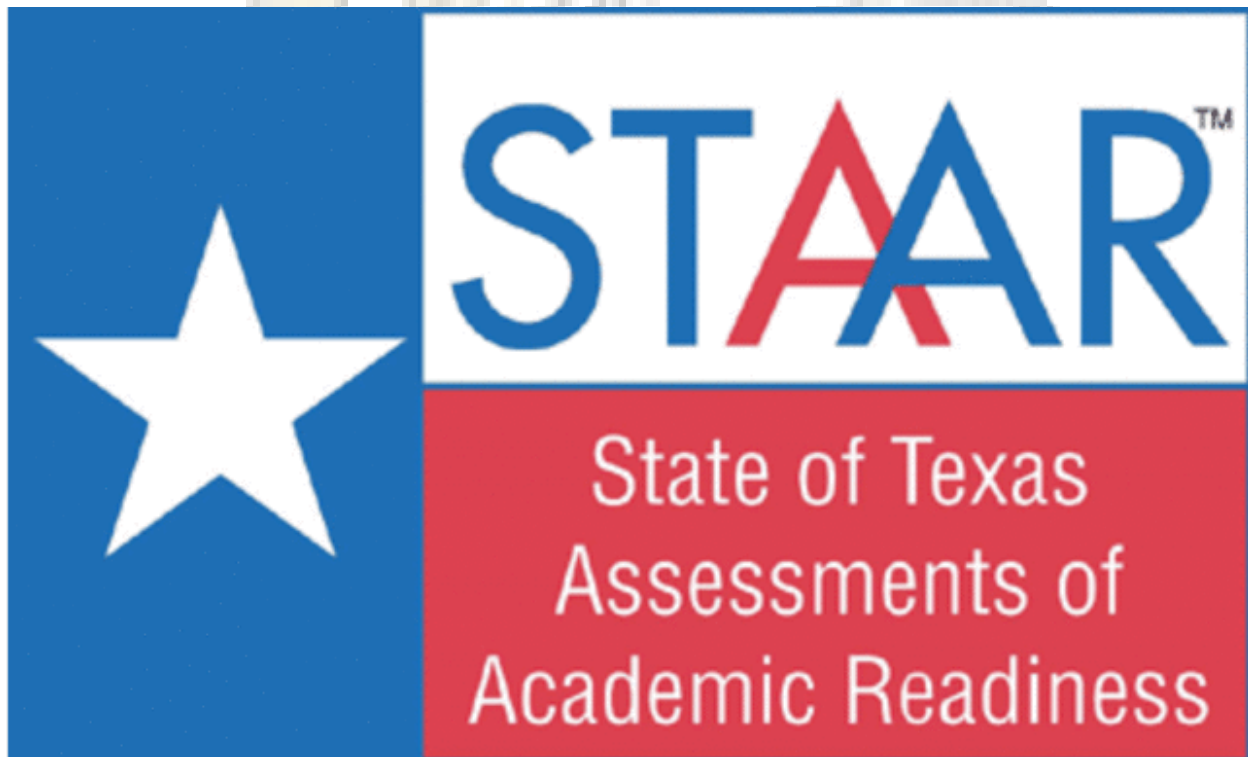

## **ELA Dept**

### **English I:**

- Students have participated in the 10-day STAAR Review learning activities that were introduced during our Rockin' Review workshop in February. They expressed enjoyment of the variety of activities and indicated their interest in seeing more similar opportunities in the future, beyond just during STAAR preparation.

### **English II:**

- My students recently participated in a STAAR Blitz in preparation for the upcoming STAAR English II assessment scheduled for April 14th. I am confident that they are well-prepared and ready to demonstrate their growth this year. Following the STAAR exam, we will transition to exploring Black Out Poetry and aim to obtain expert feedback on Slam Poetry. This is always such an exciting time for me, as the students get to hone in on their personal preferences! Additionally, for honors students, we will delve into World War II literature, with the potential for a surprise visit to the Holocaust Museum, contingent upon approval.

### **English III:**

- Students are beginning a unit centered on *The Crucible* by Arthur Miller. This study will align with English III TEKS by focusing on the analysis of American literature within its historical context, particularly examining the connections between the Salem Witch Trials and broader themes of fear, mass hysteria, and social influence. Instruction will emphasize critical reading, character and theme development, and the evaluation of the author's purpose and use of dramatic elements. Students will engage in discussions and written responses that require textual evidence, fostering analytical thinking and a deeper understanding of complex societal issues.

### **English IV:**

- Last week, students engaged in a focused study of the Romanticism literary movement, including a close analysis of two poems by William Wordsworth. Instruction emphasized critical reading, thematic analysis, and interpretation of literary elements aligned to English IV TEKS, including analyzing the influence of historical context on literature and evaluating the author's use of figurative language and imagery. Students demonstrated their understanding through written and discussion-based responses that required textual evidence and higher-order thinking skills.

## **Math Dept**

- Algebra 1 students are Reviewing for the STAAR Test that is coming up soon.
- Mu Alpha Theta will be having inductions soon and electing new officials for next school year.
- Geometry is finishing up our study on Quadrilaterals. We are moving on to circles.
- Algebra 2 is covering square root functions, cube root functions, and exponential functions. We are graphing these functions and discussing their characteristics including domain, range, end behaviors, intervals, and specific important points.
- Math Models is ending the financial literacy unit by discussing taxes (income and sales) and how this impacts us daily. We will cover interest at the end of the unit.
- College Prep Math classes are testing over Displays of data and finding the measures of central tendencies for different types of data. They will soon be reviewing for the Final Exam!
- Precalculus started graphing Sine and Cosine Graphs today, and will be doing transformations of these two functions
- The Dual Credit Class, Math 1314 is working on System of Linear Functions in Three Variables, and Non-linear Systems. Soon they will be working on solving systems using Cramer's Rule and Gauss Jordan Method.

## **Social Studies Dept**

- World Geography, learning the unit over Asia, specifically China.
- World History is learning about the Industrial Revolution.
- AP World history is deep in the World War II era and AP US History is into the Great Depression. Both AP classes are also preparing for the AP Exams next month.
- U.S. History students for the STAAR exam next week.
- Economics lessons on Economic downturns, market failures, and intervention of the market by the government.

## **Science Dept**

### ● **Biology**

Biology students are currently in the middle of STAAR review, revisiting all major concepts and focusing on making connections across the content. Students are working to understand the bigger picture of biology, from the microscopic level of cells as the basic unit of life to the larger scale of ecosystems and how all living things are interconnected. Each concept builds on the next, and students are staying engaged while also prioritizing test-taking strategies as we prepare for the upcoming STAAR exam.

### ● **Chemistry / IPC**

Chemistry and IPC students have just finished the solutions unit and are moving into acids and bases. Students will be testing common household substances using litmus paper and natural indicators such as purple cabbage to determine acidity and basicity. Based on NWEA data, IPC classes are also spiraling in additional Earth science and biology concepts, with a current focus on ecology and space. Students are making connections to real-world topics, including current events like the Artemis mission, to strengthen understanding in areas where growth is needed.

### ● **Physics**

Physics students are currently working on electricity through hands-on design, construction, and analysis of circuits. Students are learning how circuits function by exploring key components such as voltage, current, and resistance, and applying Ohm's Law to perform calculations. Through building and testing circuits, students are understanding how electricity flows in a complete path and how factors like switches can open and close a circuit. This unit emphasizes real-world applications and helps students connect these concepts to everyday electrical devices.

- **Forensic Science**

Forensic Science students recently completed their unit on counterfeit and forgery. As part of this unit, students watched *Catch Me If You Can* to learn about Frank Abagnale Jr. and his impact on modern fraud investigation and banking security. Students are now beginning a unit on handwriting analysis, where they will analyze writing samples to identify authors and detect forgeries through hands-on activities.

## **CTE**

- ENTRE 2 - Students designed and pressed the UIL Academic T shirts. Our in-house Panther Post business is growing. There is strong interest for us to design and make the Senior Sunrise t-shirts before school starts. Mrs. Jannise was awarded one of the Education Foundation grants for more equipment to help increase Panther Post production next year. Students are about to begin their IBC exam; they have been reviewing the Gmetrix study guide and doing practice tests.
- CHILD DEVELOPMENT & HUMAN GROWTH and DEVELOPMENT- Students are completing projects after researching what harm is done after too much technology interferes with relationships, from family to dating to friendships.
- PRINCIPLES OF EDUCATION - The students developed personal education philosophies and now are researching, presenting, and educating the class about an assigned classroom emergency, complete with the required drills.
- BIM- reviewing for IBC exam.
- ENTRE 1-reviewing for IBC exam.

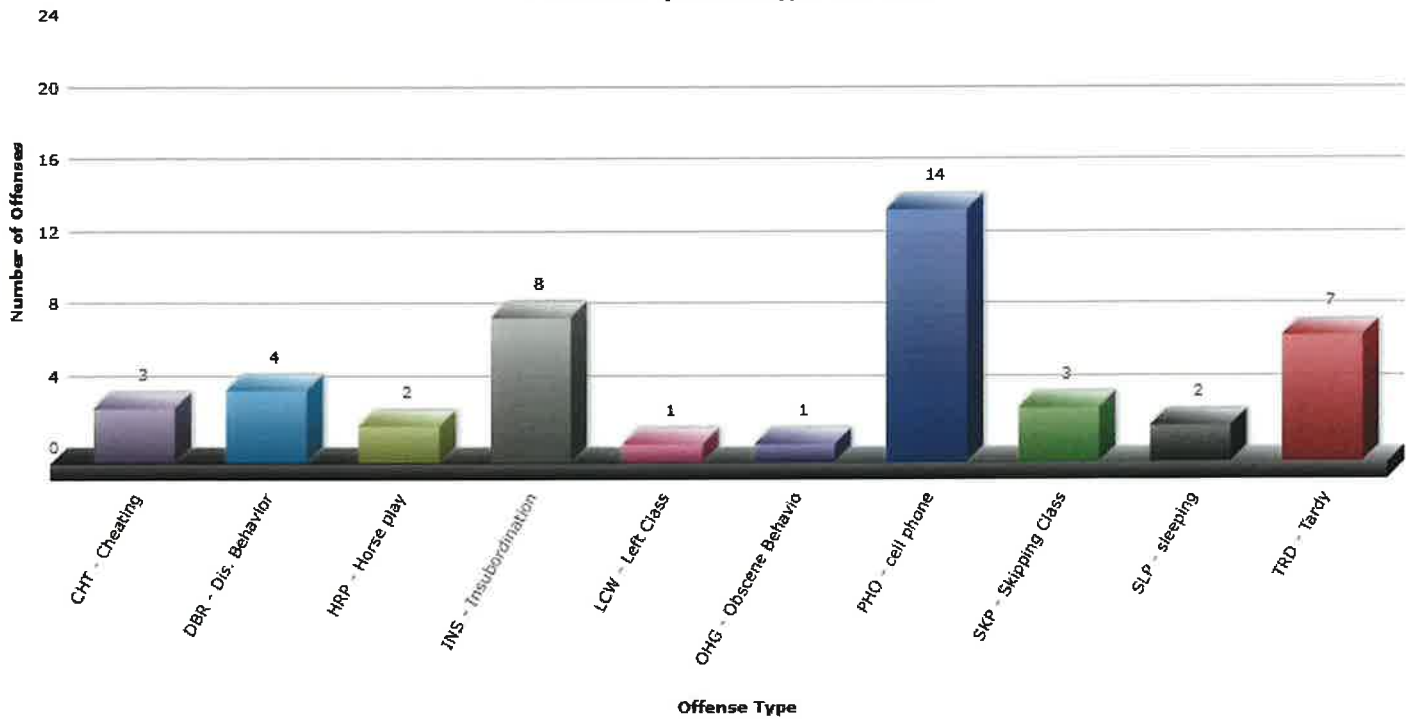

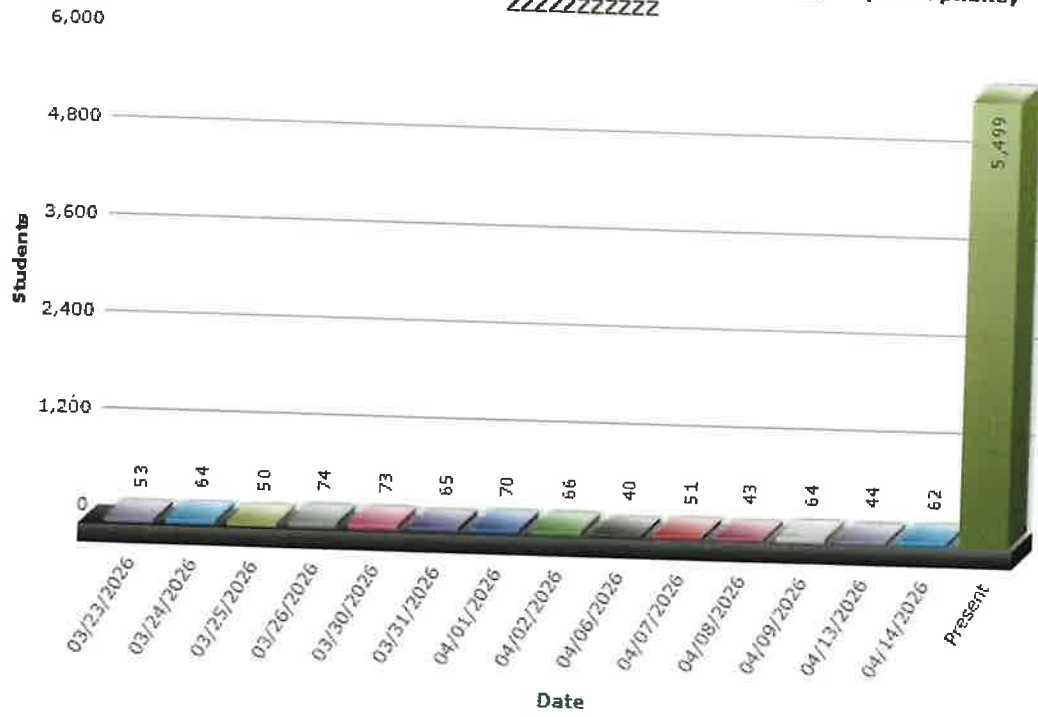
Discipline Offenses

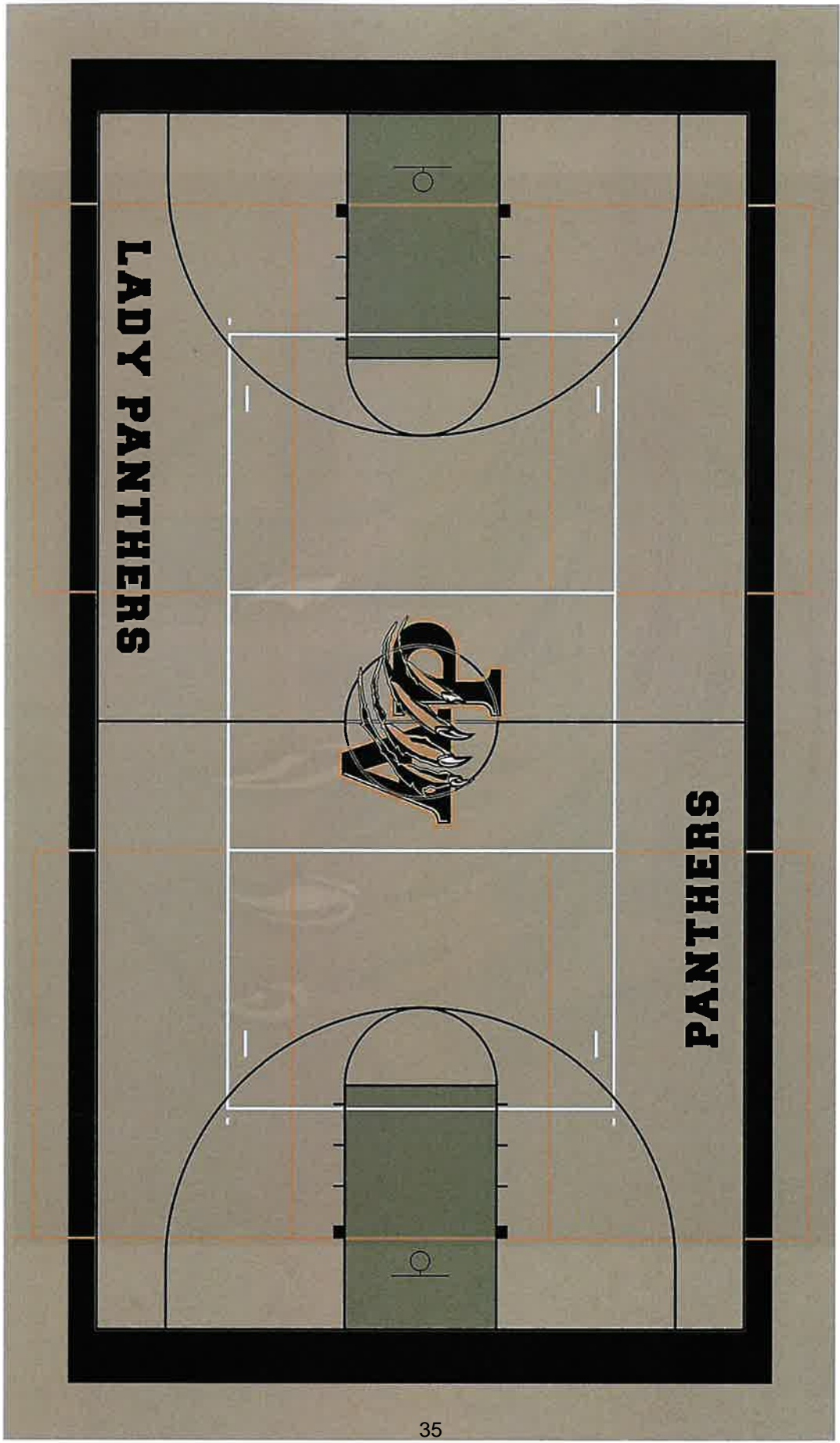
