**DISTRICT STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT**

Dr. Rachel Savage, Superintendent of Schools, and Kristin Sanders, Assistant Superintendent for Pupil Personnel and Special Services, presented an update on the Moline-Coal Valley School District's Code of Conduct for students. Dr. Savage stated the District is revising its code of conduct for all levels. Elementary school, middle school, and high school will all have separate documents. The draft of the documents was returned by legal counsel at date later than expected. Therefore, a vote on this item will be tabled until the next meeting. Ms. Sanders has been developing the document with the discipline committee for a number of months. From a District standpoint, there needs to be consistency from building to building. These revised codes of conduct are pulled together from many District sources including school handbooks, Board policy, and the District website, to name a few. A draft copy of the handbook was given to each Board member. Ms. Sanders will also email the elementary and middle school versions to Board members.

Ms. Sanders shared a graph of in school suspensions (ISS) from 2017 to 2022, noting the ISS data has been shared with principals for the last six years. Suspension data shows the amount of exclusionary discipline in schools. Ms. Sanders then shared out of school suspension (OSS) data. The District has to have four years of not being in top 20% to get off of the State watch list.

Ms. Sanders then broke down the data by elementary and secondary and shared ISS and OSS statistics. A Board member asked if the numbers on the graph represent that number of students or if there could be a student listed multiple times within the graph. Ms. Sanders stated that repeat offenders are listed within that graph.

Dr. Brian Prybil, Assistant Superintendent for Elementary Teaching and Learning, noted that Tier 1 is referring to supports for all students. Mr. Prybil discussed school-wide teaching of behavior in common areas, classroom teaching of class expectations, school-wide referrals identifying location, time, and behavior, consistent classroom tools, including Class Dojo and teacher behavior data, building-wide building reviews, and behavior in common areas to address Tier 1 issues. District communication will be through Remind but building-wide communication at the elementary level will be through Class Dojo. Elementary school counselors teach additional timely topics in collaboration with teacher and building principal, using Panorama data as a guide. They are also looking at Five Essentials data. Those counselors are teaching every elementary classroom weekly with the teacher.

Mr. Prybil discussed some of the discipline/behavior resources including behavior intervention and reporting, deans added to each middle school, and exclusionary discipline rubrics, to name a few. Mr. Prybil also shared Tier 2 and Tier 3 behavior resources. Those are used when things are not working at Tier 1. It is noteworthy to state that at the building level, those involved work hard to put plans in place to maintain a working plan that fits the student's needs. Mr. Prybil stated that the partnership that really stands out is Robert Young, who provide site-based counseling to students weekly.

Ms. Sanders shared notable changes for the 2022-2023 school year. At the June 27, 2022 Board meeting, the Board approved mental health training for staff members. The training will be a three-day training held in October. Another notable change is the behavior rubrics have been updated. The behavior rubrics are tools that District administrators use when they are considering what they should do about a student's behavior. Those behavior rubrics are in the codes of conduct. The restorative options have been expanded, as well as other in-school supports so it is not always exclusionary. The goal is to try to keep students in school. There is an Alternative to Suspension classroom, which will be used in lieu of suspension for some high school students. There are also deans at both middle schools. Ms. Sanders noted another change is that the threat assessment document has been revised.

Ms. Sanders shared the Board policies which are reflected in the code of conduct document. Finally, Ms. Sanders listed the pages that have the most additions/changes. Those are: Student Appearance on Pages 1-3, Rights and Responsibilities on Page 6, and Behavior Offense categories on pages 13-15. The next Board meeting will be an opportunity to ask more questions and approve the codes. Dr. Savage stated once the Code of Conduct has been Board approved, it will be sent to all parents via Skylert and available online and in schools

A motion was made by Kate Schaefer, seconded by Audrey Adamson, all in favor that the approval of the Code of Conduct be tabled and brought up for a vote at a future meeting.

Dr. Rachel Savage, Superintendent of Schools, stated registration for new students will be held at Wilson Middle School on August 2 and 3, 2022. Registration is for students new to the District, new Kindergarten students, or any current families that need to verify their home address. All other returning students are asked to complete the registration process online.

There have been a significant level of facility projects this summer. Dr. Savage recognized Dave McDermott, Keith Karstens, and all custodial and maintenance staff who have coordinated and executed well with all of the challenges of these projects. Dr. Savage stated that summer school has gone well and the academic recovery process is successfully continuing.

### School Year 2022-2023 Strategic Pace Goals

Dr. Savage gave a draft copy of the strategic PACE goals to each Board member, noting the goal in this process is to keep the goals very manageable. The results of goals come from unfinished work from last year, stakeholder input, and District data. Dr. Savage went through each of those goals. There are two goals for People, three goals for Achievement, two goals for Community, and two goals for Environment.

### School Safety Update

Dr. Savage noted that school safety is always being reviewed and revised. There is a very active District safety committee. Dr. Savage also shared a school safety update sheet with Board members. On August 19, 2022, District administrators will receive incident command training via the Moline Police Department.

### HVAC Construction Updates

Dave McDermott stated that the Moline-Coal Valley School District was one of the most proactive school districts to identify the schools for air quality projects with grant funding. In October 2021, the District pre-ordered chillers. The District was told last week that the chillers will not be delivered until after the first day of school. This will be communicated with building principals so they can let their staff know.

Facts: Conducting an annual superintendent evaluation is one of the school board's most important functions. The superintendent evaluation is the instrument through which the board provides feedback to the superintendent, how s(he) is performing, whether its goals for the district are being achieved and what needs to be done if they are not. The SuperEval model has been designed to reflect the current practice in education to use a rubric style evaluation to determine levels of performance for the superintendent. The use of SuperEval will help to enhance the performance of the superintendent, focus the district on goals and school improvement priorities, and lead to transparent measures of performance and reasonable targets to meet.

Cost: The total cost is \$2,195.00. The purchase is to be paid out of the Ed Tech budget.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Education engage the services of SuperEval, Buffalo, New York, for a superintendent evaluation instrument in the amount of \$2,195.00.

Reason for Board Consideration: Board of Education approval is required.

Action Necessary: Board of Education approval is requested.


Facts: At the July 26<sup>th</sup> Board meeting, the Board approved engaging the services of Tri-State Travel, to provide Moline High School athletic charter transportation services for the 2022-2023 school year. Recall, the District requested proposals from ACT II Transportation (Coal Valley, Illinois), Burlington Trailways (Burlington, Iowa), Green River (Peru, Illinois) and, Tri-State Travel (Davenport, Iowa), for the high school athletic charter transportation for the 2022-2023 school year. Currently, the High School Athletic Director's practice is to allow charter bus service for any athletic teams that consist of 30 or more players/coaches required to travel to venues over 100 miles away.

Unfortunately, receiving bids in a timely manner took longer than anticipated, and resulted in seeking Board approval at the July meeting rather than the June meeting. This resulted in the low bidder, Tri-State, not being able to honor the requested event dates. In reaching out to Green River Transportation, the second lowest qualified bidder, they can still provide the requested services. Therefore, the administration's recommendation is to approve the charter transportation with Green River, the second lowest bidder for the 2022-2023 school year.

Cost: The cost is \$90,477 which is supported from the Transportation Fund (Fund 4). The Charter Bus Services cost varies from year-to-year based on team away schedules.

Recommended Action: That the Board of Education engage the services of Green River Lines, Peru, Illinois to provide Moline High School athletic charter transportation services for \$90,477 during the 2022-2023 school year.
