

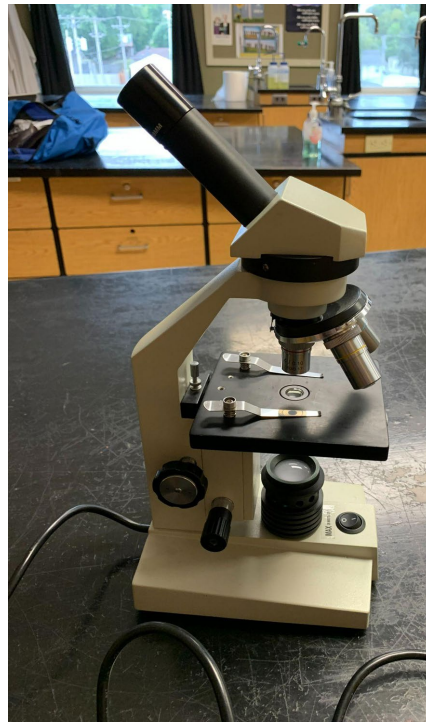

Manual slide movement



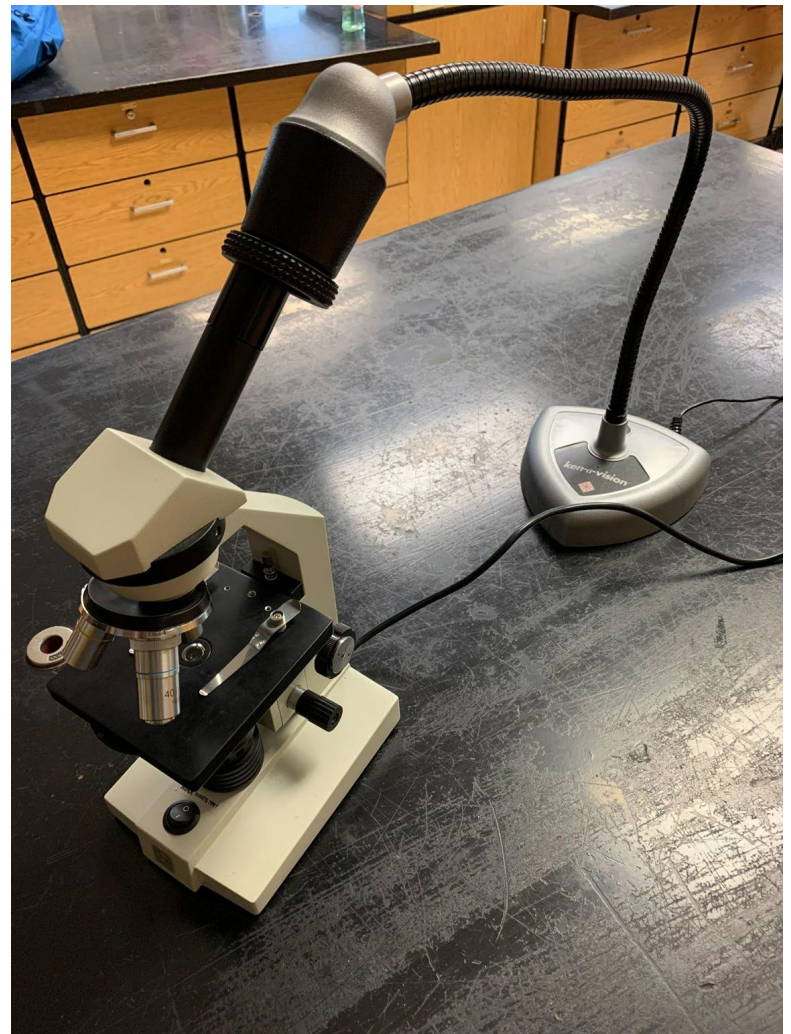
Our current situation...

Our current situation...

Ken-A-Vision went out of business during COVID-19

No support for products or software

Ken-A-Vision, a Kansas City-based manufacturer of traditional and digital microscopes, document cameras, visualizers, and classroom software applications, as well as a distributor of professional drones for commercial use, has closed its doors after many years in business. Ken-A-Vision created educational products for students and teachers around the world and supplied commercial drone pilots with professional-grade drones.

Microscope Market

Low end microscopes (many in the market) ~\$100 from amazon.com

Mid-range... Ken-A-Vision supplied many schools and universities, but is out of business. Wolfe, Swift, and Walter in the market but not many options available with quality and durability needs of regular use in a classroom.

Top-end... Lots of choices, best quality, but most costly. We started researching laboratory grade microscope companies.

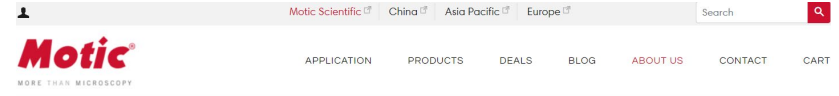
