acquisition of equipment, supplies, materials, or other property, including real property.
4. The school district has authority to enter into employment contracts. As a public employer, the school district, through its designated representatives, shall meet and negotiate with public employees in an appropriate bargaining unit and enter into written collective bargaining agreements with such employees, subject to applicable law.

E. Textbooks, Educational Materials, and Studies

1. The school district, through its school board and administrators, has the authority to determine what textbooks, educational materials, and studies should be pursued.
2. The school district shall establish and apply the school curriculum.

F. Actions and Suits

1. The school district has authority to sue and to be sued.

Statement of Revenues Analysis

This analysis reflects revenue received by the month end noted above. These numbers are only representative of the first seven fiscal months of the FY 2025-26. State Aid revenues are right in line with prior years. Property Taxes are also in line with expectations for this time of year. Deviations in revenue from prior years include Federal Aids and Miscellaneous Local Revenue which can vary year to year and are also impacted by FY25 accrued revenues as draws are completed. As a reminder, Federal funds are drawn after the expenditures take place which can happen after the fiscal year closes. The district still had a very small portion of CARES Act dollars to spend down by 9/30/2024 and draw by December 2024. The Food Service and Community Education revenue is also in line with expectations for this time of year.

Statement of Expenditures Analysis

This analysis reflects actual expenditures and does not include outstanding encumbrances along with representing the first seven fiscal month of the FY 2025-26. Overall expenditures are relatively similar to prior years. Salaries are right in line with prior years shown and benefits are slightly up from prior years percentages but still in line with expectations and budget planning. As is usually always the case, variations compared to prior years are primarily driven by the timing of payments, timing of projects, timing of purchases of supplies, materials, and capital expenditures along with the timing of payments for purchased services. The Food Service fund expenditures are down slightly due to larger projects at the High School being budgeted for but not completed at this time. Community Education is right in line with expectations. The district also revises the budget at least one more time, typically around February or March.

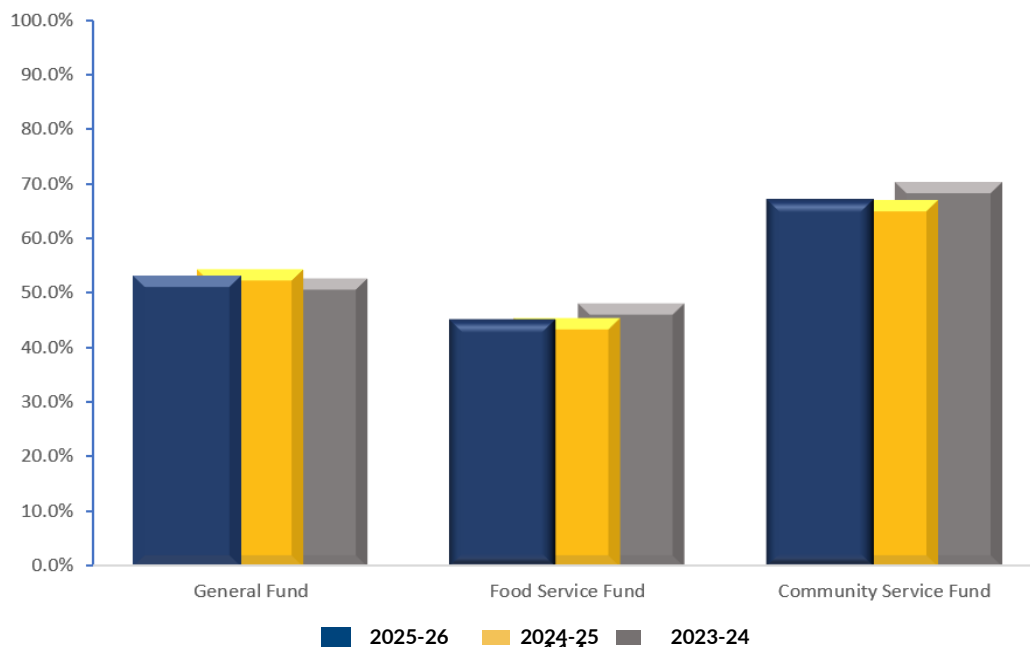

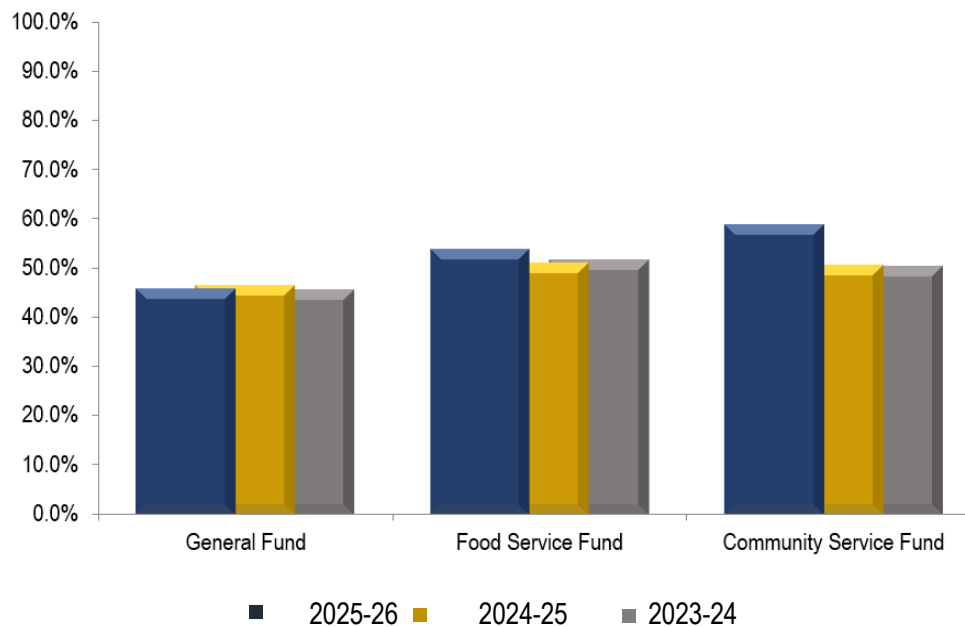
