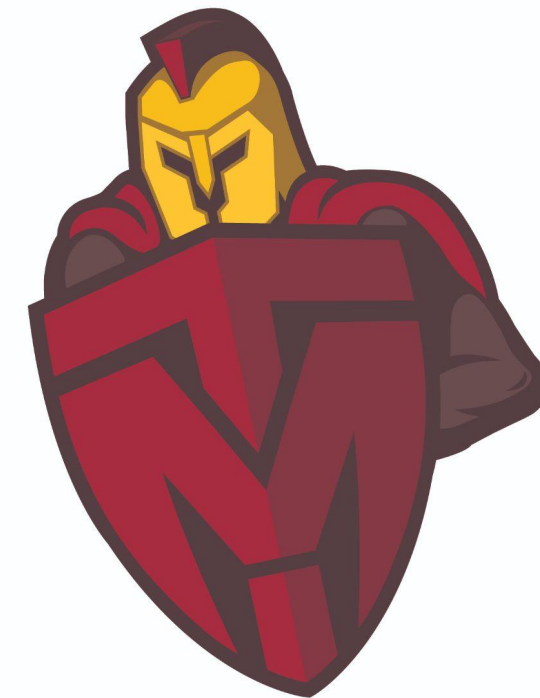

Budget considerations

ZERO-BASED BUDGETING

“What do we need?”

- Fresh review each fiscal year
- Uses historical data + department/school input
- Focuses spending on current needs and priorities
- Avoids automatically carrying forward prior-year spending

BALANCED BUDGETING

“What can we sustainably afford?”

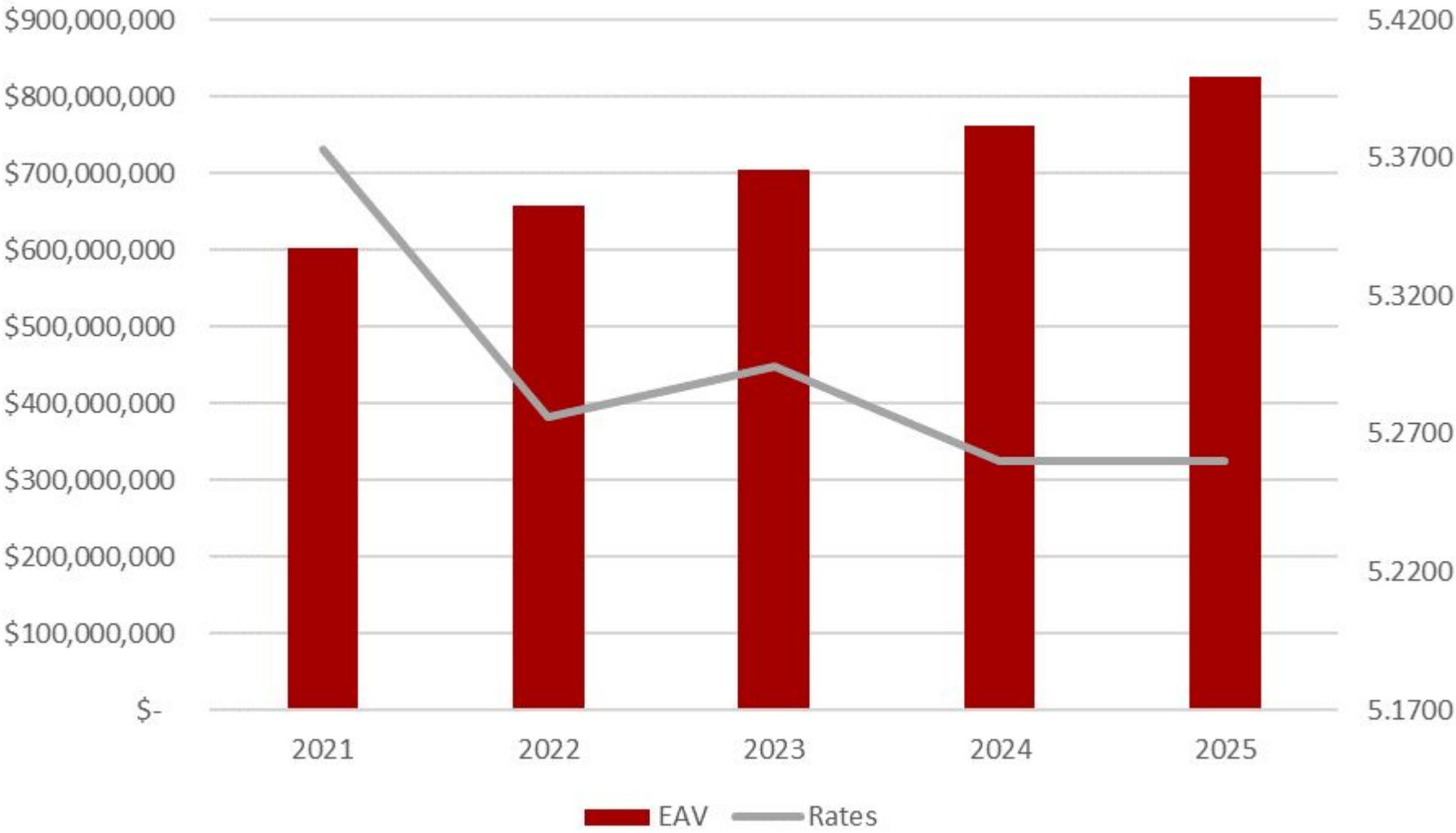
- Aligns expenditures with projected revenues
- Supports recurring expenses with recurring revenues
- Reduces reliance on reserves for ongoing costs
- Identifies financial pressures early

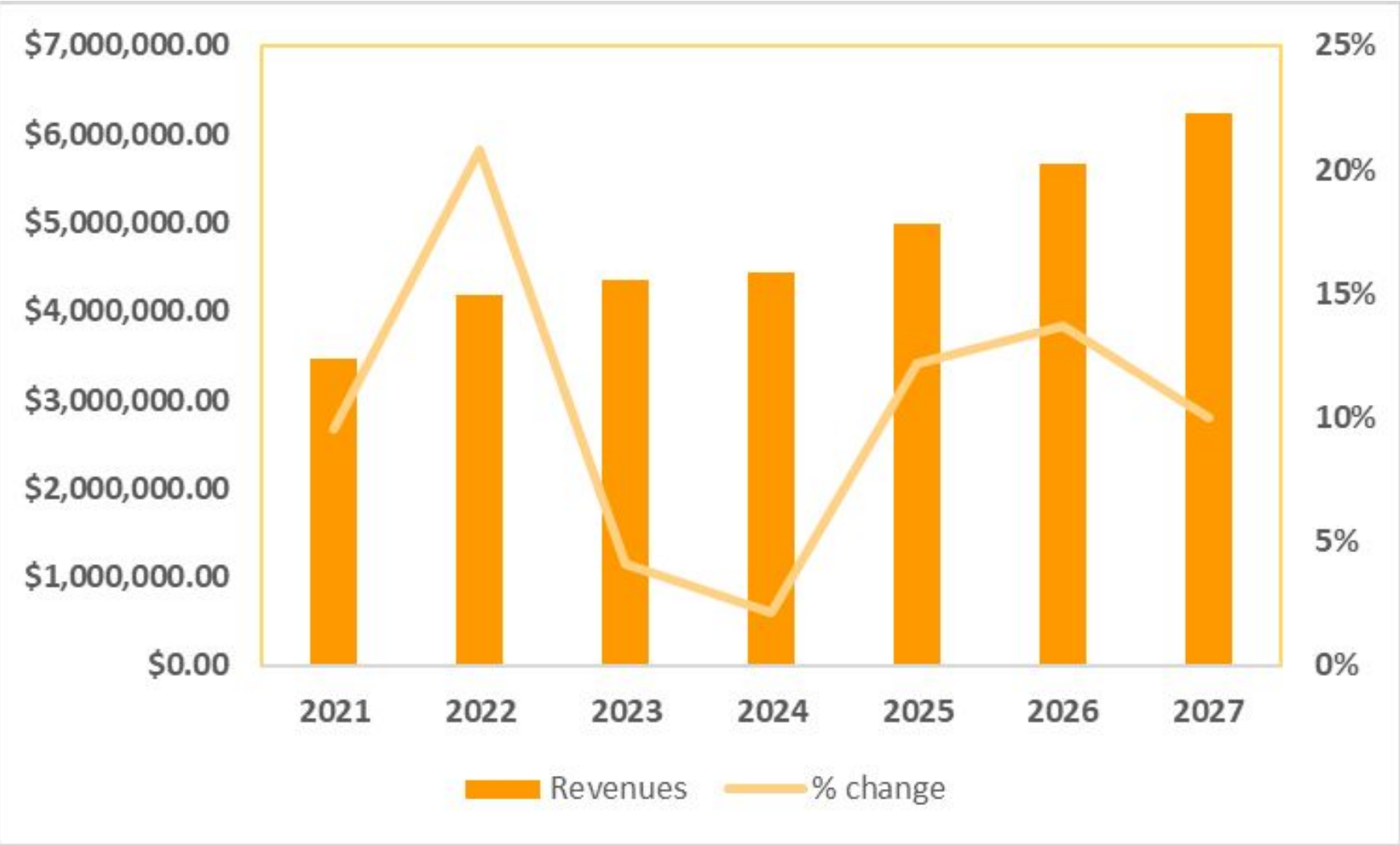

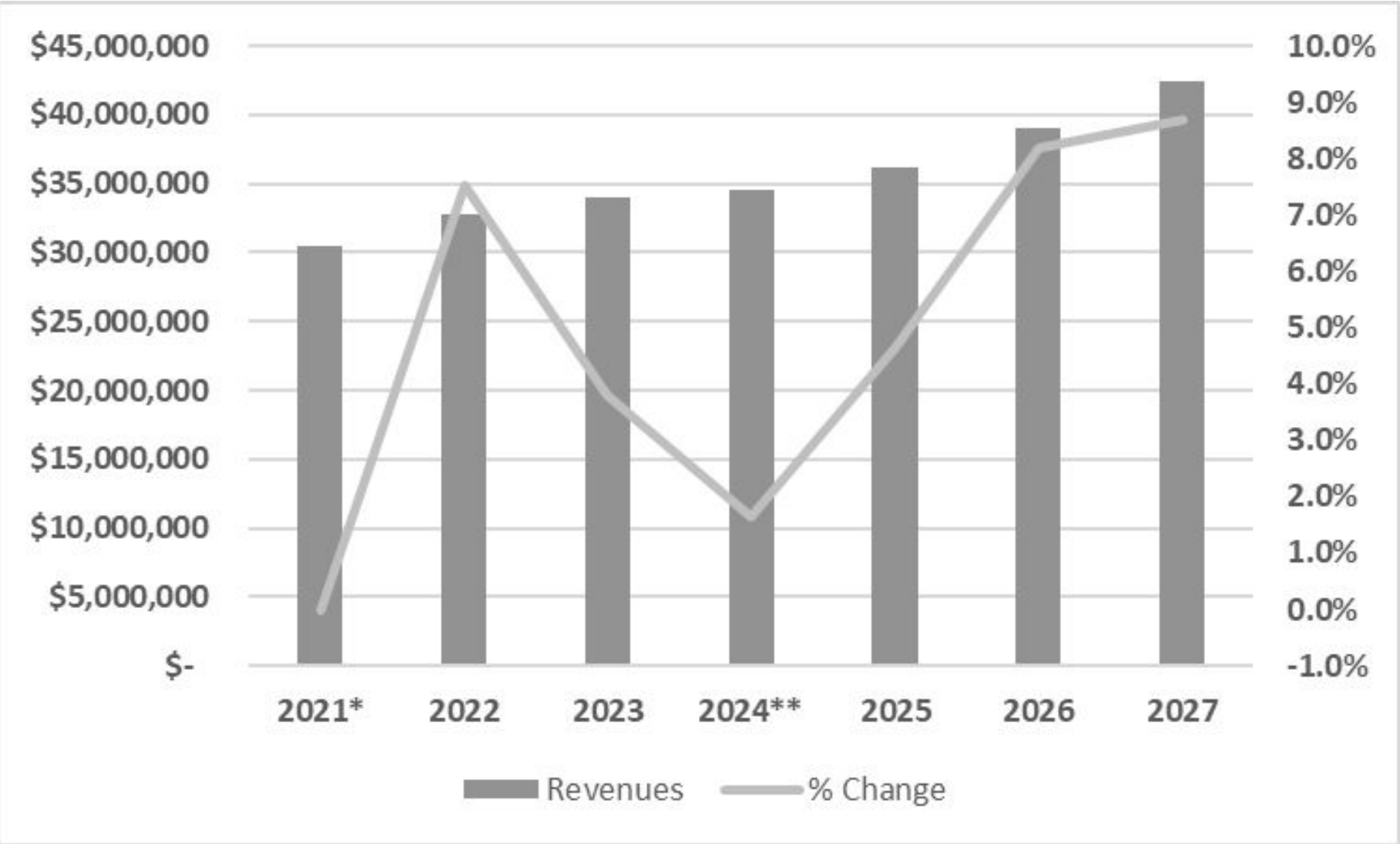

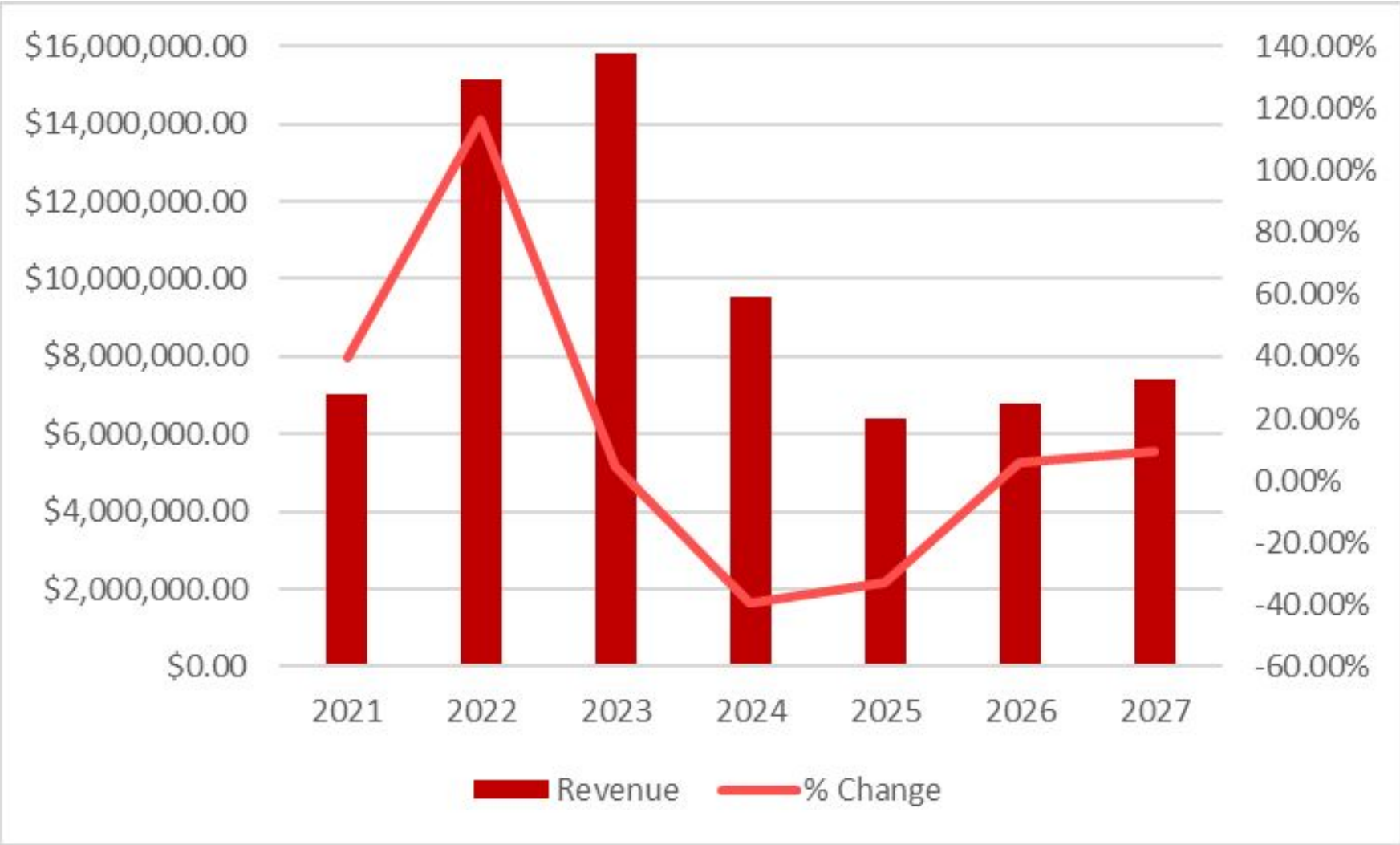

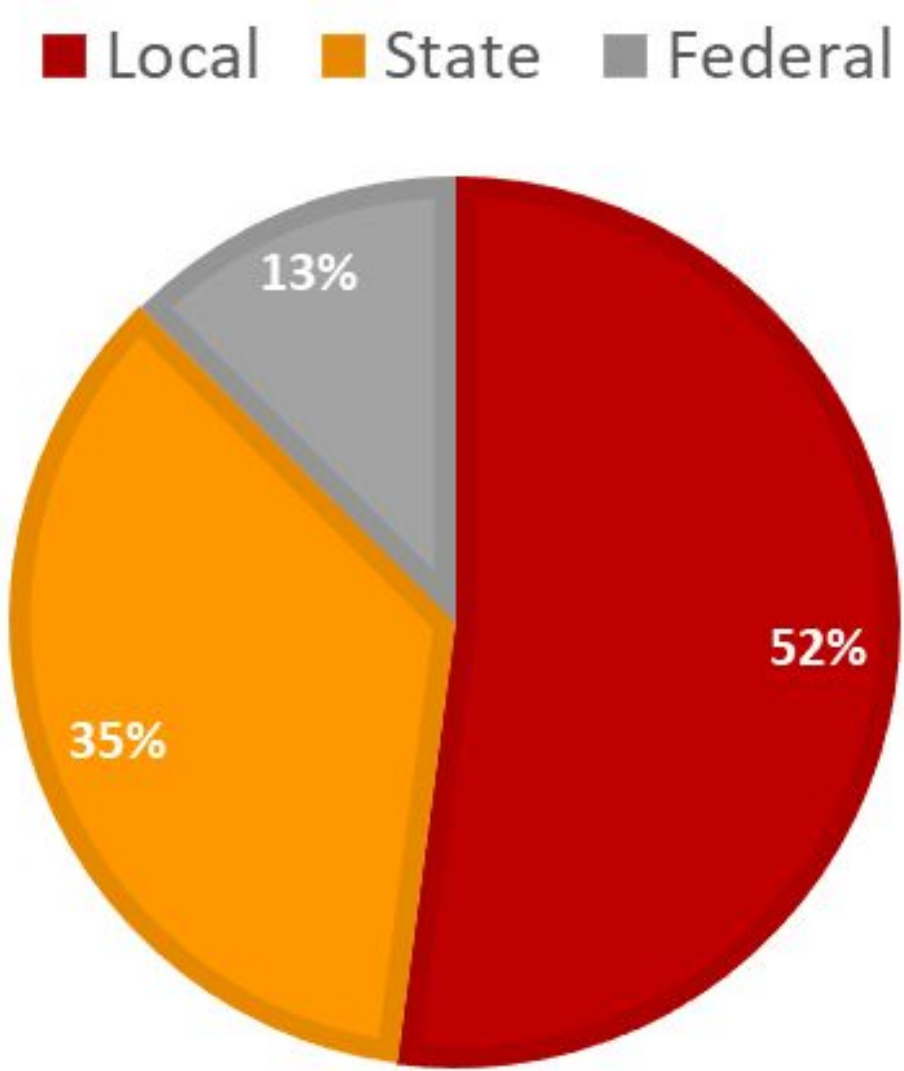

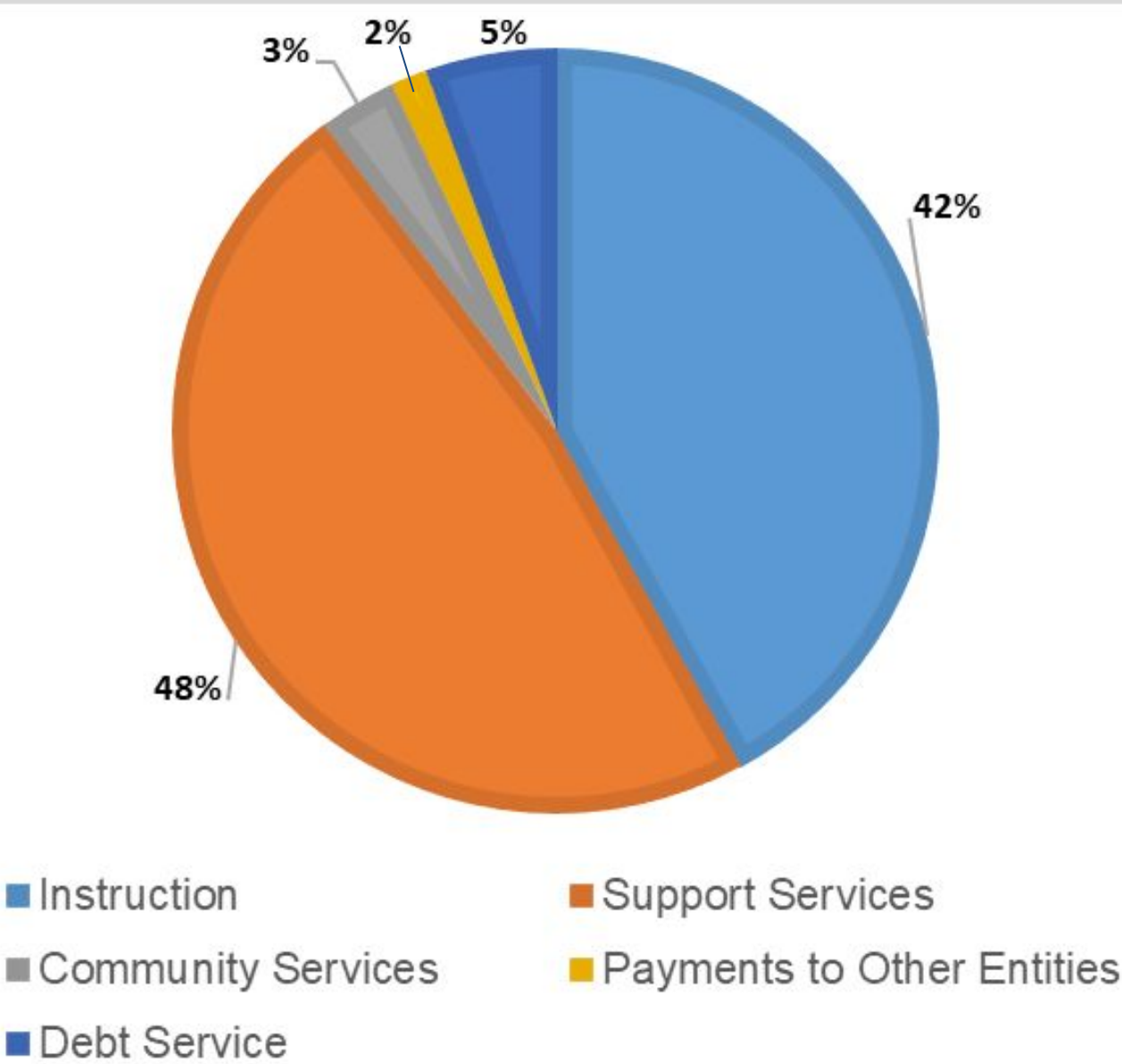

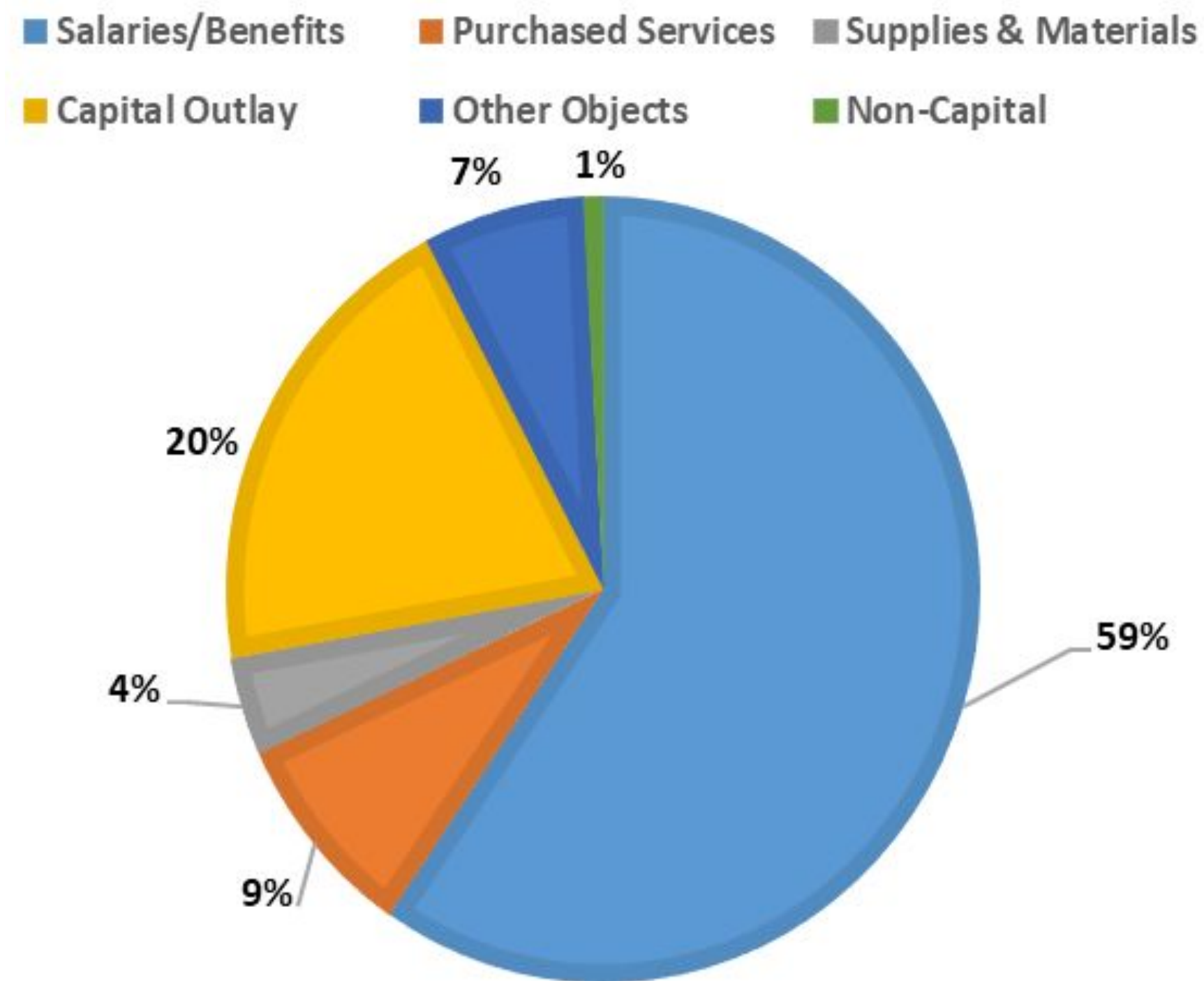

Teaching with Technology

PK-8 classrooms: Classroom access to chromebooks

High School: 1:1 access to Chromebooks

Curriculum access to digital resources and materials

- New resources go through an approval process.
- Continual discussion about convenience and learning opportunities.



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Prepping for Learning



These are the kinds of questions that our teachers are constantly asking themselves when preparing lessons:

- Is this better on paper?
- Will the technology support my teaching?
- Will the scholars be engaged in learning or engaged³⁷ in watching?
- Will the technology be a barrier for scholars?
- Is my assignment something that shows scholar learning, not their ability to manage the technology?



AI and Learning

We appreciate the opportunity for AI to support learning.

Two questions we are always asking:

- Does it align to learning and enhance learning?
- Or, does AI supplant learning?



District Technology Access

“Keep the Learners Learning”

- Reliable network
- Decentralized Network - District no longer reliant on RIHS
- Security GoGuardian, CyNet, Firewall
- Always adapting to meet current needs

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What are our current expectations during instructional time?

- Electronic devices must be powered off and out of sight.
- This includes cell phones, smartphones, smart watches, tablets, laptops, and other devices.
- Exceptions include:
 - Staff/administrator permission
 - IEP or Section 504 accommodations
 - Emergencies threatening safety
- Devices may be used during designated non-instructional times, including lunch and before/after school.
- Device use cannot disrupt the learning environment or violate the rights of others.

Wireless Communication Device Policy

“Input and Feedback Process”

Background: SB2427: Wireless Communication Device Policy - beginning 2027-2028 school year.

Illinois Public Act 104-0657 requires school districts to adopt and implement a wireless communication device policy by the beginning of the **2027–2028 school year**. ***The policy must address (1) use during school time, (2) storage, (3) consistent enforcement, and (4) trauma-informed/developmentally appropriate implementation.*** The law specifically requires input from the teachers' collective bargaining agent (if applicable), administrators, and parents/guardians. Student input is encouraged and Rock Island-Milan School District values our scholars' input so we will include their voice in our district's wireless communication device policy.



Step 1: Review

- What would a fair, consistent, and workable cell phone policy look like for our school community?

Staff

- What phone-related challenges affect teaching, learning, safety, or workload?
- What enforcement approach is realistic?
- What would a fair, consistent, and workable cell phone policy look like for our school community?



Step 3: Draft

Step 3: DRAFT - Turning stakeholder input into a one-page policy framework.

Before we finalize a district policy, we will publish a draft framework containing:

- **Purpose:** Why are we limiting wireless communication devices?
- **When:** What does "school time" mean?
- **Where:** What are the storage expectations?
- **Exceptions:** What circumstances allow device use?

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Step 3: Draft

Step 3: DRAFT - Turning stakeholder input into a one-page policy framework.

Before we finalize a district policy, we will publish a draft framework containing:

- **Communication:** How do parents contact students during the school day?
- **Enforcement:** What happens when the policy is not followed?
- **Equity:** How will accommodations and individual needs be addressed?
- **Implementation:** How will staff and students be supported?
- **Review:** How will we know whether the policy is working?

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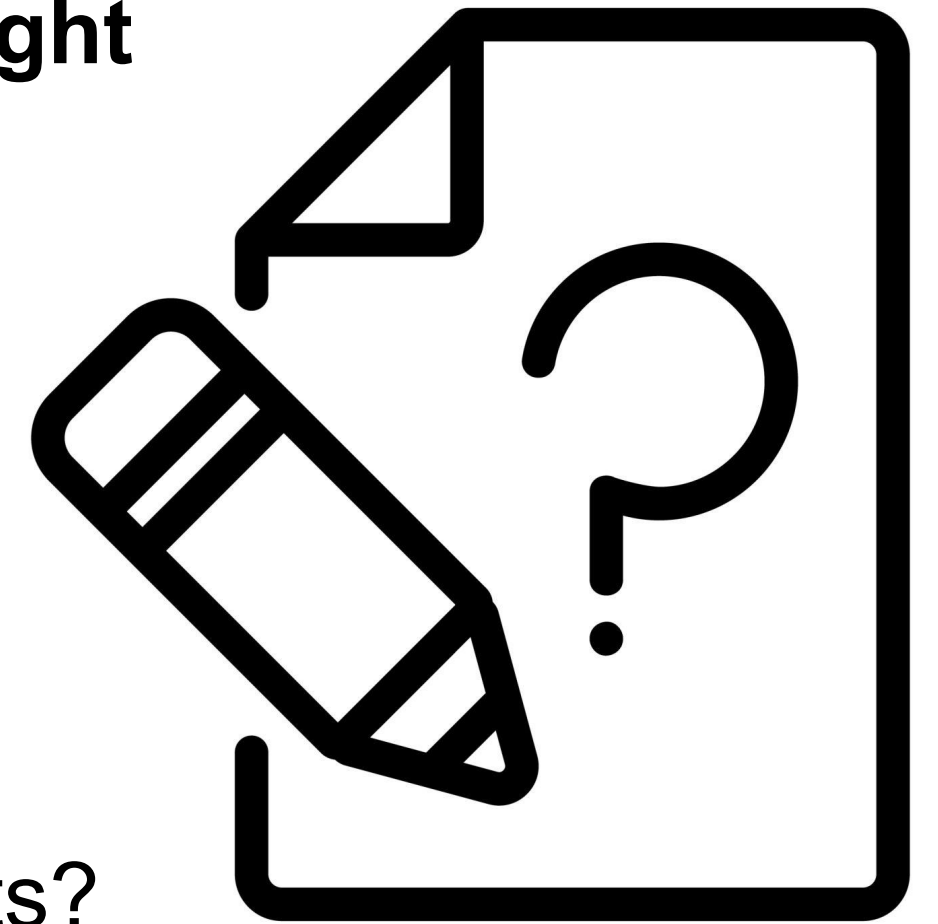


Step 4: Test

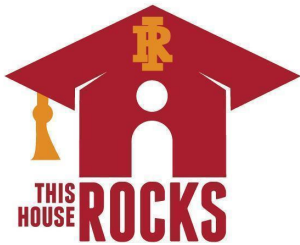

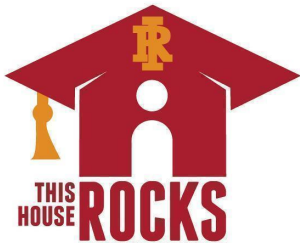
