






Standard 15" Base Bigger 18" Base



Important to Note:

- 2022 ratings and 2023 ratings use different methodologies
- 2022 ratings and 2023 ratings cannot be compared
- It is possible that a campus with an *A* rating in 2022 may improve in 2023 and yet receive a *B* rating
- “What If” ratings are preliminary versions of campus and district ratings using the new *A-F* methodology in order to view 2022 results under the new framework.





Why “What if” Reports:




End of Course Trends by Test and Performance Level




End of Course Trends by Subject Tested and Performance Level


