MMS will be a busy place this summer! I will share most of the educational programming we will be providing for our students this summer.

**Summer Targeted Services** for students in Kindergarten - Grade 5 will once again be provided at MMS. Students must be referred by their classroom teacher in order to attend this program. Summer Targeted Services focus on reading, math, and writing every day. Summer Targeted Services runs from Tuesday, June 6th through Friday, June 30th (Monday-Friday).

Students in Kindergarten - Grade 2 will attend from 12:00-3:00 and students in Grade 3 - Grade 5 will attend from 8:00-11:00. Transportation is available for any student attending Summer Targeted Services. Lunch will also be available for all Summer Targeted Services students at no cost. More information will be sent out to families who have students planning to attend.

**Extended School Year (ESY)** is a special education service provided to students who qualify for ESY Services through the Individualized Education Plan (IEP) process. ESY runs from Tuesday, June 6th through Friday, June 30th (Monday-Friday). Students in Kindergarten - Grade 2 will attend from 12:00-3:00 and students in Grade 3 - Grade 12 will attend from 8:00-11:00. Transportation is available for any student attending ESY Services. Lunch will also be available for all ESY students at no cost. More information will be sent out to families who have students planning to attend.

**Credit Recovery** is required for any student in grades 6, 7, and 8, who failed a semester or more of a core class (Reading/English, Math, Science, Social Studies).

Students who attend will be provided with an individualized learning plan based on the areas they did not meet standards. Students are allowed to work at their own pace (including at home) in order to complete their requirements. Credit Recovery runs from June 6th through June 30th from 8:00-11:00 (Monday through Friday). Once a student has completed their requirements they no longer will be required to attend the remaining days.

**Band Lessons** are provided during the month of June. Ashley Olson (MMS Band Director) will be providing in-person lessons for students. 6th grade students starting to play an instrument for the first time are highly encouraged to attend. Please register through Community Education.

Students in grades 5-8 that participated in our **Discovery II** program during the school year will have the opportunity to attend Summer Discovery with Ms. Marcinkowski. This program meets approximately eight times during the months of June and July. Ms. Marcinkowski will send out additional information to students and families who are interested and eligible to attend.

All students in grades 5, 6, and 7 will have the opportunity to participate in **GAMMA Math** which is scheduled for July 17th through July 21st. Students will explore math in new ways along with students from area districts. This program runs from 8:45 - 1:45 in Willmar. Transportation is provided by the district. More information and registration forms will be sent out in May.

All students in grades 5, 6, and 7 will have the opportunity to participate in **STEM/Robotics** which is scheduled for July 24th through August 4th. Students will explore robotics with students from area districts. This program

## Description of Proposed School Construction Project

Montevideo Public School District, ISD 0129-01, is proposing a two question bond referendum on May 9, 2023. The first ballot question would authorize \$54.86 million in bonding authority to finance district-wide facility improvements. Proposed improvements include: repurposing the existing middle school to serve as a K-4 elementary school, the closure and demolition of the two existing elementary schools (Ramsey and Sanford) and modifications to the existing high school to serve as a middle/high school. The second ballot question would authorize \$11.35 million in bonding authority to finance an auditorium addition to the middle/high school proposed in ballot question one. Passage of the second ballot question is contingent upon passage of the first ballot question.

The projects proposed would be scheduled for completion in calendar years 2024 and 2025. Cost estimates by ballot question, location and project type are as follows:

Sanford Elementary is currently serving K-2 students and Ramsey Elementary is serving students in grades 1-3. The two elementary schools are the District's oldest buildings. They were originally constructed in the 1950s and are around 42,000 square feet each. The renovation costs for both elementary schools is estimated to be 90% of the cost of new construction. Both the existing elementary schools and the middle school are well above MDE guidelines in terms of space or square footage per K-4 student.

The existing middle school was constructed in 1995 and is the newest of the District's buildings. Only minor renovations will be necessary to modify it to serve K-4 students. There is roughly 190 square feet per student when the space in the two existing elementary schools is combined. If the middle school is converted to K-4 use, it would provide roughly 258 square feet per student. MDE Guidelines call for up to 135 square feet per student at the elementary level for new construction. The proposed conversion of the existing middle school to serve K-4 students will allow the district to reduce costs operationally and eliminate the costs associated with maintaining the aging elementary schools.

The high school was built in 1965 and is roughly 122,000 square feet. The proposed addition to the high school in the first ballot question would add another 123,000 square feet, or a total of around 245,000 square feet, for the proposed

middle/high school. Currently, 5-12<sup>th</sup> grade enrollment is around 816 students. On a square foot per student basis, the proposed middle/high school would provide approximately 300 square feet per student. MDE Guidelines call for up to 190 square feet per student for high school students based on new construction.

The District is projecting stable student enrollment over the next five-year period.

The district has supplied cost estimates to operate and staff the additional building space and it appears existing revenues, along with operational savings from the closure of the two existing elementary school, will be sufficient to fund any associated operational cost increases. The proposed projects appear to be in the long-term interest of the school district.

#### **Review and Comment Statement**

Based on the department's analysis of the school district's required documentation and other pertinent information from sources of the Minnesota Department of Education, the Commissioner of Education provides a positive review and comment.
