Speakers must address the Board from the podium and state their name before speaking. The Board shall not answer questions and shall not deliberate or decide regarding any subject. Board policy prohibits the discussion of complaints against district employees and/or students during public comment.

**TITLE: Consideration and Approval of  
Eliminating Face Covering Requirements**

**DATE: May 21, 2021**

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**BOARD ACTION ITEM**

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**BACKGROUND:**

On May 18, 2021, the Governor of the State of Texas issued Executive Order GA 36, wherein public schools may continue to follow policies regarding the wearing of face coverings to the extent reflected in current guidance by the Texas Education Agency, until June 4, 2021. The Texas Education Agency shall revise its guidance such that, effective 11:59 p.m. on June 4, 2021, no student, teacher, parent, or other staff member or visitor may be required to wear a face covering. Thus, making masks optional at that time.

**CONSIDERATIONS:**

The safety and health of all our students and staff are always our top priority. Further, as our active case count has significantly declined and continues to remain low, and the COVID-19 vaccines have become more readily accessible, and there are many upcoming student and parent activities, the Cleburne Board of Trustees must consider the effects of maintaining the safety mask protocols.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

As this is strictly a Board decision mandated by TEA, until June 4, 2021, and thereafter the execution of the Governor's Executive Order GA-36 becomes effective, the superintendent does not have a recommendation.
