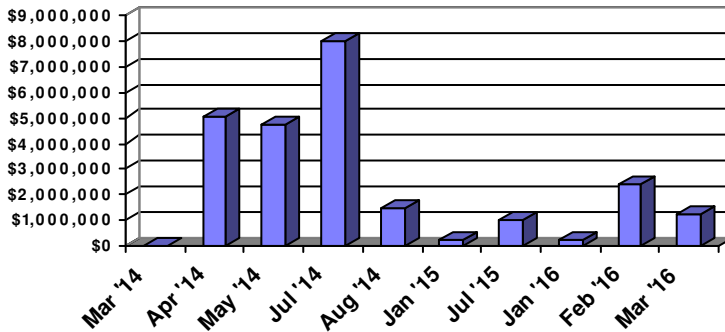

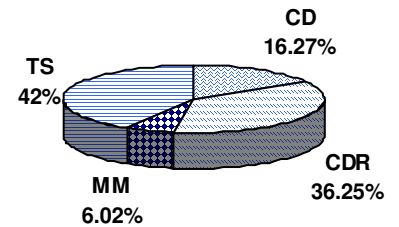

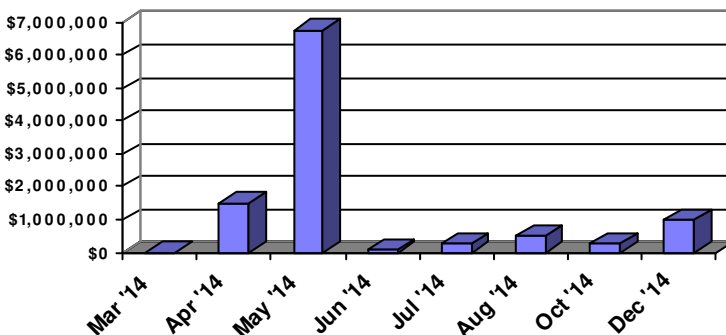

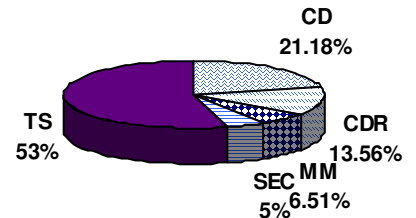

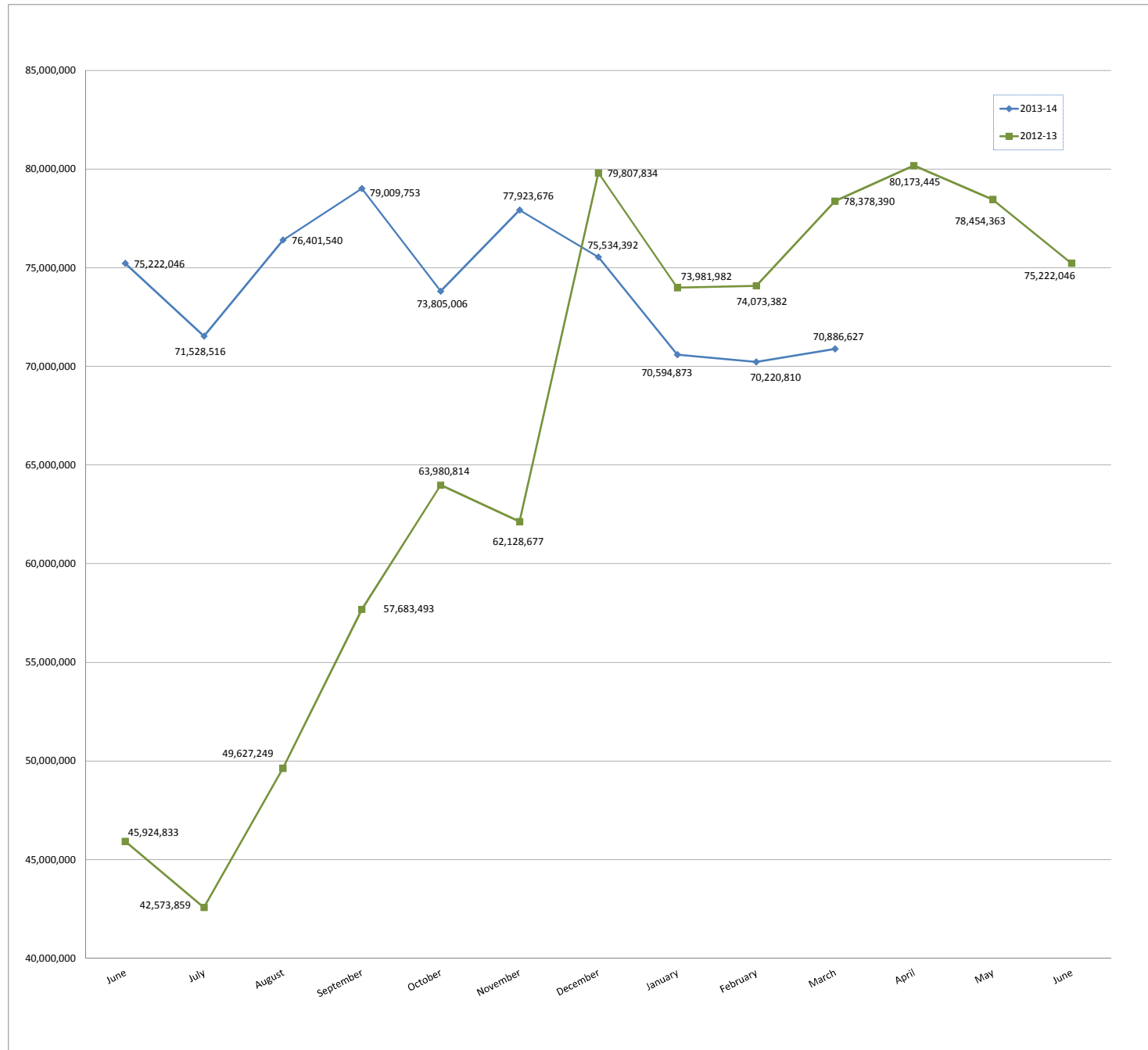

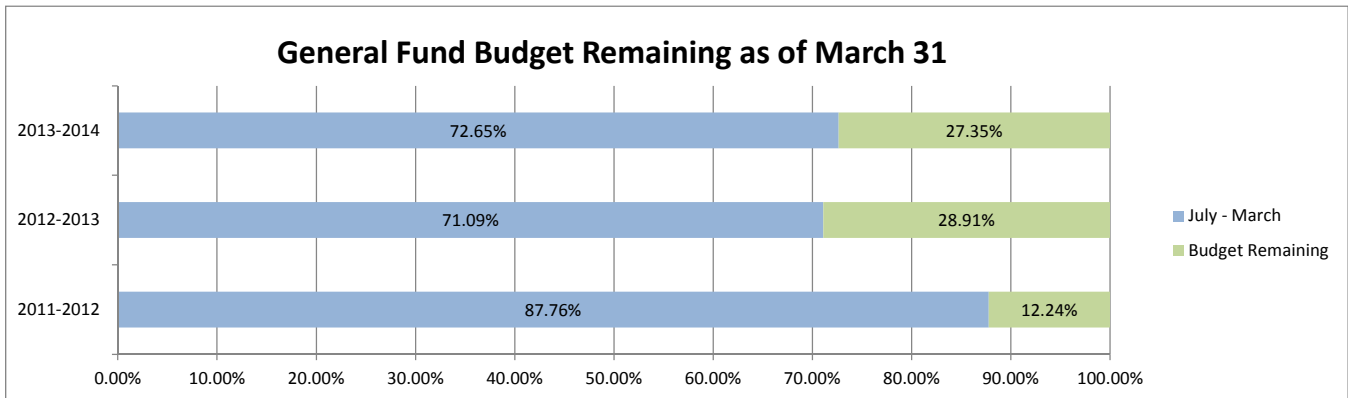
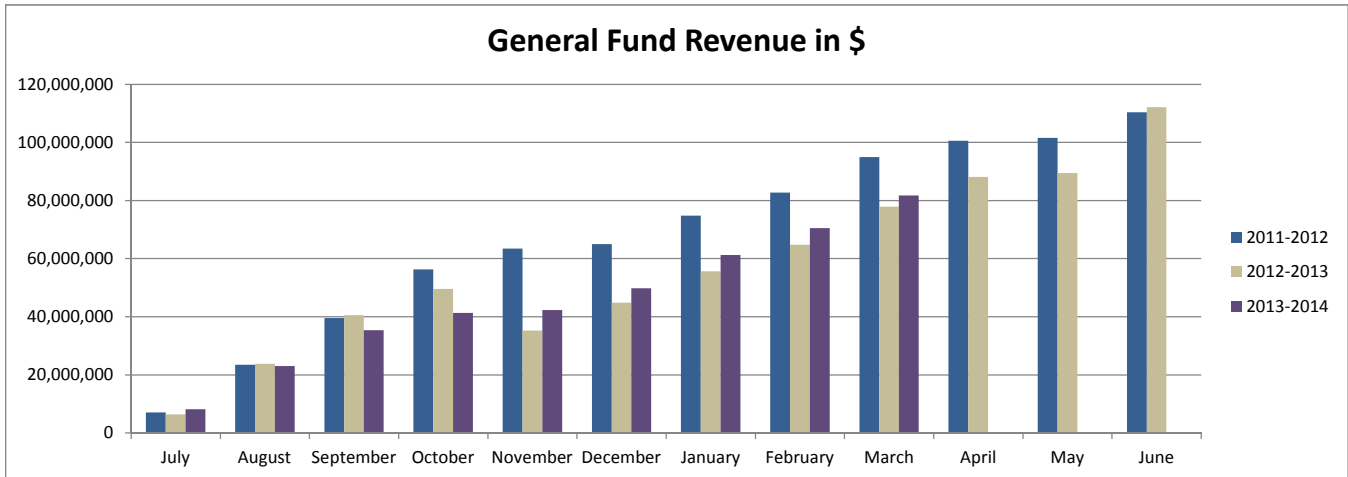


GENERAL FUND CASH AND INVESTMENTS

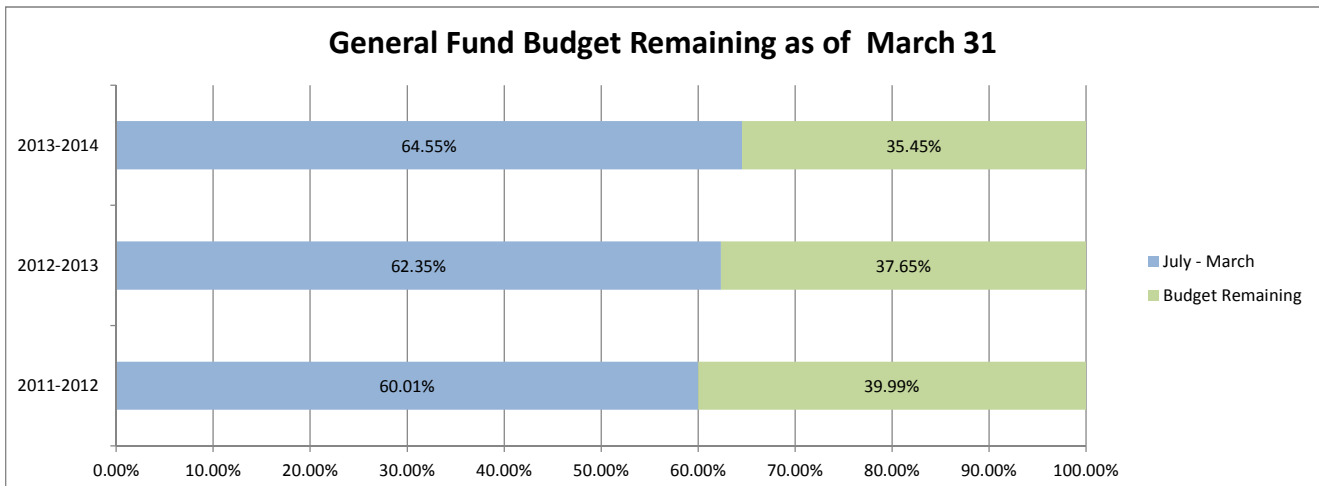
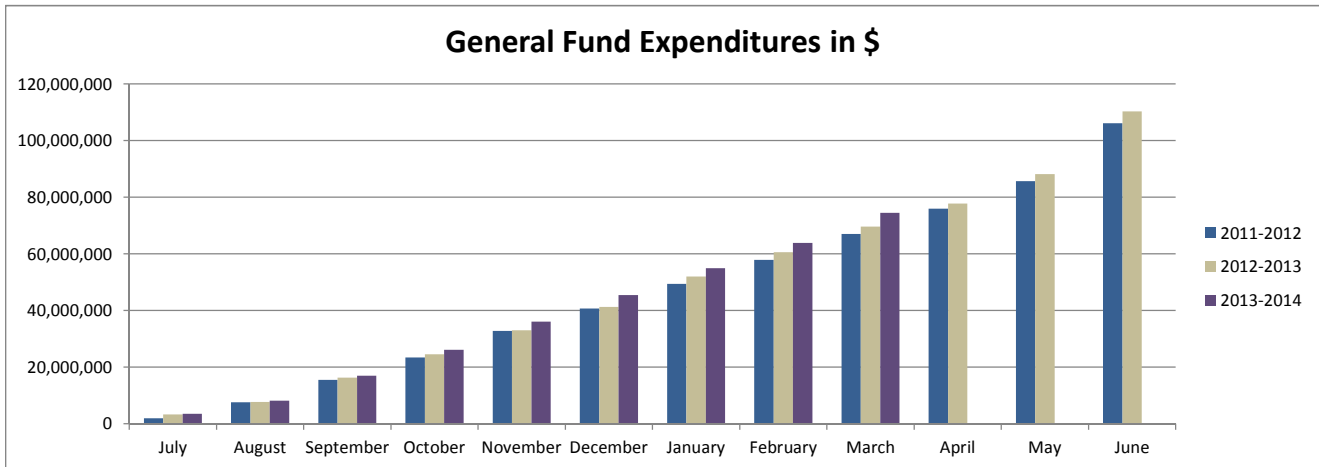

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**Policy 102 Equal Educational Opportunity**

Policy 214 Out-of-State Travel by School Board Members

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to control out-of-state travel by school board members as required by law.

II. SCOPE

This policy applies to elected members of the School Board serving in their official capacity.

III. DEFINITIONS

None.

IV. POLICY STATEMENT

Occasionally, it may be appropriate for school board members to travel out of state to fulfill their obligations. Travel outside the state is appropriate when it will contribute to school board members acquiring the knowledge and information necessary to more effectively carry out their responsibilities as school board members. Travel to out-of-state meetings, such as regional or national meetings of the National School Boards Association, for which the member intends to seek reimbursement from the school district must be preapproved by the School Board at a regularly scheduled meeting of the board.

Requests for reimbursement must adhere to the district’s expense reimbursement regulations, be itemized on the appropriate school district form and submitted to the Superintendent. Reimbursable expenses may include transportation, meals, lodging, registration fees, required materials, parking fees, tips, and other reasonable and necessary school district-related expenses. Receipts for lodging, commercial transportation, registration, and other reasonable and necessary expenses must be attached to the reimbursement form.

Amounts to be reimbursed for board member out-of-state travel, including registration fees, shall be within the school board’s approved budget allocations.

V. RESPONSIBILITIES

*Board Chair* – Ensure out-of-state travel for board members is preapproved at a regularly scheduled meeting of the board.

*Superintendent* – Assist board members in securing registrations, housing, and travel accommodations for board approved out-of-state travel. Receive and review requests for reimbursement in accordance with district regulations.

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**I. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to provide a fair employment setting for all persons in Independent School District 191 in compliance with state and federal law.

Any job applicant or employee wishing to discuss the need for a reasonable accommodation, or other matters related to a disability or the enforcement and application of this policy, should contact the Executive Director of Human Resources. This individual is the school district's appointed ADA/Section 504 coordinator for all employees.

**RE: Joint Powers agreement between the City of Eagan and ISD 191 – School Resource Officer**

**RECOMMENDATION:** That the Board approve the Joint Powers agreement between the City of Eagan and ISD 191 for the purpose of funding a school resource officer.

Currently ISD 191 has a joint powers agreement with the City of Savage for similar services which extend through the 2016-2017 school year. We have proposed a similar multi-year contract to the City of Eagan to establish costs and terms through the 2016-2017 school year. Our Burnsville Alternative High School and Metcalf Junior High each have the benefit of a half time equivalent School Resource Officer provided by the City of Eagan at this time. The agreement calls for a set amount annual payment by the district in return for the continued support at a total one full-time equivalent School Resource Officer(s) available between the two sites on the student attendance days.

School Resource Officers within our school have proven to be a very valuable resource for the district and we are very pleased to be able to share in this agreement with the City of Eagan.

## JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT

THIS JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") has been entered into as of April 18, 2014 by and between the City of Eagan a Minnesota Municipal Corporation, and political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, Independent School District No. 191 ("School District"), pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 471.59 and Chapter 469.

1. **PURPOSE.** The purpose of this Agreement is to create, fund, and implement the position of School Resource Officer.
2. **JOB DESCRIPTION.** The Officer will be assigned by the City. The Officer will report to and be directed by the Chief of Police for the City, but will consult regularly with the School District. A representative of the School District may take part in the School Resource Officer interview when the application process is initiated for the position. The Officer shall be assigned to Metcalf Junior High School as a .5 FTE and Cedar Alternative as a .5 FTE on days in which students are in attendance as part of the standard daily curriculum.
3. **FUNDING** The payment schedule for reimbursement to the City of Eagan for the term of this Agreement shall be set forth as follows:
  - 2014/2015 School Year - \$35,665
  - 2015/2016 School Year - \$36,734
  - 2016/2017 School Year - \$37,836
4. **BILLING.** The City shall invoice the School District on January 1, 2015 and annually each year thereafter consistent with the payment schedule..
5. **TERM.** This Agreement shall commence on April 18 2014. This Agreement shall automatically renew each year for 3 years or until revised by mutual consent or otherwise terminated by either party upon 90 days advance written notice. The School District reserves the right to reduce services required through this agreement provided 90 days advance written notice is given by the School District. Any change made to the required services shall result in a prorated adjustment to the payment schedule for reimbursement.
6. **CITY OF EAGAN EMPLOYEE.** The Officer is a City employee and shall not be considered an employee of the School District for any purpose, including, but not limited to salaries, wages, other compensation or fringe benefits, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, PERA, FICA, liability insurance, keeping of personnel records, termination of employment, individual contracts or other contractual rights.
7. **PROVISION, OWNERSHIP AND DISTRIBUTION OF PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT.** The School District will provide the Officer a secure furnished office space and telephone at no charge to the City. The City will furnish the Officer a car and other necessary law-enforcement equipment at no expense to the School District. Each party hereto shall maintain ownership of all property and equipment provided for and in furtherance of the purpose of this agreement. At the expiration of the term of this agreement, any property and equipment so provided shall remain the property of the party supplying or providing the property and equipment.
8. **DAMAGE TO PROPERTY OR EQUIPMENT.** Each party shall be responsible for damage to or loss of any property or equipment furnished thereby in furtherance of the purpose of this Agreement. Each party waives the right to sue the other party for any damages to or loss of its property or equipment, even if the damages were cause wholly or partially by the negligence of the other party, its officers, agents, or employees. Neither party shall be liable or responsible to the other party for depreciation of any property or equipment.

- 9. **INDEMNIFICATION.** Each party shall be liable for its own acts, and those of its respective officers, agents, and employees, to the extent provided by law and hereby agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the other party, its officers, agents, and employees against any and all liability, loss, costs, damages, expenses, claims or actions, including attorney's fees which the other, its officers and employees may hereafter sustain, incur or be required to pay, arising out of or by reason of any act or omission of the party, its agents, servants or employees, in the execution, performance, or failure to adequately perform its obligations pursuant to this Agreement. No party to this Agreement shall be required to pay on behalf of itself and to the other party any amount as indemnification to the party, arising pursuant to this Agreement expressly, by operation of law or otherwise, in excess of the limits of liability applicable to the party required to pay as established in Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466, or in the event that Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 does not apply, the maximum amount of insurance coverage available to the party required to pay. The limits of liability all of the parties may not be added together to increase the maximum amount of liability for any party. The intent of this section is to limit each party's obligation to indemnify the other party. In those instances in which a party is directly liable for damages as well as for indemnification to the other party, the combined liability of the party will not exceed the limits of liability under Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 applicable to the liable party or in the event that Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 does not apply, the maximum amount of insurance coverage available to the liable party.
  
- 10. **SEVERABILITY.** The provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed severable. If any part of this Agreement is rendered void, invalid, or unenforceable, such rendering shall not affect the enforceability and validity of the remainder of this Agreement unless the part or parts which are void, invalid or otherwise unenforceable shall substantially impair the value of the entire Agreement with respect to any party.
