Executive Summary:

Schools will continue with Distance Learning for the remainder of the 2019-2020 as ordered by the MDE. In response, the administration has developed the following plan.

Facts:

- Jordan Schools was scheduled to host the annual Minnesota State Kindergarten Conference on Friday, May 1st. This was set to be a professional development day on our district's calendar and will continue as a professional development day along with Monday, May 4th.
 - The State of Minnesota has now mandated that May 1st and May 4th are professional development days. The district's staff will be required to participate in MDE led webinars.
- If the district were following the approved calendar, the last day with K-11 students was scheduled for Thursday, June 4th, and the last day for staff was scheduled for Friday, June 5th.
- The district's instructional hours and days requirement will be satisfied by Friday, May 29th.
 - Please see attached Instructional Hours and Days What-ifs spreadsheet.

Proposal:

- We propose to continue with instruction of new material through Friday, May 22nd.
 - Interventions/remedial instruction/make-ups would occur through Wednesday, May 27th.
 - Grading would occur on May 28th and 29th. Final grades would be due on the 29th.
- Chromebook collection and distribution of students' desk and locker material would take place from May 27th through the 29th. A distribution and collection plan similar to the distribution that took place with 3rd and 4th grade Chromebooks would occur. A limited number of staff would use two-way radios to coordinate the distribution of the pre-bagged and labeled student materials and to collect the Chromebooks at all three buildings.
- All ISD 717 staff will sign up for limited time slots (designed to maintain social distancing), beginning on May 4th through May 29th to obtain personal items and prepare classrooms for summer cleaning and maintenance. Sign-up will occur using a Google Form.

- All ISD 717 staff would take part in a form of professional development during the week of June 1st through the 5th. The purpose of this professional development would be to complete the following tasks:
 - Debrief on the distance learning model and prepare for a similar future event if required.
 - Complete the development of proficiency scales based on the power standards. This is part of our focus on standards based instruction.
 - Provide an opportunity to convert instructional material from the Schoology LMS to the Google Classroom LMS.
 - Complete other tasks associated with the end of the school year.
- The National Honor Society Ceremony will take place in the fall of 2020. This event was scheduled to take place on Monday, April 20th.
- The annual Awards Ceremony will occur in virtual format. Mr. Vizenor is working on the details of this event and will share information soon.
- Seniors would graduate in a modified ceremony to be held at Ames Field with specific details yet to be determined. Social distancing guidelines will need to be followed, which will limit guest attendance and some of the traditional commencement ceremony activities (assuming the stay at home order is lifted or modified by the time the graduation ceremony occurs). Administration is proposing to hold graduation at 6:00 PM on Friday, May 29th, Saturday, May 30th, or Sunday, May 31st (weather dependent). Having three possible dates allows for the district to choose the best “weather date.” Administration is waiting for additional guidance from the State of Minnesota, and due to the unknown factors, graduation details are highly subject to change.

Other Distance Learning Operations/Provisions

- Lunches will be served through Thursday, June 4th unless directed differently by the State of Minnesota.
- Childcare for Essential Workers' children will continue through Thursday, June 4th unless directed differently by the State of Minnesota.
- Summer Kids' Company, CERC operations, summer school, ESY (extended school year), and other CE programming will be determined based on the Governor's orders and rules associated with social distancing as dictated by the State of Minnesota.

** **Note:** This plan has been created as a “what-if” scenario and is subject to change pending additional decisions made by the governor and State of Minnesota. The purpose in creating this plan is allow the district to take a proactive approach to the end of the school year.*

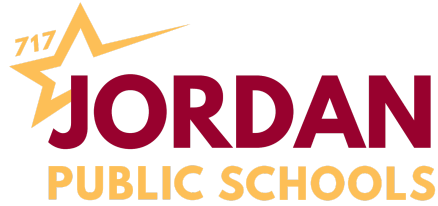

Executive Summary: 2020-2021 LTFM-Capital Projects-Safe Schools

Submitted by: Amy Hafemann and Tim Bisek

There is much work to be done using our LTFM, Capital \$'s, Safe School \$'s; and of course, not enough to do everything. After carefully looking at our lists, we have come up with a plan to do the projects that are listed on the attached sheet.

A brief recap of the LTFM \$'s. I am projecting that we will have a \$25,000 fund balance going into the 2020-2021 school year. I have projected our state aid to be around \$239,000 and Levy \$'s to be around \$484,000. That gives the district a total of \$723,000.

The major projects are:

- JHS - Lighting & Sound Board-Auditorium - \$35,000
- JMS - Tile Walls - common spaces - \$20,000
- JES - Carpet - K-1 Wing - \$15,000
- JES - Parking Lot Light Poles to LED - \$12,000
- Athletic Parking Lot Light Poles to LED - \$12,000
- Parking lot repairs - \$30,000
- Old health & safety - \$112,000
- Mechanical service contracts- \$30,000

At this point, expenditures total \$323,500. As projects finish and \$'s amounts are final, these amounts will change. The district will always try to make the best use of our \$'s.

A brief recap of Capital \$'s. I am not estimating any fund balance carryover going into the 2020-2021 school year. I have projected our Levy \$'s to be around \$141,656, State Aid to be around \$326,536, and Rent Income around \$10,000. This gives an estimated total of \$478,192.

The major expenditures for Capital \$'s are:

- Farmland Payment (COP \$'s) - \$85,872
- Scott County Property Tax - est \$20,000
- Device Lease pymt - \$58,000

- Copier leases - \$15,900
- Curriculum - \$60,000
- Infinite Campus Licensure - \$17,000
- Technology - new devices - \$95,000
- Technology Equipment - \$20,000

There are more set expenditures that the Capital \$'s are used for, but the end goal is to use the \$'s we are allotted wisely.

A brief recap of Safe School \$'s. This fund does not have a positive fund balance. The projected Levy \$s are \$85,500. The major project is:

- JHS - Security Cameras - \$44,000
