Goal I: Increase academic achievement by strengthening educational programs for all students:

- Algebra 1 has started to build a foundation in math by reviewing expressions and reviewing order of operations as well. Geometry is defining, classifying, and drawing points, lines, planes, defined terms and undefined terms in the geometric system. Math of Models is using data, patterns, and algebraic techniques to model and make predictions in real-world problems situations. College Prep Math is working on building a Learning Community and Scientific Notation. PreCalculus is reviewing parent functions and their transformations including the Step-Function and Sine Functions. Calculus is going to master Limits and Algebra 2 is exploring a list of ten parent functions and their transformations.
- FFA Chapter had a fun summer. The officer team attended the Texas FFA State Convention in Fort Worth, Texas. While there, we contributed as voting delegates to elect the new Texas FFA State Officers.
 - It was exciting to have 3 members receive their Lone Star degree! They were Aubrey Andrews, Meredith Ashley and Maggie Stephenson. This is the highest degree a member can earn in the state of Texas!!!
 - We also had many students represent Anahuac FFA at shows over the summer: Maggie Stephenson, Meredith Ashley, and Aubrey Andrews.
 - We had two FFA officers apply and interview to be on the HLSR Junior Rodeo Committee. Both students were selected to serve HLSR this coming year!
 - Finally, at the Ag Teachers Conference this summer, the Ag Teachers were awarded with the "Rising Star" award for the Area 9 association. This award is given to ONE chapter in Area 9 (there are 87 chapters in our area). We received this award due to our success this past year. We are "on the rise" within the area and state and a chapter everyone should keep their eye on! This award can be viewed in the trophy case at the high school!
- In the English department they have spent the first few days building a classroom community! They are working on establishing rapport and relationships and have been implementing routines and procedures to help ensure that our classrooms run smoothly. 1. Student Achievement:

Literacy: 3 Year Goal: The percent of 3rd grade students that score meets grade level or above on STAAR Reading will increase from 16% to 60% by June 2024.

Annual Target: The percent of 3rd grade students that score meets grade level or above on STAAR Reading will increase from 41% to 50% by June 2023.

Math: 3 Year Goal: The percent of 3rd grade students that meets grade level or above on STAAR Math will increase from 12% to 60% by June 2024.
