At JES she took on several small groups working with children in reading and social skills. She was a part of IEP meetings and evaluation planning meetings. She worked with children on sharing, taking turns, appropriate language and

behavior, and reading Prior to Jordan, she was a lead teacher in a head start program for one year in Iowa. There she wrote lesson plans that correlated with standards, set up stations (weekly), coordinated field trips and in house programs, performed home visits, taught curriculum, attended trainings, filled out government paper work for program, toilet training, and IEP's.
