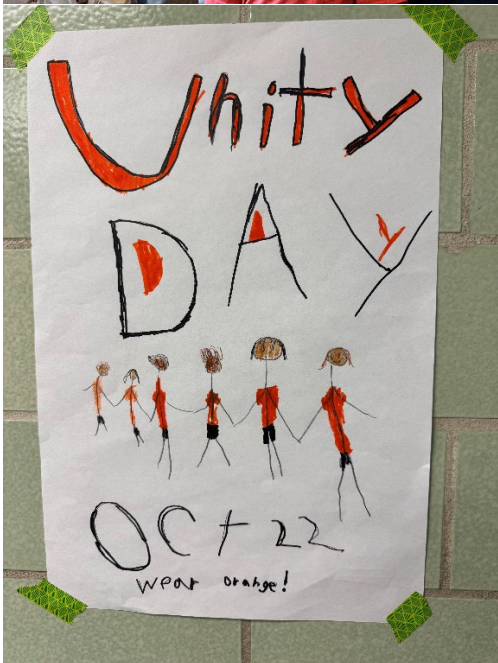

Cloquet Area Alternative Education Programs:

We had two very wonderful days during our short MEA week. On Tuesday, we honored Indigenous Peoples' Day at the Forestry Center, where our own Teresa Angell put together a fantastic lesson on the "Seven Grandfather Teachings" for our students. We actually have posters of these teachings hanging in our hallway at CAAEP, but in the year+ that I have been here, we haven't talked about them, so the timing was good to revisit them. Teresa is a great teacher and the students and staff offered great audience participation throughout her lesson. While she talked, she also gave students a right-brained creative activity so they were able to draw northern lights with chalk on black paper, or create a small puzzle, or identify and display important Native American plants on a small board.

They had a fantastic taco bar lunch that included the chance to try bison meat, a typical Native American staple food, and then went on an outdoor scavenger hunt and spent time around the campfire with Wendy Waha. Wendy spent most of the day with us, connecting with our students and telling stories around the campfire. Many students and staff also smudged before returning to the building after lunch, and Wendy and Teresa explained what that was, the purpose and intent, and how they were taught to do it so all students felt welcomed and included in the tradition, and most students took part. Students also had time to write a positive message that they felt was an important "message to the world" that we will add to our board on the 3rd floor (in black and white).

In the afternoon, students watched the movie "Smoke Signals" before returning to school. This day was the highest percentage of student attendance we had ever had on a school field trip and everyone had a really great day!

On Wednesday, we boarded the bus again and headed to St. Scholastica where our former science teacher, Kevin Taralseth now works. He hosted our students for a day of rock wall climbing, mountain biking, playing in the huge field house, and touring the campus. We had two sessions in the morning and students chose two activities in which to participate. Scholastica has underground tunnels and big buildings that look like Hogwarts, so the college tour was eventful! The biking paths connect to Hartley Park and run through UMD, so the bikers were in for a surprise as well, and the rock wall climbers were determined and those who struggled at first were victorious by lunch as they reached the top of the wall. Lunch is always a big treat for our students because the food is good, they have lots of choices, they eat near the older college students and they can go back for as much as they want and they LOVE it! Kevin had several student assistants who helped throughout the day, and most importantly, our students spent a day on campus and had a very positive experience! After lunch we made a fairly quick stop at Enger Tower. It was a gorgeous day and there was just enough time to run to the beautiful overlook on either side, and hop back on the bus and head home. Once again, most of our students were in attendance and took part with positive attitudes, they made good choices, and were ready to start their MEA break on a positive note.

Childcare update: Kids Corner, Li'l Lumberjacks, and Li'l Thunder

Kids Corner

- **Enrollment:** 150 children
 - **Waiting List:** 3 children
 - **Average Daily Attendance:**
 - **Morning:** 38 children (high of 47)
 - **Afternoon:** 74 children (high of 106)
 - **Notes:** Afternoon attendance regularly exceeds 100, indicating strong demand and potential capacity considerations.

Li'l Lumberjacks Childcare

- **Enrollment:** 81 children
 - **Waiting List:** 4 children
 - **Physical Capacity:** 55 children
 - **Average Daily Attendance:** 42 children (high of 47)
 - **Notes:** Enrollment exceeds the physical capacity due to part-time scheduling and alternating attendance patterns. The program is operating near daily capacity with consistent participation.

Li'l Thunder Childcare

Summary

Overall, the district's childcare programs continue to experience strong interest and participation, particularly at Kids Corner and Li'l Lumberjacks. Kids Corner regularly reaches high afternoon attendance numbers, while Li'l Lumberjacks operates close to its physical capacity. Li'l Thunder Childcare remains under capacity, and ongoing marketing efforts are focused on increasing enrollment. Continued tracking of attendance, capacity, and waitlist data will support effective planning for staffing and future program needs.

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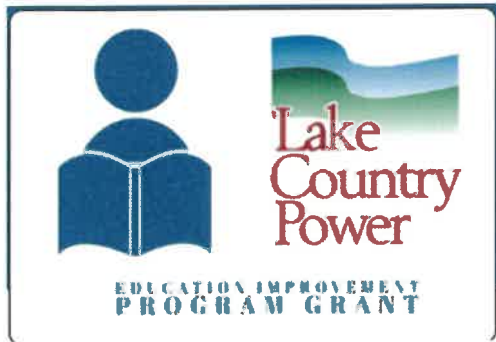

INTRODUCTION

Your school district may qualify for a grant up to \$100,000 from Lake Country Power, funded through the cooperative's Education Improvement Program using "unclaimed capital." The online application period runs from **September 1 - November 30**. Grants will be awarded the following spring or summer.

On June 28, 2022, Lake Country Power's board of directors approved the Education Improvement Program. The program utilizes "unclaimed capital credit" funds. The State of Minnesota allows electric cooperatives, like Lake Country Power, to invest the monies locally and use toward educational purposes after several years of trying to locate former co-op members with their capital credit refunds. Funds that remain unclaimed are allowed to be used at the cooperative's discretion if it meets State criteria.

DESCRIPTION

Lake Country Power is making every effort possible to keep the funds local while benefiting the communities and schools within the cooperative's service area through the Education Improvement Program.

QUALIFICATIONS

The Lake Country Power board of directors will choose recipients based on the following criteria:

- Application process is open to all independent school districts in the cooperative's service territory.
- Applications must come from the school district administration for projects at any facility in their respective district.
- Repeat awards to any school will be at the discretion of the LCP board of directors.
- Applications must be submitted on the official Education Improvement Program application form.
- The following factors will be considered in the evaluation of all funding requests:
 - a. Potential benefit to area school districts and the entire community.
 - b. Level of community support for the project or the school district requesting the funds.
 - c. Administrative and financial capability of the school district to execute the completion of the project in a reasonable and timely manner.
 - d. Results that are predictable and can be evaluated.

We saw an unexpected increase in the number of students requiring English Language Learner (ELL) services this year. These services are required under Minnesota state law for students who qualify. Historically, we have only had a very small number of students requiring these services. With the growth in numbers, we are identifying a need to formalize our program and ensure we are providing all required components. We are proposing providing our ELL teacher, Anna Gamst, with a 6th period stipend for the full year to compensate her for this coordination. This additional stipend is supported by the principal team and me. We receive specialized funds from the state for ELL services and the addition of this stipend fits within the funds we are allocated.

During the 2025-2028 Cloquet Principal Association contract negotiations, the addition of the paid holiday Juneteenth was not negotiated. Juneteenth is a Minnesota paid holiday for all state employees, including school district employees. This memorandum of understanding adds Juneteenth as an additional paid holiday (total of 13) for the Cloquet Principal Association members. This is consistent with our other bargaining agreements and was an oversight by both parties. We negotiated Juneteenth into our other bargaining agreements in 2023 and 2024.

ARTICLE VIII -- DUTY YEAR

Section 2. Holidays: Principals shall receive 13 paid holidays: Independence Day (2), Labor Day, Thanksgiving (2), Christmas (2), New Year’s (2), President’s Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day and Juneteenth.

AGREEMENT FOR TARGETED SERVICES

This Agreement, made and effective as of the 27th day of August 2025, by and between ISD 701, Hibbing Public Schools, hereinafter referred to as "non-member district", and the Cloquet Public Schools, hereinafter referred to as "Provider", for collaborating on ALC programming for the sole purpose of providing Targeted Services within ISD 701

RECITALS

The parties hereto recite and declare as follows:

1. The non-member district has a need and desire to report targeted services through the Provider's Alternative Learning Center (ALC) as required by the Minnesota Department of Education.
2. The Provider will submit service hours and other data required for targeted services to be reported to the Minnesota Department of Education needed by the non-member schools.
3. The non-member district desires to pay Provider to provide services referenced above.

Now, therefore, for the reasons set forth above and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises of the parties hereto, the parties covenant and agree, as follows:

I. Term and Duration

This agreement shall commence on the 1st day of October 2025, through the 30th day of June 2026. This agreement can be renewed, modified, or changed only in written form and by approval by the non-member district and Provider.

During the term of this agreement, or any extension or renewal of same, the agreement can be terminated without cause by either party with 60 days' written notice to the other.

II. Services to Be Provided by Provider

The Provider shall provide administrative support and MDE reporting coordination for targeted services given in the non-member district.

III. Services to Be Provided by the Non-Member District

The non-member district shall be responsible for providing all aspects of program delivery including, but not limited to, all hiring, oversight and termination of program staff. The non-member district shall also be responsible for paying all staff in alignment with its collective bargaining agreements and payroll policies. The non-member district shall also be responsible for all scheduling and delivery of program curriculum and services, including providing for all facilities.

IV. Payment and Reimbursement

Starting October 1, 2025, the Provider will provide services as defined in section II and the non-member district agrees to pay the following:

- Non-member district access fee: \$5,000

The Provider will submit an invoice to the non-member district that reflects the above the access fee.

The non-member school shall make payments for services based on receipt of the invoice from the Provider.
