APPROVAL OF COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MINUTES

The minutes of the Committee of the Whole meeting of January 10, 2022 were presented for approval as presented.

PUBLIC COMMENT AND PARTICIPATION

Public comment was deferred to the regular Board of Education meeting.

SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT – ROOSEVELT ELEMENTARY

Paul Mills, Principal at Roosevelt Elementary, welcomed everyone to Roosevelt. Mr. Mills shared some facts about Roosevelt including that there are currently 428 students who attend Roosevelt and 60 staff members. Mr. Mills introduced Ms. Laura Masias, 3rd Grade Teacher, Tara Wilson, Parent Coordinator, and Payton Munn and Samaira Perez, 5th grade students. Mr. Mills, staff members, and students, shared the impact Class Dojo had at Roosevelt Elementary. Mr. Mills stated that Class Dojo has weekly reports which shares how many messages were sent,

how many photos/videos were shared, and the percentage of positive behavior for the entire school. This app has improved home/school communication. Mr. Mills then shared photos of behavior rewards which included a snowball fight and hot cocoa, movie and popcorn, and popsicles and dancing.

PRESENTATION ON DISTRICT AND CITY APPRENTICESHIP

Dr. Rachel Savage, Superintendent of Schools, presented a new partnership opportunity the District is planning with the City of Moline. The District is working towards increasing student career readiness work related experiences. Moline High School students will have the opportunity to engage in a partnership with the City of Moline. This program will add to a growing list of student apprenticeship opportunities. This model can certainly prove to be replicated with different entities moving forward.

The District is in the process of finalizing an intergovernmental agreement. There will be three tiers to the student work-readiness experiences with the Public Works Department. There will be exposure to six different city departments including engineering, fleet maintenance, utilities field maintenance, drinking water treatment plant, parks and street maintenance, and wastewater treatment plant. For Tier 1, approximately 25 students who have expressed interest in a career in the trade will be invited to take a tour with the City in March of 2022. For Tier 2, a selection committee will select six students to intern with the City during the summer. Tier 3 will involve the same six students the following summer, and they will have the option to spend six full weeks in one singular functional area. They will receive an exit interview within the Human Resources Department with the City of Moline. If successful, students will be guaranteed an interview for any vacant applicable positions for which they are qualified.

CALENDAR UPDATE

Dr. Matt DeBaene, Assistant Superintendent for Secondary Teaching and Learning, stated that Board members received a draft copy of the school year calendars for the 2022-2023 and the 2023-2024 school years. Dr. DeBaene noted that one of the main obstacles the calendar committee had to overcome is all the construction happening across the District this summer. One of the biggest concerns is making sure all of the construction is completed and then students begin their school year, as scheduled. The calendar committee developed a two-year calendar which has a late start date.
