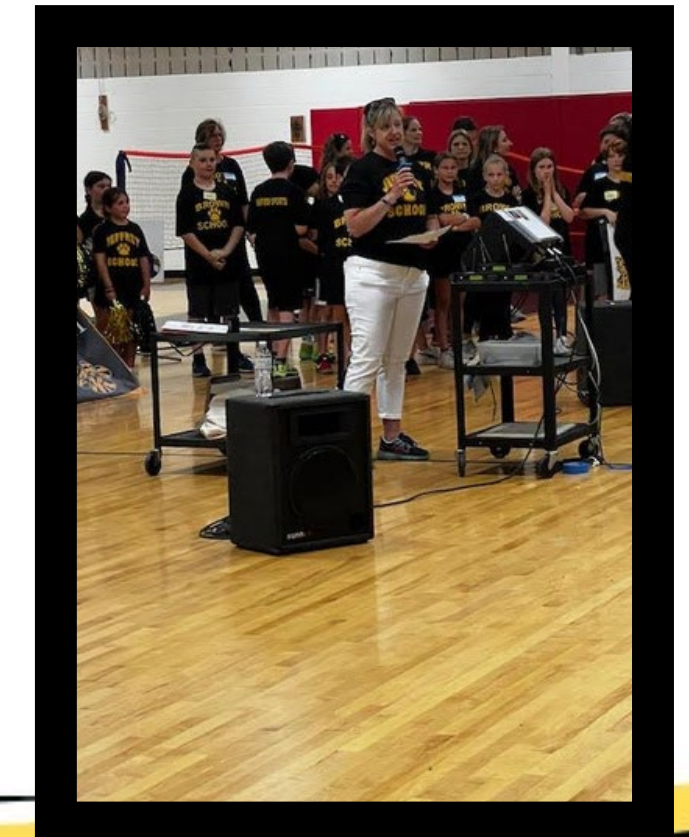

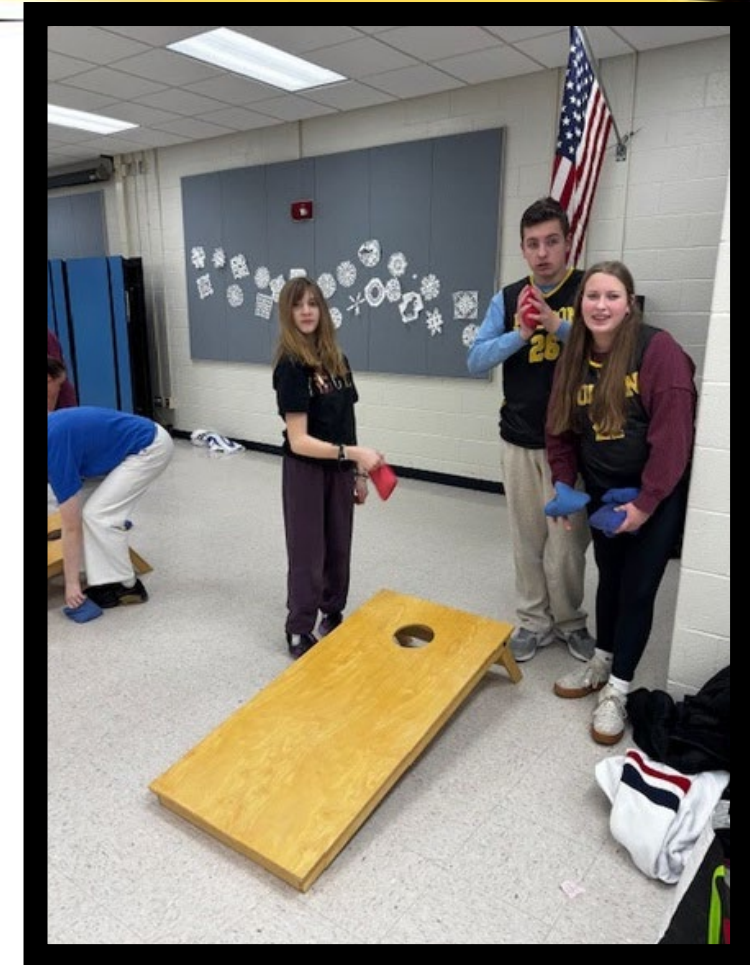
Elementary School Unified Day


