#### BOE Meeting

1. Roll Call

3. Public Open Forum
  - 3.1 Public Comments – Dr. Stirn and President Gorman welcomed guests attending in person and virtually.
  - 3.2 Public Comments – Neil Wallner, HBT physical education teacher, addressed the Board concerning the outdoor physical education space for gym class.
4. Action Items
  - 4.1 Consent Agenda – Business Manager Pflug reviewed revenues and expenditures. Revenues are currently at 52.47% compared to 49.09% a year ago. Expenditures are at 60.82% as compared to 62.92% a year ago. The District received impact fees for 13 new home starts totaling \$76,971.88 for April. Transition fees received for April were \$28,840.00. The bills payable is typical for March.
  - 4.2 Approve Elementary Parent/Student Handbook – Principal Schreiber reviewed the handbook with the board last month. No changes have been made since then.
  - 4.3 Approve Middle School Parent/Student Handbook – Principal Haug reviewed the handbook with the board last month. No changes have been made since then.
  - 4.4 Approve High School Parent/Student Handbook –Assistant Principal Farrington reviewed the handbook with the board last month. No changes have been made since then.
  - 4.5 Approve Refuse Bid – Two companies submitted bids for the 2-year refuse bid. Groot was the lowest responsible bidder and will be awarded the bid.
  - 4.6 Approve he the Fuel Bid – Three companies submitted bids and Feece Oil is the lowest responsible bidder. Feece Oil was awarded the bid.
  - 4.7 Approve the Copy Paper Bid – Three companies submitted bids for paper. The Paper Corporation will be awarded the bid.
  - 4.8 Approve the CTE Wheel Alignment Machines Bid These machines are for the Northern Kane EFE 110 program- Two companies submitted bids and Automotive Equipment Specialist bid met the specifications that include teacher training, curriculum, and student certification.

- 4.9 Approve the CTE Desktop CNC/Milling Machines Bid – this machine is for the Northern Kane County EFE 110 program. Midwest Machinery Resources LLC (HFO Chicago) will be awarded the bid.
- 4.10 Resolution to Honorably Dismiss of Temporary Education Support Personnel – The resolution honorably dismisses the temporary secretaries that were hired to assist in the building offices when we returned to school.
5. Information Items
- 5.1 Athletics and Activities Update – Athletic Director Diversey recognized Ernesto Lopez Magdalenas for his accomplishments in athletics. Ernesto plays football, competition cheer, and pole vaults in track. In gymnastics he qualified in 4 of 6 events at the State level, and placed 5<sup>th</sup> in State. Ernesto is Central's first male State Champion on the vault. Director Diversey updated the board with student athletics and activities. Central has one male tennis player who placed 17<sup>th</sup> in the State. The basketball coaches were nominated for IHSA Coaches of the year. The baseball team is 10/8, softball is 10/7 and the bands from grades 7-12 held an outdoor concert on the football field. The high school choir has an outdoor concert on May 20, 2021. On May 22<sup>nd</sup> the high school service club is hosting a color run. All money raised from the color run will go to the National Alliance on Mental Health. The Senior Gala was a huge success. One hundred fifteen seniors attended the gala. Parents were there at the beginning to cheer them on the red carpet. The students were divided into two groups for activities, they had a hypnotist, enjoyed a dinner, raffles, nominations for a king and queen, and superlatives were named. The evening ended with a 10-minute fireworks show. A new 221 graduate sign will be put up later in the week.
- 5.2 In-Person/Remote Learning Status Report – The State Superintendent Dr. Ayala has officially reported that the State Board of Education's stance is that school will officially reopen in the fall. We have entered the bridge phase and will officially enter Phase 5 June 11. The CDC and IDPH have been working on new guidelines. Vaccinated people do not have to wear masks unless inside a school and social distancing will need to be maintained. The guidance is expected to be different in the fall and it will be posted on our website. All students are expected to return in-person unless there is a medical reason to stay remote. Currently we have received a 40-45% response rate out of our 4500 students. So far, we have 33 students who would remain remote. How do we service this small number of remote students? Administration is working with the ROE who is working with the State Board of Education to see if we can offer a remote only school where students from Kane County could be taught remotely. Dr. Mongan is also reaching out to other districts to see if they would want to work together and cluster students and have a group of teachers work with the remote students. So far numbers across Kane County are similar to District 301. Assistant Superintendent Mongan reviewed Fast bridge data with the board. The data compared scores from Winter 2020 to Winter 2021. The data in reading and math showed gains, not losses in both in person learning and remote. Getting the kids back in school full time in the fall is important to give students more opportunity for growth.

- 5.3 Capital Projects Update – Director Polowy reported on his summer projects. One concern was the availability of materials for the projects. He has been able to secure materials for the projects in advance and have received most of the materials. Other projects include the roof at the District Office, upgrading HVAC systems at H.B. Thomas and Prairie View. The systems are antiquated. Entech is the provider of those controls. Lighting controls will be updated at all buildings and will receive some cost savings from ComEd. Painting and flooring will continue throughout the district. Maintenance tickets have increased a little since the kids are back.
- 5.4 Central High School Graduation May 27, 2021 – Kerri McCastland is heading up graduation. Graduation is May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at the NOW Arena in Hoffman Estates. The Board of Education will be in attendance. Regalia for the new board members is on its way, Herff Jones is just a little backed up. Graduation will be held indoors, and students received six tickets each.
- 5.5 German 3 Textbook – Department Chair Anette Bliss requested supplemental materials to align with her German 2 and 4 curriculums. The materials she is currently using are out of date and would like something more current. The cost is about \$1,200.00 for a classroom set. Ms. Bliss believes the hard copy is better in foreign language rather than an on-line system.

### **Rationale:**

Updated resources needed for German 3. These will align to the current supplemental materials used in the German 2 coursework and to the textbook materials utilized in German 4. Other rationale provided by the Department Chair Bliss:

- Several of the topics covered are topics currently covered in the German 3 curriculum, but with a fresh and current use of vocabulary and material. The topics friendship (introducing people), Media, living together, holidays, sport accidents are in our current curriculum.
- Additionally, the book offers a unit on career choices and future plans, a highly relevant topic, but a gap in our current curriculum. The second book also offers a unit on school to school exchanges, discussing not only practical questions but also emotions. I find it relevant because we have a school to school exchange, but at the same time the vocabulary is relevant for anybody who faces going into a new and unknown situation.
- Vocabulary is highly useful but also quite demanding which is very appropriate for an intermediate level class that German 3 is. With that, this series helps students with the transition from level 2 into the complexities of level 4.

**AFFILIATION AGREEMENT  
 BETWEEN  
 Northern Kane County Region 110

**THIS AGREEMENT** (“**Agreement**”) is entered into this 1st Day of July, 2021 by and between Animal Clinic of South Elgin (“**Facility**”), the Board of Education of Central Community Unit School District No. 301 (“**District**”), and Northern Kane Region 100 (collectively the “**Parties**”).

**WHEREAS**, the District desires to utilize Animal Clinic of South Elgin’s facility at 896 N. LaFox Street, South Elgin, Illinois 60177 for the purpose of providing veterinary assistant practical learning and clinical experiences (see Exhibit A for program-specific requirements) to the high school students of the District and the high school students of the other school districts in Northern Kane Region 110 (an intergovernmental agreement between Community Unit School District 300, Community Unit School District 301, Community Unit School District 303, and Unit School District U-46); and

**WHEREAS**, the Facility desires to provide such practical learning and clinical experiences to students, both as a community service and as ongoing education for its own staff.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, it is understood and agreed upon by the parties hereto as follows:

**A. SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES:**

**1. Provision of foundational curriculum to students.** The District shall have the total responsibility for planning and determining the adequacy of the educational experience of students in theoretical background, basic skill, professional ethics, attitude and behavior, and will assign to the Facility only those students who have satisfactorily completed the prerequisite didactic portion of the District’s curriculum.

**2. Liability insurance.** The Facility and each participating school district shall provide its own General Liability insurance, including but not limited to property loss and damage claims, claims for bodily injury or death, and other civil actions, claims or suits, including the defenses thereof, which may be made against the insured party. No provision of insurance or self-insurance by the District, Northern Kane County Region 110, or other participating school district shall modify, amend, or in any other way remove the immunities of public employees and local governmental entities granted in the *Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act*, 745 ILCS 10/1 et seq.

**3. Designation of liaison to Facility; communications relating to clinical placements.** The District and/or Northern Kane County Region 110 will designate a faculty or other

professional staff member to coordinate and act as its liaison to the Facility. The assignments to be undertaken by the students participating in the educational program will be mutually arranged and a regular exchange of information will be maintained by on-site visits when practical and by letter, email, or telephone in other instances.

The District shall notify the Facility in writing of any change or proposed change of the person(s) responsible for coordinating clinical placements with the Facility.

**4. School notices to students.** The District shall notify each student prior to his or her arrival at the Facility that he/she is required to:

- (a) Follow the administrative policies, standards, and practices of the Facility.
- (b) Obtain medical care at his or her own expense for any injuries or illnesses sustained as a direct or indirect result of his/her affiliation with the Facility.
- (c) Provide his/her own transportation.
- (d) Report to the Facility on time and follow all established regulations during the regularly scheduled operating hours of the Facility.
- (e) Conform to the standards and practices established by the District while functioning at the Facility.
- (f) Obtain prior written approval of the Facility and the District before publishing any material relating to the clinical learning experience.
- (g) Meet the personal, ethical, and professional standards required of employees of the Facility and that are consistent with the applicable professional Code of Ethics and the applicable standards of relevant accrediting or regulatory bodies.
- (h) Notify his or her home school district of any medical conditions which may affect participation at the Facility.

## **B. FACILITY RESPONSIBILITIES:**

**1. Such permission must be signed by the Facility staff member, a District representative, the student, and the student's parent or guardian. At no time will one student be alone with any one Facility employee.

**8. FERPA Compliance.** The Facility shall comply with the applicable provisions of the *Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974*, 20 USC 1232 (g), otherwise known as FERPA or the Buckley Amendment, as well as the *Illinois School Student Records Act*, 105 ILCS 10/1 et seq., and shall take all measures necessary to ensure the confidentiality of any and all information in its possession regarding the District's students who train at the Facility pursuant to this agreement. The Facility shall have access to student record information (records which alone, or with other records, personally identify a student) only to the extent necessary for student participation in the program. The Facility will maintain such records as confidential records and shall not disclose them to third parties except pursuant to court order, in the case of an emergency, or with consent of the District or student and parent/guardian. At the conclusion of a student's participation in the program,

the Facility shall return all student records in its possession to the District or, at the District's request, directly to the student's home school district if other than the District.

### **C. OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES:**

**1. The Parties shall notify one another if there are known breaches of this confidentiality.

The District will advise students that dissemination or public posting of any client/patient information through social media or other means will be prohibited.

**2. Determination of instructional period.** The course of instruction will cover a period of time as arranged between the District and the Facility. The starting clinical date will begin on **July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021 with the last clinical on August 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022.**

Specifically, the supervising Certified Veterinary Technician or Licensed Veterinarian must sign off on all performed skills listed on the Evaluation Form attached to this Agreement as Exhibit A. The Facility staff and the District's externship coordinator will communicate on a regular basis for the purpose of reviewing and evaluating current clinical experiences offered to students.

## 5. Removal of students.

(a) The District has the right to remove a student from a clinical education program. The District shall notify the Facility of such removal in writing.

(b) The Facility may immediately remove any student participating in a clinical education program from the Facility's premises for behavior that the Facility deems to be an immediate threat to the health or welfare of its clients/patients, staff members, visitors, or operations. In such event, the Facility shall notify the relevant District staff member in writing of its actions and the reasons for its actions as soon as practicable. 

**THIS AGREEMENT (“Agreement”)** is entered into this **1st Day of July, 2021** by and between Dundee Animal Hospital (Elgin) (“**Facility**”), the Board of Education of Central Community Unit School District No. 301 (“**District**”), and Northern Kane Region 100 (collectively the “**Parties**”).

**WHEREAS**, the Facility desires to provide such practical learning and clinical experiences to students, both as a community service and as ongoing education for its own staff.


