Recommendation

We recommend the school board approve the proposed amended resolution calling for an election to revoke and replace the current Operating levy and Capital Projects (technology) levy.

Background

The School Board authorized an election on each of these levies on March 22, 2022. At the time, the Board was informed that an adjustment to the resolution would most likely be needed because the Minnesota Department of Education needed to update our current operating capital authorization once inflation was calculated in late July.

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board (the Board) of Independent School District No. 279 (Osseo Area Schools), Minnesota (the School District) as follows:

It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

1. The Board has investigated the facts and does hereby find, determine and declare that it is necessary and expedient to
 - (a) revoke the School District's existing referendum revenue authorization of \$1,650.53 per pupil that is scheduled to expire after taxes payable in 2023 and replace that authorization with a new authorization of \$2,010.00 per pupil, subject to an annual increase at the rate of inflation. The proposed referendum revenue authorization would be first levied in 2022 for taxes payable in 2023 and applicable for ten (10) years unless otherwise revoked or reduced as provided by law; and
 - (b) revoke the School District's existing capital project levy authorization in the amount of 3.701% times the net tax capacity of the School District, scheduled to expire after taxes

payable in 2023, and to replace that authorization with a new capital project levy authorization in the amount of 4.701% times the net tax capacity of the School District to provide funds for the for the acquisition and installation of improved instructional technology, safety and security technology, systems for the technology infrastructure, and technology support staffing.

The proposed capital project levy authorization will raise approximately \$11,192,923 for taxes first levied in 2022, payable in 2023, and would be authorized for ten (10) years. The estimated total cost of the projects to be funded over that time period is approximately \$111,929,234. The program will be commenced prior to November 8, 2027 which is a date not more than five (5) years from the date of the special election approving the capital project levy authorization.

The question on the revocation of the existing referendum revenue authorization and the approval of a new referendum revenue authorization shall be School District Question 1 on the School District ballot at the special election held to approve said authorization.

The question on the revocation of the existing capital project levy authorization and the approval of the new capital project levy authorization shall be School District Question 2 on the School District ballot at the special election held to approve said authorization.

2. The questions on the revocation of the existing referendum revenue authorization and the approval of a new referendum revenue authorization and the revocation of the existing capital project levy authorization and the approval of the new capital project levy authorization of the School District shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the School District at a special election, which is hereby called and directed to be held in conjunction with the state general election on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
3. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the precincts and polling places for this special election are those precincts or parts of precincts located within the boundaries of the School District which have been established by the governing bodies located in whole or in part within the School District.
4. The Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause written notice of the special election to be: (a) provided to the County Auditor at least seventy-four (74) days before the date of the special election; (b) provided to the Commissioner of Education at least seventy-four (74) days before the date of the special election; (c) mailed to every taxpayer in the School District, at least fifteen (15) days but no more than forty-five (45) days prior to the date of the special election; (d) posted at the administrative offices of the School District, for public inspection, at least ten (10) days before the date of the special election; and (e) published in the official newspaper of the School District once each week for at least two consecutive weeks, with the last publication being at least one week before the date of the special election.

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board (the Board) of Independent School District No. 279 (Osseo Area Schools), Minnesota (the School District) as follows:

By resolution duly adopted on March 22, 2022 entitled “RESOLUTION RELATING TO DETERMINING THE NECESSITY OF REVOKING AN EXISTING REFERENDUM REVENUE AUTHORIZATION AND REPLACING IT WITH A NEW REFERENDUM REVENUE AUTHORIZATION AND REVOKING AN EXISTING CAPITAL PROJECT LEVY AUTHORIZATION AND REPLACING IT WITH A NEW CAPITAL PROJECT LEVY AUTHORIZATION, AND CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION AND REFERENDUM THEREON” (the Original Resolution) this Board called for a special election to be held on November 8, 2022 on the questions of the revocation of the existing referendum revenue authorization and the approval of a new referendum revenue authorization and revocation of the existing capital project levy authorization and the approval of the new capital project levy authorization. The proposed

referendum revenue authorization would be first levied in 2022 for taxes payable in 2023 and applicable for ten (10) years unless otherwise revoked or reduced as provided by law; and

**PASSAGE OF THIS REFERENDUM WILL RESULT IN AN INCREASE IN YOUR
PROPERTY TAXES**

For School District Question 1, the property tax portion of the revenue authorized will require an estimated referendum tax rate of 0.21875% for taxes payable in 2023 of the referendum market value of all classes of taxable property in the School District, as defined by Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.01, Subdivision 3, which excludes certain agricultural property, seasonal property and post-secondary student housing.

The projected annual dollar increases for typical residential homesteads, apartments, commercial-industrial properties, and most other classes of property within the School District are as shown in the table below, subject to an annual increase at the rate of inflation with respect to School District Question 1.

For agricultural property (both homestead and non-homestead), the taxes for the proposed referendum will be based on the value of the house, garage and one acre of land. There will be no referendum taxes paid on the value of agricultural land and buildings. For seasonal recreational residential property (e.g., cabins), there will be no taxes paid for the proposed referendum.

The figures in the table below are based on taxes for the voter approved referendum and capital project levies only, and do not include taxes for other purposes:

The precincts and polling places for the special election will be the precincts and polling places used for the state general election.

(c) Paragraphs 5 through 12 shall be added to the Original Resolution:

5. The Clerk is authorized and directed to acquire and distribute such election materials as may be necessary for the proper conduct of this special election. If an optical scan voting system is being used, the Clerk shall comply with the laws and rules governing the procedures and requirements for optical scan voting systems. The Clerk is authorized and directed to acquire and distribute such election materials and to take such other actions as may be necessary for the proper conduct of this special election and generally to cooperate with election authorities conducting any other elections on that date. The Clerk and members of the administration are authorized and directed to take such actions as may be necessary to coordinate this election with other elections, including entering into agreements with appropriate municipal and county officials regarding preparation and distribution of ballots or ballot cards, election administration, and cost sharing.
6. The Clerk is authorized and directed to cause a printed ballot for the questions to be prepared in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.08, Subdivision 5 and the rules of the secretary of state for use at the special election. If an optical scan voting system is being used, the Clerk shall cause official ballots to be printed according to the format of ballots for optical scan voting systems provided by the laws and rules governing optical scan voting systems. The Clerk is further authorized and directed to cause a sample ballot to be posted in the administrative offices of the School District, for public inspection, at least four (4) days before the date of the special election and to cause two sample ballots to be posted at each polling place on the date of the special election and to cooperate with the proper election officials to cause ballots or ballot cards to be prepared for use at said election. 7. If the School District will be contracting to print the ballots for this special election, the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to prepare instructions to the printer for layout of the ballot. Before a contract in excess of \$1,000 is awarded for printing ballots, the printer shall, upon request, furnish in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 204D.04 a sufficient bond, letter of credit or certified check acceptable to the Clerk in an amount not less than \$1,000 conditioned on printing the ballots in conformity with the Minnesota election law and the instructions delivered. The Clerk shall set the amount of the bond, letter of credit or certified check in an amount equal to the value of the purchase.
8. The individuals designated as judges for the state general election shall act as election judges for this special election and shall conduct the special election at the various polling places in the manner prescribed by law.
9. The special election shall be held and the returns made and canvassed in the manner prescribed by law and the Board shall meet on a date between the third day, November 11, 2022, and the tenth day, November 18, 2022, after the special election for the purpose of canvassing the results thereof.
10. If the capital project levy authorization proposed in School District Question 2 is approved, all proceeds from the capital project levy shall be deposited in the capital project referendum account which is a separate account in the School District's general fund. All interest income attributable to the capital project referendum account must be credited to the capital project referendum account. Money in the capital project referendum account may only be used for the costs of acquisition and betterment of approved projects. Minnesota Statutes, Section 123B.71, Subdivision 8 provides an exemption from the requirement that the School District obtain a review and comment prior to holding a capital project levy authorization special election if the proposed capital project addresses only technology and if the funds generated by the proposed capital project levy authorization will be used only as authorized in Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.10, Subdivision 14. Accordingly, the Board hereby determines that the proposed capital project addresses only technology and that, if approved by the voters, the funds generated by the capital project levy authorization will be used only as authorized in Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.10, Subdivision 14. The funds in the capital project referendum account may be accumulated and not be expended until sufficient funds are available, may be accumulated and not be expended until additional funds from a bond issue are available, or may be expended on an ongoing basis for approved project costs. Any funds remaining in the capital project referendum account that are not applied to the payment of the costs of the approved projects before their final completion shall be transferred to the School District's debt redemption fund.
11. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 123B. 63, Subdivision 3(f), Section 126C.17, Subdivision 9(e), and Section 205A.07, Subdivision 3a, the Clerk is hereby instructed to notify the Commissioner of Education of the results of the special election and to provide the certified vote totals for the ballot question in written form within fifteen (15) days after the results have been certified by the Board.
