4. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A. District Update
Brenda Sanford, Superintendent

Ms. Sanford gave a District update. The Red Oak ISD Education Foundation distributed \$57,398.20 in grant money on Thursday, March 11. The Foundation has now made 1.4 million in contributions to the District over the last 19 years.

Both Red Oak Hawks and Lady Hawks Soccer Teams are advancing to the playoffs. She gave the board the locations and times of both playoff games.

Ellis County Art Association is holding their 2021 Student Art Exhibit in Waxahachie March 23-28. Many ROHS students' art work will be displayed.

Red Oak High School FFA members recently exhibited two projects at the Houston Livestock Show in the Ag Mechanics Project Show and earned blue ribbons for both projects.

There was a false alarm lockdown today at Red Oak Middle School, CTE Building, DAEP and 6th Grade Center. Everyone did an exceptional job.

The Red Oak ISD Board of Trustees Standard Operating Procedures Manual will be on the agenda at the regular board meeting in March for adoption. Ms. Sanford asked if any of the Board members had anything to discuss prior to adoption. There was nothing that needed to be discussed other than masks, which will be discussed during Action Items.

Brenda Sanford, Superintendent**

Ms. Sanford presented the Board with information regarding Governor Abbott's Executive Order and the Texas Education Agency's guidance. She told the Board that TEA's guidance, under Health and Hygiene Practices: Masks, number 2, section 3 states: The governing board of a school system may modify or eliminate by formal action the mask-related requirements. The only requirement/protocol the Board is allowed to amend is the Mask Protocol.

She also informed the Board of a change that will begin March 24. The CDC is changing the stay-at-home period for close contacts of individuals who tested positive. Originally it was a 14-day stay-at-home period for close contact exposure without testing. The CDC has changed this to 10 days. Originally there was a 10-day stay-at-home after close contact exposure after receiving a negative testing result and that is now 7 days. Our Ellis County Local Health Authority has also made this recommendation.

Ms. Sanford also shared District COVID-19 data in regards to total and active cases, results of the Stakeholder Survey, Region 10 School Survey and Hold Harmless information.

It is the recommendation of the Administration to maintain the current face covering requirements for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year. This recommendation comes after extensive collaboration with TEA, CDC, Local Health Authorities, Ellis County Superintendents, Region 10 Superintendents, Campus

Administration, Cabinet, Communication Advisory Council, Stakeholder Surveys and analyzing COVID data.

The Board discussed the information presented by Ms. Sanford.

Ms. Petersen made a motion that the mask-related requirements and protocol continue in the same manner as has been set up until this point for the remainder of the 2020-2021 school year with no modifications. Mr. Knight seconded the motion. The motion passed 4 – 1 with Ms. Story voting “no”. Ms. Porter lost connectivity and was unable to vote.

I. Term

The term of the Red Oak ISD District of Innovation Plan will be the five-year span from the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year through the end of the 2025-2026 school year, unless the Board of Trustees should desire to terminate or amend the plan.

II. An Aligned Program

The Plan is in alignment with the Board's Vision of: "Realizing Our Individual Student's Dreams"

The Red Oak ISD family believes education is not one-size-fits-all. We prepare each student to thrive in our rapidly changing world through personalized learning and multiple pathways to success – all without sacrificing the timeless values that have built our country and community.

Strategic Priorities in Academics

- Preparing students for their future through multiple pathways [dual credit, career technical, advanced placement, NJROTC]
- Engaged classrooms through student-focused instruction
- Personalized learning rather than one-size-fits-all
- Partnerships with institutions of higher learning, parents, and community

III. Requirements of the Texas Education Code Currently Inhibiting Plan Goals

a. Teacher Certification

(TEC §21.003; §21.044; §21.053 and §21.057)

Texas Education Code Sections 21.003, 21.044 and 21.053 and 21.057 limit the ability to hire teachers in highly specialized, hard-to-fill areas, and limits the district's ability to adjust course offerings based upon student demand and State regulations. Through an exemption from existing teacher certification requirements, Red Oak ISD will be granted the flexibility to hire professionals in specialized trades and vocations to teach identified career and technical courses. This also allows Red Oak ISD to utilize certified teachers to teach one subject out of their certified field for one year with the approval of the superintendent. The District will also have the flexibility to hire credentialed community or university college instructors in specific content areas to afford more students the opportunity to take dual-credit courses if certified teachers are not available to teach those courses, and allows the district to accommodate student incremental course requests with the current staff until reasonable staffing adjustments can be accomplished.

b. Probationary Contracts

(TEC §21.102)

Under current guidelines, probationary periods for newly hired teachers and administrators who have been in public education for at least five of the previous eight years cannot exceed one year. This limited time period is insufficient in some cases to fully determine the teacher's effectiveness in the classroom. Relief from Texas Education Code 21.102 will permit the District the option to issue a second-year probationary contract for a total probationary period of up to two years for experienced administrators, teachers, counselors or nurses newly hired in Red Oak ISD.

c. Flexible Start Date

(TEC §25.0811)

Red Oak ISD is seeking an exemption from the uniform start date in order to offer flexibility within the development process of our local district calendar and address local priorities and needs when establishing the annual calendar, such as achieving a balance of instructional days between the two semesters.

d. Class Size Ratio

(TEC §25.111, 25.112, 25.113)

The District works to minimize the number of State waivers filed to address class size. Given that Red Oak ISD is anticipating rapid growth, relief from the class size mandate will allow the District to follow local protocols in determining class size, without the additional requirement to file a State waiver in the event of overage.

e. Depositories Contract

(TEC §45.205)

Current statute requires school districts to enter into a two-year contract with a depository bank. This two-year agreement does not provide stability which in turn can cause depository banks to limit options of service, interest rates, and fees. In addition to costs and time involved in the request for proposal process, a district incurs additional costs for printing checks should the district be forced to change depositories. Relief from this mandate would allow the District to continue with a depository bank as long as it is beneficial to the District.

f. Campus Behavior Committee

(TEC §37.0012)

Districts are required to name one individual per campus to serve as campus behavior coordinator. Utilization of a disciplinary committee and a coordinated team of discipline officers in lieu of a single person will allow the campus to embrace a collaborative approach to student behavior management.

g. Transfer Students

(TEC §25.036)

The transfer policy for non-resident students is deemed to be a one-year commitment on the part of the District. Relief from the code governing this policy would eliminate the provision of a one-year commitment in the event of exceptional circumstances which would include, but are not limited to: student misbehavior warranting in or out of school suspension, placement in DAEP or expulsion; or attendance which falls below the TEA truancy standard including absences from school, and/or multiple instances of late arrival, early dismissal or late pickup.

h. Uniform Group Coverage Program

(TEC §22.004 (i))

TEC §22.004 (i) states that a school district may not make group health coverage available to its employees pursuant to TEC 22.004(b) after the date a District implements the program of coverages provided under Chapter 1579 of the Texas Insurance Code. The current process allows no flexibility in the design of group health insurance benefits to fit the needs of all Red Oak ISD employees. This provision also prohibits the District from procuring group health insurance benefits that may provide better coverages for its employees and at a lower cost. This provision is in direct contradiction to the wishes of the Red Oak ISD Board of Trustees who represent community interests in this matter.

Texas Education Code 22.004 is not in any of the prohibited exemptions that can be included in a District's local innovation plan pursuant to Texas Education Code 12A.004 and the list of the Commissioner's prohibited exemptions in Texas Administrative Code Title 19, Chapter 102, subchapter JJ, Section 102.130

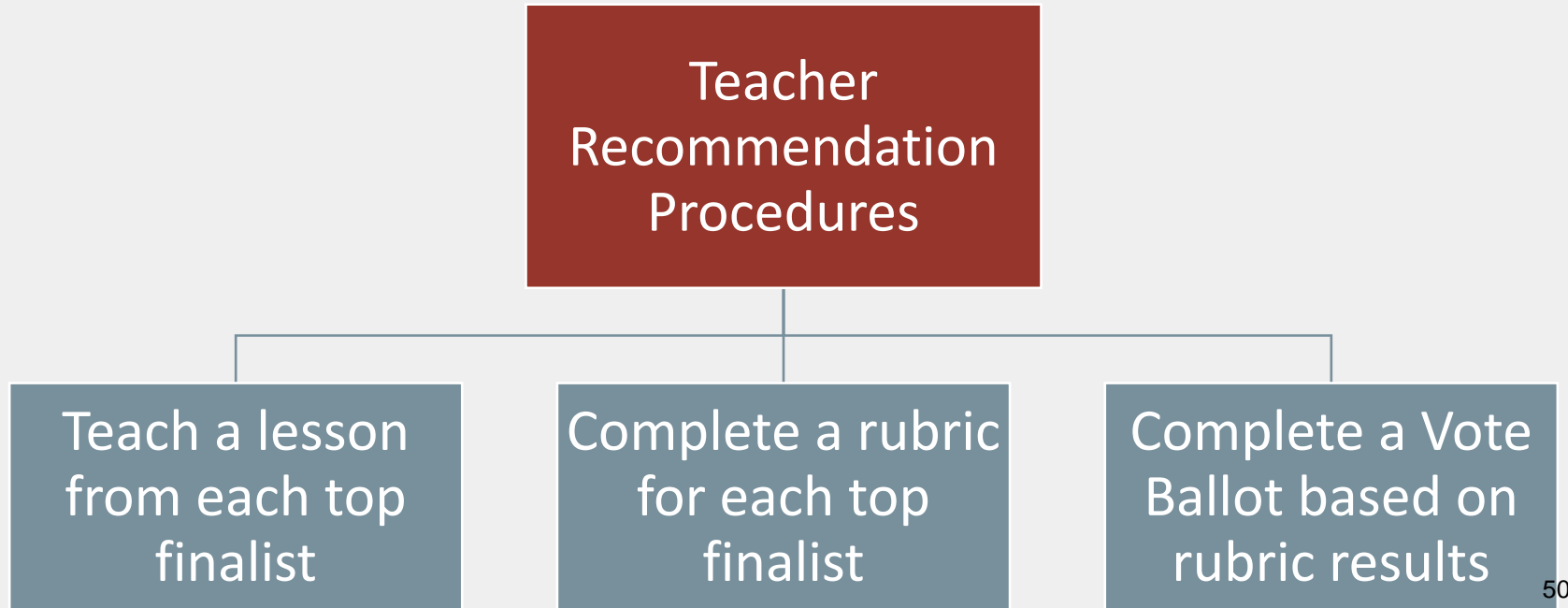

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION CONTRACT

This Interlocal Cooperation Contract (“Contract”) is entered into effective July 1, 2021, (Effective Date”), by and between the Contracting Parties, pursuant to authority granted in and in compliance with the *Interlocal Cooperation Act*, Chapter 791, *Texas Government Code*.

1. CONTRACTING PARTIES:

Receiving Party: Texas State Technical College, an institution of higher education and an agency of the State of Texas

Providing Party: Red Oak Independent School District, a local government of the State of Texas

2. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Contract is for Receiving Party to obtain services of Providing Party to provide utilities and services to TSTC (North Texas) for the Industrial Technology Center (ITC).

- Utilities – electricity, natural gas, water, sewer, garbage
- Services – police coverage

3. STATEMENT OF SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED:

Providing Party will perform the following services (“services”):

- a) Provide electricity, natural gas, water, sewage and garbage utilities and services, hereinafter referred to as “Utilities”; and
- b) Provide police services.

4. WARRANTIES:

Receiving Party warrants that (1) it has authority to contract for the services under authority granted in Chapter 135, *Texas Education Code*, and Chapter 791, *Texas Government Code*; (2) the contract has been approved by the governing body of the Receiving Party, and it has all necessary power and has received all necessary approvals to execute and deliver this contract; and (3) the representative signing this Contract on its behalf is authorized by its governing body to sign this Contract.

Providing Party warrants that (1) it has authority to perform the services under authority granted in Chapter 135, *Texas Education Code*, and Chapter 791, *Texas Government Code*; (2) the contract has been approved by the governing body of the Providing Party, and it has all necessary power and has received all necessary approvals to execute and deliver this contract; and (3) the representative signing this Contract on its behalf is authorized by its governing body to sign this Contract.

5. BASIS FOR CALCULATING REIMBURSABLE COSTS:

ITC Building

Utilities - \$85,000 per 12 months

Police Services - \$500 per 12 months

Total - \$85,500 per 12 months

TSTC Expenditures per month - \$7,125 for contract period of 24 months

6. CONTRACT AMOUNT:

The total amount of this Contract shall not exceed: \$171,000 (One hundred seventy-one thousand dollars), however if utilities cost more than the amount budgeted the amount paid will be actual utility cost incurred.

7. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES:

Providing Party will invoice Receiving Party for services monthly.

In accordance with *Texas Prompt Payment Act*, Chapter 2251, *Texas Government Code*, Receiving Party shall reimburse Providing Party for services performed. Payments made under this Contract will (1) fairly compensate Performing Party for the services performed under this Contract, and (2) be made from current revenues available to Receiving Party.

8. TERM OF CONTRACT:

This Contract will begin on the Effective Date and will expire on June 30, 2023.

9. TERMINATION

In the event of a material failure by a Contracting Party to perform its duties and obligations in accordance with the terms of this Contract, the other Party shall promptly notify the party believed to be in default, and such Party shall have 10 business days to cure such material failure. In the event the material failure is not cured within 10 business days, the other Party may terminate this Contract upon

60 days' advance written notice of termination setting forth the nature of the material failure; provided that, the material failure is through no fault of the terminating Party. The termination will not be effective if the material failure is fully cured prior to the end of the 60-day period.

10. NOTICES:

All notices, consents, approvals, demands, requests or other communications provided for or permitted to be given under any of the provisions of this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given or served when delivered by hand delivery or when deposited in the U.S. mail by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, and addressed as below or such other persons or address as may be given in writing by either Party to the other in accordance with the Section:

11. OTHER PROVISIONS:

- a) **Entire Contract; Modifications.** This Contract supersedes all prior agreements, written or oral, between Receiving Party and Providing Party and shall constitute the entire agreement and understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Contract. This Contract and each of its provisions shall be binding upon the parties and may not be waived, modified, amended or altered except in writing signed by Receiving Party and Providing Party.
- b) **Assignment.** This Contract is not transferable or assignable except upon written approval by Receiving Party and Providing Party.
- c) **Severability.** If any one or more of the provisions contained in this Contract shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof, and this Contract shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this Contract.

- d) **Public Records.** It shall be the independent responsibility of Receiving Party and Providing Party to comply with the provisions of Chapter 552, *Texas Government Code* (the "*Public Information Act*"), as those provisions apply to the parties' respective information. Receiving Party is not authorized to receive public information requests or take any action under the *Public Information Act* on behalf of Providing Party. Likewise, Providing Party is not authorized to receive public information requests or take any other action under the *Public Information Act* on behalf of Receiving Party.

- e) **Loss of Funding.** Performance by a Contracting Party of its duties and obligations under this Contract may be dependent upon the appropriation and allotment of funds by the Texas State Legislature (the "Legislature") and/or allocation of funds by that Contracting Party's governing board. If the Legislature fails to appropriate or allot the necessary funds to a Contracting Party, or a Contracting Party's governing board fails to allocate the necessary funds, then the Contracting Party that loses funding may terminate this Contract without further duty or obligation under this Contract.

- f) **Alternative Dispute Resolution.** If disputes arise under the Contract, the contracting parties agree to use the alternative dispute resolution procedures authorized under *Governmental Dispute Resolution Act*, Chapter 2009, *Texas Government Code*.

Duly authorized representatives of the Contracting Parties have executed and delivered this Contract to be effective as of the Effective Date.

The current Interlocal Cooperation Contract with TSTC for Police Services will expire in June 2021. The new contract will extend ROISD Police Services until June of 2023.

Fiscal Implications:

TSTC pays ROISD \$500.00 annually for Police Services as outlined in the General Interlocal Agreement between ROISD and TSTC.

Administrative Recommendation:

Administration recommends the Board approve the Interlocal Cooperation Contract for Police Services to TSTC.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION CONTRACT

This Interlocal Cooperation Contract (“Contract”) is entered into effective July 1, 2021 (Effective Date”), by and between the Contracting Parties, pursuant to authority granted in and in compliance with the *Interlocal Cooperation Act*, Chapter 791, *Texas Government Code*.

1. CONTRACTING PARTIES:

RECEIVING PARTY: Texas State Technical College, an institution of higher education and an agency of the State of Texas, for the campus whose address is 119 North Lowrance Road, Red Oak, Texas 75154.

PROVIDING PARTY: Red Oak Independent School District Police Department, a local government of the State Texas, whose address is 156 Louise Ritter Boulevard, Red Oak, Texas 75154.

RECEIVING PARTY and the PROVIDING PARTY may individually be referred to as a “Party” or collectively as “Parties” to this Contract.

2. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Contract is for RECEIVING PARTY to obtain services of PROVIDING PARTY. PROVIDING PARTY will provide police coverage, to include police protection and detection services (“Services”), to RECEIVING PARTY at the above listed address of the RECEIVING PARTY.

3. STATEMENT OF SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED:

PROVIDING PARTY will perform the following services (“Services”), and RECEIVING PARTY will provide the following support:

- a) PROVIDING PARTY will provide police coverage, to include police protection and detection, generally and as outlined below.
- b) PROVIDING PARTY will notify the RECEIVING PARTY of any incident or situation on any property within the city limits of the City of Red Oak that may affect the safety of persons on any property owned, leased, or under the control of RECEIVING PARTY. Likewise, the RECEIVING PARTY shall notify the PROVIDING PARTY of any incident or situation on any property owned, leased, or under the control of RECEIVING PARTY that may affect the safety of the residents of the City of Red Oak.
- c) Should the RECEIVING PARTY request the assistance of the PROVIDING PARTY for the purpose of collecting and preserving evidence, the PROVIDING PARTY shall be granted control of the crime scene. The RECEIVING PARTY will support and assist the

PROVIDING PARTY as directed by the PROVIDING PARTY. The PROVIDING PARTY shall involve and coordinate the processing of the crime scene with the RECEIVING PARTY. The PROVIDING PARTY shall be responsible for the storage, preservation, and processing of all physical evidence.

- d) Should the RECEIVING PARTY request the assistance of the PROVIDING PARTY in incidents involving a barricaded person or a hostage situation, or building or area searches, the PROVIDING PARTY shall be granted control of the scene. The RECEIVING PARTY will support and assist the PROVIDING PARTY as directed by the PROVIDING PARTY at the scene. The PROVIDING PARTY shall involve and coordinate the resolution of the incident with the RECEIVING PARTY. Upon resolution of the incident, the area shall be returned to the control of the RECEIVING PARTY. The PROVIDING PARTY shall be responsible for the investigation and case management of the incident.
- e) Should the RECEIVING PARTY request the assistance of the PROVIDING PARTY and PROVIDING PARTY accepts in the investigation of an offense which occurred on the RECEIVING PARTY'S property, the PROVIDING PARTY will assume responsibility for the investigation and case management of the incident. The PROVIDING PARTY will involve and coordinate the investigation with the RECEIVING PARTY to the extent possible.
- f) When it is necessary for PROVIDING PARTY to execute a warrant or conduct an investigation on any property owned, leased, or under the control of the RECEIVING PARTY, the PROVIDING PARTY will notify RECEIVING PARTY of the activity in order to minimize disruption to a class to execute an arrest or search warrant. In the event of "fresh" or "hot" pursuit, the PROVIDING PARTY shall notify the RECEIVING PARTY as soon as possible and the PROVIDING PARTY officer will proceed as necessary.
- g) The RECEIVING PARTY shall be responsible for providing the PROVIDING PARTY with a current list of all properties owned, leased, or under the control of the RECEIVING PARTY. The list will include the property name and street address.
- h) Pursuant to the Federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act ("Clery Act"), the RECEIVING PARTY is required to annually compile and publish crime statistics of specified crimes reported to local police agencies that occurred on or near campus and on college controlled or affiliated property. Pursuant to the Clery Act, the RECEIVING PARTY is required to report these crimes separately for a number of geographic locations. These locations include the main campus, on-campus student residential facilities, off campus buildings or property that is owned or controlled by the RECEIVING PARTY, or recognized student organization such as a fraternity, and public property immediately adjacent to the college campus. To comply with this federal law the RECEIVING PARTY will annually provide the PROVIDING PARTY with written request for specific crime statistics under the Jeanne Clery act for

the previous year and the PROVIDING PARTY will provide the statistics no later than August 1st of each year.

- i) Special Events. From time to time major events are planned on the RECEIVING PARTY'S campus that may impact on the PROVIDING PARTY. Timely planning and coordination by RECEIVING PARTY with PROVIDING PARTY is important to ensure that the event is adequately staffed and the public safety is ensured. The RECEIVING PARTY will contact PROVIDING PARTY as early as practical to initiate the planning process and coordination process. PROVIDING PARTY's principal point of contact is the Chief of Police.

RECEIVING PARTY warrants that (1) it has authority to contract for the services under authority granted in Chapter 135, *Texas Education Code*, and Chapter 791, *Texas Government Code*; (2) the contract has been approved by the governing body of the RECEIVING PARTY, and it has all necessary power and has received all necessary approvals to execute and deliver this contract; and (3) the representative signing this Contract on its behalf is authorized by its governing body to sign this Contract.

PROVIDING PARTY warrants that (1) it has authority to perform the services under authority granted in Chapter 135, *Texas Education Code*, and Chapter 791, *Texas Government Code*; (2) the contract has been approved by the governing body of the PROVIDING PARTY, and it has all necessary power and has received all necessary approvals to execute and deliver this contract; and (3) the representative signing this Contract on its behalf is authorized by its governing body to sign this Contract.

5. TERM OF CONTRACT:

This Contract will begin on the Effective Date and will expire on June 30, 2023.

6. TERMINATION

In the event of a material failure by a Party to perform its duties and obligations in accordance with the terms of this Contract, the other Party shall promptly notify the Party believed to be in

default, and such Party shall have 10 business days to cure such material failure. In the event the material failure is not cured within 10 business days, the other Party may terminate this Contract upon 60 days' advance written notice of termination setting forth the nature of the material failure; provided that, the material failure is through no fault of the terminating Party. The termination will not be effective if the material failure is fully cured prior to the end of the 60-day period.

7. NOTICES:

All notices, consents, approvals, demands, requests or other communications provided for or permitted to be given under any of the provisions of this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given or served when delivered by hand delivery or when deposited in the U.S. mail by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, and addressed as below or such other persons or address as may be given in writing by either Party to the other in accordance with the Section:

8. OTHER PROVISIONS:

- a) **Entire Contract; Modifications.** This Contract supersedes all prior agreements, written or oral, between RECEIVING PARTY and PROVIDING PARTY and shall constitute the entire agreement and understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Contract. This Contract and each of its provisions shall be binding upon the parties and may not be waived, modified, amended or altered except in writing signed by RECEIVING PARTY and PROVIDING PARTY.
- b) **Assignment.** This Contract is not transferable or assignable except upon written approval by RECEIVING PARTY and PROVIDING PARTY.

- c) **Severability.** If any one or more of the provisions contained in this Contract shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision thereof, and this Contract shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this Contract.

- d) **Public Records.** It shall be the independent responsibility of Receiving Party and PROVIDING PARTY to comply with the provisions of Chapter 552, *Texas Government Code* (the "*Public Information Act*"), as those provisions apply to the parties' respective information. RECEIVING PARTY is not authorized to receive public information requests or take any action under the *Public Information Act* on behalf of PROVIDING PARTY. Likewise, PROVIDING PARTY is not authorized to receive public information requests or take any other action under the *Public Information Act* on behalf of RECEIVING PARTY.

- e) **Loss of Funding.** Performance by a Contracting Party of its duties and obligations under this Contract may be dependent upon the appropriation and allotment of funds by the Texas State Legislature (the "Legislature") and/or allocation of funds by that Contracting Party's governing board. If the Legislature fails to appropriate or allot the necessary funds to a Contracting Party, or a Contracting Party's governing board fails to allocate the necessary funds, then the Contracting Party that loses funding may terminate this Contract without further duty or obligation under this Contract.

- f) **Alternative Dispute Resolution.** If disputes arise under the Contract, the contracting parties agree to use the alternative dispute resolution procedures authorized under *Governmental Dispute Resolution Act*, Chapter 2009, *Texas Government Code*.

Duly authorized representatives of the Contracting Parties have executed and delivered this Contract to be effective as of the Effective Date.

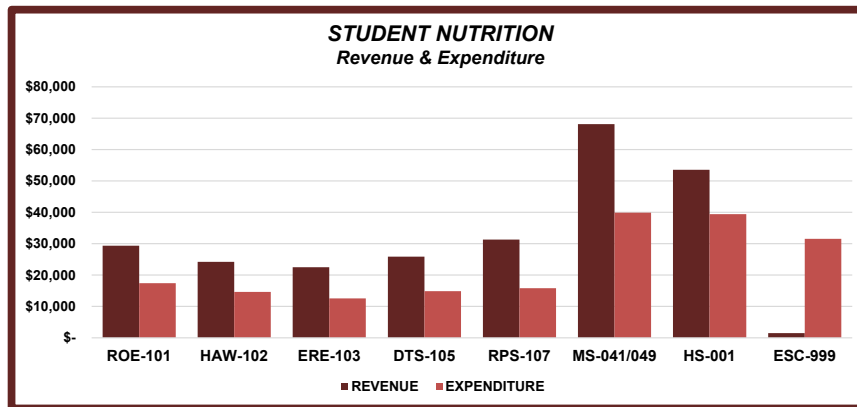
