APPROVAL OF COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MINUTES

The minutes of the Committee of the Whole meeting of April 11, 2022 were presented for approval as presented.

A motion was made by Chet DeSmet, seconded by Erin Waldron-Smith, unanimously carried, that the minutes of the Committee of the Whole meeting of April 11, 2022 be approved as presented and placed on file.

PUBLIC COMMENT AND PARTICIPATION

There was no public comment or participation.

SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT – LINCOLN-IRVING

Rosalva Portillo, Lincoln-Irving Principal, shared that all activities at Lincoln-Irving are followed by the SOAR acronym. SOAR stands for Safe, On task, Accountable, Respectful.

Ms. Portillo introduced Leslie Perkins, Coordinator of English Learners. Ms. Perkins shared the three pillars of the dual language education: bilingualism/biliteracy, grade level academic achievement, and cross-cultural competence. Ms. Perkins then shared a graph of research from a Thomas and Collier study, which is a 30+ year study with over 7 million participants where they studied the different models of working with multi lingual learners. Ms. Perkins noted that, consistent with the graph, the Dual Language starts out the same, but by Grade 5, there is a difference between dual language and content-based ESL. By the secondary level, the dual language continues to improve while the content-based ESL stays about the same. The Moline-Coal Valley School District is following the national research trend that Dual Language is the superior model for teaching English Learners.

Ms. Portillo introduced Angelica Villarreal, Instructional Coach at Lincoln-Irving. Ms. Villarreal shared that first and second grade teachers were able to implement consistent small group support using a general classroom with the instructional coach. The focus for first grade was Spanish early literacy and the second-grade focus was Spanish reading. Ms. Villarreal shared the assessment scores. The testing was completed in Spanish. In November of 2021, 15% of students in first grade were proficient and reading at grade level expectation. By March of 2022, 43% of those students were proficient and reading at grade level expectation. By second grade, students were 21% proficient in February 2022 and 55% proficient in April 2022.

SCHOOL YEAR 2021-2022 CLOSEOUT OF PACE GOALS

Dr. Rachel Savage, Superintendent of Schools, stated it is the time of year to close out the 2021-2022 PACE goals. There were eight goals for the PACE strategy. When administration analyzed the degree to which each of the goals was attained, the red light, yellow light, green light process was utilized. The eight goals included two for People, two for Achievement, two for Community, and two for Environment. Dr. Savage reviewed the goals in detail.

The first goal for People is Recruitment. Dr. Savage noted this is an ongoing, long-term goal to increase the diversity of District staff. The second goal for People is professional development. Both of these goals are rated as a yellow and will continue to be ongoing.

The first goal for Achievement is Gifted Education. This work is rated as a green and was achieved as written. The second goal for Achievement is Work-Based Learning. This work is rated as a green and was achieved as written.

The first goal for Community is Parent Mentors. This work is rated as a green and was achieved as written. The second goal for Community is Engaging Businesses in the Community. This work is rated as a green. The work was achieved but the path evolved and changed as the school year progressed, so the end goal was achieved but in a different way that actually yielded better results.

The first goal for Environment is Panorama. This work is rated as a green and was achieved as written. The second goal for Environment is ASPIRE and Panorama. This work is rated as a yellow and will continue to be ongoing.
