Executive Summary:

Our Garland ISD visual arts students participate in TEAM, Junior VASE, and VASE as part of maintaining our recognition as a Texas Art Educators Association District of Distinction. This is our 4th year to receive this honor.

This year several of our elementary art students competed at the Texas Elementary Art Meet. Over 7,260 entries were submitted across the state and 568 of these were awarded the Top of TEAM. 3 of these entries come from our very own GISD. Those students are **Evelyn Do** and **Dan Thai** from Hickman Elementary and **Alan Lainez** from Rowlett Elementary.

At the middle school level, 15,582 works were adjudicated statewide for Junior VASE. 1,152 were awarded Platinum medals. Eight of those platinum medals come from GISD students.

All seven of our high schools competed at the TAEA regional VASE competition. Students from 5 of the 7 high schools advanced to the state level. Of these 2,152 works that advanced to state, only 150 were awarded Gold Seals in the State!

Executive Summary:

The top priority of Garland ISD and the State of Texas is keeping students and staff safe every day. The Texas School Safety Center recently conducted an Intruder Detection Audit at one or more of our campuses. The audits test whether a campus is accessible to an unauthorized individual. This audit seeks to help districts identify how campuses can improve safety for students, such as ensuring exterior doors are locked. The audit provides us with an opportunity to create a safer learning environment for our students and staff.

We are working closely with our district's School Safety & Security Committee to ensure that we are training all our staff and securing our doors for the protection of everyone at our campuses. The support from the state in conducting the Intruder Detection Audits is just one of the many actions we are taking to ensure our schools are safe. We know that this work does not end, and we appreciate the Board's support.

We acknowledge that parents and community members are likely very interested in the details of the audit results; however, it is in the best interest of the students that we do not share this information to the broader public as it could lead to compromising important campus security information. Specific details of the Intruder Detection Audit will be discussed in the executive session and with the Safety and Security Committee. Garland ISD is committed to providing a safe and secure learning environment for our students and staff.

Attached are lists of delinquent taxes we recommend be removed from the delinquent tax roll as required by the Texas Property Tax Code §33.05(c)(1) and (2) and mobile home and business personal property accounts we have determined to be uncollectible and are beyond the statute of limitations and recommend be removed from the delinquent tax roll.

Exhibit A contains the accounts that should be removed from the tax roll pursuant to §33.05 (c)(1) of the Texas Property Tax Code. This provision of the Code provides that a tax on real property that has been delinquent for more than 20 years shall be removed from the delinquent tax roll. This includes the 2005 and prior tax years. The total amount of base taxes for this list is \$40,329.11.

Exhibit B contains the delinquent taxes that we recommend be removed from the delinquent tax roll that we have determined to be uncollectible and are beyond the statute of limitations. RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REMOVAL OF TAXES FROM THE DELINQUENT TAX ROLL PURSUANT TO SECTION 33.05(c)(1) AND (2) OF THE TEXAS PROPERTY TAX CODE

WHEREAS, Texas Property Tax Code §33.05(c)(1) provides for the removal of real property taxes that have been delinquent for more than 20 years from the delinquent tax roll, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that certain business personal property tax accounts have been determined to be uncollectible and should be removed from the delinquent tax roll.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE GARLAND INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, GARLAND, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. The Garland Independent School District does hereby provide specific authorization to the Director of Taxation to remove these taxes from its delinquent tax roll.

Section 2. This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage in accordance with the provisions of the law.

That, **Garland Independent School District**, hereinafter called "Grantor," whether one or more, for and in consideration of Ten and NO/100 Dollars (\$10.00) and other valuable consideration to Grantor in hand paid by **Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC, a Delaware limited liability company**, 1616 Woodall Rodgers Freeway, Dallas, Texas 75202-1234, hereinafter referred to as "Company," has granted, sold and conveyed and by these presents does grant, sell and convey unto said Company, its successors and assigns, an aerial easement and right-of-way for overhead electric power and communications lines, each consisting of variable number of wires and cables over and across all that certain tract(s) of land located in Dallas County, Texas, more particularly described as follows:

SEE EXHIBIT "A" (ATTACHED)

Grantor recognizes that the general course of said lines or the metes and bounds description as above described, is based on preliminary surveys only, and Grantor hereby agrees that the easement and right-of-way and its general dimensions hereby granted shall apply to the actual location of said overhead lines when constructed.

Together with the right of ingress and egress over and along the easement and right-of-way and over Grantor's adjacent lands to or from the easement and right-of-way, for the purpose of and with the right to construct, operate, improve, reconstruct, repair, inspect, patrol, maintain and remove such overhead electric power and communications lines as the Company may from time to time find necessary, convenient or desirable, the right to relocate its facilities along the same general direction of said lines, the right to relocate said lines in the same relative position to any adjacent road if and as such road is widened in the future, the right to trim and cut down trees and shrubbery on the easement and right-of-way and Grantor's land adjacent thereto, to the extent, in the sole judgment of the Company, necessary to prevent possible interference with the operation of said overhead lines or to remove possible hazard thereto, and the right to remove or prevent the construction on the easement and right-of-way of any or all buildings, structures and obstructions.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This memorandum of understanding (“MOU”) is entered into by **Midwestern State University**, a public institution of higher education located in the State of Texas and **Garland ISD** (“Agency”) located at 501 S. Jupiter Rd., Garland, Texas 75042. MSU and Agency may be referred to throughout individually as a “Party” or collectively as the “Parties”.

Agreement

Now therefore, for the consideration herein expressed, MSU and Agency hereby agree as follows:

Article 1 MSU Responsibilities

Supervised Fieldwork Experience. The administrators of the University have established an approved professional program which has been accredited by Texas Education Agency (TEA) and the Council for Accreditation for Educator Preparation (CAEP). The primary objective of field instruction is for students to continue the integration of knowledge, skill, and self-awareness under university supervision toward the goal of competence at the level of a beginning teacher. It is the desire of the University to utilize resources of the Agency for students admitted to the WCOE Teacher Preparation Program of the University. The Agency has such facilities and is desirous of cooperating with the University in making them available for educational purposes.

- 1.1 The University will provide the Agency with current information on dates of practicum assignments, hours of work and the nature of educational assignments necessary for each student.
- 1.2 The University will designate a University Field Supervisor to work with the Agency in developing student assignments and training activities, assisting with student evaluation and resolving disputes as may arise.
- 1.3 The University will confer with the Agency prior to the placement of any student in order to establish or to review the purpose, provisions and responsibilities involved in the practicum experience.
- 1.4 The University is responsible for monitoring the learning experiences of the student.
- 1.5 The University, at the request of the Agency, will withdraw any student who, after negotiation and conciliation, is unsuitable in terms of adherence to the Agency’s policies and procedures.
- 1.6 The University acknowledges the cooperative nature of the teacher preparation program and solicits professional consultation in relevant aspects of the field program.

Article 2 Agency Responsibilities

- 2.1 The Agency will designate one or more staff person(s) with a valid educational license, three or more years of educational experience, and an accomplished educator as indicated by student learning and performance evaluations to instruct and to supervise the student(s) and to be available for such consultation as required by the University to insure student learning.
- 2.2 The Agency will provide adequate time for the University Field Supervisor to hold individual conferences with the student for at least four times a semester.
- 2.3 The Agency will be responsible for the actual supervision and control of the student's activities within the Agency.
- 2.4 The Agency will supply office supplies, telephone facilities and office arrangements which enable the student to function effectively. There will be adequate provision for safeguarding confidential materials, such as case materials, and student records.

- 2.5 The Agency will provide student with a variety of learning experiences, such as orientation to the Agency, direct teaching experience, professional learning communities, and experiences with the organizational function of the Agency.
- 2.6 The Agency will communicate immediately with the University Field Supervisor, any concern regarding the student's performance/learning.
- 2.7 The Agency will provide adequate time for the cooperating mentor teacher to submit evaluation reports which adequately describe the student's learning in the field.
- 2.8 The Agency will consult with the University Field Supervisor immediately if specific circumstances arise, which require the Agency to ask that the student be withdrawn from the placement during the school year.
- 2.9 The Agency will make time available to cooperating mentor teachers to participate in the orientation conducted by the University.
- 2.10 The Agency agrees to provide access to the University and supply each student with all Agency policies, rules, and regulations which are pertinent to the student's role.

Article 3 Student Responsibilities

- 3.1 The student will follow Agency and University policies, procedures, programs and operating standards. Examples are rules for hours of Agency operation and necessary absences.
- 3.2 The student will be under the actual control and supervision of the Agency during participation in field activities.
- 3.3 The student will complete all required documentation, such as time logs, MISL, lesson plans, and observation reflections required by the teacher preparation program and the University Field Supervisor.
- 3.4 The student will prepare for and participate in regular evaluation conferences.
- 3.5 The student has the responsibility to act professionally and ethically, to maintain confidentiality, and to give priority to student's learning and wellbeing.
- 3.6 The student is required to obtain malpractice liability insurance, since this will not be provided by the Agency or the University. If the Agency has health requirements, the student is expected to meet the requirements of the Agency.
- 3.7 The student is not an employee and is not entitled to financial remuneration during the placement unless otherwise arranged for with the Agency and University such as in the case of an educational aide.
- 3.8 (2.9) The student will follow the Agency's calendar and schedule.

Article 4 Terms

- 4.1 This agreement shall be effective upon signature by the parties concerned and shall be ongoing and automatically renewed each year unless terminated by either institution by written notification. Either party may terminate the agreement by providing notification in writing with at least 90 days' notice of the intent to end the agreement. If such notice is given, this agreement shall terminate: (a) at the end of the 90 days; or (b) when all students enrolled in the program at the time such notice is given have completed their respective courses of study under the program, whichever event occurs last.

Article 5 General Provisions

5.1 **Event Venue.** MSU shall provide an online venue for the Supervised Fieldwork Experience through MSU's eLearning programs.

5.2 **No Warranty.** MSU makes no warranties or representations concerning the subject matter or content of or materials for the Supervised Fieldwork Experience. The Supervised Fieldwork Experiences are general education only and are not the provision of medical advice.

5.3 **Governing Law; Venue. Intentionally deleted.**

5.4 **Dispute Resolution.** The Parties will utilize the dispute resolution process provided for in Texas Government Code 2260 ("Chapter 2260") and the related rules adopted by the AG pursuant to Chapter 2260 will be used by Agency to attempt to resolve any claim for breach of contract made by Agency that cannot be resolved in the ordinary course of business for all disputes arising from this MOU. Neither the execution of this MOU by MSU nor any other conduct of any representative of MSU relating to the MOU will be considered a waiver of MSU's sovereign immunity to suit.

5.5 **Limitation of MSU's Liability. It is understood and agreed that MSU will not be liable for any negligent or wrongful acts, either of commission or omission, chargeable to it unless such liability is imposed by Texas law and that this MOU shall not be construed as seeking to either enlarge or diminish any obligation or duty owed by MSU to Agency or to any third party.**

5.6 **Independent Agency.** MSU represents and warrants that it is an independent Agency with no authority to contract for Agency or in any way to bind or to commit Agency to any agreement of any kind or to assume any liabilities of any nature in the name of or on behalf of Agency. Under no circumstances will MSU, or any of its staff, if any, hold out as or be considered an agent, employee, joint venture, or partner of Agency.

5.7 **Force Majeure.** "Event of Force Majeure" means an event beyond the control of Agency or MSU which prevents or makes a Party's compliance with any of its obligations under the MOU illegal or impracticable, including but not limited to: act of God (including, without limitation, fire, explosion, earthquake, tornado, drought, and flood); war, act or threats of terrorism, hostilities (whether or not war be declared), invasion, act of enemies, mobilization, requisition, or embargo; rebellion, insurrection, military or usurped power, or civil war; contamination or destruction from any nuclear, chemical, or biological event; riot, commotion, strikes, go slows, lock outs, or disorder; epidemic, pandemic, viral outbreak, or health crisis; or directive of governmental authority. No Party will be considered in breach of the MOU to the extent that performance of their respective obligations is prevented or made illegal or impracticable by an Event of Force Majeure that arises during the term (or after execution of the MOU but prior to the beginning of the term). A Party asserting an Event of Force Majeure hereunder ("Affected Party") will give reasonable notice to the other Party of an Event of Force Majeure upon it being foreseen by, or becoming known to, Affected Party. In the event of an Event of Force Majeure, the Affected Party will endeavor to continue to perform its obligations under the MOU only so far as reasonably practicable.

5.8 **Entire Agreement; Amendments.** This MOU supersedes all prior agreements, written or oral, between Agency and MSU and will constitute the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. This MOU and each of its provisions will be binding upon the Parties and may not be waived, modified, amended or altered except in writing signed by MSU and Agency.

Publicity and Marks. Agency agrees that it will not publicize this MOU or disclose, confirm, or deny any details of this MOU to third parties, or use MSU's name or protected marks without MSU's prior express written approval.

5.9 **Assignment.** Neither this MOU, nor any rights or obligations of monies due hereunder are assignable or transferable (as security for advances or otherwise) unless MSU agrees in writing. Agency will not assign or sub award any portion of a MOU without MSU's prior written approval, which will not be unreasonably withheld. MSU will not recognize any assignment or sub agreement made without MSU's prior written approval, and any such assignment by Agency will be wholly void and ineffective for all purposes unless made in conformity with this section.

5.10

- 5.11 **Texas Public Information Act.** All information, documentation, and other material submitted by Agency for and under this MOU are subject to public disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 552 (“PIA”), or as otherwise required by applicable law or judicial order. Contactor is hereby notified that MSU strictly adheres to the PIA and the interpretations thereof rendered by the courts and Texas Attorney General (“AG”). MSU will use best efforts to maintain the confidentiality of all Agency-submitted information except where MSU is required to disclose it under the PIA or other applicable law or judicial order.
- 5.12 **FERPA.** If given access to the personally identifiable information about any student during performance of the services, the Parties agree to abide by the limitations on re-disclosure of personally identifiable information from student records as set forth in The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (“FERPA”) 34 CFR, §99.3.
- 5.13 **Proprietary Rights.** Agency acknowledges that, in the course of performing the services, MSU may provide access to instructions, methods, and techniques that have been previously developed by MSU (collectively, the “Pre-existing Materials”) and that the same will remain the sole and exclusive property of MSU. Except as expressly set forth herein, no license is granted to the Agency with respect to any Pre-existing Materials. Nothing in this MOU will be construed to grant to Agency any ownership or other interest in Pre-existing Materials, except as may be provided under a license specifically applicable to such Pre-existing Materials. The provisions of this section will survive the termination of the MOU.
- 5.14 **Applicable Law and Regulations.** Agency agrees that it will comply with all federal, state, or local laws or regulations applicable to Agency’s performance under the MOU. Agency also agrees that pursuant to Texas Education Code §51.9335(h), in any agreement for the acquisition of goods or services to which MSU is a party, any provision required by applicable law to be included in the agreement is considered to be part of the agreement whether or not the provision appears on the face of the agreement or if the agreement contains any provision to the contrary.
- 5.15 **Compliance with Texas Government Code §2274.002.** If this MOU has a value of \$100,000 or more to be paid wholly or partly from public funds of MSU, and if Agency is a company, other than a sole proprietorship, with ten (10) or more full-time employees, then pursuant to Texas Government Code §2274.002, Agency affirmatively states it (1) does not have a practice, policy, guidance, or directive that discriminates against a firearm entity or firearm trade association; and (2) will not discriminate during the term of the MOU against a firearm entity or trade association.
- 5.16 **No Boycott.** If this MOU has a value of \$100,000 or more to be paid wholly or partly from public funds of MSU, and if Agency is a company, other than a sole proprietorship, with 10 or more full-time employees, then pursuant to Texas Government Code §§ 2271.002 and 2274.002, Agency affirmatively states it does not and will not:
- Boycott Israel during the term of this MOU. In this paragraph, the terms “company” and “boycott Israel” shall have the meanings described in Texas Government Code § 808.001.
 - Boycott energy companies during the term of this MOU. In this paragraph, the terms “company” and “boycott energy companies” shall have the meanings described in Texas Government Code § 809.001.
- 5.17 **Trafficking of Persons.** Under §2155.0061, Texas Government Code, Agency certifies that the individual or business entity named in the MOU is not ineligible to receive the specified MOU and acknowledges that the MOU may be terminated and payment withheld if this certification is inaccurate.
- 5.18 **Emergency Health and Safety Procedures.** In the event of pandemic, epidemic, viral outbreak, health crisis, or other emergency (“Emergency”), MSU may, at its sole discretion, implement new or modified health and safety procedures in order to protect the health and safety of the MSU community. In the event of Emergency, Agency agrees to adhere to all such procedures and related directives from MSU when entering onto and/or performing services on MSU’s campus.
- 5.19 **Texas Health and Safety Code.** Agency affirmatively states that it will comply with the requirements of Texas Health and Safety Code, § 161.0085(c).

5.20 **Limitations.** THE PARTIES ARE AWARE THAT THERE MAY BE CONSTITUTIONAL AND STATUTORY LIMITATIONS ON THE AUTHORITY OF MSU TO ENTER INTO CERTAIN TERMS AND CONDITIONS, INCLUDING TERMS AND CONDITIONS (IF ANY) RELATING TO LIENS ON MSU’S PROPERTY; DISCLAIMERS AND LIMITATIONS OF WARRANTIES; DISCLAIMERS AND LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES; WAIVERS, DISCLAIMERS AND LIMITATIONS OF MSU’S LEGAL RIGHTS, REMEDIES, REQUIREMENTS AND PROCESSES; LIMITATIONS OF PERIODS TO BRING LEGAL ACTION; GRANTING CONTROL OF LITIGATION OR SETTLEMENT TO ANOTHER PARTY; LIABILITY FOR ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF THIRD PARTIES; PAYMENT OF ATTORNEYS’ FEES; DISPUTE RESOLUTION; INDEMNITIES; ANY PROVISION THAT CREATES AN UNKNOWN OR UNFUNDED LIABILITY; AND CONFIDENTIALITY (COLLECTIVELY, THE “LIMITATIONS”), AND TERMS AND CONDITIONS RELATED TO THE LIMITATIONS WILL NOT BE BINDING ON MSU EXCEPT TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED BY THE LAWS AND CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF TEXAS.

Memorandum of Understanding for Licensure Programs**

This Memorandum of Understanding (“Agreement”) is entered into and made effective this ____ day of _____, 20__ (“Effective Date”) by and between The University of Texas at Dallas, hereinafter referred to as (the "UNIVERSITY"), a Texas State Agency and component institution of The University of Texas System (“System”), on the behalf of both the Teacher Development Center (TDC) the UTeach Dallas program (UTEACH DALLAS), and Garland Independent School District, hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL" or “ISD."

The purpose of this Agreement is to guide and direct a working relationship between UNIVERSITY and SCHOOL in providing clinical practice experiences for pre-service teachers (CANDIDATES), in ("Field-Based Experiences"), ("Clinical Teaching") (“Residency”) and (“Internship”) as required by the Texas Education Agency and 19 TAC § 228, and in accordance with UNIVERSITY state-approved licensure programs. Note: The Teacher Development Center program and the UTeach Dallas program run independently of each other beyond certification and have different requirements to meet the needs of their CANDIDATES. All university students admitted to the Teacher Development Center or UTeach Dallas programs are pre-service teacher CANDIDATES.

As outlined in the course catalogue, the UNIVERSITY requires both TDC and UTEACH DALLAS CANDIDATES to complete both Field Experiences and either Residency, Clinical Teaching or Internship. These are described in each program’s course guides and in the course catalogue and are subject to the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing, and of the promises and mutual agreements contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

ACTIVITIES AND SERVICES

The UNIVERSITY requests highly-qualified teachers to provide activities and services for the CANDIDATES, to act as Supervising Teachers for Clinical Teaching, Host Teachers for Residency, Mentors for Internship or as Mentor Teachers for Early Field Experiences.

ISD agrees and promises to:

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- A. Provide to the CANDIDATE the opportunity to carry out major professional functions under appropriate supervision in a sequence of experiences designed to enhance competencies in comprehensive assessment, intervention, evaluation of services provided, and professional practice.
- B. Provide a training experience for either year-long residency or clinical teaching as prescribed in 19 TAC § 228.
- C. Provide supervised, interactive, and directed early field experience placement for pre-service teachers to meet 19 TAC § 228 requirements and residency agreements including teaching standards-based lessons in these early classroom experiences.
- D. Maintain sole responsibility for the instruction, education and welfare of its students. The ISD shall be responsible for providing adequate staffing necessary to carry out the goals and objectives of the school district.
- E. That CANDIDATES assigned to it for the purposes set forth in this agreement will be under the supervision, control, and responsibility of the SCHOOL. ___
- F. Employ a clearly designated actively licensed, qualified professional who is responsible for the integrity and quality of the program.
- G. Shall provide qualified supervisors for CANDIDATES that meet the TEA requirements in 19 TAC §228. For purposes of this Agreement, the term "supervisor" shall be defined as the district employee who has been assigned to supervise the CANDIDATES. The supervisor will be a resource person for CANDIDATES and University faculty while at the SCHOOL. Supervisors selected by the SCHOOL will:
 - 1. assist in orienting CANDIDATES to the ISD and the assigned workstation within which the CANDIDATES will be assigned;
 - 2. explain all SCHOOL and district policies, rules, and regulations to CANDIDATES;
 - 3. provide prompt and substantive feedback to CANDIDATES regarding all performance activities and interactions with SCHOOL personnel, students, and parents;
 - 4. complete written evaluations of CANDIDATES' progress and submit them to the University Faculty/Site Supervisor, after reviewing them with the applicable CANDIDATES;
 - 5. signing off on a time record of CANDIDATE attendance, including a running record of total time across the field-based experience.
 - 6. immediately inform SCHOOL administrators as well as the University Faculty/ University Field Supervisor/Site Supervisor of any concerns regarding a CANDIDATE;
 - 7. establish a time to meet and discuss with CANDIDATES their activities, impressions, reflections, and suggestions for goals and areas of improvement;
 - 8. supervise, coach and co-teach with CANDIDATES on a daily basis. If the assigned supervisor is absent for any reason, a qualified, licensed professional must be assigned to supervise the CANDIDATES. Under no circumstance can a CANDIDATE, even if he/she is licensed, serve as the professional educator of record during the CANDIDATE'S experience.
 - 9. allow university field supervisor/staff representative(s) into the classroom and/or virtual learning environment (VLE) to observe lessons of a CANDIDATES working toward certification;
- H. Shall allow the Teacher Development Center and UTeach Dallas to choose/recommend these

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supervisors to the district based on recommendations by principals, district leaders, interest, experience, and classroom performance.

- I. Shall provide to University and CANDIDATES the policies and procedures and other relevant materials to allow CANDIDATES to function appropriately within the SCHOOL.
- J. Shall retain the right, in its sole discretion, to request the removal of any individual from any SCHOOL ISD property, including but not limited to the assigned work station. CANDIDATES shall be instructed by the University to promptly and without protest leave an area whenever they are requested to do so by an authorized SCHOOL representative.
- K. Shall provide necessary emergency medical services to CANDIDATES. SCHOOL will call emergency medical services should it become necessary; SCHOOL, however, will not be liable for any charges incurred as a result of the administration of those services. CANDIDATES assigned to ISD shall follow ISD protocols for health and safety.
- L. Shall permit CANDIDATES access to the district, portal, technology, curricula and curricula resources, and library facilities/curriculum laboratories available to district personnel. CANDIDATES are prohibited from removing materials from the SCHOOL without appropriate approval.
- M. Shall keep confidential and shall not disclose to any person or entity:
 - 1. CANDIDATE applications;
 - 2. CANDIDATE health records or reports; and/or
 - 3. any CANDIDATE records as defined in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act,

20 U.S.C. § 1232g, concerning any CANDIDATE participating in the education experiences provided by SCHOOL, except to the extent such disclosure is required by law, authorized by the CANDIDATE or is ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction. The ISD shall maintain policies and procedures necessary to protect the confidentiality of CANDIDATE records as defined herein.

- N. Provide CANDIDATE supervision which is regularly scheduled and sufficient relative to the CANDIDATE's responsibility assuring, that the CANDIDATE receives the hours stated in 19 TAC § 228, subch. D to complete their certification pathway. The individual supervision will be regularly scheduled, formal, and face-to-face with the specific intent of dealing with the professional services rendered directly by the CANDIDATE. The primary supervisor must provide both formal and informal observation as stated in code. The individual supervision will include all observation requirements in 19 TAC § 228. The supervisor assumes full responsibility for the supervision provided.
- O. Assure that the CANDIDATE has regularly scheduled, supervised and documented training activities and professional development with other CANDIDATES and with district personnel.
- Q. The CANDIDATE's supervisor will certify in writing that the CANDIDATE program requirements have been met.
- R. Shall inform the University of changes in District policy, procedures and staffing that might affect the CANDIDATE'S experience.
- S. Work with UNIVERSITY personnel to collaboratively identify, train, and support ISD teachers who are serving in early field-based experience placement or as Cooperating/Host or Mentor Teachers to

CANDIDATES. Qualified teachers will participate in trainings offered by UNIVERSITY personnel as required by the Texas Education Agency.

- T. Incorporate on its parent-permission form that media coverage includes the use of video-capture technology in classrooms for purposes of evaluating and improving the instructional practice of CANDIDATES, as well as capturing video for TEA-required, student portfolio performance assessment for certification purposes; and
- U. Collaborate with UNIVERSITY to identify schools, principals and sufficient Teachers to participate in the Program's initial teacher preparation initiative, and support fidelity of implementation.

The University of Texas at Dallas agrees and promises to:

- A. Certify at the time of arrival of the CANDIDATE:
 - 1. Completion of course work in scientific, applied and specialty areas, including formal assessment/diagnosis and intervention/treatment;
 - 2. Completion of a formal introduction to ethical and professional standards.
- B. Notify the CANDIDATE'S Supervisor of any change in the student's status prior to the commencement of or during the CANDIDATE'S program.
- C. Provide a FIELD SUPERVISOR who shall maintain an ongoing relationship with the ISD CANDIDATE'S supervisor and who shall provide all formal and informal observations as provided in 19 TAC § 228.
- D. The University will offer educational programs accredited by appropriate organizations; and will determine standards of education, hours of instruction, learning experiences, administration, matriculation, promotion, and graduation.
- E. The University will keep all records and reports on CANDIDATE experiences in accordance with University policy and regulatory requirements.
- F. The University will plan with the ISD, in advance of the commencement of any semester, its schedule of CANDIDATES' assignments to the designated areas, including dates and numbers of CANDIDATES.
- G. The University agrees to inform CANDIDATES that CANDIDATES shall be responsible for following the rules and regulations of the ISD, including recognition of the confidential nature of information regarding ISD students and their records.
- H. The University will provide to the ISD a copy of course objectives for the learning experience. The ISD, together with the University, will make arrangements for evaluating the learning experience.
- I. The University will assign a Faculty/Site Supervisor who will collaborate with the ISD's assigned supervisors.
- J. CANDIDATES shall not be considered as employees or agents of the ISD.
- K. The University acknowledges that the ISD has a legal obligation to maintain the confidentiality and privacy of student records in accordance with applicable law and regulations, specifically the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). The University is receiving information in compliance with the requirements and expectations outlined in FERPA. The University acknowledges that it must

comply with said law and regulations and safeguard student information. The University is prohibited from re-disclosing the information to a third party without prior written consent from the parent or the eligible student. University must destroy any student information received from the district when no longer needed for the purposes listed in this agreement.

- L. To the extent the University intends to conduct a survey of the ISD students, the University must enter into a Data Sharing Agreement with the ISD in compliance with requirements of the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), prior to conducting the survey.
- M. Upon request of the ISD, withdraw from the program any CANDIDATE whose performance is unsatisfactory or whose personal characteristics prevent a desirable relationship with the ISD. The University may reassign a CANDIDATE after consultation with an appropriate ISD representative if such reassignment is in the best interest of the CANDIDATE, the ISD or University. The University agrees to hold harmless the ISD for any cause of action resulting from reassignment, withdrawal or expulsion of the CANDIDATE by University.

The Parties agree to the following to articulate the protocol and responsibilities of the University and ISD when using video capture technology for the purpose of evaluating and improving the clinical practice of CANDIDATES. ISD may use the video captured pursuant to this Agreement for legitimate educational purposes. Legitimate educational purposes for ISD include, but are not limited to, the following: use of the video in a student disciplinary matter, use of the video in a personnel matter, any matter in which ISD is mandated to report an incident to law enforcement or state authorities (e.g., Texas Department of Family and Protective Services), and matters in which review of the video may be used to assess and/or provide Section 504 or Special Education services to students.

A. University Responsibilities:

- 1. UNIVERSITY candidates will be captured under ISD media permission protocol.
- 2. The UNIVERSITY in recognition of the sensitivity of media practice will:
 - a) limit its recordings to only the number of classes necessary to achieve its purpose of evaluating and improving the clinical practice of CANDIDATES;
 - b) record only those students in which the parents/guardians of the enrolled student have provided written consent to such recording;
 - c) center the CANDIDATE as the focal point of the video;
 - d) unless otherwise required, the camera will be positioned in the classroom in such a manner as to minimize the capture of EC-12 student faces, though some incidental exposure is likely; and
 - e) direct the field-based experience student/clinical teacher/resident/intern CANDIDATE to determine with ISD administrators the identity of any students that have circumstances forbidding recording-and in such cases, no recording of those students is permitted.
 - f) restrict authorized individuals to access videos to only individuals entitled by law to access them (e.g., field-based experience students/clinical teachers/residents/interns/CANDIDATEs, host/cooperating teachers, university field supervisors, district administration, and UNIVERSITY administration, and state required performance assessment).

- h) prepare all CANDIDATES to utilize video capture software solutions for any recording associated with UNIVERSITY course assignments or performance assessments;
 - i) train CANDIDATES to upload to the secure, FERPA compliant site for all video associated with course assignments or performance assessment within twenty-four (24) hours of capture;
 - j) ensure the video capture application provides the security assurances necessary for recording in the classroom. Video captured is automatically and permanently erased from the recording device once uploaded to the secure website;
 - k) coordinate maintenance of the video on the secure website for a period of not to exceed ten (10) years from the time of capture; and
 - l) the UNIVERSITY will retain all video content in accordance with applicable retention policies, and will store the content in university secure-protected technology environment with strict access controls remaining in place;
 - m) use video for instructional purposes only, self-observation and self-evaluation of instructional practices; observation and evaluation of the field-based experience students'/ clinical teacher/resident/intern/CANDIDATE, candidates' instructional skills; program evaluation; data relevant to instructional competencies of field-based experience students/clinical teachers/resident/intern/CANDIDATES and state required performance assessment.
3. In no case will images or audio of ISD students appear in public forum for purposes of self/candidate/program evaluation, or for purposes of research presentation unless the identity of students is completely masked (e.g., blurring of facial or other identifying features).

B. ISD Responsibilities:

- 1. ISD will inform and obtain written consent from parents/guardians of the use of video capture technology in district classrooms and explain the measures taken to specifically avoid video capture of their students to the extent practicable.
- 2. Video-capture of the field-based experience student/clinical teacher/CANDIDATE will not be published without valid consents as required by FERPA or any other applicable privacy law, regulation or policy.

It is mutually agreed that:

- A. The CANDIDATE shall function within the policies of the District.
- B. If the CANDIDATE is expelled from the University, withdrawn from the CANDIDATE program, or removed from the ISD CANDIDATE program under this Agreement, such action will terminate all contractual obligations to the ISD specifically related to expelled, withdrawn or removed CANDIDATE. University agrees to hold the ISD harmless regarding such expulsion, withdrawal or removal and indemnify and defend the ISD in any action involving the expulsion, withdrawal, or removal.
- C. The University and ISD will not discriminate against any person because of race, color, religion,

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sex, or national origin, age, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, genetic information nor any other basis prohibited by law in educational programs or activities that it operates or in employment decisions.

- D. University and ISD shall provide prompt notification in writing to one another and, to the extent required by law, shall reasonably cooperate with one another in the defense of, any lawsuits, claims, or threatened claims that pertain to services provided pursuant to this Agreement.

- E. University acknowledges that the ISD is subject to the Texas Public Information Act (TPIA). As such, upon receipt of a request under the TPIA, ISD is required to comply with the requirements of the TPIA. For purposes of the TPIA, "public information" is defined as information that is written, produced, collected, assembled, or maintained under a law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business:
1. by Garland ISD; [or]
 2. for Garland ISD and Garland ISD
 - a. owns the information; [or]
 - b. has a right of access to the information; or
 - c. spends or contributes public money for the purpose of writing, producing, collecting, assembling, or maintaining the information; or
 - d. by an individual officer or employee of Garland ISD in the officer's or employee's official capacity and the information pertains to official business of the ISD.
- F. University is expected to fully cooperate with the ISD in responding to public information requests. This includes, but is not limited to, providing the ISD with requested documentation. In the event that the request involves documentation that University has clearly marked as

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confidential and/or proprietary, ISD will provide University with the required notices under the TPIA. University acknowledges that it has the responsibility to brief the Attorney General's Office on why the documents identified as confidential and/or proprietary fall within an exception to public disclosure.

- G. CANDIDATES are required to receive criminal background check clearance through the Human Resources Department of Garland ISD before arriving on campus. The cost of that background check is to be borne by the University.
- H. This Agreement is not intended and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture or association between the University and ISD and its employees, CANDIDATES, or agents, but rather is an Agreement by and among two independent contractors. Each CANDIDATE is placed with the ISD in order to receive educational experience as part of the academic curriculum; duties performed by a CANDIDATE are not performed as an employee of the ISD but rather in fulfillment of the academic requirements of the educational experience and are performed under direct supervision by ISD personnel. University acknowledges that nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to confer any right upon the University or University personnel to participate in, control, or direct operations at the SCHOOL.
- I. ISD shall timely notify the University when any University employee or CANDIDATE has been involved in a reported incident involving the ISD. As may be allowed by law, University will have the opportunity to participate in any on-going investigation and may have access to any oral or written reports and any other documentation related to the reported incident, unless such disclosure is prohibited by law.
- J. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement as to the rights and obligations of the parties hereto and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements and undertaking of the parties pertaining to the referenced subject matter.
- K. Modifications. This Agreement and each of its provisions shall be binding upon the parties and may not be waived, modified, amended or altered except by a written amendment signed by ISD and University.
- L. Captions. The captions of paragraphs in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not be considered or referred to in resolving questions of interpretation or construction.
- M. Governing Law and Venue. This Agreement and all of the rights and obligations of the parties hereto and all of the terms and conditions hereof shall be construed, interpreted and applied in accordance with and governed by and enforced under the laws of the State of Texas, and the parties hereto agree that venue shall be in Dallas County, Texas.
- N. Severability. In case any provision hereof shall, for any reason, be held invalid or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid or unenforceable provision had not been included herein. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which, taken together, shall constitute one and the same agreement.
- O. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be

Notwithstanding any term herein to the contrary, this license is nonexclusive as between the Licensor and Licensee, and Licensor reserves the absolute right to use the Premises at any date or time. In the event of an express conflict between this License and the Terms, the Terms shall control.

W I T N E S S E T H

1. Agreement to License; Concessions. Subject to the terms and conditions of this License, Licensor hereby licenses and grants access to Licensee, and Licensee hereby takes the premises located in Garland, Dallas County, Texas, and being more particularly described in the Terms.

2. Term. Licensee shall be permitted to use the Premises for the times indicated in the Terms for the purposes stated therein. Licensor shall make the Premises available to the Licensee at the times specified in the Terms for any set-up required prior to the event.

3. Allowed Use. The Premises licensed is to be used by Licensee for the purposes stated within the Terms and for no other uses or purposes whatsoever ("Allowed Use"). Licensee shall not use or permit the use of the Premises, or any part thereof, for any purpose other than as stipulated without the written consent of Licensor.

4. Loss or Destruction of Property Licensed. If the Premises become, as a practical matter, totally untenable after a casualty loss such as fire, storm, explosion, earthquake, or other casualty, and if the casualty loss is not due to the negligence or fault of the Licensee or the Licensee's employees, guests or invitees, either Licensor or Licensee may terminate the License at any time by giving written notice to the other.

5. Licensee to Provide Insurance. No additional insurance is required of Licensee under this Agreement.

6. Assignment or Sublicense. Unless expressly allowed under the Terms, Licensee shall not assign this License or

sublicense the Premises, or any part thereof, without the prior written consent of the Licensor, which may be denied for any reason or no reason at all.

7. **Right to Audit; Inspections.** In permitting the use of the Premises, Licensor does not relinquish its rights to access and enter the Premises and does hereby expressly retain the right to enforce any and all laws and applicable rules and regulations. The Licensor's agents, officers, and employees (including law enforcement) may enter upon and into the Premises at all times to make inspections and perform compliance audits to ensure compliance with this License. In the event Licensor elects to do a compliance audit to confirm Licensee is operating its business as described in above Section 4 and is in conformance with all material provisions of this License, Licensor shall give Licensee written notice three business days in advance of entering the Premises to conduct a compliance audit.

8. **Termination.** This License may be terminated by Licensor for any reason, or no reason at all, upon three (3) days written notice to Licensee.

9. **Severability.** If any term or provision of this License is held to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, the legality, validity, or enforceability of the remaining terms or provisions of this License shall not be affected thereby, and in lieu of each such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable term or provision, there shall be added automatically to this License a legal, valid, or enforceable term or provision as similar as possible to the term or provision declared illegal, invalid, or unenforceable.

10. **Waiver.** Either Licensor or Licensee shall have the right to waive any requirement contained in this License which is intended for the waiving party's benefit but, except as otherwise provided herein, such waiver shall be effective only if in writing executed by the party for whose benefit such requirement is intended.

11. **Governing Law.** This License and all of the transactions contemplated herein shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. The provisions and obligations of this License are performable in Dallas County, Texas such that exclusive venue for any action arising out of this License shall be

in a court of competent jurisdiction in Dallas County, Texas.

12. **Paragraph Headings; Construction.** The paragraph headings contained in this License are for convenience only and shall in no way enlarge or limit the scope or meaning of the various and several paragraphs hereof. Both parties have participated in the negotiation and preparation of this License and this License shall not be construed either more or less strongly against or for either party.

13. **Complete Agreement.** This License, including its Exhibits, contains the entire agreement between Licensor and Licensee with respect to the Premises and, except as set forth herein and in written instruments executed in connection herewith, neither Licensor nor Licensee has made any agreements, covenants, warranties, or representations of any kind or character, express or implied, oral or written, with respect to the Premises including, without limitation, any warranties of habitability, merchantability, workmanship, income to be derived from the Premises, expenses to be incurred in connection with the Premises or with respect to any other conditions, facts, or requirements relating or pertaining to the Premises.

14. **Binding Effect.** Except as limited herein, the terms and provisions of this License shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, devisees, personal and legal representatives, successors, and assigns.

15. **Gender.** Within this License, words of any gender shall be held and construed to include any other gender, and words in the singular number shall be held and construed to include the plural, unless the context otherwise requires.

16. **Counterparts.** This License has been executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

17. **Exhibits.** All exhibits to this License are incorporated herein by reference for all purposes wherever reference is made to the same.

18. **No Waiver of Immunity or Defense.** No party, by execution of this Agreement, waives nor shall be deemed to

have waived, any immunity or defense that would otherwise be available to it including, without limitation, immunity from liability and suit for damages to one another or to any third-party except as otherwise provided by law.

19. **Relationship of Parties.** Nothing contained in this License shall be deemed or construed by the parties hereto or by any third party to create the relationship of principal and agent or of partnership or of joint venture or of any association whatsoever between the parties, it being expressly understood and agreed that no provision contained in this License nor any act or acts of the parties hereto shall be deemed to create any relationship between the parties other than the relationship of Licensor and Licensee as those terms are understood herein.

20. **Non-Discrimination.** Licensee promises and warrants that no person shall on the grounds of race, color, national origin, or sex, as provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 be excluded from participation in, be denied access or benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program, activity, or transaction on the Premises.

21. **Signature Authority.** Both Parties represent, warrant, and agree that they have the full right and authority to enter into this License, and that the person executing this License on behalf of the respective Party has the full right and authority to enter into this License and bind the Party to each and every obligation contained herein. Licensee understands and acknowledges that Licensor cannot be lawfully held responsible for any obligation contained herein and this License cannot be amended, without the authorization of the express authorization of the City Manager of the City of Garland and executed by the City Manager of the City of Garland.

Except as provided herein, LICENSEE is prohibited from and hereby agrees not to lease, sublease, or assign this License, or any part thereof, except on prior written consent of PRCAD or as authorized in this agreement. In the event written consent is granted, LICENSEE shall submit the written contract from assignee or sub-licensee stating all provisions regarding utilization of facilities and fees to be paid to the organization. The contract must be submitted for the approval of PRCAD prior to entering into an agreement with sublicensee or assignee.

1.0 Agreement Period; Location; License Fee; Deposit:

- 1.1 **TERM:** Facility use by LICENSEE shall generally begin on ~~6/1/2026~~ and end on ~~8/5/2026~~ ("Term"). LICENSEE may use the Premises at the times more specifically described in Section 2.0 below.
- 1.2 **FACILITY/FIELD(S)/COURT(S):** The Facilities will include interior and exterior space at 6 recreation centers: Audubon 342 W. Oats Rd, Bradfield 1146 Castle Dr., Granger 1310 W. Ave F, Fields 1701 Dairy Road, Holford 2314 Homestead Place, and Hollabaugh 3925 W. Walnut.
- 1.3 **LICENSE FEE:** LICENSOR reserves the right to charge LICENSEE a non-refundable license fee of ~~\$0.00~~ for the Term to cover expenses related to LICENSEE'S use of the Premises. LICENSOR may adjust the amount of the fee upon 30 days written notice to LICENSEE.
- 1.4 **DEPOSIT:** LICENSEE shall pay LICENSOR a non-refundable security deposit of \$0 within 10 business days of executing this License.

2.0 Allowed Use:

- 2.1 **USAGE PERIODS/DATES/SEASONS:** ~~6/1/2026-8/5/2026 Monday – Friday, 10 am – 2 pm~~
- 2.2 LICENSEE is granted permission to conduct the following recreational activities on the Premises during the Term of this Agreement ("Use"): Summer Nutrition Program
- 2.3 **NON-EXCLUSIVE:** This License is non-exclusive as between the Licensor and Licensor retains primacy and the absolute right to use the Premises at any time.
- 2.4 **WEATHER:** For outdoor events, LICENSEE is responsible for determining whether to allow participants to use the Premises during and following inclement weather. LICENSEE shall have an inclement weather policy consistent with the National Weather Service and National Lightning Safety Institute guidelines. PRCAD reserves the right to cancel any activities or uses due to inclement weather or Facility conditions.

3.0 Facility Maintenance:

- 3.1 LICENSEE shall have responsibility to maintain Facilities during the periods approved for their use. LICENSEE is expected to maintain and keep in good condition the interiors and exteriors of facilities owned by LICENSEE. PRCAD will maintain exteriors of City owned facilities and LICENSEE will maintain interiors.

- 3.2 LICENSEE is responsible to keep all facilities operated by LICENSEE in good condition. Any damage to the Facilities or equipment during LICENSEE'S approved facility use period must be repaired in a timely manner. LICENSEE is responsible for year-round maintenance of LICENSEE owned facilities. If LICENSEE does not make repairs in time frame set by PRCAD, repairs will be made by PRCAD and the LICENSEE shall be charged all expenses for the repairs.
- 3.3 STORAGE: LICENSEE will store maintenance equipment and supplies in PRCAD approved storage areas. Personal property, materials, or equipment must be stored in a clean and organized manner. Only items related to the allowed Use may be stored on the Premises. PRCAD reserves the right to remove and dispose of improperly stored maintenance equipment or materials. Only locks and keys issued by PRCAD may be used to secure storage facilities.
- 3.4 RESTROOMS: In the event the Premises includes restroom facilities, the restrooms must be locked when the Premises are not in use by LICENSEE. LICENSOR will endeavor to supply all restroom materials, including soap, toilet paper, and paper towels. LICENSEE shall notify LICENSOR within 48 hours of use of the Premises if restrooms are in need of additional supplies.
- 3.5 All LICENSEE facility repairs or corrections requested by PRCAD shall be completed by the requested date. Failure to complete repairs may result in delay to LICENSEE'S use of the Premises until repairs or corrections are completed.
- 3.6 LICENSEE shall remove all equipment which is movable and not of permanent nature from the site within thirty days of the agreement termination date. If equipment is not removed from site after thirty days, PRCAD has authority to take possession and/or dispose of this equipment.
- 4.0 Criminal Background Checks. LICENSEE, if providing youth activities, shall conduct criminal background checks on any person holding a position within the organization. This shall include, but is not limited to, elected/appointed board members/officers, assistants, , concession volunteers, promotional volunteers, equipment managers, and facility managers. It shall be the sole responsibility of the LICENSEE to conduct all criminal background checks.
- 5.0 Incorporation of Policies. The policies and regulations of PRCAD are incorporated into and made a part of this Agreement. Unless expressly provided herein, no officer, agent or employee of PRCAD may waive any policy of PRCAD or grant any privilege to the LICENSEE.
- 6.0 Relationship of Parties: Nothing contained herein shall be deemed or construed by the parties hereto or by any third party to create the relationship of principal and agent or partnership nor of venture, it is being expressly understood and agreed that no provision contained herein nor any act or acts of the parties hereto shall be deemed to create any relationship between the parties other than the relationship between the City of Garland as a governmental entity, and its citizens, in a regulatory matter governing the use of facilities and the conduct of activities related thereto. The LICENSEE shall not represent to any person, by any means, that it acts for or on behalf of the City, unless expressly so authorized in writing by the City.
- 7.0 Independent Contractor:
- 7.1 While engaged in carrying out and complying with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the LICENSEE is, and shall be, an Independent Contractor and shall not, with respect to its acts or omissions, be deemed an officer, employee or agent of the City. The LICENSEE shall not at any time or in any manner represent that it or any of its agents or employees are in any manner agents or employees of the City.
- 7.2 LICENSEE is and shall be an Independent Contractor, with full, complete and exclusive power and authority to direct, supervise, and control its own employees and agents and to determine the method of the performance of the activities covered hereby. The fact that the City's representative shall have the right to observe LICENSEE'S work during his performance and

to carry out the other prerogatives which are expressly reserved to and vested in the City's representative hereunder, is not intended to and shall not at any time change or affect the status of the LICENSEE as an Independent Contractor with respect to either the City's representative or to the LICENSEE'S own employees or agents or to any other person, firm or corporation.

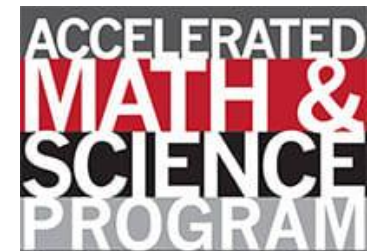
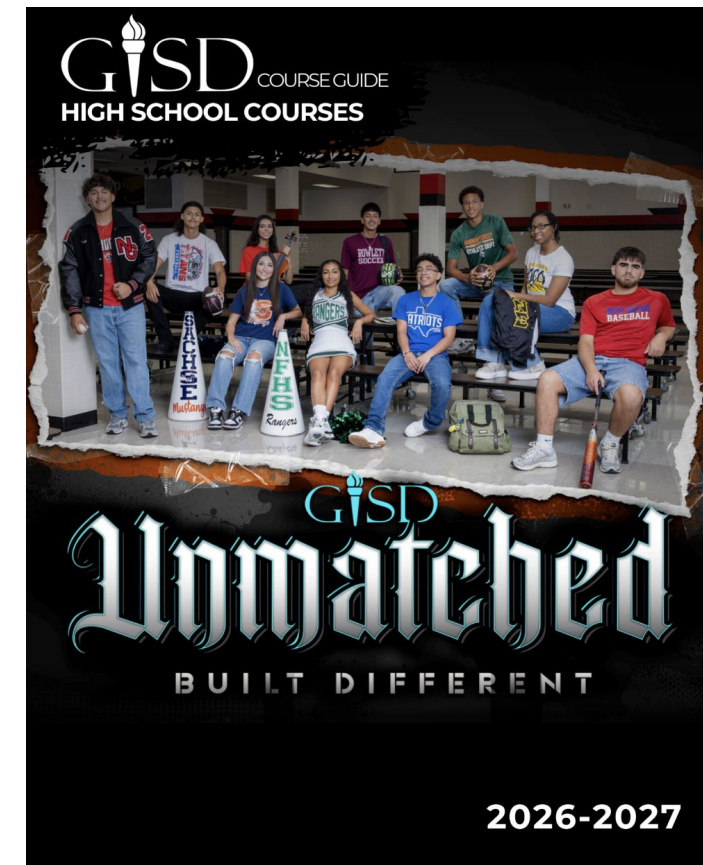

Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) is entered into and effective on the date of the last signature below (the “Effective Date”), by and between Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service an agency of the State of Texas and a member of The Texas A&M University System (“AgriLife Extension”), and Garland Independent School District (“Collaborator”). Member and Collaborator are sometimes hereafter referred to as “Party” individually and as “Parties” collectively.

This MOU consists of two articles. Article 1 is a non-binding portion of this MOU containing the general understandings and intentions of the Parties. Article 2 contains terms to which the Parties agree to be bound. The Parties agree as follows:

Article 1

- 1.1 This Article 1 is not intended to be legally binding on either Party.
- 1.2 The Parties desire to provide hands-on experiences through 4-H programs that support youth leadership, civic engagement, and career readiness. Activities may include after-school clubs, STEM learning, healthy living projects, and community service initiatives hosted on Collaborator’s campuses (the “Purpose”).
- 1.3 AgriLife Extension intends to:
 - (a) deliver evidence-based nutrition and wellness programs such as Better Living for Texans (BLT) and Walk Across Texas to promote healthy eating, physical activity, and chronic disease prevention among Collaborator students and families.
 - (b) work with Collaborator to host family-focused workshops on topics such as parenting skills, financial literacy, food safety, and community resource awareness—empowering families to support student success and well-being.
 - (c) implement garden-based learning, environmental awareness, and sustainable agriculture education through programs such as school gardens, pollinator habitats, and urban agriculture demonstrations, integrating science and environmental stewardship into classroom and extracurricular learning.
 - (d) partner with Collaborator to provide experiential learning opportunities, guest speakers, and career exploration activities that expose students to agricultural sciences, environmental careers, nutrition education, and public service pathways aligned with workforce development goals.
 - (e) Follow and abide by all Collaborator Board policies and procedures.
 - (f) Follow and abide by all policies and procedures of the Collaborator campus or facility.
 - (g) Ensure that all representatives have passed AgriLife Extension’s background checks required upon employment.
 - (h) Maintain the confidentiality of all Collaborator’s student information and acknowledge that any student information may only be used for purposes related to and within the scope of the Community Organization’s programs as described below in Section 2.3.
- 1.4 Collaborator intends to:
 - (a) Designate individuals serving in campus leadership roles as specific points of contact at each participating campus.

- (b) Designate a public space for the Community Organization to conduct activities after school.
- (c) Provide appropriate oversight/supervision.

Article 2

- 2.1 This Article 2 is intended to be legally binding on the Parties.
- 2.2 Each Party acknowledges that neither Party will have any legal rights or obligations as to the understandings and intentions in Article 1, and neither Party should or may take any action or fail to take any action in detrimental reliance on Article 1.
- 2.3 The Parties anticipate that under this MOU it may be necessary for a Party (the “Disclosing Party”) to transfer information of a confidential nature (“Confidential Information”) to the other Party (the “Receiving Party”). The Disclosing Party shall clearly identify Confidential Information at the time of disclosure by (i) appropriate stamp or markings on the document exchanged, or (ii) written notice, with attached listings of all material, copies of all documents, and complete summaries of all oral disclosures (under prior assertion of the confidential nature of the same) to which each notice relates, delivered within thirty (30) days of the disclosure to the other Party.
- (a) “Confidential Information” does not include information that: (i) is or becomes publicly known or available other than as a result of a breach of this MOU by the Receiving Party; (ii) was already in the possession of the Receiving Party as the result of disclosure by an individual or entity that was not then obligated to keep that information confidential; (iii) the Disclosing Party had disclosed or discloses to an individual or entity without confidentiality restrictions; or (iv) the Receiving Party had developed or develops independently before or after the Disclosing Party discloses equivalent information to the Receiving Party.
 - (b) The Receiving Party shall use the same reasonable efforts to protect the Disclosing Party’s Confidential Information as it uses to protect its own confidential information of a similar nature. The Receiving Party may use Confidential Information only for the Purpose under this MOU and may disclose Confidential Information only to its directors, regents, officers, employees, agents, consultants, advisors, or other representatives (“Representatives”) having a need to know the Confidential Information for the Purpose, provided that they are subject to confidentiality obligations not less restrictive than those set forth herein, and that the Receiving Party remains responsible for its Representatives’ compliance with such obligations.
 - (c) If the Receiving Party is legally required to disclose Confidential Information, the Receiving Party shall, to the extent allowed by law, promptly give the Disclosing Party written notice of the requirement so as to provide the Disclosing Party a reasonable opportunity to pursue appropriate process to prevent or limit the disclosure. If the Receiving Party complies with the terms of this Section, disclosure of that portion of the Confidential Information, which the Receiving Party is legally required to disclose, will not constitute a breach of this MOU.
 - (d) The Receiving Party shall, upon request of the Disclosing Party, promptly return or destroy all materials embodying Confidential Information other than materials in

electronic backup systems or otherwise not reasonably capable of being readily located and segregated without undue burden or expense, except that the Receiving Party may securely retain one (1) copy in its files solely for record purposes. The Receiving Party's obligations as to Confidential Information will survive the termination or expiration of this MOU for a period of three (3) years.

- 2.4 Each Party acknowledges that all rights in any trademarks, service marks, slogans, logos, designs, and other similar means of distinction associated with that Party (its "Marks"), including all goodwill pertaining to the Marks, are the sole property of that Party. Neither Party may use the Marks of the other without the advance written consent of that Party, except that each Party may use the name of the other Party in factual statements that, in context, are not misleading or imply an endorsement by that Party or its employees. The Parties will mutually agree in advance upon any public announcements, or communications to the media regarding this MOU to be provided pursuant to this MOU.
- 2.5 Each Party shall be responsible for its own costs, risks, and liabilities as a result of its activities under this MOU without expectation of reimbursement from the other Party. There will be no exchange of funds or other resources among the Parties.
- 2.6 This MOU commences on the Effective Date and continues through one year from the Effective Date (the "Term"), unless sooner terminated as provided herein, not to exceed a total Term of five (5) years. Either Party may terminate this MOU effective upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other Party. Either Party may terminate this MOU effective upon written notice to the other Party if the other Party materially breaches any term of this MOU and fails to cure such breach within ten (10) days after receiving written notice of the breach.
- 2.7 Each Party shall conduct all activities in connection with this MOU in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations.
- 2.8 The validity of this MOU and all matters pertaining to this MOU, including but not limited to, matters of performance, breach, remedies, procedures, rights, duties, interpretation or construction, shall be governed and determined in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Pursuant to Section 85.18(b), Texas Education Code, mandatory venue for all legal proceedings against AgriLife Extension is to be in the county in which the principal office of AgriLife Extension's governing officer is located.
- 2.9 Any notice required or permitted under this MOU must be in writing and in English, and is deemed given: (a) three (3) business days after it is deposited and post-marked with the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, (b) the next business day after it is sent by overnight carrier, (c) on the date sent by email transmission with electronic confirmation of receipt by the party being notified, or (d) on the date of delivery if delivered personally. Parties can change their respective notice address by sending to the other Party a notice of the new address. Notices should be addressed as follows:

- 2.10 This MOU is not intended to create a partnership or joint venture between the Parties. Neither Party may bind the other or otherwise act in any way as the representative of the other, unless specifically authorized, in advance and in writing, to do so, and then only for the limited purpose stated in such authorization.
- 2.11 This MOU contains the entire understanding of the Parties as to its subject matter and supersedes all other written and oral agreements between the Parties as to that subject matter.
- 2.12 This MOU is assignable only with the written consent of both Parties.
- 2.13 Each provision of this MOU is severable. If any provision is rendered invalid or unenforceable by statute or regulations or declared null and void by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions will remain in full force and effect if the essential terms of this MOU remain valid, legal, and enforceable.
- 2.14 Neither Party is liable or responsible to the other Party for any loss or damage or for any delays or failure to perform under this MOU due to causes beyond its reasonable control, including, but not limited to, acts of God, employee strikes, epidemics, war, riots, flood, fire, sabotage, terrorist acts or any other circumstances of like character (force majeure occurrence).
- 2.15 Member is an agency of the state of Texas and under the Constitution and the laws of the state of Texas possesses certain rights and privileges, is subject to certain limitations and restrictions, and only has authority as is granted to it under the Constitution and the laws of the state of Texas. Collaborator expressly acknowledges that Member is an agency of the state of Texas and nothing in this MOU will be construed as a waiver or relinquishment by Member of its right to claim such exemptions, remedies, privileges, and immunities as may be provided by the Constitution and the laws of the state of Texas.
- 2.16 Prior to performing any specific projects or work contemplated by this MOU, the Parties will enter into a separate agreement containing definitive statements of work and associated budgets. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this MOU does not bind the Parties to negotiate or consummate any such later agreement(s).
- 2.17 Should this document be executed in two languages, the English version of this MOU represents the understanding of the Parties. Any other version is provided as a translation only. In the event of conflict between the two versions, the English version will prevail.

Each Party enters into this MOU as of the Effective Date.

Executive Summary:

The division of leadership has expressed a desire to participate in the Region One Education Service Center Purchasing Interlocal Agreement. It is recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the agreement as permitted by Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code.

The Interlocal Agreement does not have a participation fee and is similar to the agreements we currently have with other Region Service Centers. The purchasing department recommends approval at the May 26, 2026, Board of Trustees Meeting.

REGION ONE EDUCATION SERVICE CENTER MASTER INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

This Master Interlocal Agreement (“Agreement”) is made by and between Region One Education Service Center (“Region One”) and Garland ISD (“Member”), (collectively referred to as the “Parties”) acting herein by and through their respectively authorized officers or employees.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code authorizes local governments to contract with each other to provide governmental functions and services; and
WHEREAS, the Parties wish to enter into this Agreement to provide local governments with greater efficiency and economy in purchasing products and services; and
NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of and conditioned upon the mutual covenants and agreements, herein, the Parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. **TERM:** This Agreement is effective from the date of the last signature and shall automatically renew for services and/or goods selected for successive one-year terms unless either party gives sixty (60) days prior written notice of non-renewal. Notice of such non-renewal shall be sent according to Paragraph 13. The conditions set forth herein shall apply to the initial term and all subsequent renewals.
2. **TERMINATION:** Either party will be in default of this Agreement if such party fails to comply with any obligation in this Agreement and such failure continues for ten (10) days after receiving written notice from the non-defaulting party. In the event of default, the non-defaulting party, upon written notice to the defaulting Party, may terminate this Agreement for cause as of the date specified in the notice, and may seek other relief as provided by law. Region One or the Member may terminate this Agreement in writing at any time upon providing at least thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. The Member agrees to pay an amount which bears the same ratio to the total compensation as the services actually performed to the total services of this Agreement, less any compensation previously paid. The Member acknowledges that some service contracts accompanying this Agreement may not be subject to early termination and therefore early termination in such situations is void.
3. **SCOPE:** The scope of this Agreement is limited to the purchase of goods and/or services, other than engineering or architectural services or construction services, governed by the contracts between Region One and vendors offering such services/goods. The purchase of goods includes the purchase of any services reasonably required for the installation, operation, or maintenance of the goods. The Member acknowledges and agrees that the terms of the contracts between Region One and the vendors providing such goods and/or services are incorporated as if they were fully set out herein. The Member shall abide by the terms of the contracts for the goods/services the Member elects to purchase.
4. **ELECTION OF GOODS AND/OR SERVICES:** A list of the goods/services available for contracting through this Agreement is contained in the Election of Goods and/or Services Form, attached hereto as Exhibit A. Upon entering into this Agreement, the Member shall indicate on the Election of Goods and/or Services all goods and/or services the Member seeks to purchase for the initial term of this Agreement. If Member elects to purchase different goods and/or services for subsequent renewal terms, Member shall complete an

updated Exhibit A, which will be effective upon the start of the renewal term. If Member does not complete an updated Exhibit A, then the election(s) contained in the present Exhibit A shall control for the term of the renewal(s).

5. RELATIONSHIP: The relationship between the Parties is that of independent contractor. Neither party has the authority to bind the other in any manner.

6. MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES: The Member understands that certain federal requirements involve circumstances unique to the Member's transaction and must be completed by the Member. At the time of procurement, specific information about the Member's transaction is unavailable to Region One, including the funding source to be used, the total value of the transaction, any specific requirements of a particular grant, or the Member's local policy requirements. As a result, the Member is ultimately responsible for compliance with certain applicable requirements and is advised to consult with the Member's legal counsel or granting agency to confirm compliance with any applicable regulations. Depending on the value or nature of a specific transaction, specific grant conditions, or other requirements, the Member may be required to:

- a. Maintain written procedures regarding conflicts of interest of employees engaged in the selection, award, and administration of contracts or purchasing;
- b. Avoid the purchase of unnecessary or duplicative items;
- c. Prepare an Independent Estimate and conduct a Cost and Price Analysis where the total cost of any transaction will exceed the simplified acquisition threshold, and negotiate profit as a separate cost item (if a cost analysis is performed);
- d. Take any necessary steps to ensure minority businesses, women's businesses, and labor surplus area firms are used when possible (i.e. dividing a project into smaller tasks or quantities to maximize participation by small, minority, and women owned businesses); and/or
- e. Ensure compliance with provisions related to recovered materials and domestic preferences.

7. COOP MEMBERSHIP: The Member understands that by executing this Agreement it agrees to be a member of the Region One Coop.

8. CURRENT REVENUES: The Member hereby warrants that all payments required of it pursuant to this Agreement shall be made from current revenues budgeted and available to the Member.

9. PAYMENT TERMS: Invoices are generated upon selection of goods/services. Invoices shall be payable to Region One in accordance with the provisions of the Prompt Pay Act Texas Government Code Chapter 2251, within forty-five (45) days after the Member's receipt of the invoice and delivery of the goods or services, and interest shall be payable by the Member on all past due amounts at the rate specified in Section 2251.025(b), Texas Government Code.

10. SOFTWARE SERVICES: Should the Member elect to purchase any of the software services offered by Region One, the Member understands that it may be required to execute a license agreement for such software. If a license agreement is required for purchase and use of any software, the Member agrees to execute such agreement in a timely manner.

11. ENERGY COOPERATIVES: As detailed in the corresponding contract documents for any energy cooperatives, Member's membership in such groups is coterminous with Region One's membership.

12. OWNERSHIP OF WORK PRODUCT: All work product, including any concepts, products, research, reports, studies, data, or other documents, drawings or materials prepared by Region One in the performance of its obligations under this Agreement shall not be works for hire and shall remain the exclusive property of Region

One. Any programs, data or other materials furnished by Region One for use by Member in connection with the Services performed under this Agreement will remain Region One's property, subject to any superseding licensing agreement or intellectual property rights of third parties.

13. NOTICE: Any notice required or permitted by this Agreement must be in writing and addressed to the party at the address set forth below, or such other address as is subsequently specified in writing. Notices will be effective as the date: (i) delivered by hand, (ii) delivered by national courier service or Registered/Certified Mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, (iii) received by facsimile, or (iv) received by email.

14. AMENDMENTS: Region One may, from time to time, amend the terms of this Agreement including a change in program selection and an adjustment in the program fees, as may be necessary for the reasonable supervision and administration of this Agreement and to defray its reasonable administrative costs. No amendment shall become effective until the beginning of the next renewal term; provided, Region One has given not less than 60 days written notice. As detailed herein, on an annual basis, Member has the option to execute an updated Election of Goods and Services, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and may, for such upcoming renewal term, make changes to the goods/services it purchases except where not allowable under a specific program. Member is responsible for providing Region One with evidence that Exhibit A is duly authorized and payable from current appropriated funds of Member's governing body.

15. AUTHORIZATION: By entering into this Agreement, Member certifies that it has received board authorization for all expenditures for services and/or goods provided pursuant to this Agreement.
