Contractual Agreement with Gail A. Kisling.

THIS AGREEMENT entered into on **August 4, 2020** between Bonneville School District #93, hereby known as the District, having a principal place of business at 3497 N. Ammon Road, Idaho Falls, Idaho, and **Gail Kisling**, hereby known as the Contractor, is for the school year **2020-21**.

The following service(s) requested: **Speech and Language Therapy**

Dates of service: beginning **August 20, 2020** through **June 30, 2021**

Rates for service: **\$62.00 per hour**

Contractor requirements attached hereto are made a part of this contract.

The parties agree that the Contractor is solely responsible for all costs and expenses incurred in connection with the performance of those services described in this agreement unless noted above.

1. The Contractor agrees to provide speech/language pathology and related services in accordance with the rules and regulations established by the Idaho State Board of Education as provided in Section 33-3003, Idaho Code, as amended for exceptional students living in this district.
2. The Contractor agrees to provide education and/or related services for identified student(s) including:
 - a. The appropriate staff and oversight to implement IEPs for each student as determined by the school IEP team;
 - b. Services to the students according to the school district's **2020-21** school calendar, excluding emergency school closures or when a student is absent.
3. The Contractor further agrees to provide the District the following:
 - a. Services as authorized in the student's IEP/504;
 - b. Other services such as consultations and meetings;
 - c. Assurance that all work will be performed in accordance with the highest professional standards;
 - d. A copy of the service provider's Staff Qualifications showing professional credentials for the district's files;
 - e. Verification all employees who come into contact with the student have been subject to a criminal background check as required by Idaho Code 33-130 and have been determined to not have a criminal history inconsistent with working with children.
 - f. Daily completion of the District's report as a means of written documentation for service days, times and results of services provided for each student, as per the IEP.
 - g. Submission of billing to Special Services for services provided within 30 days of the date of the service provided. Additional hours will be compensated at the same rate, provided that the additional hours, over and above those stated, have received prior**

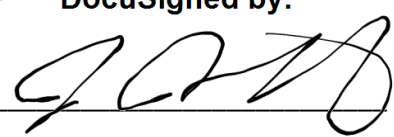
written approval of the Director of Special Services. All invoices should be numbered and dated showing the dates and hours of service provided for each student.

- h. Certificate of Liability Insurance.
 - i. Proof of Worker's Compensation coverage.
4. If the student is no longer receiving services from the Contractor for any reason, the Contractor shall inform the District, and the obligation of the District to pay for services will cease as of the last day of service provided.
 5. The Contractor and the District agree to comply with all pertinent statues of the State of Idaho and such rules and regulations as the State Board of Education may legally prescribe, which are by reference incorporated in and made a part of this Contract as though set forth herein.
 6. The District assures that health-related services or program placement will begin after having conducted an IEP team meeting to develop an IEP. The Contractor, at the District's discretion, may request or attend subsequent IEP team meetings to revise the student's IDP, but a District representative must participate in all such meetings.
 7. The District will pay the Contractor based on submission of an invoice with documentation as described in 3.g.
 8. The District will provide documentation necessary for the Contractor to carry out the portion of the IEP that falls under Contractor responsibility.
 9. The District may terminate this Agreement immediately if the District determines that the Contractor has willfully violated any statutory requirement or government regulation or the services related to this Agreement are modified or terminated for a student. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause upon providing 30 days written notice to the other party.
 10. Contractor shall be solely liable for any losses or damages resulting from performance of any of the services covered by this Agreement. Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the District from any liability, including, but not limited to, cost, expenses, and attorney fees, resulting from Contractor's performance of the services provided under this Agreement. Proof of liability insurance with Bonneville School District #93 listed as an "additional insured" shall be submitted to the District within ten (10) days of the date of this Agreement.

The contractor agrees that as an independent contractor they are not eligible for district benefits of any kind. The contractor also agrees to maintain liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 and worker's compensation coverage for its employees. If the contractor does not have worker's compensation, the contractor will pay \$.55 for every \$ 100 billed. This will be deducted in the invoice.

ATTENDANCE

The process of education requires a regular continuity of instruction, classroom participation, learning experiences, and study in order to reach the goal of maximum educational benefits for each individual child. The regular contact of students with one another in the classroom and their participation in instructional activities under the tutelage of a competent teacher are vital. Education is much more than written assignments or homework; it encompasses instruction, discussion, interaction, and project work which occurs in the classroom. Most of the learning that takes place in a classroom cannot be replicated or sent home as homework. When a child is not in school, learning opportunities are lost. This is an established principle of education that underlies and gives purpose to the statutory requirement of compulsory schooling in this state.

Regular attendance reflects a student's dependability and is a significant factor on the student's permanent record. Future employers are as much concerned about punctuality and dependability as they are about academic record. School success, scholarship, and job opportunity are greatly affected by a good attendance record.

Therefore, the intent of the Board of Trustees is to have students attend school on a regular basis since regular and consistent attendance results in increased learning. A student's presence in the classroom with the regular teacher contributes to time on task, and time on task contributes directly to learning.

All students are required to be in attendance at school at least ninety percent (90%) of the time school is in session during each grading period. **Being in attendance means being physically present in the classroom or engaged in virtual learning online in the direction of the teacher** ~~Therefore, credit may not be granted to students missing more than ten percent (10%) of the time school is in session.~~

Guidelines

1. **Parents/guardians and** students shall be accountable for all absences.
2. Every effort will be made to assure that students are treated fairly and equitably.

Attendance Requirements

1. Except in extraordinary cases, students are expected to be present at school and their assigned grade or subject **or engaged in virtual online learning in the direction of the classroom teacher.**
 - a. **7th - 12th grade students must be present for at least thirty (30) minutes of instruction to be counted as in attendance for each class period.**

toward the maximum number of absences allowed per grading period.

In order for an absence to be excused, an adequate acceptable written or oral excuse must be provided by the student's parent/guardian within forty-eight (48) hours of the last day of the absence, except for school approved activity absences.

Habitual Truant: -any student who repeatedly has violated the attendance regulations established by Board policy; or any child whose parents/guardians, have failed or refused to cause such child to be instructed as provided in Idaho Code 33-202.

Informal Hearing: means that the parent/guardian has an opportunity to explain and provide evidence that the absences were reasonable and that credit should not be denied. The parent/guardian does not have the right to be represented by an attorney.

In-School Suspension: (In-School Detention) one in which the student remains in school, isolated from peers. The student is considered present in school for attendance purposes. Make-up work is allowed.

Late Verified Absences: absence cleared after the forty-eight (48) hour deadline has expired.

~~**Loss of Credit due to Attendance: (LCA).** To be used when a high school student has exceeded the limit of absent days allowed in any class during the grading period. The LCA code will only be used at the high schools.~~

School Sponsored Activity Absences: absences for school sponsored programs in which classes will be missed and are considered to be excused absences. School sponsored activity absences are not counted toward the maximum number of absences.

Supervised School Suspension: one in which the student attends at an alternate location. The student is considered present in school for attendance purposes. Make-up work is allowed.

Suspension: (Out of School Suspension) Involuntary removal from school. The student is supervised by a family member at home. Suspended students will not be counted as truant and make-up work will be required. However, credit for the work will be at the discretion of the teacher and building administrator depending on whether the suspension is related to an academic performance requirement.

Tardies: A student is tardy if he/she is not in the assigned classroom when the bell rings. Teachers may require students to be seated when the bell rings.

Truancies: Absence of a student from class or any portion of a class for any reason other than illness, emergency, or activities which have prior approval of the administration. Parental permission is not valid when a student misses class and remains on school grounds.

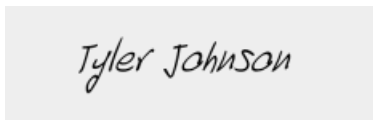

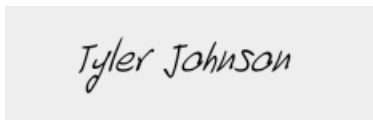
