Mr. Chad Harrod, Chairman, called the Port Tampa Bay (PTB) Business Meeting to order at 9:31 a.m. Chairman Harrod thanked Board members, PTB staff and public for attending.

The following Board members were in attendance: Mr. Chad Harrod, Chairman; Mr. Ted Conner, Vice-Chairman; Mr. Patrick H. Allman, Secretary/Treasurer; The Honorable Christine Miller, Commissioner; and The Honorable Mayor Jane Castor, Commissioner. Port Tampa Bay Commissioner Seats #2 and #4 are currently vacant.

The following PTB senior management staff members were in attendance, Mr. Paul Anderson, President/CEO; Mr. Charles Klug, Principal Counsel; Mr. Raul Alfonso, Executive Vice President and Chief Commercial Officer; Mr. Michael Poole, Chief Financial Officer; Mr. Brian Giuliani, Chief Operating Officer; Mr. Greg Lovelace, Senior Vice President of Business Development and Marketing; Mr. Patrick Blair, Vice President of Engineering; Mr. Ram Kancharla, Vice President of Planning and Economic Development; Mr. Ed Washington, Vice President of Real Estate; Mr. Karl Strauch, Vice President of Marketing; Ms. Joeanne Toledo, Vice President of Human Resources; Mr. Thomas Hobbs, Chief of Staff; Mr. Ken Washington, Chief Information Officer; and Mr. Mark Dubina, Vice President of Security.

**A. INVOCATION – PLEDGE**

Chaplain Steve Finnesy led the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

There were no public comments.

**B. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF JUNE 17, 2025, BOARD MEETING AND JUNE 17, 2025, FINANCIAL AUDIT SELECTION COMMITTEE MEETING**

Mayor Castor, seconded by Commissioner Conner, moved to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was carried unanimously.

**PRESENTATION OF THE CARGO AND CRUISE QUARTERLY REPORT**

Mr. Greg Lovelace outlined the Cargo and Cruise Quarterly Report as presented.

In response to Mayor Castor's question regarding why cement bulk was down 19%, Mr. Lovelace stated that one of the tenants has not been able to handle cement after sustaining storm damage to its dock.

In response to Chairman Harrod's question regarding why the dock has not yet been repaired, Mr. Patrick Blair explained that the tenant was considering multiple options for repairs. There was further discussion regarding the repair process and Port Tampa Bay's role in expediting tenant repairs, with Mr. Klug noting that Port Tampa Bay staff will allow the tenant to proceed as long as the tenant is making progress.

**PRESENTATION AND RECEIPT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR TEN MONTHS ENDING JULY 31, 2025**

Mr. Michael Poole presented the financial statement and reviewed specific line items.

There being no comments, Commissioner Conner, seconded by Mayor Castor, moved to receive the Financial Statement for Ten Months Ending July 31, 2025. The motion was carried unanimously.

There being no comments, Mayor Castor, seconded by Commissioner Miller, moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. The motion was carried unanimously.

## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Chairman Harrod asked that the Executive Director Report be given at this time to accommodate Mr. Anderson's schedule.

Mr. Anderson announced the first recipients of the Anchor Scholarship Foundation have been named. Mr. Anderson explained that the scholarships are funded by the USS Jack H. Lucas Commissioning Committee, which is known as the Jack H. and Ruby Lucas Endowed Scholarship; and awards annual scholarships to three students who are the spouse or child of a U.S. Navy service member who served aboard the USS Jack H. Lucas at least one year. Mr. Anderson noted the following 2025 recipients: Rosav Ramsook, a Navy spouse starting her first year of clinical lab science at the University of California – San Diego, was awarded \$4,000; Karen Luque, a Navy spouse and sophomore studying Business Administration at San Diego City College, was awarded \$2,000; and Mary Louise Nisperos Wiffkopf, a Navy spouse seeking an industry certification in aesthetics from Evergreen Beauty College, was awarded \$2,000.

Mr. Anderson shared that the University of South Florida's (USF) College of Nursing was named a Center of Excellence in Nursing Education by the National League for Nursing. USF was one of 21 nursing education programs nationwide to receive this outstanding achievement.

Mr. Anderson stated that Port Tampa Bay was recognized with a 2025 'Quest for Quality' Award in the gulf port category from Logistics Management magazine, an honor determined by the publication's readers.

Mr. Anderson announced that Port Tampa Bay's Engineering team has been working with DarkSky International, the leading global authority on light pollution, to launch a groundbreaking new certification program to bring responsible lighting to industrial-scale seaports. The *DarkSky Approved Port Marine Terminal Lighting Program* is designed to significantly reduce light pollution, safeguarding sensitive coastal ecosystems and nearby communities, while enhancing safe and efficient working conditions. The certification program was initiated in 2023 in partnership with Port Tampa Bay. At the port, berths 301 and 218 will feature responsible industrial lighting methods to protect sensitive wetlands and adjacent nature preserve.

Mr. Anderson stated that Carnival Cruise Line recently completed its inaugural summer jobs program for high school students in five of its U.S. homeports, including Port Tampa Bay. The program provided students who are at least 17 years old with six weeks of paid, hands-on experience at Carnival's cruise terminal operations and helps the maritime community inspire the next generation of workers. Mr. Anderson continued that earlier this month, Carnival hosted 11 interns for a celebration aboard the Carnival *Paradise* while she was at port. The students represented schools throughout Tampa Bay and even included the daughter of Port Tampa Bay's Director of Finance, Phillip Lawson.

**D. REGULAR AGENDA**

**1. APPROVAL OF AMENDMENT TO PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION GRANT AGREEMENT (PTGA) WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION – SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDS TO PTGA #435130-19406, G1092**

Mr. Ram Kancharla outlined the item as presented in the agenda.

There being no comments, Mayor Castor, seconded by Commissioner Conner, moved to authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to enter into Public Transportation Grant Agreement #435130-19406, G1092, with the Florida Department of Transportation, District Seven, in the amount of \$8,714,322 for Berth 214 improvements, which requires a match from PTB in the amount of \$8,714,322, subject to review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

**2. APPROVAL OF PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION GRANT AGREEMENT (PTGA) WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION – PTGA #455639-19401**

Mr. Kancharla outlined the item as presented in the agenda.

In response to Mayor Castor's question as to where dredge materials are taken for disposal, Mr. Patrick Blair explained that maintenance dredge materials are of low quality and not usually utilized for things like beach renourishment, construction or raising elevations. However, he noted that first cut/deep dredge material is of higher quality and could be used for such purposes. He continued that certain cuts are broken down to seven sections with "Contract A" including Eastport, Port Sutton and the west side of Hooker's Point up to the REK facility. He also noted that most of that material will be filling Eastport Phase 3, in the reclamation of 60 acres. Port Tampa Bay also works with the local community to locate projects where good material can have a beneficial use and reduce environmental impacts.

There being no further comments, Commissioner Miller, seconded by Mayor Castor, moved to authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to enter into Public Transportation Grant Agreement (#455639-19401) with FDOT, District 7, for \$3,000,000 for Navigational Improvements/Maintenance Dredging with a local match of \$1,000,000. Also authorize the payment of \$52,500 to the Florida Port Council, subject to review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

**3. APPROVAL OF LEASE AGREEMENT WITH REDWING MATERIALS I, LLC**

Mr. Ed Washington outlined this item and item D-4 together, as presented in the respective agenda items.

In response to Chairman Harrod's question regarding when the shared conveyor system on Port Redwing would be operational, Mr. Washington stated that the conveyor system should be completed and operational in approximately two years. There was further discussion regarding the status of SESCO's construction with Mr. Washington explaining that SESCO has ramped up with its warehouse nearing completion and the loader on schedule to be completed in November.

There was further discussion regarding the history of Port Redwing with Mr. Klug explaining that Port Tampa Bay acquired the southern half of the property in 1995, and a Surface Water Improvement Management (SWIM) program purchased the northern half. Mr. Klug continued that Port Redwing began to generate a lot of interest after Mr. Anderson's efforts to deepen the channel from approximately 34 to 42 feet around 2019.

There being no further comments, Mayor Castor, seconded by Commissioner Conner moved to authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to execute a lease agreement with Redwing Materials I, LLC, in accordance with the terms set forth in this agenda item, subject to review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

#### **4. APPROVAL OF LEASE AMENDMENT WITH PANGAEA FLORIDA, LLC**

Having presented this item in concurrence with item D-3, Mr. Washington read the recommendation as listed in this agenda.

There being no further comments, Mayor Castor, seconded by Commissioner Conner, moved to authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to execute a lease amendment with Pangaea Florida, LLC, in accordance with the terms set forth in this agenda item, subject to review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

#### **5. APPROVAL OF LEASE AGREEMENT WITH ARGOS MATERIALS, LLC**

Mr. Ed Washington outlined the item as presented in the agenda.

In response to Commissioner Allman's question regarding Port Tampa Bay granting a non-exclusive easement to Argos to move commodities at Berth 31, Mr. Washington explained that Argos will temporarily utilize Berth 30 while Port Tampa Bay is adding a breasting dolphin to Berth 31, which will give Argos the opportunity to bring its product straight into its site.

In response to Chairman Harrod's question regarding which entity is financially responsible for the Lease, Mr. Washington noted that Argos Materials 1, LLC is a subsidiary of Cemargos, which is wholly owned by Cementos Argos and, which in turn, is wholly owned by Grupo Argos. Cementos Argos is the main parent entity and Mr. Washington continued that he had thoroughly reviewed the financial statements from all the stated entities.

There being no further comments, Commissioner Allman, seconded by Mayor Castor, moved to authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to execute a lease agreement with Argos Materials I, LLC, in accordance with the terms set forth in this agenda item, subject to review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

#### **6. APPROVAL OF THE PURCHASE OF PORT TAMPA BAY EQUIPMENT FOR FACILITIES MANAGEMENT DEPARTMENT**

Port Tampa Bay Director of Facilities Management, Mr. Norberto Sanchez, outlined the item as presented in the agenda.

In response to Commissioner Allman's question regarding where the equipment would be stored and how it would be transported, Mr. Sanchez stated that the equipment will be stored in Port Tampa Bay Facilities Department's warehouse, and a trailer is being purchased as one of

the 16 pieces of equipment. Additionally, in the instance of extreme weather events, a third-party contractor will be in place to provide a lowboy trailer to transport equipment as needed.

There was further discussion regarding whether the listed generators being purchased will be portable or stationary, and what warranties are in place. Mr. Sanchez explained that there are preventative maintenance contracts for the stationary generators located on PTB-owned sites however there are no preventative maintenance contracts for the portable generators. After further discussion with Chairman Harrod expressing concern for warranty coverage being linked to specific preventative maintenance actions, Mr. Sanchez stated he would check into that.

There being no further comments, Commissioner Allman, seconded by Commissioner Miller, moved to authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to purchase 16 pieces of equipment as listed in this agenda item for the Facilities Management Department in the amount of \$1,102,908.00, subject to review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

Mr. Paul Anderson left the meeting at 10:32 am.

**7. APPROVAL OF THE PURCHASE OF PORT TAMPA BAY HVAC CHILLERS FOR CRUISE TERMINAL NO. 3 AND CHILLER COILS FOR HEADQUARTERS BUILDING FROM TRANE US INC.**

Mr. Sanchez outlined the item as presented in the agenda.

Mr. Sanchez explained that, in addition to only replacing one chiller at the time, the installation would work with the cruise schedule for minimal impact and, should it be necessary, a temporary chiller would be provided.

There being no further comments, Commissioner Allman, seconded by Mayor Castor, moved to authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to approve the purchase and repairs for the HVAC equipment at Cruise Terminal #3 and Headquarters from Trane US Inc., in the amount of \$1,217,044.00, subject to review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

**8. APPROVAL OF CONTRACT AWARD FOR JANITORIAL SERVICES AT PORT TAMPA BAY FACILITIES**

Mr. Sanchez outlined the item as presented in the agenda.

In response to Chairman Harrod's question regarding how the six percent contingency could be utilized, Mr. Sanchez explained that additional services could become necessary in instances of a delayed ship due to fog and various circumstances, or after an extreme weather event. The contingency would allow for that added expense. Further discussion revealed that a minimal amount of contingency funds had been used in the previous contract year.

There being no further comments, Commissioner Conner, seconded by Mayor Castor, moved to authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to enter into an agreement with Xtremely Clean Janitorial Services LLC to provide janitorial services for the period of one (1) year with two (2) one (1) year extension options in the amount of \$579,812.00, and authorize a total budget of \$614,600.72 for the project, which includes a six percent (6%) contingency for unforeseen circumstances that may occur during the contract term, subject to approval of the FY2026 Operating Budget and review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

**9. APPROVAL OF THE PURCHASE OF PORT TAMPA BAY SURVEY VESSEL**

Mr. Patrick Blair outlined the item as presented in the agenda.

There was discussion regarding the need for an additional survey vessel, its primary use, as well as where the vessel would be stored during a heavy weather event. Mr. Blair explained that the primary use is surveying for maintenance dredging and PTB staff would assist the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE) and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association (NOAA) with post-storm surveying to open the channel as quickly as possible. Mr. Blair continued that the vessel would be stored in PTB's heavy weather storage building and has invited ACOE and NOAA to also store their vessels at the same location.

In response to Commissioner Miller's question regarding the use of the current vessel after the new vessel is delivered, Mr. Blair stated that the current vessel would be maintained and continued to be utilized as needed.

There being no further comments, Commissioner Allman, seconded by Miller, moved to authorize the Port President/CEO or his designee, to approve up to \$750,000 for the purchase of the new survey vessel from Silver Ships, Inc. with associated equipment, through the competitively bid GSA contract (GS-07F-5953P), subject to review by Port counsel. The motion was carried unanimously.

**10. APPROVAL OF AUTHORIZATION TO MODIFY FUNDING FOR LIEBHERR-AMERICA, INC. CONTRACT FOR TWO NEW SHIP-TO-SHORE GANTRY CRANES**

Mr. Michael Poole outlined the item as presented in the agenda.

There was discussion regarding the currency conversion rates as it relates to the timing of the down payment and subsequent payment installments. In response to Chairman Harrod's question regarding if the conversion rates become much more favorable to PTB, would PTB be able to revert to the better conversion rate, Mr. Poole explained that there would be a significant termination penalty. There was discussion regarding timing of the transaction with Mr. Poole outlining the risk of not locking in the current conversion rate and noting that associated fees for this transaction are included. There was further discussion regarding the tariff and staff stated that they would explore applying for a waiver. Mr. Raul Alfonso stated that staff wanted to align the purchase of the cranes to the completion of the Berth 214 project, with the cranes becoming operational in late 2026 or the Spring of 2027.

Commissioner Allman proposed an amendment to approve this item as recommended and additionally approve the additional \$7 million to cover the additional cash in US dollars needed to accommodate the conversion rate and the 15% tariff.

There being no further comments, Commissioner Allman, seconded by Commissioner Conner, moved to authorize funding of the Liebherr-America, Inc. contract for two new ship-to-shore gantry cranes in the amount of (€)30,653,827 plus payment of 15% for the applicable tariff, and authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to execute the contract as modified by this agenda item, and increase funding within the Fiscal Year 2025 Capital Budget by an additional

\$7 million to accommodate the aforementioned payments, subject to final review by Port counsel. The amended motion was carried unanimously.

Mayor Castor, seconded by Commissioner Miller, moved to receive reports as presented. The motion was carried four to zero with Mayor Castor being absent.

**EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT**

The Executive Director Report was given immediately following the Consent Agenda.

**F. PRESENTATIONS**

There was no presentation.

Mr. Klug stated that representatives of Maschmeyer were present and would like to address the Board. Mr. Ed Washington introduced Mr. Troy Maschmeyer, Mr. Steve Bishop, Mr. Jeff Cathey and Mr. Mary Fallon, the principals of Maschmeyer Concrete, which is the parent company of Redwing Materials 1, LLC (Redwing). Mr. Fallon thanked the Board for approving the updated lease. Mr. Fallon continued that Redwing had purchased the machine to mill the slag in Europe and was facing the same issues with conversion rates and the 15% tariff. Maschmeyer has been in business for 80-plus years and is a major ready-mix company in Florida. Site construction should take approximately 18 to 24 months and once operational, the site will make slag to go with the cement and the concrete.

In response to Chairman Harrod's question as to why Redwing chose Port Tampa Bay, Mr. Fallon stated that the site is ideal and deep water with raw materials coming from overseas and manufactured on site, then sent out into the marketplace. So it was the ideal port for the location of Maschmeyer's assets.

**SUBJECT: WHARFAGE INCENTIVE AGREEMENT WITH SEACATLINE****BACKGROUND:**

SeacatLine, a division of the Curacao-based Seatrade Group, is one of the world's leading refrigerated shipping companies, offering specialized reefer and dry container transport, as well as break-bulk and project cargo solutions. SeacatLine operates a container service between Costa Rica and Port Tampa Bay (PTB) with the M/V Pia Express and recently announced the expansion of container service with an additional vessel, the M/V Progreso, enhancing its weekly schedule with a third bi-weekly sailing and reinforcing its role as a vital trade link between Florida and Central America. M/V Progreso together with M/V Pia Express will increase the capacity on the Tuesday/Wednesday weekly SeacatLine's service with a 5-day transit time between Moin, Costa Rica, and Port Tampa Bay's PLRS terminal along Berth 219, operating and supporting additional cargo volume in both directions.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

To support the expansion of this service, PTB staff and SeacatLine have negotiated the following wharfage discounts for containers and breakbulk:

**SUBJECT: EXTENSION OF COMPREHENSIVE BANKING SERVICES AGREEMENT****BACKGROUND:**

At its August 17, 2021, meeting, the Port Tampa Bay (PTB) Board approved an agreement with Truist Bank to provide Comprehensive Banking Services for an initial term of three years with two extension options of one year each. While not all-inclusive, Comprehensive Banking Services include the establishment and maintenance of checking, overnight investment and ongoing investment accounts, online treasury management services, provision of corporate purchasing card services, electronic bank transfers, Automatic Clearing House (ACH) origination, credit card processing and disaster planning.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

The initial three-year term began October 1, 2021, and ended September 30, 2024. On September 17, 2024, the PTB Board approved the first one-year extension option for the period October 1, 2024, to September 30, 2025. PTB Staff is requesting the second one-year extension option for the period October 1, 2025, to September 30, 2026.

Funding for this extension has been included in the proposed FY2026 Operating Budget.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to execute a one-year renewal extension of the agreement with Truist Bank.

**SUBJECT: WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND AUTO INSURANCE COVERAGE****BACKGROUND:**

Florida Insurance Alliance (FIA) was established to provide various types of insurance coverage (such as workers' compensation and auto) to Florida public entities. The major components used in determining premiums for workers' compensation policies are the projected payrolls for each classification of employees multiplied by the designated rates for each of those classifications and the insured's "Experience Modification Factor" developed by the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI). An "Experience Modification Factor" is an indicator of an organization's historical loss experience over the past 3 years. Port Tampa Bay's (PTB) Experience Modification Factor is viewed as favorable.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

PTB's insurance broker, Arthur J. Gallagher (AJG), has solicited the workers' compensation and auto insurance market to obtain the best possible coverage at the most economical cost. For workers' compensation, the current policy with Florida Insurance Alliance expires on September 30, 2025, at annual cost of \$101,734. Florida Insurance Alliance has offered a workers' compensation policy for the period October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, for a premium of \$107,497.

For auto insurance, the current policy with Florida Insurance Alliance expires on September 30, 2025, at an annual cost of \$100,382. Florida Insurance Alliance has offered an auto policy for the period October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, for a premium of \$91,309.

Funds for these insurance coverages have been included in the FY2026 Operating Expense budget. Since Arthur J. Gallagher is PTB's broker, it would bill PTB for the premium and PTB, in turn, would pay Florida Insurance Alliance.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to execute agreements with Florida Insurance Alliance for a one (1) year period from October 1, 2025, to September 30, 2026, at an annual premium of \$107,497 for workers' compensation insurance and \$91,309 for auto insurance, subject to review by Port counsel.

(TCC) for the Landscape Services Agreement (Agreement) that commenced on October 1, 2024 for an initial term of one (1) year with two (2) one (1) year extension options.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

PTB staff is satisfied with T.C.C.'s performance and recommends exercising the first extension option extending the Agreement to September 30, 2026, and authorizing the funding of the Agreement for an amount not to exceed \$138,100 per contract year.

T.C.C. is a Port Tampa Bay registered Small Business Enterprise. Funding for this Agreement is included in the proposed FY2026 Operating Budget.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

At the October 22, 2024, Board meeting, PTB's Board of Commissioners approved the selection of T.C.C. Enterprise, Inc. (TCC) for the Grounds Maintenance Agreement (Agreement). The parties entered into an agreement that commenced on October 1, 2024, for an initial term of one (1) year with two (2) one (1) year extension options.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

PTB staff has been satisfied with T.C.C.'s performance and recommends exercising the first extension option extending the Agreement to September 30, 2026, and authorizing the funding of the Agreement for an amount not to exceed \$456,060 per contract year, which includes a 10% contingency for unforeseen circumstances.

T.C.C. is a Port Tampa Bay registered Small Business Enterprise. Funding for this Agreement is included in the proposed FY2026 Operating Budget.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to exercise the first extension option of the Grounds Maintenance Agreement with T.C.C. Enterprise, Inc. for the term of October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, for an amount not to exceed \$456,060, subject to review by Port Counsel.

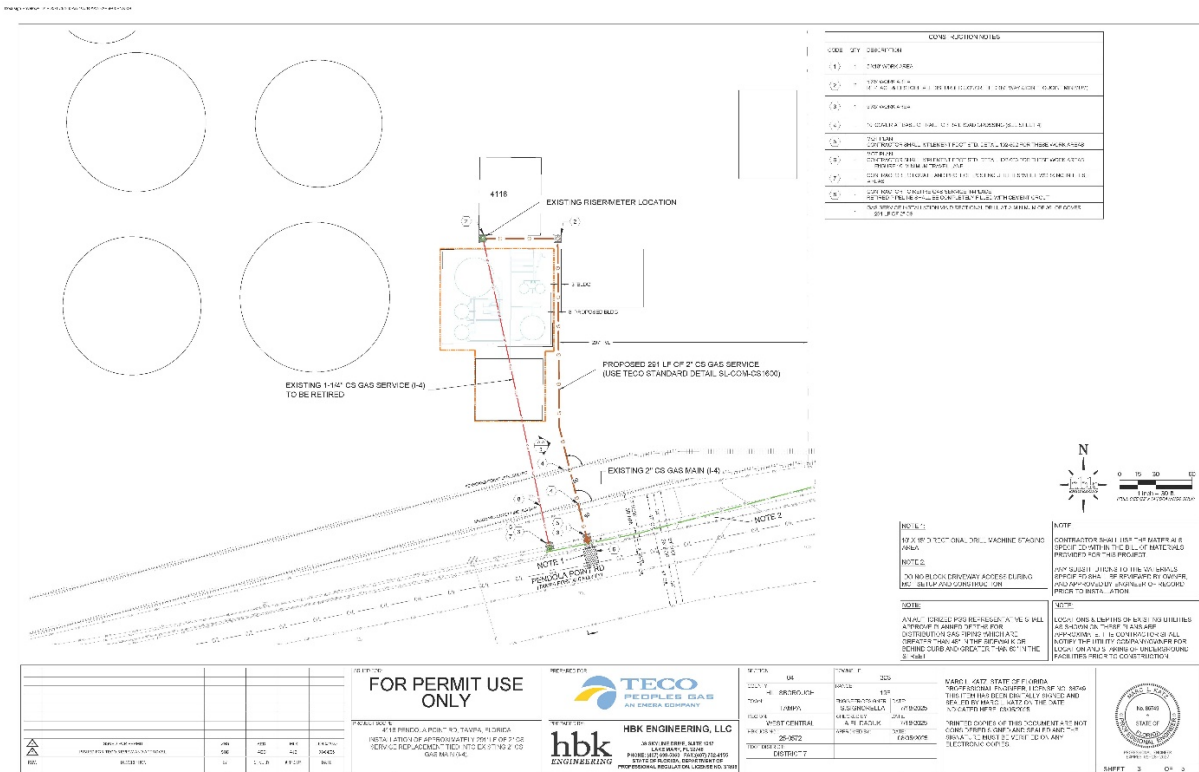
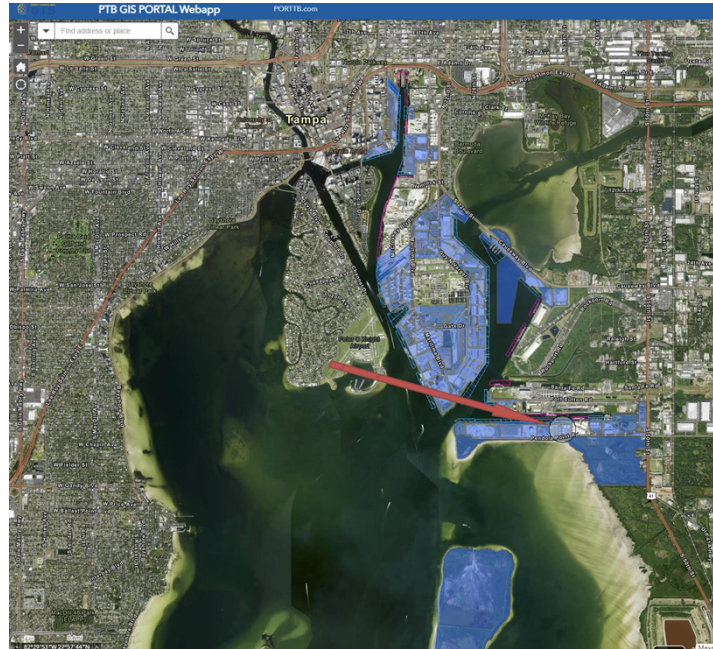
Martin Operating Partnership, LP (Martin) is owned by Martin Midstream Partners, L.P., a publicly traded limited partnership with terminal operations and storage services for petroleum products, natural gas, LPG, Sulphur processing and distribution. Martin's Tampa terminal is one of four specialty terminals located throughout the Gulf Coast region that provides integrated services. PTB entered into a lease agreement (Lease) with Martin in 1995 to lease land on Pendola Point which expires December 15, 2026. Peoples Gas System, Inc., has submitted a site improvements permit application for the installation of approximately 291' LF of 2" CSS service replacement tied into existing 2" CSGAS Main (I-4) to provide new gas service to Martin.

PTB staff has reviewed the application, determined that the proposed location of improvements does not have any conflicts, and recommends approval of the site improvements permit and the granting of the associated utility easement.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Approve the site improvements permit and authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to approve the site improvements permit and execute the applicable utility easement with Peoples Gas System, Inc., for the installation of new gas service to Martin Operating Partnership, LP, as described in this agenda item, subject to review by Port counsel.

**SUBJECT: CONTRACT EXTENSION WITH BAYVIEW PUBLIC RELATIONS, INC. FOR SOCIAL MEDIA CONSULTANT SERVICES**

**BACKGROUND:**

On September 19, 2023, the Port Tampa Bay (PTB) Board of Commissioners approved the contract award for communications consulting services to Bayview Public Relations, Inc., d/b/a B2 Communications (B2 Communications) for a term of one (1) year with two (2) one-year extension options. The first one-year extension expires September 30, 2025.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

Throughout the year, B2 Communications worked with senior port staff on a variety of issues, offering primary support for the Director of Communications. B2 Communications' staff have assisted with media requests, special events, media relations, social media, digital industry communications, and media strategies.

PTB staff recommends exercising the second one-year contract extension options with B2 Communications for the period October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, for an amount not to exceed \$25,000, which includes all expenses except as specifically authorized by PTB on special assignments. The contract is non-exclusive and PTB retains the right to engage additional outside consulting services on an as-needed basis. All other terms and conditions of the original contracts, including the right to terminate upon thirty (30) days' written notice, would remain the same. B2 Communications is a PTB registered Small Business Enterprise.

Funds for these renewals were included in the proposed FY26 Operating budget.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to exercise the second one-year extension option to the social media public relations agreement with Bayview Public Relations, Inc. d/b/a B2 Communications, from October 1, 2025, through September 30, 2026, per the terms described in this agenda item and for an amount not to exceed \$25,000, subject to review by Port counsel.

**SUBJECT: EXTENSION OF THE VIDEO PRODUCTION SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH SHOOTING STARS POST, INC.**

**BACKGROUND:**

Port Tampa Bay (PTB) retains a video production company to represent PTB with a high-quality visual identity through video production services that are strategically placed in multi-media channels for distribution. At its meeting on August 15, 2023, the PTB Board awarded the Video Production Services Agreement to Shooting Stars Post, Inc. (Shooting Stars) for an initial term of one (1) with two (2) extension options of one (1) year each with an amount not to exceed \$90,000. The PTB Board approved the first extension of the contract at its August 20, 2024, Board meeting. PTB staff would like to exercise the final extension option.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

PTB's video production and library is a critical component to both the trade and the consumer-facing side of our business. Sight, sound, and motion is critical in today's world in capturing the attention of our audience in various multimedia channels and is imperative to the strategic goals of Marketing and Business Development.

Shooting Stars Post has provided consistent services that help support our efforts to promote PTB'S the Port Tampa Bay brand both locally and internationally. Shooting Stars has been instrumental in assisting PTB maintain a consistent and synergistic look and feel to its video productions and in the furtherance of PTB's brand. This past year Shooting Stars has completed digital video presentation(s) and has supplemented PTB's video library with updated vignettes as new cargos, ships, services, land developments, and tenants were added to PTB's diverse business lines and operations. In addition, Shooting Stars has documented new ship arrivals and supported a new execution for our tradeshow video presentation.

The contract extension would be for one (1) additional year (September 1, 2025, to August 31, 2026) for an amount not to exceed \$90,000.00. The funding for this contract was included in the approved FY2025 and proposed FY2026 Operating Budget.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to execute the final one (1) year extension option of the Agreement for Video Production Services for the period commencing September 1, 2025, through August 31, 2026, with Shooting Stars Post, Inc., for an amount not to exceed \$90,000.00, subject to review by Port counsel.

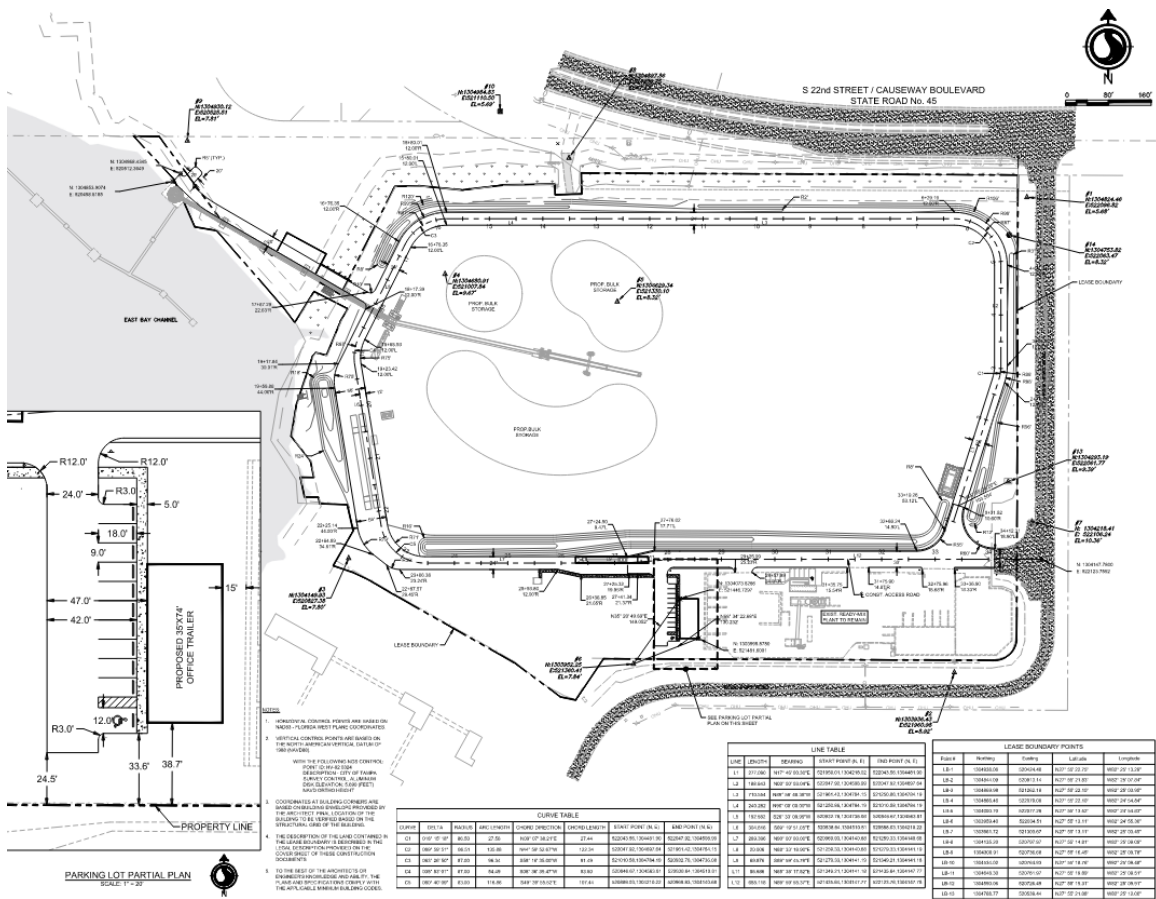
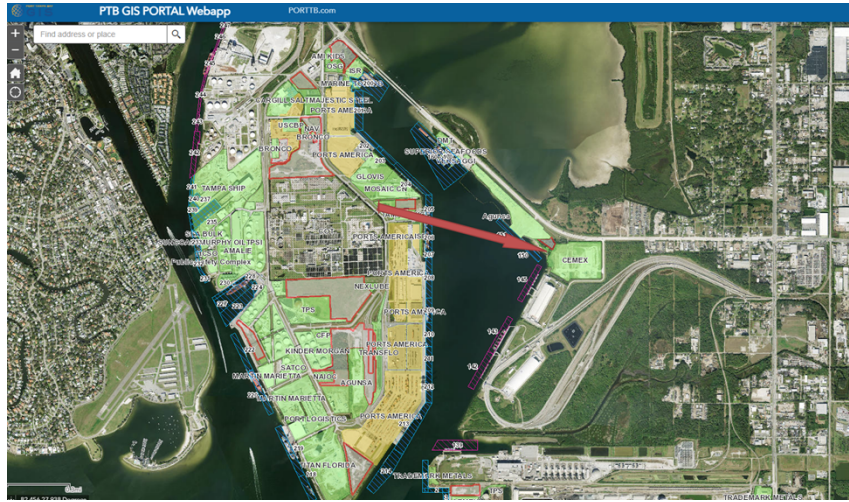

The estimated cost of construction is \$9.2 million. This development is under construction and requires a utility easement for a new electrical service from Tampa Electric Company (TECO).

**SUBJECT: RANKING OF FIRMS AND CONTRACT AWARD FOR FINANCIAL AUDITING SERVICES, RFP 002-25**

**BACKGROUND:**

On April 29, 2025, PTB Board's Financial Audit Committee (Audit Committee) approved the Scope of Services for a Request for Proposals (RFP) to acquire Financial Auditing Services for an initial term of three years with two separate one-year extension options. The RFP requested the firms provide their fee amount for years one, two and three. The fee for years four and five will be negotiated if the extension options are awarded. A Small Business Enterprise goal of nine percent was requested. Five firms responded to the RFP. A staff advisory team reviewed the proposals and provided a preliminary ranking. The proposals and the preliminary ranking were submitted to the Audit Committee in advance of the Audit Committee meeting.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

On June 17, 2025, the Audit Committee, after reviewing the proposals and discussion, ranked the five firms (highest to lowest) as follows:

- 1) Rivero, Gordimer & Company, P.A.
- 2) Mauldin & Jenkins, LLC
- 3) Crowe, LLP
- 4) Cherry Bekaert, LLP
- 5) Carr, Riggs & Ingram, LLC

The Audit Committee requested that the two highest ranked firms provide a presentation at a subsequent meeting. At the August 18, 2025 Audit Committee meeting, the top two firms (Rivero, Gordimer and Mauldin & Jenkins) provided presentations and answered questions from Audit Committee members.

After discussion and scoring, the Audit Committee ranked Mauldin & Jenkins (with SBE partner Public Sector Performance Associates) as the highest ranked firm and Rivero, Gordimer & Company, P.A., as the second ranked firm. Mauldin & Jenkins' fee proposal for the first three years is as follows - Year 1: \$64,900; Year 2: \$65,900; Year 3: \$67,900 (total \$198,700). The first-year amount is included in our FY 2026 Operating Budget with the following years to be included in subsequent year's budgets.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Approve the ranking of the final two firms and authorize the Port President/CEO to execute a contract with the highest ranked firm, Mauldin & Jenkins, LLC, to provide financial auditing services for a three-year term in an amount of \$64,900, for year 1, \$65,900, for year 1, and \$67,900, for year 3 with two separate one-year extension options. PTB staff would negotiate the fee with Mauldin & Jenkins, LLC prior to the beginning of each subsequent contract year and would submit the fee to the Board for approval. All terms of the contract are subject to review by Principal counsel.

**SUBJECT: CONTRACT EXTENSION AND INCREASED FUNDING FOR GENERAL PLANNING CONSULTING SERVICES**

**BACKGROUND:**

On June 29, 2023, Port Tampa Bay (PTB) solicited a Request for Qualifications (RFQ No. Q-005-23) for General Planning Services Consultants, and on August 15, 2023, PTB's Board of Commissioners (Board) authorized an agreement with Renaissance Planning Group, Inc. for an initial term of one (1) year with two (2) consecutive one (1) year extension options.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has awarded Port Tampa Bay (PTB) \$150,000 to support the development of a transportation master plan, which will be undertaken by Renaissance Planning Group, Inc. PTB's FY 2025/26 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget includes \$550,000 for general planning services, of which \$150,000 is being funded by the FDOT grant.

**FACT/COMMENTS:**

The Renaissance team assists PTB with a wide range of professional studies, plans, assessments, and grant proposals. Their team consists of several firms which specialize in various port and maritime related general planning services including freight and transportation planning; cruise and cargo planning and forecasting; preliminary project development and engineering; grant proposal development; and economic analysis. In particular, the Renaissance team has been instrumental in providing planning services necessary for grant applications and proposals including economic impact analysis, market assessment, financial policy, project presentation and technical analysis. The firm has proven to be responsive and cooperative.

Work under this Agreement is assigned by PTB to the consultant through work orders and Renaissance is compensated only for actual work performed and costs incurred in the performance of the services. Staff recommend exercising the second one (1) year extension option with Renaissance Planning Group, Inc., for a not to exceed budget amount of \$550,000, which is included in PTB's FY 2025/26 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) budget. Of this amount, \$150,000 will be funded through a grant award from FDOT for the development of a transportation master plan, with the balance funded by PTB funds.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to exercise the final one (1) year extension option with Renaissance Planning Group, Inc. under the General Planning Services Agreement, for a not-to-exceed budget amount of \$550,000, through September 30, 2026, subject to budget approval and review by Port counsel.

**SUBJECT: INCREASED FUNDING FOR CONTRACT WITH HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES AND AUTHORIZE THE USE OF THIRD-PARTY CONTRACTOR TO ADMINISTER OFF-DUTY LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES**

**BACKGROUND:**

At its September 20, 2022, meeting, Port Tampa Bay's (PTB) Board authorized a contract with the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office (HCSO) to provide dedicated law enforcement services at Port Tampa Bay for a term of six (6) years through September 30, 2028.

**FACTS/COMMENTS:**

The six (6) year HCSO contract includes costs associated with personnel, motor vehicle replacement/maintenance, operational support, training, and equipment replacement. These costs are identified in the contract, which also allows for annual adjustments of five percent (5%) for salaries and additional adjustments to costs associated with motor vehicle replacement/maintenance, operational support, staffing levels, training, and equipment replacement. Total budgeted costs related to the contract in FY2025 were \$3,754,165. Total costs associated with this contract in FY2026 are \$4,146,518.

In addition, HCSO recently notified PTB that HCSO has engaged the services of a third-party contractor, Off Duty Management (ODM), to administer off-duty law enforcement services for HCSO. This change will require PTB to use ODM to schedule off duty Sheriff Deputies for off duty employment including, but not limited to, cruise security and special events. ODM will collect an administrative fee of 14.5% or \$6.50, whichever is greater, per Deputy, per hour. This change will allow PTB to eliminate costs of direct payment of Deputies for off duty employment using the PTB payroll system known as Paylocity.

Funding for this contract and off duty employment of HCSO Deputies was included in the proposed FY2026 Port Operating Budget.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Authorize the increase of the HCSO contract in an amount not to exceed \$4,146,518 and authorize the Port President/CEO, or his designee, to execute an amendment with HCSO for law enforcement services for such increased funding; and authorize the use of a third-party contractor, chosen by the HCSO, to administer off-duty Sheriff Deputies for PTB, all subject to review by Port counsel.
