WHY NOW? – COMPENSATORY FUNDING

Compensatory (Free & Reduced-Price Lunch) Revenue is based on student eligibility for free/reduced-price meals and provides funds for schools to support underprepared students. In 2023, the state moved to universal free meals, which reduces form submissions—and thus eligibility data—potentially lowering compensatory revenue. The legislature appropriated \$55 million in FY26 only and established a legislative task force to make recommendations on future program changes.

For Nicollet, loss of compensatory revenue means fewer resources for interventions like extra instruction, early literacy, and math support forcing potential difficult choices about staffing and programming.

WHY NOW? – SEASONAL UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE

Minnesota passed a law in 2023 extending unemployment insurance to non-instructional school workers during the summer. A \$135 million trust fund was appropriated to cover costs until June 2027 or until depleted

After Fiscal Year 2027, districts may/must absorb costs—either via local levies (from FY 2028 onward) or general fund budgets

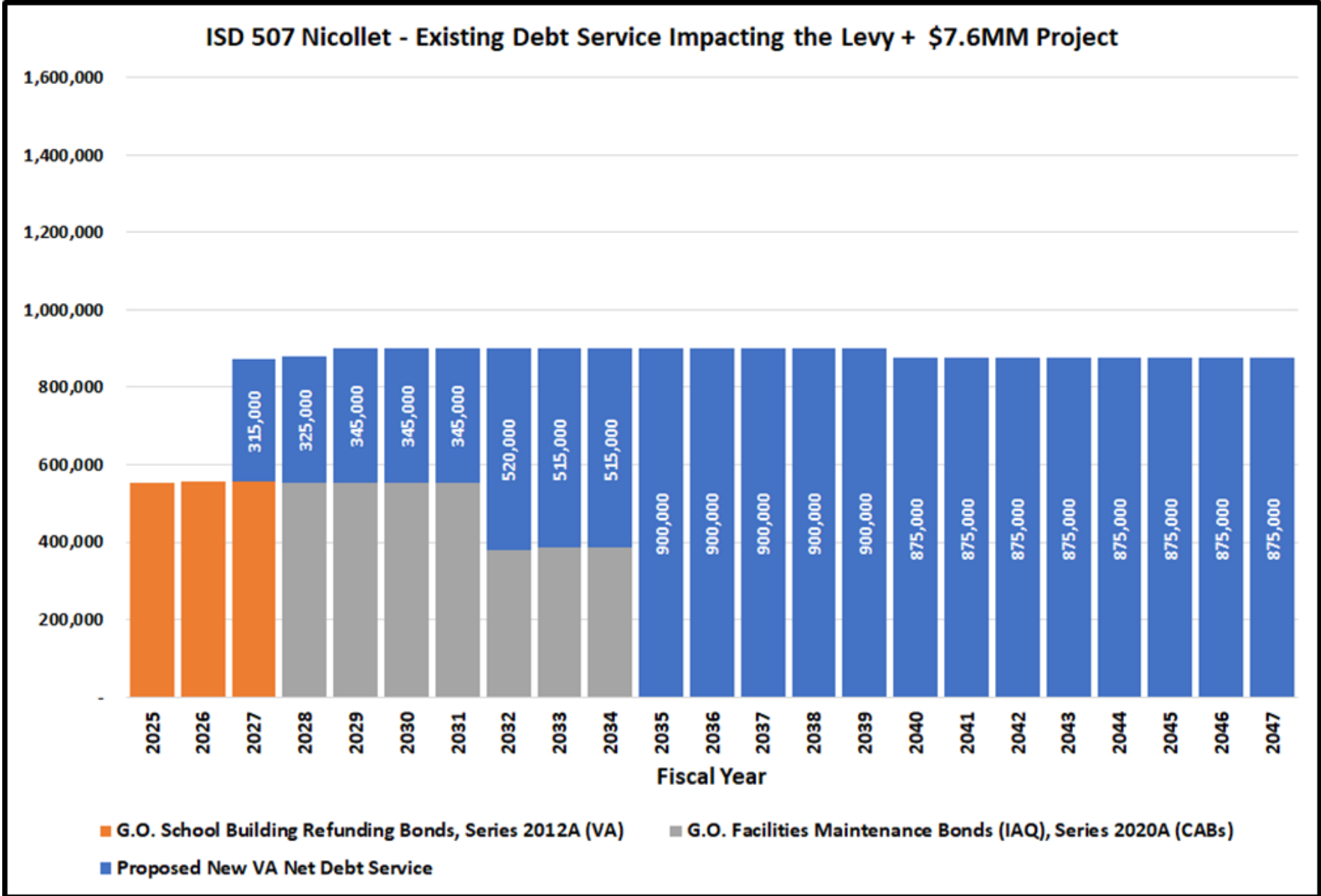

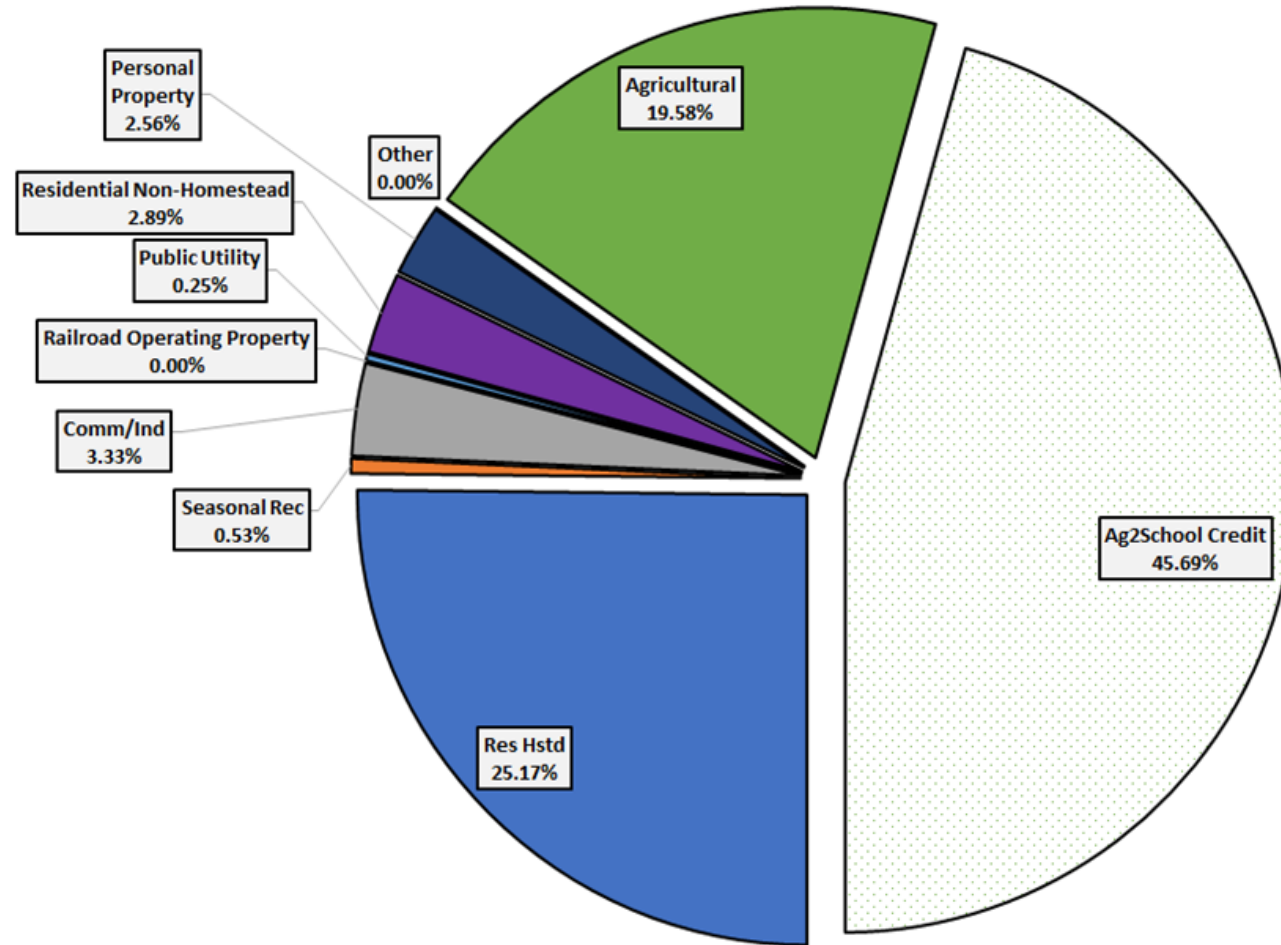

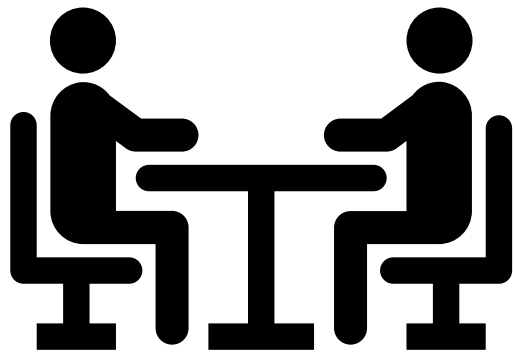

QUESTIONS/DISCUSSION

Superintendent Report

1. Annual update:
 - a. One year ago we approved working with NEXUS to begin a study of our long term facility maintenance and growth. We completed the planning and surveyed the community regarding an operating and bond referendum to update and improve.
 - b. We entered into Strategic Planning with MSBA. In April the committee completed their work and we now have a 5 year strategic plan to develop a stronger Nicollet Public School.
2. Nexus- Rob Brown, Robin Courier, Scot Osborne, and Mathew Cabanilla, will present the work of the Facilities Community and District Committee. Detailed outline of what areas are recommended for improvements or updates. The board will hear the tax impact as well in a later presentation and a recommendation to full support the community/facility task force move to referendum will be requested.

We are checking into hiring the city of Nicollet to complete the election process with trained election judges.

5. Enrollment update: It has been quiet since the end of the school year. We've had 8 new enrollments and 6 students leaving Nicollet. We have one student inquiring to return to Nicollet after transferring out in ninth grade. Flyers will be sent to north Mankato residents early August.
6. No student report until September Board meeting.
7. Negotiations - the district team met June 16 and our team met with the teachers June 17. We continue to work through some language changes and will meet in August to discuss financial positions.

8. SMS has transferred Kim Moske payroll specialist to another district. Frances Long payroll specialist for SMS began working with Nicollet public schools July 1, 2025 Frances has experience working in school finance for the St. Peter public schools.
9. Personnel:
 - a. Nancy Remmert has agreed to a one year K-8 principal position at a FTE .6. We were able to secure Nancy's employment with the number of teachers that retired or left the district. Her contract is attached for your approval. She began July 1, 2025 pending Board approval, July 9, 2025.
 - b. We hired Jessica Bode and Mandy Russow to our paraprofessional staff for the 2025-2026 school year.
 - c. Completed Letter of Agreements (LOAs) for the following employees. Salaried employees received a 2 % increase and hourly employees moved up a step on the pay grid.
 1. Kendra Hoffman - NECC Director 2% increase
 2. Scott Otto - Director of Facilities and Grounds 2% increase
 3. James Bernau - Activities Director 2% increase
 4. Nicole Tish - Community Education Coordinator \$12,000 to \$13,200

 7. Ron Gieffer - Custodian: step increase
 8. Larry Steece - Custodian: step increase
10. Kendra and I have been working on updating the NECC staff handbook. The last update was 2017. Every staff member, when hired, receives a handbook with an outline of rules and expectations.
11. In the handbook benefits are addressed. NECC has a past practice of offering a 25% discount for staff children up to 3. For the past 5 years staff may have received free daycare. We slowly adjusted the discount to 50% last year and have made the final leap to correct the benefit to 25%. We should see a significant decrease in NECCs deficit. NECC is also working to create a schedule that utilizes our part time assistants to allow for correct student to staff ratios. We will see a significant decrease in NECCs deficit due to correct ratio scheduling.

RESOLUTION RELATING TO INCREASING THE GENERAL EDUCATION REVENUE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS AND CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION THEREON; AND APPROVAL OF REVIEW AND COMMENT SUBMITTAL TO MINNESOTA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board (the “Board”) of Independent School District No. 507 (Nicollet Public Schools), Minnesota (the “School District”) as follows:

1. The Board has investigated the facts and does hereby find and determine that it is necessary and expedient that the School District increase its general education revenue authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.10.

2. Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.17 authorizes the School District to increase its general education revenue in an amount approved by the voters of the district at a referendum called for such purpose.

3. The Board hereby determines and declares that it is necessary and expedient for the School District to increase its general education revenue by \$1,014.76 per adjusted pupil unit, subject to an annual increase at the rate of inflation. As provided by law, the ballot question must abbreviate the term “per adjusted pupil unit” as “per pupil.” The proposed referendum revenue authorization would be applicable for five (5) years, beginning with taxes payable in 2026, unless otherwise revoked or reduced as provided by law

The question on the approval of the referendum revenue authorization shall be School District Ballot Question 1 on the School District ballot at a special election to be held to approve said authorization.

4. The Board has investigated the facts and does hereby find, determine and declare that it is necessary and expedient to issue general obligation school building bonds of the School District, in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$7,600,000 to provide funds for the acquisition and betterment of school sites and facilities including, but not limited to, the construction of a secure main entrance; renovations and expansion of the career and technical education space; and capital required deferred maintenance projects.

The question on the approval of this issuance of bonds shall be School District Ballot Question 2 on the School District ballot at a special election to be held to approve said authorization. The passage of School District Ballot Question 2 shall be contingent on the passage of School District Ballot Question 1.

5. The projects described in paragraph 4 hereof shall be submitted to the Commissioner of Education of the State of Minnesota (the “Commissioner”) for Review and Comment. The proposal for review and comment by the Commissioner is hereby approved. The Board’s

determination to hold the special election to authorize the issuance of the bonds is contingent upon receiving a favorable Review and Comment. The Superintendent, or such other School District representative as may be designated by the Superintendent, is hereby authorized to submit the proposed projects for review and comment by the Commissioner in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 123B.71, as amended. When the Commissioner's favorable Review and Comment is received, the Clerk is authorized and directed to publish this favorable Review and Comment in a legal newspaper of general circulation in the School District not less than forty-eight (48) nor more than seventy (70) days prior to the special election date.

The actions of the School District's administration in consulting with the Minnesota Department of Education, for the Commissioner's Review and Comment and taking such other actions as necessary to comply with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 123B.71, as amended, are hereby ratified and approved in all respects.

The Board must hold a public meeting to discuss the Commissioner's Review and Comment before the referendum for bonds.

6. The ballot questions as specified above (subject to the conditions set forth in paragraph 4 above) shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the School District at a special election, which is hereby called and directed to be held on Tuesday, November 4, 2025, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m. This date is a uniform election date specified in Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.05.

7. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the School District combined polling place and the precincts served by the polling place, as previously established and designated by Board resolution adopted on December 9, 2020, is hereby designated for this special election.

8. The Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to: (a) cause written notice of the special election to be provided to the county auditor of each county in which the School District is located, in whole or in part, at least eighty-four (84) days before the date of the special election; (b) cause written notice of the special election to be provided to the Commissioner of Education at least seventy-four (74) days prior to the date of the special election; (c) cause written notice of the special election to be posted at the administrative offices of the School District, for public inspection, at least ten (10) days before the date of the special election; (d) cause a sample ballot to be posted at the administrative offices of the school district at least four (4) days before the date of said special election and to cause two sample ballots to be posted at the combined polling place on election day (note - the sample ballot shall not be printed on the same color paper as the official ballot); (e) if applicable, cause written notice of the special election to be sent by nonforwardable first class mail to every affected household in the District with at least one registered voter at least fourteen (14) days before the date of the special election; and (f) cause written notice of the special election to be published in the official newspaper of the School District once each week for at least two consecutive weeks, with the last publication being at least one week prior to the date of the special election.

The notice shall contain the required projections and the required statement specified in Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.17, subdivision 9, paragraph (b). The clerk is also directed to cause a copy of this notice to be submitted to the Commissioner of Education and to the county auditor of each county in which the school district is located in whole or in part at least fifteen (15) days prior to the day of the election.

10. The Clerk is authorized and directed to acquire and distribute such election materials and to take such other actions as may be necessary for the proper conduct of this special election and generally to cooperate with state, city, township and county election authorities conducting state general and other elections on that date (if any). 12. Optical scan ballots must be printed in black ink on white materials, except that marks to be read by the automatic tabulating equipment may be printed in another color ink. The name of the precinct and machine-readable identification must be printed on each ballot. Voting instructions must be printed at the top of the ballot on each side that includes ballot information. The instruction must include an illustration of the proper mark to be used to indicate a vote. Lines for initials of at least two election judges must be printed on one side of the ballot so that the judges’ initials are visible when the ballots are enclosed in a secrecy sleeve.

13. If the School District will be contracting to print the ballots for this special election, the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to prepare instructions to the printer for layout of the ballot. 17. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 206.85, subdivision 1(6), if applicable, the Clerk shall cause notice of the location of the counting center or the places where the ballots will be counted to be published in the School District's official newspaper at least once within the week before the special election and in the daily newspaper of widest circulation, if any, once on the day before the special election.

18. As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 203B.121, the Board hereby establishes a ballot board to process, accept and reject absentee ballots at school district elections not held in conjunction with the state primary or state general election or that are conducted by a municipality on behalf of the school district and generally to carry out the duties of a ballot board as provided by Section 203B.121 and other applicable laws. 19. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to begin assembling names of trained election judges to serve at the combined polling place during the special election. The election judges shall act as clerks of election, count the ballots cast and submit the results to the school board for canvass in the manner provided for other school district elections.

20. The special election shall be held and the returns made and canvassed in the manner prescribed by law and the Board shall meet on a date between the third day and the tenth day after the special election for the purpose of canvassing the results thereof.

21. The board hereby confirms those precincts and polling places so established by those municipalities.

2. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the board may establish a combined polling place for several precincts for school district elections not held on the day of a statewide election. **Each combined polling place must be a polling place that has been designated by a county or municipality.** The following combined polling places are established to serve the precincts specified for all school district special and general elections not held on the same day as a statewide election:

A notice that is returned as undeliverable must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate county auditor, who shall change the registrant's status to "challenged" in the statewide registration system.

(If a combined polling place is changed, the change must be adopted at least ninety (90) days prior to the first election where it will be used unless that polling place has become unavailable for use.) This date is August 2, 2025, for an election on November 4, 2025.
