
Roads in the City

- 379 miles of public roads in the City of Farmington Hills
- Roads are owned by various agencies:
 - State of Michigan – 49 Miles
(I-696, I-275, M-5, M-10, Grand River Ave.)
 - Road Commission for Oakland County – 30 Miles
(12 Mile, 10 Mile, Orchard Lake, Middlebelt, Haggerty)
 - City of Farmington Hills – 300 Miles
(Major Roads and Local Roads)

City-Owned Roads

- The City of Farmington Hills is responsible for 300 miles of public roads
- Roads fall into several categories
 - Major roads
(i.e. 13 Mile Road, 11 Mile Road, Drake Road, etc.)
 - Local roads: neighborhoods and subdivision streets
(i.e. Kendallwood Drive, Lundy, Bridgeman St.)
 - City industrial roads
(i.e. Hills Tech Drive, Industrial Park Drive, etc.)
 - City gravel roads

Current City Road Funding


- State Road Revenue (ACT 51) passed to City:
 - Fuel taxes and vehicle registration fees
 - Pays for road operations and maintenance
 - Snow plowing and salting, patching, crack sealing, gravel road grading, forestry and landscaping, road striping, traffic signals, and signs
- Federal and State Grants (Major Roads):
 - Awarded on a project-by-project basis
 - Fluctuates year to year
 - Can only be used for qualifying projects
- 2014 Road Millage – 2.0 Mills **EXPIRING**
 - Major mile road reconstruction
 - Improved preventative maintenance and reconstruction on City major mile roads
 - Improved preventative maintenance on City local roads
 - Additional resources for local road construction projects
- 2018 Road Millage – 2.75 Mills
 - Included Charter Amendment removing requirement for Special Assessments for neighborhood road improvements
 - Established dedicated funding for local, neighborhood roads


Pavement Management Process

 - Standard method used to collect road surface condition data
 - Visual assessment of road surface on a scale of 1-10
 - 10 is new construction and 1 is totally failed



Major Road Condition Progress




Local Road Condition Progress








Proposed Public Roads Millage

- Renewal of 2014 Road Millage
- 2.0 mills (same as 2014)
- Will generate ~ \$9+ million annually
- Allows continued investment in public roads
- Maintains progress toward improved road conditions on City owned roads

Financial Impact to Residents

- The average sale price for a home in Farmington Hills will be approximately \$360,000 in 2025, with a taxable value of approximately \$120,000;
- To determine the cost of the millage for the average home:
 - **Homes taxable value x millage rate/1000**
 - **Example: \$120,000 x 2.0 millage rate/1000 = \$240 annually (an increase of approximately \$20 over 2014)**

Goals and Expectations

- Sustained road funding ensures continued progress
- Improved safety for pedestrians and motorists
- Reduced wear and tear on vehicles
- Keeps the City a desirable location to live, work and do business
- Enhanced asset management
- Improved property curb appeal
- Stabilize and improve property values

Proposed Ballot Language

Shall Section 7.02e of the Farmington Hills City Charter be amended to allow a renewal of the previous voter-approved additional special tax rate for purposes of the improvement, rehabilitation, repair and maintenance of public roads, streets and road drainage within the City by authorizing the City to levy a millage in the amount of 2.0 mills (being \$2 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of ten years, starting with the July 2025 levy and resulting in the authorization to collect an estimated \$9,000,000 in the first year if approved and levied?






Millage Renewal

On November 5, 2024, Farmington and Farmington Hills voters will be asked to consider a **20-year renewal** of the Farmington Community Library's summer operating millage.

The November 5th ballot question proposes a millage renewal at the rate of 0.9264 mills. **This is equivalent to the current summer millage rate; FCL is not requesting an increase.** Funds levied by this millage account for 55% of the Library's total revenue on average each year. This millage funds normal Library operations.





Operating Millage Calculation

- Non-Homestead Millage Rate
 - Authorized - 21.0 mills
 - MAX Levy Annually - 18.0 mills
- Homestead Millage Rate
 - Annual Calculation
 - $\$1,876 \text{ pp} \times \text{Enrollment} = \text{Property Taxes to collect}$
 - $\text{Property Taxes} / \text{Taxable Value} = \text{Millage Rate}$

Key Elements

- About 27 percent of the District's revenue is currently derived from this Renewal. This millage pays for teachers and staffing costs, daily operational expenses, and instructional materials.
- This is different from the recently passed bond proposal that is paying for infrastructure, buses, and technology.
- Without this millage in place, the District would lose more than \$49 million annually and the state would not make up the shortfall. The loss of this revenue would mean a drastic change in our programming.

Please find enclosed the subject resolution, provided by Jim Crowley of Miller, Canfield, Paddock & Stone, which requires Board approval.

Our 2015 Series I bonds are callable in May 2025 and based upon the current market conditions can provide savings of approximately \$4.2 million for our taxpayers. This could result in a decreased debt millage rate in the future, however this is dependent upon taxable values. We plan on using a negotiated sale with Stifel, Nicolaus & Company as our Underwriter, as we have for the previous bond sales, as this will allow us to proceed with the sale in early 2025 when the market conditions are the most favorable. Our financial advisor will continue to be PFM Financial Advisors, LLC. The Board will be asked to approve this resolution at the October 22, 2024 board meeting.

Jim is unable to be in attendance at the Board meeting, however Alan Szuma from Miller Canfield will attend to review the resolution and answer any questions you may have. Brodi Kilian, financial advisor from PFM (Public Financial Management) Financial Advisors, LLC will also be at the Board Meeting to answer any questions you might have regarding the sale of the bonds and timing.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING
2025 REFUNDING BONDS
(UNLIMITED TAX GENERAL OBLIGATION)**

At a regular meeting of the Board of Education (the “Board”) of the Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland, State of Michigan (the “School District”), held in the School District on October 22, 2024, at 6:00 p.m., local time.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member _____ and supported by Member _____.

WHEREAS, Act 34, Public Acts of Michigan, 2001, as amended, the Revised Municipal Finance Act (the “Act 34”), permits the School District to refund all or part of the funded indebtedness of the School District; and

WHEREAS, the School District has previously issued its 2015 School Building and Site and Refunding Bonds (Unlimited Tax General Obligation), dated June 25, 2015 (the “Prior Bonds”); and

WHEREAS, the School District has determined that it is in the best interest of the School District to issue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$45,500,000 to currently refund all or a portion of the callable maturities of the Prior Bonds (the “Refunded Bonds”); and

WHEREAS, the School District desires to sell the bonds pursuant to a negotiated sale in order to preserve maximum flexibility in the timing and structure of the transaction and to minimize the costs of issuance thereof; and

WHEREAS, the School District also deems it advisable to authorize the Superintendent and the Assistant Superintendent for Business Services, or either one acting alone (each an “Authorized Officer”) to accept an offer to purchase the bonds from an underwriter, negotiate, approve and execute a bond purchase agreement with the underwriter and to approve various other terms and documents in connection with the sale and delivery of the bonds to the underwriter; and

WHEREAS, the School District must either be granted qualified status within the meaning of Act 34 or receive prior approval of the bonds from the Michigan Department of Treasury (“Treasury”).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Issuance of Bonds. Bonds of the School District designated 2025 Refunding Bonds (Unlimited Tax General Obligation) (the “Bonds”), are hereby authorized to be issued in one or more series, with such changes to the bond name, designation or suffix as may be appropriate for each series based on the type of bonds issued, in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$45,500,000, or such lesser amount as shall be determined by an Authorized Officer upon sale of the Bonds, for the purpose of currently refunding the Refunded Bonds and paying costs of issuing the Bonds.

2. Bond Details. The Bonds shall consist of bonds registered as to principal and interest of the denomination of \$5,000 or integral multiples thereof, be dated as of such date as shall be determined by an Authorized Officer at the time of sale of the Bonds and numbered as determined by the Transfer Agent (as defined below). The Bonds shall mature on May 1 and/or November 1 in the years and in the principal amounts as determined by an Authorized Officer at the time of sale. The Bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates to be determined upon negotiated sale thereof, but in any event not exceeding a true interest cost of 4.50%, payable semi-annually on May 1 and November 1 in the years as determined by the Authorized Officer at the time of sale, *provided that* the net present value savings to be realized by the School District shall be not less than 3.00% of the principal amount of the Refunded Bonds, and the underwriter’s discount shall not exceed 0.75% of the principal amount of the Bonds.

The principal of the Bonds shall be payable at a bank or trust company selected by an Authorized Officer, as registrar and transfer agent for the Bonds (the “Transfer Agent”) upon presentation and surrender of the appropriate Bond. Interest on the Bonds shall be paid by check drawn on the Transfer Agent, mailed to the registered owner of the Bonds at the registered address, as shown on the registration books of the School District maintained by the Transfer Agent. Interest on the Bonds shall be paid by check drawn on the Transfer Agent mailed to the registered owner of the Bonds at the registered address, as shown on the registration books of the School District maintained by the Transfer Agent. Interest shall be payable to the registered owner of record as of the fifteenth day of the month prior to the payment date for each interest payment. The date of determination of registered owner for purposes of payment of interest as provided in this paragraph may be changed by the School District to conform to market practice in the future.

The Bonds may be issued in book-entry-only form through The Depository Trust Company in New York, New York.

The Bonds of any series may be issued as serial or term bonds or both and shall be subject to optional or mandatory redemption prior to maturity at the times, in the manner, in the amounts and at the prices determined by the Authorized Officer at the time of sale of the Bonds.

Unless waived by any registered owner of any Bonds to be redeemed, official notice of redemption shall be given by the Transfer Agent on behalf of the School District. Such notice shall be dated and shall contain at a minimum the following information: original issue date; maturity dates; interest rates; CUSIP numbers, if any; certificate numbers (and in the case of partial redemption) the called amounts of each certificate; the redemption date; the redemption price; the place where Bonds called for redemption are to be surrendered for payment; and that interest on Bonds or portions thereof called for redemption shall cease to accrue from and after the redemption date.

In addition, further notice shall be given by the Transfer Agent in such manner as may be required or suggested by regulations or market practice at the applicable time, but no defect in such further notice nor any failure to give all or any portion of such further notice shall in any manner defeat the effectiveness of a call for redemption if notice thereof is given as prescribed herein.

3. Bond Form and Execution of Bonds. The Bonds shall be in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A with such changes as are authorized by the terms of this Resolution or necessary to complete the provisions hereof. The Bonds shall be signed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the President and Secretary of the Board. No Bonds shall be valid until authenticated by an authorized representative of the Transfer Agent. The Bonds shall be delivered to the Transfer Agent for authentication and be delivered by it to the purchaser in accordance with instructions from the Treasurer of the Board upon payment of the purchase price for the Bonds in accordance with the bond purchase agreement therefor when accepted. Executed blank bonds for registration and issuance to transferees may simultaneously, and from time to time thereafter as necessary, be delivered to the Transfer Agent for safekeeping.

4. Debt Retirement Fund. Unless the School District establishes a Common Debt Retirement Fund as provided by law for all issues of bonds of like character of the School District, the Treasurer shall open a special depository account for the Bonds with a bank to be designated as the 2025 Refunding Bonds Debt Retirement Fund (the "Debt Retirement Fund"). All proceeds from taxes levied for the payment of the principal of, interest on and redemption premium, if any, for the Bonds shall be deposited into the Debt Retirement Fund or the Common Debt Retirement Fund, if one is established. Once the Debt Retirement Fund is established, the moneys deposited in such fund shall be used solely for the purpose of paying the principal of, interest on and redemption premium, if any, for the Bonds. If the School District establishes a Common Debt Retirement Fund, the moneys deposited in that fund shall be used solely for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and other bonds of like character of the School District payable from the Common Debt Retirement Fund. The accrued interest, if any, received upon delivery of the Bonds shall also be deposited in the appropriate debt retirement fund. Taxes required to be levied to meet the principal and interest obligations and redemption premiums, if any, may be without limitation as to rate or amount, as provided by Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution of 1963.

5. Bond Proceeds. Proceeds of the Bonds shall be used to pay the costs of issuance of the Bonds and to secure payment of the Refunded Bonds as provided in this paragraph. From the proceeds of the Bonds there shall be set aside a sum sufficient to pay the costs of issuance of

the Bonds in a fund designated the 2025 Refunding Bonds Costs of Issuance Fund (the “Costs of Issuance Fund”). Moneys in the Costs of Issuance Fund shall be used solely to pay expenses of issuance of the Bonds. Any amounts remaining in the Costs of Issuance Fund after payment of issuance expenses shall be transferred to the Debt Retirement Fund for the Bonds. The balance of the proceeds of the Bonds, together with any moneys transferred by the School District at the time of sale of the Bonds from the debt retirement fund for the Refunded Bonds, and any other available funds provided by the School District, shall be invested in direct obligations of or obligations the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of America or other obligations the principal of and interest on which are fully secured by the foregoing in one or more funds (the “Escrow Fund”) and used to pay principal of and interest on the Refunded Bonds. The Escrow Fund shall be held by a bank or trust company, as trustee and escrow agent (the “Escrow Agent”), in trust pursuant to an Escrow Agreement (the “Escrow Agreement”) which shall irrevocably direct the Trustee to take all necessary steps to call for redemption the Refunded Bonds specified by the Authorized Officer upon sale of the Bonds, including publication and mailing of redemption notices, on any date specified by the Authorized Officer on which the Refunded Bonds may be called for redemption. The investments held in the Escrow Fund shall be such that the principal and interest payments received thereon will be sufficient, without reinvestment, to pay the principal of and interest on the Refunded Bonds as they become due pursuant to maturity or the call for redemption required by this paragraph, and the Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to select and retain on behalf of the School District an Escrow Agent to serve under the Escrow Agreement.

6. Unlimited Tax. Commencing with the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, it shall be the duty of the School District to levy a tax annually in an amount sufficient so that the estimated collections therefrom will be sufficient to pay promptly when due the principal of and interest becoming due on the Bonds, which tax levies shall not be subject to limitation as to rate or amount.

7. Negotiated Sale. The School District has considered the option of selling the Bonds through a competitive sale and a negotiated sale and, pursuant to the requirements of Act 34, and based on the advice of the Municipal Advisor (as defined below) has determined that a negotiated sale of the Bonds provides the School District with greater flexibility in structuring bond maturities and the timing of the sale of the Bonds, and will enable the School District to better market the Bonds to the advantage of the School District and its taxpayers.

8. Retention of Underwriter and Execution of Bond Purchase Agreement. The School District hereby appoints Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, Incorporated as senior managing underwriter for the Bonds (the “Underwriter”). Each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to appoint one or more co-managing underwriters, if recommended by the Municipal Advisor. Each Authorized Officer is further authorized to negotiate and award the sale of the Bonds to the Underwriter pursuant to a bond purchase agreement, subject to the parameters set forth in this Resolution. Each Authorized Officer is authorized to execute and deliver the bond purchase agreement on behalf of the School District without further approval of the Board, *provided that* the true interest cost on the Bonds shall not exceed 4.50%, the net present value savings to be realized by the School District shall be not less than 3.00% of the principal amount of the

Refunded Bonds and the underwriter's discount shall not exceed 0.75% of the principal amount of the Bonds..

An Authorized Officer may, without further approval or direction from the Board, execute a sale order evidencing the final terms of the Bonds, and make any of the determinations, covenants and elections authorized by this Resolution, provided that the final terms of the Bonds shall be within the parameters set forth in this Resolution.

9. Ratings and Bond Insurance. Each Authorized Officer is authorized to apply for bond ratings from municipal bond rating agencies if deemed appropriate and apply for and purchase a policy of municipal bond insurance, if deemed appropriate by the Municipal Advisor and Bond Counsel (as defined below).

10. Official Statements. The President of the Board and the Authorized Officer are each hereby authorized to approve preliminary and final official statements relating to the Bonds as is deemed appropriate by the Municipal Advisor and Bond Counsel. The President of the Board or an Authorized Officer are further authorized to execute and deliver the final Official Statement relating to the Bonds on behalf of the School District and to approve, execute and deliver any amendments and supplements to the Official Statement necessary to assure that the statements therein are, and as of the time the Bonds are delivered to the Underwriter will be true, and that it does not contain any untrue statement of a material fact and does not omit to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements therein, in light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading.

11. Continuing Disclosure Undertaking. The School District hereby covenants, in accordance with the provisions of Rule 15c2-12, promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission, as may be amended (the "Rule"), if required pursuant to the Rule, to provide or cause to be provided the information set forth in the attached Exhibit B, as such Exhibit may be revised by an Authorized Officer as required by the Rule prior to delivery of the Bonds.

12. Tax Matters. The School District hereby covenants that, to the extent permitted by law, it shall take all actions within its control necessary to maintain the exclusion of the interest on the Bonds from adjusted gross income for federal income tax purposes under the Code, including, but not limited to, actions relating to the rebate of arbitrage earnings, if applicable, and the expenditure and investment of Bond proceeds and moneys deemed to be Bond proceeds.

13. Further Bond Details. Each Authorized Officer is hereby individually authorized to adjust the final Bond details to the extent necessary or convenient to complete the transaction authorized in this Resolution, and in pursuance of the foregoing is authorized to exercise the authority and make the determinations authorized pursuant to Section 315(1)(d) of Act 34, including but not limited to, determinations regarding interest rates, prices, discounts, maturities, principal amounts, denominations, dates of issuance, interest payment dates, redemption rights, the place of delivery and payment, designation of series, and other matters, all subject to the parameters established in this Resolution.

14. Retention of Bond Counsel and Municipal Advisor. The law firm of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C. is hereby appointed as bond counsel for the School District with reference to the issuance of the Bonds authorized by this Resolution (“Bond Counsel”). The representation of the School District by Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C. as Bond Counsel is hereby confirmed and approved, notwithstanding Miller, Canfield’s periodic representation in unrelated matters of the Underwriter, Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, Incorporated, and other potential parties to the transactions contemplated by this Resolution. The School District also hereby appoints PFM Financial Advisors LLC to act as financial advisor with reference to the issuance of the Bonds authorized by this Resolution (the “Municipal Advisor”).

15. Department of Treasury. Each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to make application to Treasury for prior approval to issue the Bonds or file a qualifying statement. Each Authorized Officer or Bond Counsel, on behalf of the School District, is further authorized to request any and all waivers, including without limitation, rating waivers, or exemptions from Treasury necessary to the issuance of the Bonds as recommended by the Municipal Advisor and Bond Counsel. Each Authorized Officer is authorized to have prepared and filed a Security Report with Treasury pursuant to Act 34.

16. Further Actions. The officers, administrators, agents and attorneys of the School District are authorized and directed to execute and deliver all other agreements, documents and certificates and to take all other actions necessary to complete the issuance and delivery of the Bonds in accordance with this Resolution. The officers, administrators, agents and attorneys of the School District are authorized and directed to pay costs of issuance including Bond Counsel fees, Municipal Advisor fees, rating agency fees, Transfer Agent fees, costs of printing the preliminary and final official statements, and any other costs necessary to accomplish sale and delivery of the Bonds.

Bonds maturing in the years 20__ and thereafter shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity, at the option of the School District, in any order of maturity, and by lot within a single maturity, on any date on or after _____, 20__. Bonds or portions thereof called for redemption shall be redeemed at par plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

In case less than the full amount of an outstanding bond is called for redemption, the Transfer Agent, upon presentation of the bond called in part for redemption, shall register, authenticate and deliver to the registered owner of record a new bond in the principal amount of the portion of the original bond not called for redemption.

No further interest shall accrue on the bonds or portions of bonds called for redemption after the date fixed for redemption, whether presented for redemption or not, provided funds are on hand with the Transfer Agent to redeem the same.

Any bond may be transferred by a registered owner, in person or by the registered owner's authorized attorney or legal representative, upon surrender of the bond to the Transfer Agent for cancellation, together with a duly executed written instrument of transfer in a form approved by the Transfer Agent. Whenever any bond is surrendered for transfer, the Transfer Agent shall authenticate and deliver a new bond or bonds, in like aggregate principal amount, interest rate and maturity. The Transfer Agent shall require the owner requesting the transfer to pay any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to the transfer. This Continuing Disclosure Undertaking (the “Undertaking”) is executed and delivered by the Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland, State of Michigan (the “School District”), in connection with the issuance of its 2025 Refunding Bonds (Unlimited Tax General Obligation) (the “Bonds”). The School District covenants and agrees for the benefit of the Bondholders, as hereinafter defined, as follows:

(a) *Definitions.* The following terms used herein shall have the following meanings:

“Audited Financial Statements” means the annual audited financial statement pertaining to the School District prepared by an individual or firm of independent certified public accountants as required by Act 2, Public Acts of Michigan, 1968, as amended, which presently requires preparation in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

“Bondholders” shall mean the registered owner of any Bond or any person (a) with the power, directly or indirectly, to vote or consent with respect to, or to dispose of ownership of, any Bond (including any person holding a Bond through a nominee, depository or other intermediary) or (b) treated as the owner of any Bond for federal income tax purposes.

“EMMA” shall mean the MSRB’s Electronic Municipal Market Access District, or such other District, Internet Web site, or repository hereafter prescribed by the MSRB for the submission of electronic filings pursuant to the Rule.

“Financial Obligation” means “financial obligation” as such term is defined in the Rule.

“MSRB” means the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board.

“Rule” means Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the SEC pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, as in effect on the date of this Undertaking, including any official interpretations thereof issued either before or after the date of this Undertaking which are applicable to this Undertaking.

“SEC” means the United States Securities and Exchange Commission.

(b) *Continuing Disclosure.* The School District hereby agrees, in accordance with the provisions of the Rule, to provide or cause to be provided to the MSRB through EMMA, on or before the last day of the 6th month after the end of the fiscal year of the School District, the following annual financial information and operating data,

commencing with the fiscal year ended June 30, 2025, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB:

(1) Updates of the numerical financial information and operating data included in the official statement of the School District relating to the Bonds (the “Official Statement”) appearing in the Tables in the Official Statement as described below: [Headings to be conformed to Official Statement when available.]

- a. ENROLLMENT – Historical Enrollment;
- b. STATE AID PAYMENTS;
- c. PROPERTY VALUATIONS – History of Valuations;
- d. MAJOR TAXPAYERS;
- e. SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX RATES - (Per \$1,000 of Valuation);
- f. TAX LEVIES AND COLLECTIONS;
- g. RETIREMENT PLAN – Contribution TO MPSERS;
- h. LABOR RELATIONS;
- i. DEBT STATEMENT – DIRECT DEBT;
- j. LEGAL DEBT MARGIN;
- k. GENERAL FUND BUDGET SUMMARY, in Appendix B.

(2) The Audited Financial Statements. provided, however, that if the Audited Financial Statements are not available by the date specified above, they shall be provided when available and unaudited financial statements will be filed by such date and the Audited Financial Statements will be filed as soon as available

Such annual financial information and operating data described above are expected to be provided directly by the School District or by specific reference to documents available to the public through EMMA or filed with the SEC.

If the fiscal year of the School District is changed, the School District shall send a notice of such change to the MSRB through EMMA, prior to the earlier of the ending date of the fiscal year prior to such change or the ending date of the fiscal year as changed.

(c) *Notice of Failure to Disclose.* The School District agrees to provide or cause to be provided, in a timely manner, to the MSRB through EMMA, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB, notice of a failure by the School District to provide the annual financial information with respect to the School District described in subsection (b) above on or prior to the dates set forth in subsection (b) above.

(d) *Occurrence of Events.* The School District agrees to provide or cause to be provided to the MSRB through EMMA, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB, in a timely manner not in excess of ten business days after the occurrence of the event, notice of the occurrence of any of the following events listed in (b)(5)(i)(C) of the Rule with respect to the Bonds:

- (1) principal and interest payment delinquencies;
- (2) non-payment related defaults, if material;
- (3) unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;
- (4) unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
- (5) substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
- (6) adverse tax opinions, the issuance by the Internal Revenue Service of proposed or final determinations of taxability, Notices of Proposed Issue (IRS Form 5701-TEB) or other material notices or determinations with respect to the tax status of the Bonds, or other material events affecting the tax status of the Bonds;
- (7) modifications to rights of holders of the Bonds, if material;
- (8) bond calls, if material, and tender offers;
- (9) defeasances;
- (10) release, substitution, or sale of property securing repayment of the Bonds, if material;
- (11) rating changes;
- (12) bankruptcy, insolvency, receivership or similar event of the School District, which is considered to occur when any of the following occur: the appointment of a receiver, fiscal agent or similar officer for the School District in a proceeding under the U.S. Bankruptcy Code or in any other proceeding under state or federal law in which a court or governmental authority has assumed jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the School District, or if such jurisdiction has been assumed by leaving the existing governing body and officials or officers in possession but subject to the supervision and orders of a court or governmental authority, or the entry of an order confirming a plan of reorganization, arrangement or liquidation by a court or governmental authority having supervision or jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the School District;
- (13) the consummation of a merger, consolidation, or acquisition involving the School District or the sale of all or substantially all of the assets of the School District, other than in the ordinary course of business, the entry into a definitive agreement to undertake such an action or the termination of a definitive agreement relating to any such actions, other than pursuant to its terms, if material;
- (14) appointment of a successor or additional trustee or the change of name of a trustee, if material;
- (15) incurrence of a Financial Obligation of the School District, if material, or agreement to covenants, events of default, remedies, priority rights, or other similar terms of a Financial Obligation of the School District, any of which affect security holders, if material; or

(16) default, event of acceleration, termination event, modification of terms, or other similar events under the terms of a Financial Obligation of the School District, any of which reflect financial difficulties.

(e) *Materiality Determined Under Federal Securities Laws.* The School District agrees that its determination of whether any event listed in subsection (d) is material shall be made in accordance with federal securities laws.

(f) *Identifying Information.* All documents provided to the MSRB through EMMA shall be accompanied by the identifying information prescribed by the MSRB.

(g) *Termination of Reporting Obligation.* The obligation of the School District to provide annual financial information and notices of material events, as set forth above, shall be terminated if and when the School District no longer remains an “obligated person” with respect to the Bonds within the meaning of the Rule, including upon legal defeasance of all Bonds.

(h) *Benefit of Bondholders.* The School District agrees that its undertaking pursuant to the Rule set forth in this Undertaking is intended to be for the benefit of the Bondholders and shall be enforceable by any Bondholder; provided that, the right to enforce the provisions of this Undertaking shall be limited to a right to obtain specific enforcement of the School District’s obligations hereunder and any failure by the School District to comply with the provisions of this Undertaking shall not constitute a default or an event of default with respect to the Bonds.

(i) *Amendments to the Undertaking.* Amendments may be made in the specific types of information provided or the format of the presentation of such information to the extent deemed necessary or appropriate in the judgment of the School District, provided that the School District agrees that any such amendment will be adopted procedurally and substantively in a manner consistent with the Rule, including any interpretations thereof by the SEC, which, to the extent applicable, are incorporated herein by reference. Such interpretations currently include the requirements that (a) the amendment may only be made in connection with a change in circumstances that arises from a change in legal requirements, change in law, or change in the identity, nature, or status of the School District or the type of activities conducted thereby, (b) the undertaking, as amended, would have complied with the requirements of the Rule at the time of the primary offering of the Bonds, after taking into account any amendments or interpretations of the Rule, as well as any change in circumstances, and (c) the amendment does not materially impair the interests of Bondholders, as determined by parties unaffiliated with the School District (such as independent legal counsel), but such interpretations may be changed in the future. If the accounting principles to be followed by the School District in the preparing of the Audited Financial Statements are modified, the annual financial information for the year in which the change is made shall present a comparison between the financial statements as prepared on the prior basis and the statements as prepared on the new basis, and otherwise shall comply with the requirements of the Rule, in order to provide information to investors to enable them to

evaluate the ability of the School District to meet its obligations. A notice of the change in accounting principles shall be sent to the MSRB through EMMA.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY/BACKGROUND:

As we continue to implement the vision for technology use, we maintain focus on access and equity for all. With this in mind, we are in need of purchasing an additional 500 chromebooks for use by our students to ensure equitable access to instructional resources. If approved, these chromebooks will be deployed as necessary to maintain equitable access for all students. This purchase aligns with our bond planning and will be supported by the 2020 Bond.

RECOMMENDATION:

Administration recommends that the Board of Education authorize the purchase of 500 chromebooks in the amount of \$155,300 from Sehi Computer Products utilizing the REMC contract pricing.

IMPACT IF NOT APPROVED:

We will not have the necessary devices needed for student use.

NEXT STEPS IF APPROVED:

Farmington Public Schools will purchase and deploy these machines as needed to maintain our fleet of student devices.

Recommendation:

- **ADD exception language (shown in green) to the bylaws as shown.**

ARTICLE VI

ELECTION OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 2: Eligibility. Any Member is eligible to be elected to the Association’s Board of Directors. Only one Member from each Member School District is allowed to serve on the Board at any given time.

Exception. If a Member of the Board of Directors is elected or appointed to another Member School District Board of Education that is already represented on the Board of Directors, that Director may complete their current term on the Board of Directors.

Rationale:

- A conflict with our OCSBA bylaws will occur on January 1, 2025.
- **Description of the conflict with Article VI, Section 2 of the OCSBA bylaws:** A newly elected ISD Board of Education Trustee currently also serves on a LEA Board, which is an eligible seat on the OCSBA Board of Directors. However, when the LEA Board term expires on 12/31/2024, this Director will only serve on the ISD Board of Education which is already represented on the OCSBA Board of Directors.
- **The OCSBA Board of Directors recommends approval of additional bylaws language** that will provide an exception in this rare situation. The OCSBA Board of Directors is a working board. OCSBA elections have repeatedly shown that not enough active OCSBA Members are willing to serve on the OCSBA Board of Directors.
- **If the member school districts DO NOT approve this proposed exception,** the OCSBA Board of Directors will lose a Director on January 1, 2025.
- **If this proposed exception IS approved,** two (2) ISD Trustees will remain on the OCSBA Board of Directors until their current BOD terms end in June 2026. At the end of their current BOD terms, the exception will expire, and only one Member from the ISD Board of Education will be allowed to serve on the OCSBA Board of Directors.

Section 105 Oakland County Schools of Choice Program 2025-26 SY

The Farmington Public School District will be participating in the Section 105 Oakland County Schools of Choice program for the 2025-2026 school year:

Introduction and Background:

Our Intra-District Transfer (Internal) process provides resident families with a choice of a school building within the district that is not their home school. Requests for Intra-District (Internal) Transfers are the first placements to be made.

The District also accepts applications from employees who wish to have their non-resident children attend school within our district. "Employee" is defined as being "regular" part time or full time and excludes substitutes, non-faculty coaches and contract services. This enrollment option is termed PA-227 Non Resident Children of School District Employees (NRCSD) and is placed second. Employees can apply at any time and their children are placed in schools with open seats in the applicable grade level, except Farmington STEAM Academy. Any building or grade level that has been closed to Intra-District (Internal) Transfer would be closed to PA 227 Non Resident Employees as well.

Lastly, the Section 105 Limited Schools of Choice program was established by the State of Michigan to provide additional options to families regarding the education of their children. Under this program, if a family feels that their child(ren) will benefit by attending a participating school district outside of their home district; and, further, if there is space, then the family should be allowed this choice according to State guidelines. Section 105 is derived from a section within the State School Aid Act that specifically describes the School of Choice program and its process. Under Section 105, a pupil may transfer from one local school district to another local district within the same county or Intermediate School District (ISD). This choice option is the last option to be placed. Any building or grade level that has been closed to Intra-District (Internal) Transfer would be closed to Section 105 Limited Schools of Choice.

Proposed Timelines:

**Intra-District (Internal Transfers) and Out of District (Section 105 In County)
Schools of Choice:**

The timeframe for Intra-District (internal transfers) and Out-of-district schools of choice will be from **January 6th - February 14th, 2025.**

Intra-District Schools of Choice (Internal Transfers)
January 6th - January 24th 2025

Section 105 applications will be open to students in grades **K-9th grade students only** for the 2025-2026 School Year.

Section 105 Schools of Choice (Oakland County ISD Residents)
January 27th - February 14th 2025

Section 105 Schools of Choice

- After placement of Intra-District and PA227 students, remaining kindergarten through ninth grade spaces, not to exceed 2025-2026 staffing levels/ratios, to be opened for Section 105.
 - 20 seats open at each level, Kindergarten through 8th grade.
 - 40 seats open at ninth grade only.
- Grades 10 - 12 would be closed to Section 105 School of Choice.

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





Re: **Head Start Directors Monthly Report**

Program update:

- The Head Start program began September 4 and is currently full with 80 students with 6 students having an IEP.
- Parents completed an Ages and Stages Developmental Screenings with parents on each student, and teachers completed the DECA (Devereux's Early Childhood Assessment). The DECA is a nationally standardized assessment tool that helps teachers understand how students are progressing with respect to three key social and emotional skills: developing healthy relationships, learning to regulate emotions, and showing initiative.
- A first home visit was completed on all students. Staff reviewed various aspects of the program, reviewed the parent completed Ages and Stages Questionnaires, and took time to get to know children and parents before they came to school.
- All students received a school backpack at home visits courtesy of The Lutheran Church of the Shepherd King.
- The program received the fiscal year 2025 allocation of \$746,490. The Administration for Children and Families requires that we submit a continuation application each year as part of the grant process. This application will continue our funding for the period January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025. As part of shared governance between the Head Start Program and Farmington Public Schools, the 2025 Continuation Application Budget is shared with the Board of Education for permission to pursue this grant application. A non-federal share of 20% (\$191,008) is a required part of the contract for our program as well. The Head Start Policy Committee also votes on this application process. Signed Board of Education and Parent Policy Committee approval statements are uploaded with our application and budget.


