DATE: January 26, 2024

ACTION

BACKGROUND:

A Long-Range Planning Committee, consisting of parents & non-parents, campus & district staff, community members, and business owners, was formed to study the capital improvement program for MISD. The committee also heard from district leaders regarding the needs for fine arts, athletics, career and technical education, safety and security, transportation, technology, and early childhood education. The committee met five times beginning in October of 2023 and concluding in January of 2024.

The committee was provided information regarding the last bond programs, tax rate and financial information, building capacity and enrollment projections, construction costs, and data from a community survey that was conducted at the end of December 2023. The committee prioritized the needs of the district and, made a recommendation to the Superintendent to consider a bond package totaling \$740,243,911 after their final meeting on January 11, 2024. The recommendation was studied by the Superintendent and Cabinet. After review, the Superintendent and Cabinet recommended including each project that had been recommended by the Long-Range Planning committee as well as three additional projects for a bond package totaling \$777,000,000. The MISD Board of Trustees was presented with the information at the regularly-scheduled board meeting held on January 23, 2024 at the Dr. Jim Vaszauskas Center for Performing Arts.

CONSIDERATIONS:

Accept the recommendation of the Long-Range Planning Committee and the Superintendent to Order the calling of a Bond Election for May 4, 2024, utilizing five propositions as stated in the attached Order.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Superintendent recommends the approval of the Order calling a Bond Election for May 4, 2024 in the aggregate amount of \$777,000,000 utilizing five propositions as stated in the Order.

MOTION:

“Move to approve AN ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD BY THE MANSFIELD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, MAKING PROVISION FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION, AND RESOLVING OTHER MATTERS INCIDENT AND RELATED TO SUCH ELECTION”

AN ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD BY THE MANSFIELD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, MAKING PROVISION FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION, AND RESOLVING OTHER MATTERS INCIDENT AND RELATED TO SUCH ELECTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the *Board*) of the Mansfield Independent School District (the *District*), located in Tarrant and Johnson Counties, Texas (individually, the *County* and together, the *Counties*), hereby finds and determines that an election should be held to determine whether the District shall be authorized to issue bonds of the District in the amounts and for the purposes hereinafter identified (the *Election*); and

WHEREAS, the District will contract (individually, the *Election Contract* and together, the *Election Contracts*) with the elections administrators (individually, the *Administrator* and together, the *Administrators*) of each County to conduct all aspects of the Election for all registered voters of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds and determines that the anticipated capital improvements referenced in Proposition A may be submitted to the qualified voters of the District as a single proposition as authorized by Section 45.003(g) of the Texas Education Code (the *Code*) because these capital improvements will be used predominantly for teaching required curriculum and/or administrative purposes and are not the type of facilities described in Section 45.003(g)(1-6); and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds and determines that it is in the public interest to call and hold the Election at the earliest possible date to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds for the purposes hereinafter identified; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE MANSFIELD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT:

SECTION 1: The Election shall be held in the Mansfield Independent School District on the 4th day of May, 2024 (*Election Day*), which is a uniform election date under the Texas Election Code, as amended, and is 78 or more days from the date of the adoption of this order (the *Order*), for the purpose of submitting the following propositions to the qualified voters of the District:

PROPOSITION A

“Shall the Board of Trustees of the Mansfield Independent School District be authorized to issue and sell bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$584,500,000 for the purposes of acquiring, constructing, renovating, improving and equipping school facilities in the District (including District-wide safety and security equipment and upgrades), any necessary or related removal of existing facilities, and the purchase of new school buses, such bonds to mature serially or

otherwise (not more than 40 years from their date of issuance) in accordance with law; any issue or series of such bonds to bear interest per annum at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of the Board of Trustees, provided that such rate or rates of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of such bonds; and shall the Board of Trustees of the District be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?"

PROPOSITION B

"Shall the Board of Trustees of the Mansfield Independent School District be authorized to issue and sell bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$4,000,000 for the purposes of acquiring, improving and updating instructional technology equipment and technology infrastructure, such bonds to mature serially or otherwise (not more than 10 years from their date of issuance) in accordance with law; any issue or series of such bonds to bear interest per annum at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of the Board of Trustees, provided that such rate or rates of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of such bonds; and shall the Board of Trustees of the District be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?"

PROPOSITION C

"Shall the Board of Trustees of the Mansfield Independent School District be authorized to issue and sell bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$50,500,000 for the purposes of renovating, improving, upgrading, updating, and equipping existing District and campus stadium facilities, such bonds to mature serially or otherwise (not more than 40 years from their date of issuance) in accordance with law; any issue or series of such bonds to bear interest per annum at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of the Board of Trustees, provided that such rate or rates of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of such bonds; and shall the Board of Trustees of the District be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?"

PROPOSITION D

“Shall the Board of Trustees of the Mansfield Independent School District be authorized to issue and sell bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$85,000,000 for the purposes of acquiring, constructing, renovating, equipping and improving multipurpose fine arts spaces and Phase 2 of the existing multipurpose athletic complexes at each high school, such bonds to mature serially or otherwise (not more than 40 years from their date of issuance) in accordance with law; any issue or series of such bonds to bear interest per annum at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of the Board of Trustees, provided that such rate or rates of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of such bonds; and shall the Board of Trustees of the District be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?”

PROPOSITION E

“Shall the Board of Trustees of the Mansfield Independent School District be authorized to issue and sell bonds of the District in the principal amount of \$53,000,000 for the purposes of acquiring, constructing, renovating, equipping and improving Phase 3 of the multipurpose athletic complexes at each high school, such bonds to mature serially or otherwise (not more than 40 years from their date of issuance) in accordance with law; any issue or series of such bonds to bear interest per annum at such rate or rates (fixed, floating, variable, or otherwise) as may be determined within the discretion of the Board of Trustees, provided that such rate or rates of interest shall not exceed the maximum rate per annum authorized by law at the time of the issuance of any issue or series of such bonds; and shall the Board of Trustees of the District be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?”

SECTION 2: On Election Day, the polls shall be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the locations designated by the Elections Administrators in accordance with the Election Contracts. The locations of such polling places on Election Day are set forth in **Exhibit A** which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as a part of this Order for all purposes. **Exhibit A** shall be modified to include additional or different Election Day polling places designated by the Elections Administrators and to conform to the Election Contracts.

Tarrant County participates in the Countywide Polling Place Program under Section 43.007, as amended, Texas Election Code, meaning that any District voter registered in Tarrant County can vote in the Election at any polling place identified in **Exhibit A** for Tarrant County.

SECTION 3: Early voting shall be administered by each Elections Administrator. Early voting shall be conducted by personal appearance at the locations and during the period early voting is required or permitted by law on the dates and at the times set forth in **Exhibit B** which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as a part of this Order for all purposes. **Exhibit B** shall be modified to include additional or different early voting locations designated by the Elections Administrators and to conform to the Election Contracts.

SECTION 4: A voting system or systems meeting the standards and requirements of the Texas Election Code, as amended, is hereby adopted and approved for early voting and for election day voting. Such voting system shall comply with Texas and federal laws establishing the requirement for voting systems that is equipped for disabled individuals. Pursuant to Section 61.012, as amended, Texas Election Code, the Elections Administrators shall provide at least one accessible voting system in each polling place used in the Election.

SECTION 5: The Elections Administrators will appoint the Presiding Judges, Alternate Presiding Judges, Election Clerks, and all other election officials for the Election.

An Early Voting Ballot Board shall be created to process early voting results of the Election and the Presiding Judge of an Early Voting Ballot Board shall be designated by each of the Elections Administrators for their respective County. The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two resident qualified voters of the District to serve as members of each such Early Voting Ballot Board.

The District shall utilize a Central Counting Station (individually, the *Station*, and together the *Stations*) as provided by Section 127.001, *et seq.*, as amended, Texas Election Code. The Administrators, or the designees thereof, are hereby appointed as the Manager of each respective Station who will establish a written plan for the orderly operation of the Station in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code. The Board authorizes the Administrators, or the designees thereof, to appoint the Presiding Judge, the Tabulation Supervisor, and the Programmer of their respective Station and may appoint Station clerks as needed or desirable. The Administrators will publish (or cause to be published) notice and conduct testing on the automatic tabulation equipment relating to their respective Station and conduct instruction for the officials and clerks for the Station in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code.

SECTION 6: The official ballot shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, as amended, so as to permit voters to vote “FOR” or “AGAINST” the aforesaid propositions which shall appear on the ballot substantially as follows:

PROPOSITION A

“THE ISSUANCE OF \$584,500,000 OF BONDS BY THE MANSFIELD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, RENOVATING, IMPROVING AND EQUIPPING SCHOOL FACILITIES IN THE DISTRICT (INCLUDING DISTRICT-WIDE SAFETY AND SECURITY EQUIPMENT AND UPGRADES) AND THE PURCHASE OF NEW SCHOOL BUSES AND THE IMPOSITION OF A TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE

PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AND THE COST OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS. THIS IS A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.”

PROPOSITION B

“THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,000,000 OF BONDS BY THE MANSFIELD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY EQUIPMENT AND TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE AND THE IMPOSITION OF A TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AND THE COST OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS. THIS IS A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.”

PROPOSITION C

“THE ISSUANCE OF \$50,500,000 OF BONDS BY THE MANSFIELD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR RENOVATING, IMPROVING AND EQUIPPING EXISTING DISTRICT AND CAMPUS STADIUM FACILITIES AND THE IMPOSITION OF A TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AND THE COST OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS. THIS IS A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.”

PROPOSITION D

“THE ISSUANCE OF \$85,000,000 OF BONDS BY THE MANSFIELD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, RENOVATING, EQUIPPING AND IMPROVING MULTIPURPOSE FINE ARTS SPACES AND PHASE 2 OF THE EXISTING MULTIPURPOSE ATHLETIC COMPLEXES AT EACH HIGH SCHOOL AND THE IMPOSITION OF A TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AND THE COST OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS. THIS IS A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.”

PROPOSITION E

“THE ISSUANCE OF \$53,000,000 OF BONDS BY THE MANSFIELD INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, RENOVATING, EQUIPPING AND IMPROVING PHASE 3 OF THE MULTIPURPOSE ATHLETIC COMPLEXES AT EACH HIGH SCHOOL AND THE IMPOSITION OF A TAX SUFFICIENT TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AND THE COST OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS. THIS IS A PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.”

SECTION 7: All resident, qualified voters of the District shall be permitted to vote at the Election.

SECTION 8: Notice of election, including a Spanish and Vietnamese translation thereof, shall be published at least one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the District, with such

publication occurring not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days before Election Day. A substantial copy of this Order and the voter information, including a Spanish and Vietnamese translation thereof, shall be posted (i) on the bulletin board used for posting notices of Board meetings not less than 21 days prior to Election Day, (ii) in three additional public places within the District's boundaries not later than 21 days prior to Election Day, (iii) in a prominent location at each polling place on Election Day and during early voting, and (iv) in a prominent location on the District's internet website not less than 21 days prior to Election Day. A sample ballot shall be posted on the District's internet website not less than 21 days prior to Election Day.

SECTION 9: In accordance with Section 3.009(b)(5) and (7) through (9) of the Texas Election Code, the District, as of the date of the adoption of this Order, had outstanding an aggregate principal amount of debt equal to \$761,994,838.75; the aggregate amount of the interest owed on such District debt obligations, through the respective maturities, totaled \$352,356,311.01; and the District levied an ad valorem debt service tax rate for its outstanding debt obligations of \$0.36 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation. Based on the bond market conditions on the date of the Board's adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of bonds authorized at the Election is 4.50% (expressed as a net effective interest rate applicable to any such series of bonds). The bonds that are the subject of this Election shall mature serially or otherwise over a specified number of years (but not more than 40 years from their date of issuance), and the District estimates that, based on current bond market conditions, such bonds will amortize over a 30-year period from their respective date of issue. The foregoing estimated maximum net effective interest rate and amortization period are only estimates, provided for Texas statutory compliance; they do not serve as a cap on the per annum interest rate at which any series of bonds authorized at the Election may be sold, or the amortization period for bonds that are the subject of the Election.

SECTION 10: The Board authorizes the President, Board of Trustees, the Superintendent of Schools, the Associate Superintendent of Business and Finance, or the respective designee of either of such parties to make such modifications to this Order that are necessary for compliance with applicable Texas or federal law or to carry out the intent of the Board, as evidenced herein. By incorporating all essential terms necessary for a joint election agreement, this Order is intended to satisfy Section 271.002(d) of the Texas Election Code, as amended, without further action of the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 11: The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Order for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the Board.

SECTION 12: All orders and resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Order are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Order shall be and remain controlling as to the matters ordered herein.

SECTION 13: This Order shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America. If any provision of this Order or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Order and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the Board hereby declares that this Order would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

SECTION 14: It is officially found, determined, and declared that the meeting at which this Order is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place, and subject matter of the public business to be considered at such meeting, including this Order, was given, all as required by Chapter 551, as amended, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 15: This Order shall be in force and effect from and after its final passage, and it is so ordered.
