Our average % of special ed students is almost 5% more than Metro districts. We also have a 9% higher level of students eligible for free and reduced lunch. Significantly fewer LEP students

Our average school size is 10% of the size of metro districts. This allows them to use economy of scale when it comes to purchasing and staff size. They do however lose more resident students (likely because of all of the charter school opportunities in the metro area.

The number of ADM Served per Licensed Instructional staff is 17% fewer in ARCC members vs Metro districts. With larger enrollments, you likely have a number of sections in each grade, and when enrollment falls, you are able to drop a section and have larger class sizes. But when you only have one section, you don't have that option.

The average home value for ARCC members is 42% of the value for a metro district. This contributes to the average property tax per home to be just 28% of what a metro district pays. Because most metro districts have an operating referendum, ARCC member property tax per \$100,000 house is 72% of the metro districts average. RMV per RPU for ARCC members is just 62% of the metro districts...Which makes passing operating referendums less successful for ARCC members.

Notice their market value is almost the exact same number as their referendum market value. ARCC members see significant differences, again this makes passing operating referendums difficult.

99.27% vs 66.29% - that is significant!

Sparcity increases the cost of doing business. One area that is clear is transportation. We cover 9 times the miles they cover!

These numbers don't seem to be significantly different. I couldn't find the building age report, but those numbers would be interesting as these cap at 50 years.

Metro districts have over 5 times the operating referendums per student that ARCC members have! Holy Cow!!

As an average, metro districts receive \$1,426 more in revenue per ADM Served than ARCC member districts. That is close to a 7 % difference.

As an average, metro districts have \$1,268 less in expenditures per ADM Served than ARCC member districts. That is close to a 5 % difference.

Both Metro districts and ARCC Members received less in 2024 per pupil unit than they spent. (on average). ARCC districts lost \$4,087 on average per ADM Served and Metro districts lost \$1,393 on average.

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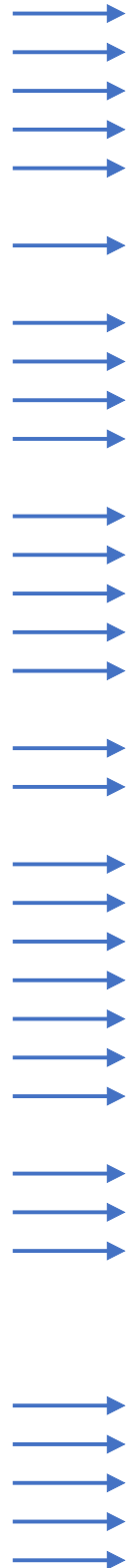

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

Process for hiring and interviewing Rock Ridge staff

1. Board approves posting of new position. Or, if the position which is open is refilling an ongoing position, the vacancy is discussed in either an admin meeting or principal meeting or between the superintendent and principal in whose building the vacancy occurs. If internally approved by the superintendent, the vacancy is then posted by Debbie Wiirre.
2. Applicants apply for position through Applitrack.
3. Applicants (especially teachers and administrators) must apply with: (Note: Non-teaching and admin applicants must apply with a, b,d,e,f, as applicable)
 - a. Cover letter
 - b. Resume
 - c. Transcripts
 - d. Letters of recommendation
 - e. Completed district application
 - f. Copy of licensure
4. Applicants are screened by administrator in charge of hiring process
5. Selected applicants are invited for an interview
6. With input from other staff, the administrator in charge of the interviews creates questions for the interview.
7. Interview team is led by the administrator in charge of the interviews and the administrator in charge of the interviews invites others to sit on the interview team. Other teachers or administrators volunteer to sit on the interview team. Those who sit in on the interview team are not paid if any interviews occur outside the normal work day. The typical interview team has between 3 and 12 individuals on the team, depending on the position being interviewed for. Each individual on the interview team usually volunteers 3-8 hours of their

time. If an administrator is being hired, often a school board rep is included on the interview team.

8. The interview team is told by the administrator in charge of the interviews, how to act during the interviews, how to record their notes on each candidate, and what they can and can't say to the candidate.
9. Selected applicants interview for the position. All candidates receive the same predetermined questions.
10. The interview team discusses and rates/ranks the candidates.
11. The administrator in charge conducts reference checks. [Note: This step is often also included as part of step 4. It is not unusual for two rounds of reference checks to be conducted on a candidate.]
12. If there is reason to suspect anything in the reference checks or background of the candidate which may affect the well-being of BIPOC students and families, the Cultural Liaison will be consulted. The Cultural Liaison will provide valuable input on potential hires within the building(s) they work. Their insights will help promote a supportive and inclusive environment. While the final hiring decisions are made by the school board, the liaison's perspective is an important part of the process.
13. If all references check out well, the administrator in charge brings the committee recommendation to the school board. A district form is completed listing who was on the interview team and other information, including the date of the interviews, and the number of applicants and number of individuals interviewed.
14. The School Board approves the hiring recommendation.
15. All interviewing questions and notes by the interviewing team are placed in district storage. This is required by State law.

Job Title: Cultural Liaison Coordinator

Department: Indian Education and Community Education

FLSA (Fair Labor Standards Act) Status: Non-Exempt

General Definition of Work:

Performs intermediate human support work providing education, instructional and emotional support services to BIPOC (*Black, Indigenous, and People of Color*) students and their families. This position encourages and empowers all BIPOC (*Black, Indigenous, and People of Color*) to become active participants in the educational activities and programs of their children. The Cultural Liaison will develop and sustain a trusting and supportive relationship between students, families, and the district personnel by facilitating communication between students, families, and the school district.

This position provides general instruction in a specialized subject or assigned group of subjects, motivating students to develop skill in assigned subject matters while supporting appropriate conduct, speech and attire, and related work as apparent or assigned. Organizes additional student activities for BIPOC. Runs student affinity and other groups related to students who are members of BIPOC groups. The Cultural Liaison will report to the Indian Education Director, Principal, and Community Education Director. The Principal holds ultimate responsibility for oversight.

Qualification Requirements:

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential function satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable an individual with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

Serves on the special education team as a cultural liaison as mandated by federal law for American Indian students and their families at IEP and other meetings. Provides academic and personal support

to students belonging to BIPOC groups. Maintains contact with teachers for student assignments, progress, and concerns. Identifies attendance concerns and confers with the program director and assistant principal regarding attendance and other behavioral concerns. Updates parents on their student's academic and attendance status. Organizes direct student activities including cultural and post-secondary field trips, affinity groups, student organizations relating to BIPOC students, curriculum development for after school clubs and senior post-secondary planning and graduation needs. Maintains a parent contact/address list and completes all mailings. Records student grade point average, reviews report cards and advises students' of their progress. Assists with parent involvement opportunities and family special events. Compiles data regarding students' academic progress, attendance, behavioral concerns, and as needed for grant reports. Performs duties as deemed necessary. Develops plans to remove obstacles to student success.

Assist new families and students as they enroll in school, guide them in what they need to know about Rock Ridge Public Schools, and help file paperwork. Promotes a better understanding between cultural and ethnic groups within the community. Act as a consultant to staff regarding the culture of students and families. Provide conflict resolution regarding absenteeism, tardiness, behaviors, etc. when necessary.

When there are considerations that may affect the well-being of BIPOC students and families, the Cultural Liaison is consulted by the administrator in charge of the hiring process and provides valuable input on potential hires within the building(s) they work. Their insights help promote a supportive and inclusive environment. While the final hiring decisions are made by the school board, the liaison's perspective is an important part of the process.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

General knowledge of the practices, methods and techniques used in the teaching of BIPOC populations. Uses skill in the use of classroom and instructional equipment; ability to maintain files and information; ability to deal effectively with students and teachers; ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with students, teachers, parents, associates, administration and the general public. Must have the ability to relate to children and provide tutoring and support services. Must be organized and innovative. Must act in a professional, confidential, and dependable manner with students, their families, and school staff. Must have computer competency to meet the program's needs. Must be knowledgeable of a student's culture and family background. Must have knowledge of the Indian Child Welfare Act. Must be willing to make home visits. Must have understanding of unique challenges and opportunities BIPOC students have living on the Range. Must be able to help students surmount these challenges and opportunities.

Education and Experience:

Minimum of an Associate of Arts degree with a human services or education emphasis required, preferably with experience working with BIPOC students and families. This position is an "at will" position with the hiring to be determined collaboratively by a representative from the Indian Education Parent Committee, school administrative representation, two other school representatives, and a representative from the Cultures, Humanities, and Arts on the Iron Range Organization. Final approval

is by the School Board. Money to pay for this position will come through a combination of funds received through Indian Education and the school district.

Physical Requirements:

This work requires the occasional exertion of up to 25 pounds of force; work regularly requires standing and speaking or hearing, frequently requires walking and stooping, kneeling, crouching or crawling and occasionally requires sitting, using hands to finger, handle or feel, climbing or balancing, reaching with hands and arms, pushing or pulling, lifting and repetitive motions; work has standard vision requirements; vocal communication is required for expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word and conveying detailed or important instructions to others accurately, loudly or quickly; hearing is required to perceive information at normal spoken word levels and to receive detailed information through oral communications and/or to make fine distinctions in sound; work requires preparing and analyzing written or computer data, operating machines and observing general surroundings and activities; work occasionally requires exposure to outdoor weather conditions; work is generally in a moderately noisy location (e.g. business office, light traffic).

Special Requirements: Knowledge of the unique educational and culturally related academic needs of BIPOC students.



BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 2909, State of Minnesota, as follows:

1. As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 203B.121, the Board hereby establishes a ballot board to process, accept and reject absentee ballots at school district elections not held in conjunction with the state primary or state general election or that are conducted by a municipality on behalf of the school district and generally to carry out the duties of a ballot board as provided by Minnesota Statutes, Section 203B.121 and other applicable laws.

2. The ballot board must consist of a sufficient number of election judges trained in the handling of absentee ballots. The ballot board may include deputy county auditors or deputy city clerks who have received training in the processing and counting of absentee ballots.

3. The clerk or the clerk’s designee is hereby authorized and directed to appoint the members of the ballot board. The clerk or the clerk’s designee shall establish, maintain and update a roster of members appointed to and currently serving on the ballot board and shall report to the Board from time to time as to its status.

4. Each member of the ballot board shall be paid reasonable compensation for services rendered during an election at the same rate as other election judges; provided, however, if a staff member is already being compensated for regular duties, additional compensation shall not be paid for ballot board duties performed during that staff member’s duty day.

DUTY TO AVOID UNNECESSARY COSTS OF SERVICE OF SUMMONS Rule 4 of the Minnesota Rules of Civil Procedure requires certain parties to cooperate in saving unnecessary costs of service of the summons and complaint. A defendant located in the United States who, after being notified of an action and asked by a plaintiff located in the United States to waive service of a summons, fails to do so will be required to bear the cost of such service unless good cause be shown for its failure to sign and return the waiver.
