As per SB2124 (effective 2024-2025):

Any 5th grader that scored **top 40% (or MEETS)** on **5th math STAAR test** is automatically enrolled in advanced math pathway where the goal is to take Algebra in 8th grade (*provided they continue scoring MEETS on STAAR*).

In 7th grade, students that are on this **Accelerated Track** take 8th grade math as 7th graders.

Only students that scored Approaches (or did not pass) on the 6th math STAAR test take 7th math STAAR.
