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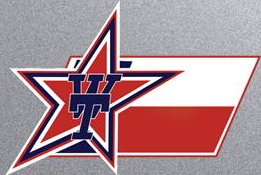
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ESL / Content-based - K-5

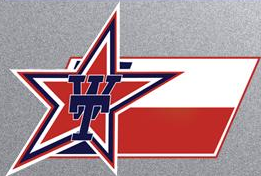
ESL Pull Out 6-12

Action

1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Texas Election Code – Unopposed Candidates:

Under Texas Election Code Chapter 2, Subchapter C, when each candidate for an office is unopposed, a school district may declare the unopposed candidates elected and cancel the election. (Election Code §§ 2.051–2.053)

When an election is canceled under this subchapter, the governing body shall declare each unopposed candidate elected to the office. A certificate of election is issued in the same manner as if the candidate had been elected at an election. (Election Code § 2.053(b))

Application to Wimberley ISD:

For the November 4, 2025 Trustee Election, the candidates for Position 4 and Position 5 were unopposed. In accordance with Texas Election Code §§ 2.051–2.053 and WISD’s resolution canceling the election, the district is not required to conduct a canvass of votes. Instead, the Board must formally declare the unopposed candidates elected and authorize issuance of Certificates of Election.

Certificates of Election: Following the declaration, the presiding officer shall issue a Certificate of Election to each elected trustee. Certificates must include the candidate’s name, office, date of election, and the signature and seal of the issuing officer. (Election Code § 67.016)

2. ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION

Declare the candidates for the November 4, 2025 Trustee Election elected to office, as permitted by Texas Election Code § 2.053, due to their unopposed status and the lawful cancellation of the election.

3. BOARD ACTION REQUIRED

I move that we approve the declaration of elected unopposed candidates for the November 4, 2025 Trustee Election and authorization to issue Certificates of Election.

1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In accordance with **Texas Election Code § 67.016** and **WISD Board Policy BBBB (Legal)**, once the official canvass of election results has been completed and approved, the presiding officer shall prepare and issue a **Certificate of Election** to each candidate elected to office.

Each Certificate of Election must include:

1. The candidate's name;
2. The office to which the candidate was elected;
3. A statement of election to an unexpired term, if applicable;
4. The date of the election;
5. The signature of the officer preparing the certificate; and
6. The official seal of the issuing authority.

Following the canvass of the **November 4, 2025** election, the **District 4 Trustee** and **District 5 Trustee** have been duly elected. Upon approval of the canvass, each will be issued a Certificate of Election, after which they may take the **Statement of Elected Officer** and the **Oath of Office** in accordance with **Texas Constitution Article XVI, Section 1**, and **Election Code § 67.016**.

2. ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION

Authorize the **Board President** to issue Certificates of Election to the **District 4 Trustee** and **District 5 Trustee** as determined by the official canvass of returns conducted on **November 17, 2025**.

3. BOARD ACTION REQUIRED

Approve the issuance of Certificates of Election to the **District 4 Trustee** and **District 5 Trustee** following certification of the November 4, 2025 election results.

1. **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

In accordance with **Texas Election Code § 67.016** and **WISD Policy BBBB (Legal)**, all elected officers must complete the **Officer's Statement** and take the **Oath of Office** before assuming the duties of their position.

The **canvass of the November 4, 2025 election results** has been completed, allowing newly elected trustees to qualify and assume their official duties.

Officer's Statement

Before taking the Oath or entering upon the duties of office, each elected or appointed Board member must sign the required Officer's Statement affirming their eligibility to serve. The signed statement shall be retained with the official records of the District.
(Tex. Const. Art. XVI, Sec. 1(b), (c))

Oath of Office

All elected or appointed trustees must take the Oath of Office before assuming their duties. Newly elected trustees shall file their official oaths with the Board President.
(Tex. Const. Art. XVI, Sec. 1(a); Education Code § 11.061(a))

The Oath may be administered and certified by any of the following, as outlined in **Government Code § 602.002**:

1. A judge, retired judge, or clerk of a municipal court;
2. A judge, retired judge, senior judge, clerk, or commissioner of a court of record;
3. A justice of the peace or clerk of a justice court; or
4. A notary public.

2. **ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION**

Newly elected **District 4 and District 5 Trustees** shall sign the Officer's Statement and take the Oath of Office in accordance with **Texas law and WISD Policy BBBB (Legal)**.

3. **BOARD ACTION REQUIRED**

Acknowledge and record the signing of the **Officer's Statement** and administration of the **Oath of Office** for the newly elected **District 4 and District 5 Trustees**.

The 2025 Hays County Hazard Mitigation Plan is a multi-jurisdictional plan developed to reduce or eliminate long-term risks to people and property from natural hazards. This updated plan is designed to replace the 2016 Hays County Hazard Mitigation Plan. The plan was prepared by Hays County in partnership with nine cities, one village, four independent school districts including Wimberley ISD, and Texas State University, with technical support from Langford Community Management Services and Rojas Planning. It identifies key hazards such as flooding, drought, wildfire, windstorms, extreme heat, and winter storms, and provides strategies to mitigate these risks through infrastructure improvements, education, and planning efforts. Public input was gathered through surveys and workshops held across the county to ensure community priorities were represented. Adoption of the plan allows all participating jurisdictions to remain eligible for FEMA hazard mitigation funding and other non-emergency disaster assistance programs. Approval of this plan ensures Hays County and its partners continue coordinated efforts to protect residents, infrastructure, and critical facilities from future disasters.

PROPOSED REVISIONS 9.5.25

**Purchasing
Authority**

The Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to make budgeted purchases for goods or services. However, any single, budgeted purchase of goods or services that costs ~~\$50,000~~ \$100,000 or more, regardless of whether the goods or services are competitively purchased, shall require Board approval before a transaction may take place.

Exception for
Emergency
Contracts

In the event of a catastrophe, emergency, or natural disaster affecting the District, the Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to contract for the replacement, construction, or repair of school equipment or facilities in accordance with law, if emergency replacement, construction, or repair is necessary for the health and safety of District students and staff. The Superintendent shall report to the Board at the next regular meeting any contract made under this authority. [See Disaster Exception, CH(LEGAL)]

The delegation regarding emergency contracts does not waive competitive purchasing requirements under Education Code Chapter 44. Only the Board is authorized to waive competitive purchasing requirements under limited circumstances in accordance with Education Code 44.031(h). [See Emergency Damage or Destruction, CH(LEGAL)]

Purchasing
Procedures

The Superintendent shall develop purchasing procedures to implement the requirements of state and federal law. [See also CB, CBB, CH(LEGAL), and COA]

Purchasing Method

The Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to determine the method of purchasing in accordance with CH(LEGAL) or CBB(LEGAL), as appropriate.

*Competitive
Bidding*

If competitive bidding is chosen as the purchasing method, the Superintendent shall prepare bid specifications. All bids shall be in accordance with administrative regulations, and the submission of any electronic bids shall also be in accordance with Board-adopted rules. All bidders shall be invited to attend the bid opening. Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled time for opening. Bids received after the specified time shall not be considered.

The District may reject any and all bids in accordance with state or federal law, as applicable.

*Competitive
Sealed Proposals*

If competitive sealed proposals are chosen as the purchasing method, the Superintendent shall prepare the request for proposals and/or specifications for items to be purchased. All proposals shall be in accordance with administrative regulations, and the submission of any electronic proposals shall also be in accordance with Board-adopted rules. Proposals received after the specified time

PURCHASING AND ACQUISITION

(LOCAL)

shall not be considered. Proposals shall be opened at the time specified, and all proposers shall be invited to attend the proposal opening. Proposals may be withdrawn prior to the scheduled time of opening. Changes in the content of a proposal, and in prices, may be negotiated after proposals are opened.

The District may reject any and all proposals in accordance with state or federal law, as applicable.

Electronic Bids or Proposals

Bids or proposals that the District has chosen to accept through electronic transmission shall be administered in accordance with Board-adopted rules. Such rules shall safeguard the integrity of the competitive procurement process; ensure the identification, security, and confidentiality of electronic bids or proposals; and ensure that the electronic bids or proposals remain effectively unopened until the proper time.

Responsibility for Debts

The Board shall assume responsibility for debts incurred in the name of the District so long as those debts are for purchases made in accordance with the adopted budget, state law, Board policy, and the District's purchasing procedures. [See CE] The Board shall not be responsible for debts incurred by persons or organizations not directly under Board control. Persons making unauthorized purchases shall assume full responsibility for all such debts.

Purchase Commitments

All purchase commitments shall be made by the Superintendent in accordance with administrative procedures, including the District's purchasing procedures.

Personal Purchases

District employees shall not be permitted to make purchases for personal use through the District's business office.

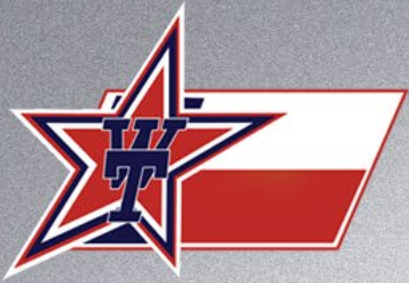

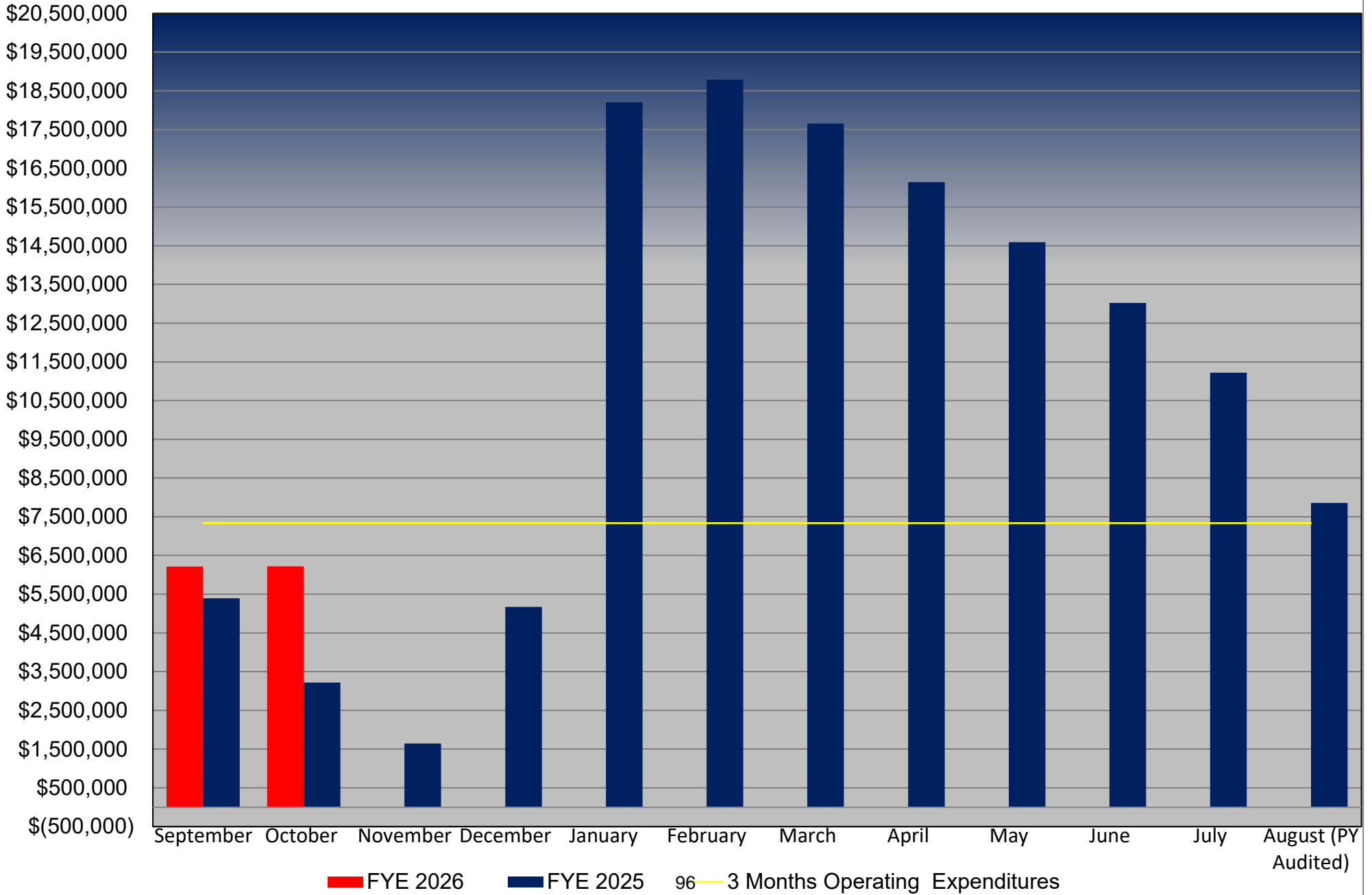
General Fund Revenues Collected Year to Date

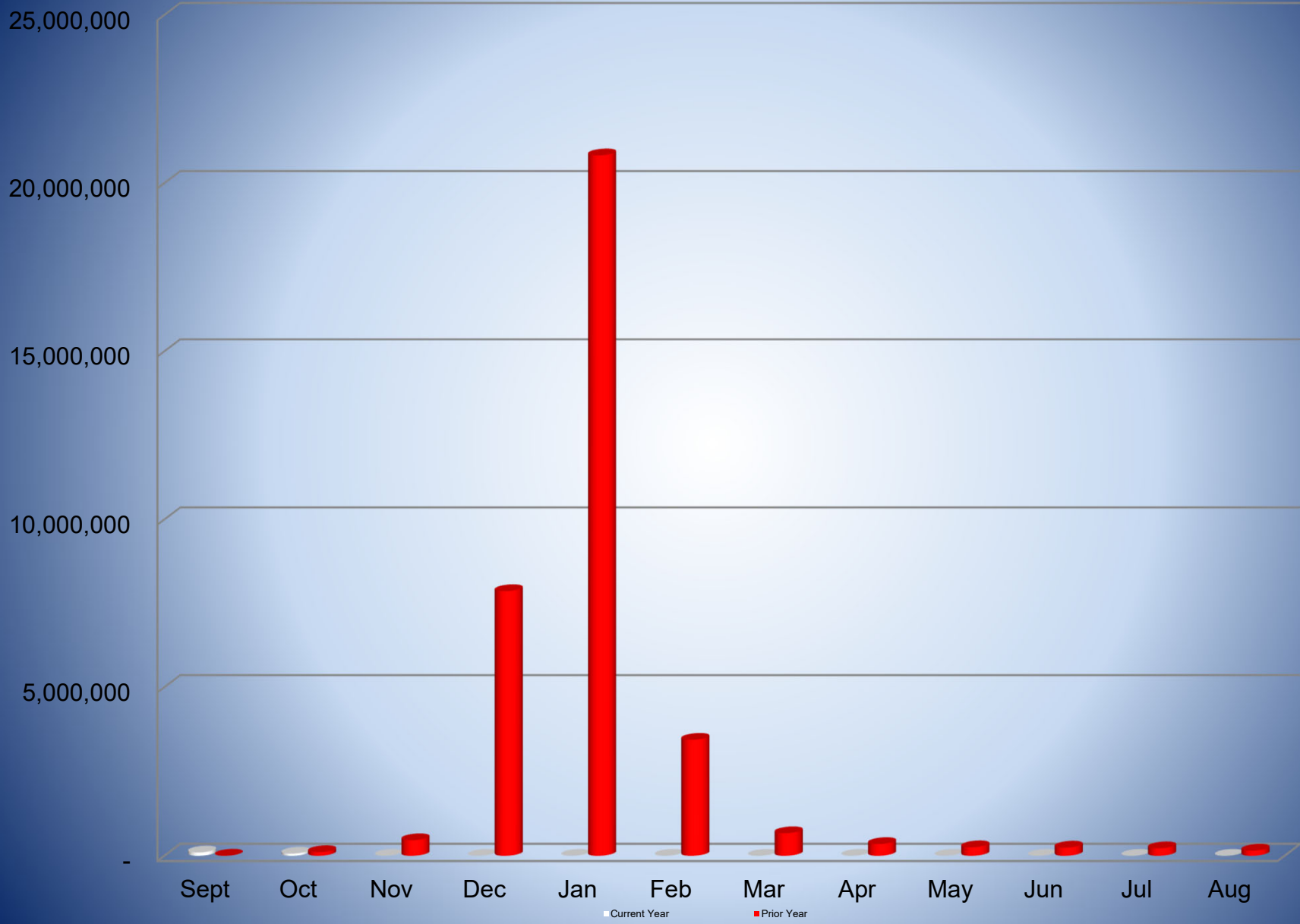

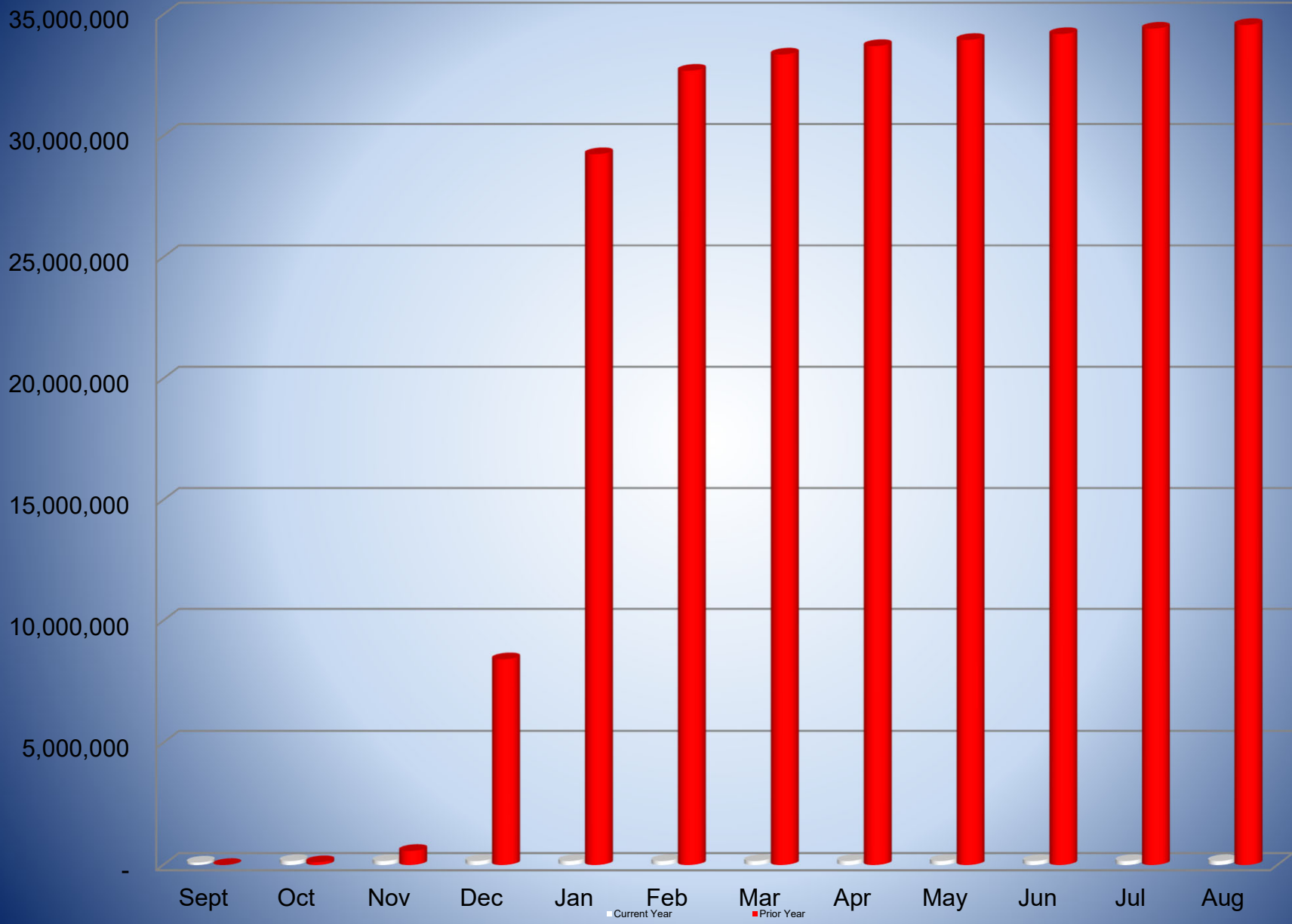

Year to Date Tax Collections Current Levy

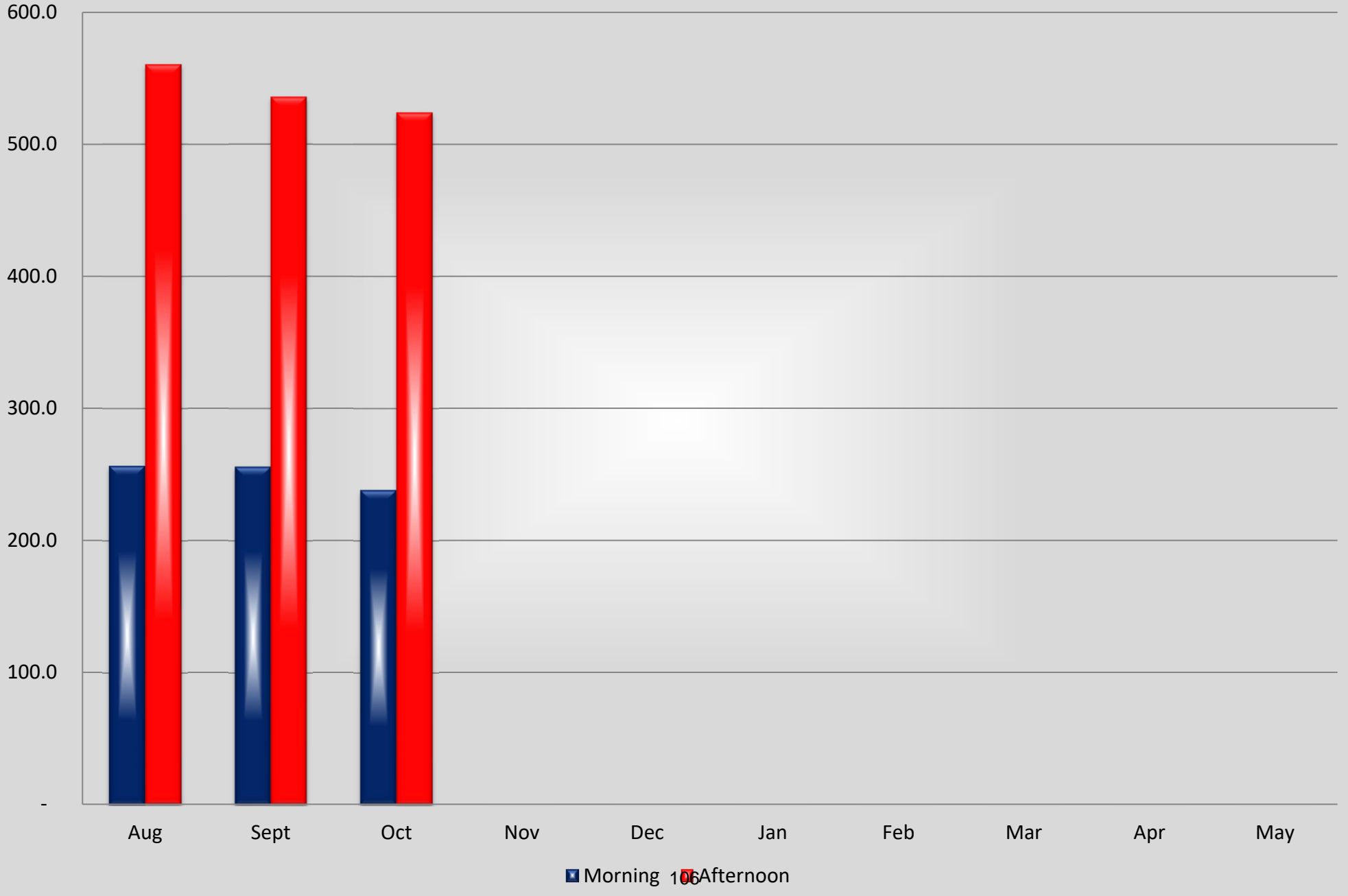

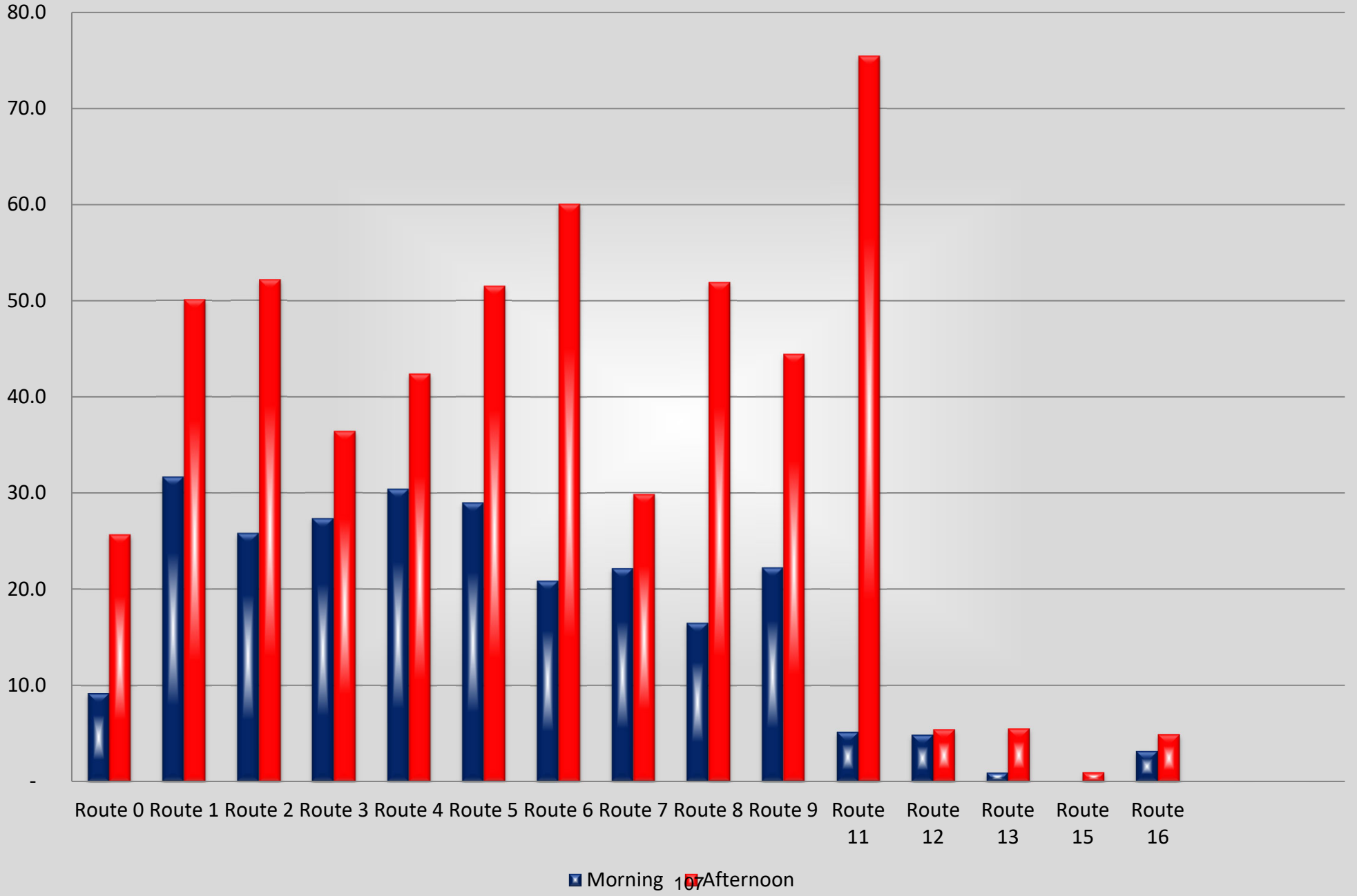

The Pledge of Allegiance to the U.S. flag was led by the Board of Trustees. Dr. Campbell held a moment of reflection and the District's Vision, Mission and Goals were read.

1. Special Recognition

Dr. Bonewald recognized the Wimberley High School State Tennis Team for their outstanding accomplishments this season. Coach Robins introduced his student-athletes and provided a brief recap of the team's successful season.

Dr. Bonewald also recognized Marnie Moore, who has served as Chair of the Student Health Advisory Committee (SHAC) since 2013. He commended her leadership and dedication in working collaboratively with principals, students, and the community. WISD expressed its sincere appreciation for her many years of service.

2. PUBLIC FORUM - The following individual(s) requested to address the Board during Public Forum: Mr. David Lewis addressed the Board to recommend naming Texan Stadium in honor of Steve Meeks, suggesting that his name be added to recognize his lasting contributions to Wimberley ISD.

3. Information Items

A. Strategic Plan Update - Priority 3, Strengthen Community Excellence Allen Bruggman, Director of Communications, provided an update on recent and ongoing initiatives within the district's communications department. His presentation included an overview of website updates, strategies for enhancing communication and engagement with the community, and efforts aligned with WISD's goal to Strengthen Community Excellence.

- B. Bond Update: Schematic Design Review

Michael Doyle introduced Mark Johnson with AG|CM, who provided a presentation on the Wimberley ISD 2025 Bond Construction Update. The update included a review of activities since the last report, budget and schedule updates, and upcoming milestones. Schematic design for Bid Packages 2 and 3 has been completed, and user groups continue to provide feedback as the design develops. Surveying and geotechnical borings have been completed at all sites, replatting is underway, and Bartlett Cocke General Contractors has been confirmed as the Construction Manager at Risk for Bid Packages 2 and 3. As of September 30, 2025, expenditures total \$1,794,587 of the \$135 million bond. Major contracted services include surveying, architecture, engineering, and asbestos testing. The overall project remains on schedule, with key construction phases projected between Spring 2026 and

Spring 2028. Upcoming board considerations include the approval of Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP) delivery methods for remaining bid packages, Musco Sports Lighting, and potential reviews of commissioning services and intercom/PA projects at the November board meeting.

Representatives from O'Connell Robertson presented the Schematic Design Estimate for Bid Packages 2 and 3, which include Wimberley High School, Danforth Junior High, Texan Stadium, and the Multipurpose Educational Activity Center. The design process to date has included over 30 user, client, and planning meetings, on-site investigations, and facility tours to gather input from staff and stakeholders. The schematic design phase provides the first detailed cost review, with total projected costs estimated at \$86,049,185, compared to the original budget of \$85,178,400, reflecting a variance of \$870,785. Presenters noted that the next phase, Design Development, will refine project details and cost accuracy. Upcoming steps include moving forward into contract document preparation and establishing a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP), anticipated between November 2025 and March 2026.

5. CFO's Report

Chief Financial Officer, Michael Doyle presented the Monthly Financial Report through September 30, 2025. Total cash and investments were \$23.67 million, with a General Fund balance of \$6.21 million (2.5 months of operating expenses). General Fund revenues were 9% of budget, and expenditures were 10%. Enterprise programs reported a net profit of \$136,033, and early tax collections totaled \$190,375 (0.5% of the levy).

6. Board President Report

Dr. Campbell announced the Annual Board of Trustees Continued Education Hours Reports.

7. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Bonewald provided his monthly district recap, highlighting recent accomplishments and events across WISD. Michelle Wilkes was recognized as Texan of the Month.

At Wimberley High School, the College Fair was held, and both the Speech and Debate and Marching Band programs were celebrated for their continued success, with the band placing 11th

in Area. The WHS and DJH Choirs recently performed and will be featured on the radio. The Annual Children's Play, directed by WHS and DJH students for the elementary campuses, also took place.

The Girls Cross Country Team advanced to the State Meet, and Volleyball earned the title of District Champions. Homecoming Week was a success, featuring Cutie Camp, the 2005 State Champion recognition, and the Class of 2005 Reunion. The Wimberley Fire Department also visited Blue Hole Primary to engage with students.
