Agreement for Service

- 1. The Oregon School Boards Association (OSBA) will provide the Corbett School District (District) with workshops and facilitation services in conjunction with the OSBA Rural Caucus Scholarship Program to be **completed by June 30, 2026**.
- 2. The Corbett School District will schedule services with the assigned OSBA consultant at the current fee schedule rate, not to exceed the full Rural Caucus Scholarship Program award of **\$1,500**. Rates for services and expenses include, but are not limited to, the following:

Full Rural Caucus Scholarship Program	\$1,500.00
Full-day workshop (up to 6 hours)	\$1,200 plus travel
Half-day workshop (up to 3 hours)	\$885 plus travel
Board Self-Assessment Survey (BSAS)	\$910 plus travel
Professional Time	\$200/hour
Travel Time	\$100/hour
Mileage (calculated from the consultant’s location)	IRS Rate
Meals, lodging and other expenses (if applicable)	Actual Cost

Total expenses covered under the scholarship shall not exceed \$1,500.00. Any additional expenses or projects beyond this amount will be billed separately.

- 3. If OSBA’s fees increase, OSBA will notify the district in writing thirty days prior to the increase in fees charged pursuant to this agreement.
- 4. Cancellation more than 24 hours prior to an in-person meeting:
 - a. If the cancellation is more than twenty-four (24) hours from the scheduled in person meeting and the Association has incurred no expenses (e.g., mileage, lodging, cancellation fees, meals) there will be no charge for the cancellation.
- 5. Cancellation less than 24 hours prior to an in-person meeting:
 - a. If the cancellation is within twenty-four (24) hours of the scheduled in person meeting, then the Corbett School District is responsible for any expenses the Association has incurred (e.g., mileage, lodging, meals, and other travel-related costs including any cancellation fees).
- 6. Cancellation, rescheduling, and alternative provisions of service due to safety concerns:
 - a. District agrees to provide a safe, non-discriminatory working environment for OSBA staff. Failure to provide a safe, non-discriminatory working environment for OSBA staff, may result in termination of this contract.
 - b. OSBA consultant may determine that inclement weather conditions pose a safety risk and prevent travel for an in-person workshop or meeting. If this occurs, the meeting may be moved to a virtual format, if appropriate. If this is not possible, appropriate, or the District does not wish to have the meeting virtually, the meeting will be rescheduled
 - c. OSBA consultant may determine that conditions for an upcoming meeting pose a safety risk and has the right to request additional security personnel be present at the meeting, or that the meeting be moved to a virtual format. If the District is not able or willing to provide any of these accommodations, the meeting will be rescheduled.
 - d. If conditions at a meeting become such that the OSBA consultant feels that their safety is at risk, or is uncomfortable proceeding with the meeting, they may ask that the meeting be recessed, rescheduled, move to a virtual format, or they may leave the meeting.
- 7. The Corbett School District will not be invoiced for the \$1,500 scholarship award provided by the Rural Caucus. Scholarship funds will be applied directly to the cost of services. The district will be invoiced only for expenses exceeding \$1,500 after services are completed and scholarship funds are exhausted.
- 8. This Agreement shall be effective on the day it is signed by both parties and shall terminate upon completion of services or on the date the Corbett School District ceases to be a member of the Oregon School Boards Association, or upon nonpayment of invoiced services.
- 9. The Corbett School District may terminate this agreement at any time by providing written notice to the Oregon School Boards Association. The Corbett School District will remain responsible for payment for any services incurred up to the time of the written notice is received by the Association, but the Corbett School District will not be responsible for any costs incurred after receipt of the written notice terminating this agreement.

10. The Oregon School Boards Association may terminate this agreement at any time by providing written notice to the Corbett School District for failure to comply with the program requirements as stated in the application submitted by the Corbett School Board. The Corbett School District will remain responsible for payment for any services incurred up to the time written notice is received by the Corbett School District, but the Corbett School District will not be responsible for any costs incurred after receipt of the written notice terminating this agreement.

Hello -

Congratulations on being awarded your Rural Caucus Scholarship! I will be the one working with your board, and would like to set up a Zoom meeting with the next couple of weeks or so to start planning. Here are a few things to know about the program before we get started, as these are the most common initial questions:

- You were awarded \$1,500, which acts as a credit toward training and travel costs. Travel costs include travel time, mileage at the IRS rate, hotel, and meals, if applicable. (I live close – we won't need hotel and meals.)
- Virtual trainings do not incur travel expenses.
- Since the scholarship functions as a credit, if you schedule a training that exceeds your allocated award, you will be billed for the overage.
- All scholarship funds must be used by June 30. Anything not used by June 30 is forfeited.
- Because there are no training events/conferences that happen between now and June 30, these funds cannot be used for registration for events – they are meant for full board training.
- We can essentially do anything the board needs! Some boards need a governance essentials training, some boards want to do a self-assessment, a superintendent evaluation, learn about how to do strategic planning, get started on a larger project and save some money with the credit, etc. I'll work with you to figure out what works best.

Oregon Department of Education Releases 2024-25 At-A-Glance School and District Profiles

The data show highest-ever percentage of students on track to graduate and a continued increase in student attendance; Oregon Online Report Card also updated.

(Salem, OR) – The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) today released the At-A-Glance School and District Profiles for the 2024-25 school year. These profiles were designed with community input to show how schools and districts compare to the statewide average in a number of categories, including regular attenders, statewide assessments, 9th grade on-track to graduate, on-time graduation, and five-year completion. Oregon's Online Report Card has also been updated, making data more accessible and transparent and allowing parents and families to readily see how their child's school is doing in comparison to the district and the state with new data visualizations.

Highlights from the 2024-25 school year include:

- The percentage of 9th graders on track to graduate is the highest ever recorded, including growth among some of Oregon's most historically marginalized student groups.
- Attendance is the highest it's been post-pandemic, but remains below pre-pandemic levels. This includes encouraging gains among some student groups, including kindergarteners and students in foster care.
- There were notable increases in proficiency in 3rd grade ELA (1.0 percentage point) and 8th grade math (2.1 percentage points), as reported as part of ODE's statewide test results in October.

"Dedicated, focused, creative educators change students' lives and keep them on track to graduate," Governor Tina Kotek said. "At-A-Glance School and District Profiles give us a window into how our schools and districts are doing. Together, we can build towards an Oregon where every student realizes their promise."

"These profiles are an important tool that help us understand how our students and schools are doing; where we're making progress, where we can do better, and how we can continue refining the ways we serve communities across the state," ODE Director Dr. Charlene Williams said. "Ultimately, this data is not just something to report—it's an opportunity to respond. It's a chance to continue implementing the strategies we know are effective and to adjust where needed, so every Oregon student can thrive. ODE will continue to focus on supporting programs that make a difference."

Oregon Online Report Card Updated

Oregon Online Report Card Updated

With this data release, ODE is adding new dial features to the Oregon Online Report Card that launched in January 2025. Starting with the 2024-25 reporting year, when you look up a school, district, or the state, you will automatically see rates for important indicators.

- Elementary and middle schools: regular attenders, ELA, math, and science.
- High schools: 9th grade on-track to graduate, on-time graduation, five-year completion, and college going, in addition to the elementary/middle school indicators.
- Districts (now aligned with metrics established through SB 141): K-2 regular attenders, regular attenders (all grades), 3rd grade ELA, 8th grade math, 9th grade on-track to graduate, on-time graduation, five-year completion, and college going.
- State (now aligned with metrics established through SB 141): includes the same indicators as the district version.

The new dials on the Online Report Card show schools' rates compared to both district and state rates, allowing for efficient *At-A-Glance* comparisons.

Oregon's Online Report Card is now updated to show the data released today. Please note that graduation and completion data are for the class of 2024; graduation and 5-year completer data from spring 2025 will be added to the Online Report Card in January 2026 to coincide with the public reporting of those data.

Oregon Statewide Report Card Released

ODE is also releasing the new SEED Survey Statewide Report, which captures students' voices about their experience in Oregon's public schools.

(Salem, OR) – The 2024-25 edition of the Oregon Statewide Report Card is now available on the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) website. This annual look at Oregon's kindergarten through grade 12 education system compiles key data on students, teachers and schools in one place for ease of access and transparency.

"This annual report is a vital tool that helps us understand how our students and schools are doing—where we are making progress, where we can do better, and how we can continue refining the ways we serve communities across our state," ODE Director Dr. Charlene Williams said. "We are building a system where continuous improvement is part of our culture, and where every public resource is invested in ways that research and experience show make the greatest difference for students. That's the promise of accountability. That's the work ahead. And together, we're going to deliver."

Oregon Statewide Report Card

The Oregon Statewide Report Card includes important education outcome data, most of which has already been released in the last year:

- There are 379 unique languages spoken by Oregon students.
- There were 3,713 Oregon State Seals of Biliteracy (OSSB) awarded to students for the 2024-25 school year, an increase of 465 from the previous year. This is the fourth year in a row that the count of awarded OSSBs has increased.
- The number of women serving as school district superintendents increased 3.2 percentage points to 39.6%.
- Oregon classrooms continue to become more diverse:
 - Students of color now make up 42.5% of the state's K-12 student body, an increase of 0.9 percentage points from the previous year.
 - Teachers of color represent 14.1% of classroom educators, an increase of 0.4 percentage points.
- The percentage of ninth graders on-track to graduate increased in 2024-25 compared to 2023-24. The total statewide rate increased by 1.8 percentage points to 86.6% and is the highest rate ever reported.

SEED Survey Statewide Report

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The Student Educational Equity Development (SEED) Survey Statewide Report

summarizes the key findings from this annual survey that is offered to all students in grades 3-11 across Oregon. Reviewing the SEED data alongside the Statewide Report Card adds nuance and depth to the numbers, helping ODE make connections between data and what students are telling us.

The 2024-25 survey captured the voices of more than 180,000 students on topics ranging from their sense of feeling valued and welcome at school, to the learning opportunities they have at school, and their plans following graduation.

Important findings in the report include:

- 92% of students perceive that there are adults at their school who care about them and 84% of students agree that they feel welcome at their school. These indicators of belonging have a strong positive association with attendance and with ninth grade on-track rates.
 - Some student groups consistently report a lower sense of belonging across elementary, middle and high school, including students with disabilities and students experiencing poverty.
- 80% of students in 4th grade report that they sometimes or often work in groups to talk about a math problem. Having more opportunities for math discussion is correlated with greater math self-efficacy and achievement.
- 59% of students in grade 6-11 report that they regularly participate in extracurriculars at school. Participation in extracurricular activities is correlated with higher attendance rates and an increased sense of belonging.
- 79% of students in grade 7-11 agreed that they have opportunities to take courses that will help them achieve their future goals.

This year's report also includes new domain scores, which aggregate responses to make the data more interpretable and allow ODE to disaggregate the results by student group. ODE is excited about the potential for this additional reporting to further support districts in their equity work.

A Board Work Session and Regular School Board Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Corbett School District was held Wednesday, October 15, 2025, beginning at 6:00 PM in the MPB and via ZOOM-Owl virtual platform. 11.1. Purchase of two EV SUV's and one EV cargo van Action Item

Dr. Fialkiewicz presented the Drive Change Fund grant from PGE that Curtis Young worked on totaling \$208,367.50. The school has been using the 10-passenger van to transport food back and forth to CAPS and CMS. Instead, this van could be freed up with two EV 8-passenger SUV's and one EV cargo van purchases of about \$65,000.00 each with about \$13,000.00 in administrative costs. 50% transferred into account and other 50% at the end of the grant. Originally communicated that the EV SUV's would be used for student transportation, but the need may not be necessary at this time, so recommending we don't purchase at this time. Dr. Fialkiewicz recommends purchase of the van only and give the remaining funds back to PGE, based off the recommendation from our transportation supervisor, Todd Williams. The original grant was for Ioniq 5's but PGE made it for KIA three row, 8-passenger SUV's to fit within the budget. Board discussion and questions regarding only van and not SUV purchases and would we need them in the future or follow administrative advice.

Dr. Fialkiewicz said the charging structures are not fully covering our needs because they are open to the community. We will need to get another grant for two CMS charging stations and then would have infrastructure for SUV's.

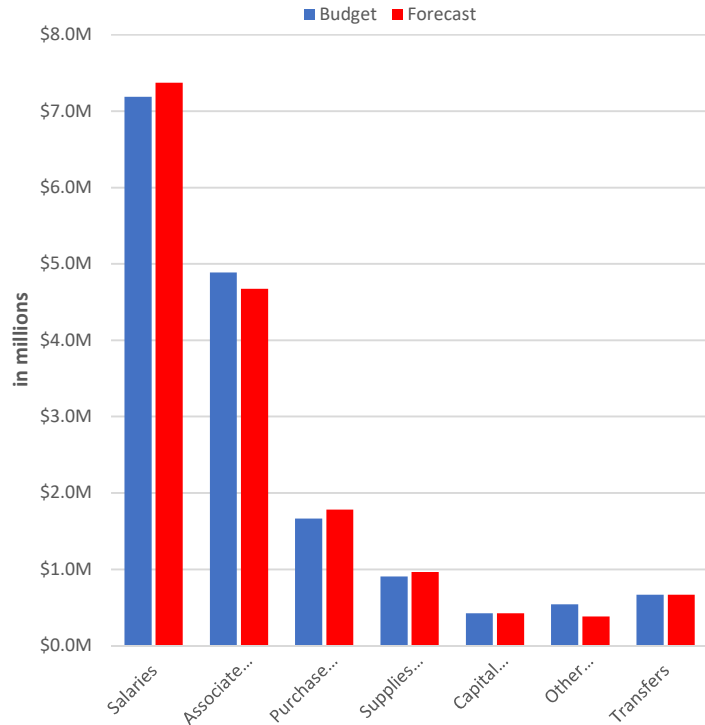
